WELCOME TO NATHAN JONES, THE PLAYERS, STAFF, DIRECTORS AND FANS OF LUTON TOWN FOR THIS AFTERNOON'S EMIRATES FA CUP THIRD ROUND CLASH.

I love the FA Cup. I think in this day and age, the general public have a different take on the FA Cup and it doesn't have the glamour it had years ago because of the Champions League and the explosion of the Premier League.

For me, though, it's a special competition. I can name the winners of the FA Cup from 1963 through to 1989 but I would be struggling to tell you who won it in the past five years.

When I was a youngster, it was a rare exposure to live football and you watched the build-up from 9am right through until five, or later if there was extra-time.

It was a special day, teams always played their strongest teams, but now you can watch up to four games a day so it has taken the edge off it for some.

But for a club like ours, and to an extent Luton as well, it could do a lot for us. I remember our FA Cup games against Huddersfield, Bournemouth and Colchester where there was a superb atmosphere at home and it changed Accrington's destiny as the influx of money enabled us to go full-time

and return to the Football League.


It's a chance to do it again and take the club to the next stage. Getting through this round and getting a plum fourth round tie could make a huge difference to Accrington Stanley.

Luton are a good side, they are above us in the league which says they have been more consistent than us, but our performances have been good even though we haven't been getting the results.

We played them at their place earlier this season and, I know it's about scoring goals and they scored the decisive one, but we controlled the game for 80 minutes and we have got to believe we can beat them.

January is a big time for clubs – we welcome Hull loan pair Jonathan Edwards and Harvey Rodgers to Accrington and I hope to bring in one or two more. Decisions will be made over the next few days on those players whose loans are up with us and those on short-term deals.

It's good to have a break from our league campaign and it's an exciting game today with a great chance to draw a big team in the next round.

We have put in two good performances in the FA Cup so far beating Bradford City and Woking to get into the third round and, as it is against a team in our league, it means there will be a League Two team in the hat for round four and I can see no reason why it can't be us.

We played Luton in November in the league and, while they won 1-0, it was a close game and there wasn't a lot in it.

We have the advantage that this is at home and, unlike some league games, it won't be a cagey affair as both teams will go for it. It should be a good open game and entertaining for the fans.

Looking back at the festive period, four points out of the nine available is a bit disappointing and we felt like we should have had more and deserved better.

At Grimsby we played quite well but just couldn't take our chances and it was a huge relief to win at Crewe. I know our goal had an

HULL OF A MOVE

NEW BOYS EAGER TO HELP REDS

NEW boys Harvey Rodgers and Jonathan Edwards have quickly settled into Accrington Stanley life.

The pair signed for the Reds on New Year's Day on a season-long loan from Premier League Hull City and will live in Kirkby.

Striker Edwards, 20, also already knew of the Stanley players so it has helped him fit straight into the squad.

"I know Janoi (Donacien) as he is from my area in London," said Edwards, who came through the ranks at Peterborough before signing for Hull in the summer.

"It has also helped that we have come to a new club together and we are living near the other players in Kirkby so will be able to travel in together."

Rodgers, 20, from York, has been at Hull since Under 10 level and hasn't yet been out on loan at any other clubs, playing regularly for the Tigers Under 23s.

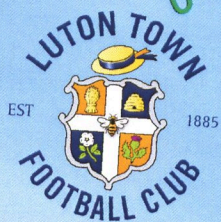
"It's what I need at this stage of my career," said the 20-year-old. "After Hull played Manchester City a few weeks ago we were called into the office and told Accrington were interested and both of us and we wanted to come.

"It's a great opportunity to play first team football and we have both been looking at the results and the league table. I know they made the play-offs last season and a couple of wins now can move us into the top half of the table so hopefully we can help Accrington do that."

Edwards has been prolific for Hull Under 23s with 13 goals in around 15 games in all competitions.

"I want to now see what I can do in the league and this is an important part of my career.

"Hopefully I can score the goals to help Accrington move up the table."

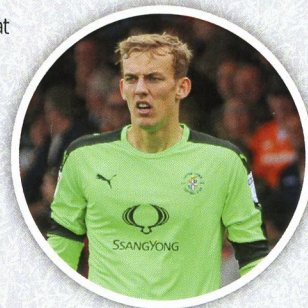

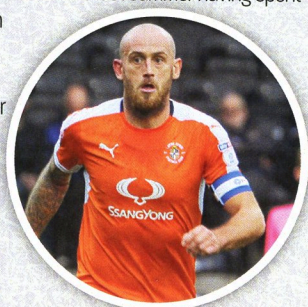
CHRISTIAN WALTON GOALKEEPER

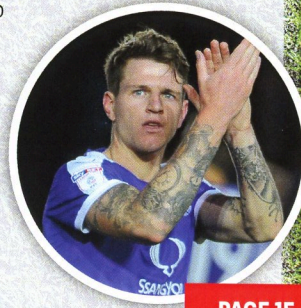
SCOTT CUTHBERT DEFENDER

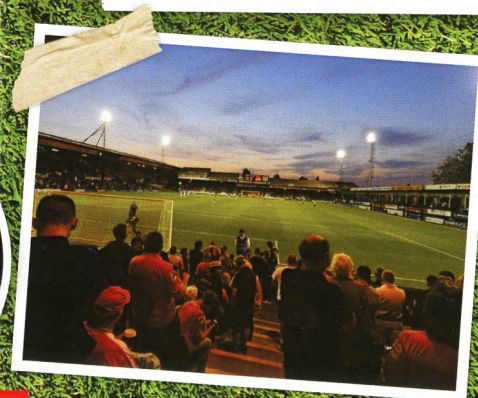
GLEN REA MIDFIELD

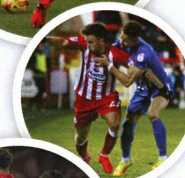
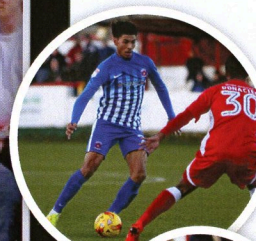

PEARSON WANTS CONTINUED IMPROVEMENT

A WIN AND A DRAW IN THE LAST TWO GAMES HAVE ENCOURAGED MATTY PEARSON – NOW HE WANTS MORE

STANLEY defender Matty Pearson is pleased with their recent upturn in form but is still asking for further improvement. The versatile 23-year-old won a penalty and scored in Monday's 2-2 draw with Hartlepool United at the Wham Stadium.

That result came just days after a first league win in ten when the Reds won 1-0 at Crewe.

Pearson thinks that three points has been a big boost to everyone around the club.

"It's a happier place than it was a week or so ago," he said. "Once you win you remember how good winning feels. As a professional you like winning at anything, whether it's cards or a board game or whatever. You just love winning. Once we got

that winning feeling back it made it all feel a lot better.

"I feel like we can climb away from danger. It's not in doubt for me. We have good players here. Jonny Edwards came on (on Monday) to make his debut, a young lad on loan and I thought he did really well. I'm sure the gaffer will get the best out of the players we have here and we'll start climbing the table."

A point against Pools means it's two games unbeaten for John Coleman's side and hopefully an end to a period of struggling to score goals but Pearson now thinks it's important to balance attack and defence.

"I'm sick of conceding goals but that just seems to be how it is at the minute," he reflected. "The plus side is that we scored two goals and posed a lot of goal threat but we couldn't keep them out."

"We're getting better in front of goal. We've always been good at creating chances really but we've started taking them. We need to keep doing that and sooner or later it will turn and we'll be scoring and not conceding."

"We were all disappointed not to win. We have to be holding on in those sort of games and seeing them through but we didn't. We got a point but sometimes a

point isn't good enough and we feel like we should have taken all three.

"We need to learn from that. As soon as we score we need to be going again and thinking about getting another goal instead of having the mindset of thinking we're a goal up and taking it easy. We can't be holding on to what we have got, we have to push on and try to score again and again."

"I was obviously pleased to put us back in front but it was the same thing again – disappointed to concede a second goal. We'll get it right though. As a defender it's hard to concede two goals at home but we'll learn from it."

Attention quickly turned to the next challenge, today's FA Cup third round tie at home to Luton Town.

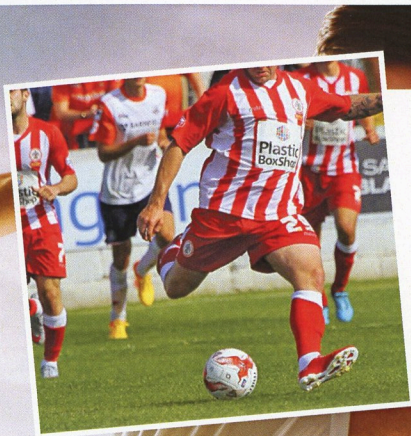
With new players like Edwards and fellow loanee Harvey Rodgers coming in, Pearson thinks competition will be fierce to win, and keep, places in the team.

"You should have to be on your toes in football," he said. "It's part and parcel. You have to be giving your all every time you play and know that there are other players who can come in and take your place if you don't. You put on your shirt and are playing for your position."

"The FA Cup is a great opportunity. You're in the spotlight, I don't know how the two managers will approach the game but whether you're keeping your shirt or coming in there's a chance to play in the next league game as well as make it into the next round."

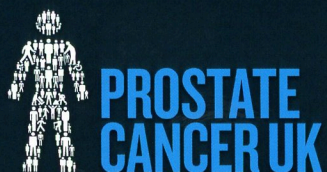

TROPHY LEADS TO SCHOLAR SUCCESS

A Sheffield competition that celebrates the world's oldest tournament has turned footballing dreams into reality for two "stars of the future".

Stanley were always going to be underdogs in a competition that boasts some of Europe's bigger teams but Stanley bosses were that blown away by the performances of Kasom Shah and Alex O'Neill they offered them scholarship contracts on the spot.

From Royal Antwerp to Celtic, the Youdan Trophy allowed the Lancashire U16 team to play

against top flight squads they would never ordinarily play against.

Stanley's Academy Head of Recruitment and Talent David Bailey said: "The Youdan Trophy allowed the boys to demonstrate their talent outside of the box.

"They proved their ability against teams they'd never normally get to play.

"The Youdan Trophy is a first class competition with great organisation and has proved the catalyst for success for these

players."

Kasom Shah said: "I can't describe how happy I am. There are still other players who are working to achieve the same as us and I want to help give them the best opportunity as well." It was also a dream come true for Alex O'Neill after being previously dropped by Liverpool.

He said: "You always have to be confident. You need to think you can do it, and I've always had a confident feel that I will get a contract so I gave it everything I had. I'm happy to say I'm a scholar at Stanley now."

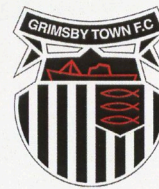

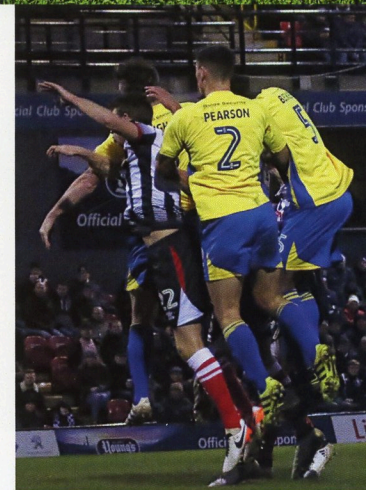

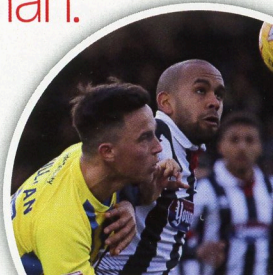

FEW managers like doing business in the January window. Inflated prices, squad disruption, limited availability - it's all too easy to get fleeced or make a catastrophic blunder.

So with agents barrelling around the country and chief execs gripping their calculators, we look at some of last year's biggest EFL deals and whether they stand up to scrutiny 12 months on...

STEVE SIDWELL STOKE - BRIGHTON (LOAN)

Barely an eyebrow was raised when veteran midfielder Sidwell arrived at the Amex, his best days seemingly over and a quiet life as back-up to Beram Kayal beckoning.

Fast-forward 12 months and - now signed permanently - the 34-year-old's composure and intelligence in the middle of the park has played a huge role in turning Chris Hughton's Seagulls from solid promotion chasers into unbeatable title contenders.

It says everything that Kayal - arguably last season's standout performer - has not been missed since injuring an ankle in October.

VERDICT: HIT

DIEGO FABBRINI WATFORD - BIRMINGHAM (£1.5M)

Sanctioned by Brum's soon-to-be new owners, Fabbri's big-money arrival was supposed to herald an exciting new dawn at St Andrews. Gone were the days of dogged scrappers on League One wages - in were flamboyant continental playmakers for hefty transfer fees.

Alas, the Italian has so far played just six times all season. Unsited to Gary Rowett's preferred 4-4-2 system, Fabbri's lack of game time is thought to have played a part in the owners' decision to install compatriot Gianfranco Zola, the man who signed him for Watford in 2013.

Yet even he seems unconvinced, with Fabbri allowed just 21 minutes in Zola's four matches so far.

VERDICT: MISS

JORDAN RHODES BLACKBURN - MIDDLESBROUGH (£9M)

Signed by chairman Steve Gibson to the chagrin of manager Aitor Karanka, the striker's six goals in 18 games undoubtedly inched Boro over the line and into the top flight. That alone was worth the cash. Nevertheless, the Scottish

international is unwanted by Karanka and serves little purpose in a doggedly defensive side. With the Spaniard in charge, Boro fans - and the rest of us - are unlikely to see Rhodes at his best.

VERDICT: MISS

YANN KERMORGANT BOURNEMOUTH - READING (£500,000)

A lot of money for a 34-year-old? It must have seemed that way as the French striker scored just three goals in 17 games for Brian McDermott's mid-table scrappers last term.

Yet the summer arrival of Jaap Stam and his possession-heavy philosophy was tailor-made for the clever hold-up man, whose deft technique and ability to play for others has underpinned the Royals' unexpected march up the table.

As a recent rest shows, the legs aren't quite up to 46 games anymore. Then again, two late goals in the dramatic 3-2 victory over Bristol City last weekend suggests there's plenty of life in the old dog yet.

VERDICT: HIT

Please keep walkways clear

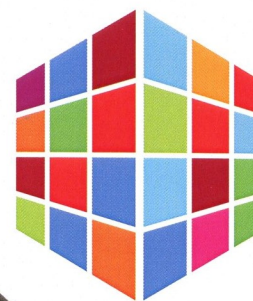

- 9 The consumption of alcohol is strictly limited to the Sports Bar, designated areas behind the stands, Sponsors Lounges and Board Room.
