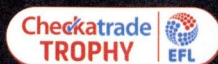

THE MANAGER NATHAN JONES



Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the
first time in 2017 for tonight's game against Chesterfield in the third
round of the Checkatrade Trophy.

I would like to welcome everybody from our visitors – including supporters, directors,
staff, caretaker manager Ritchie Humphreys and his squad – and I hope they have a
safe trip back up the M1 to Derbyshire after the game.

After the disappointment of our FA Cup exit on Saturday at Accrington Stanley,
we are now down to two competitions to aim for and after earlier victories over
Gillingham, West Brom and Swindon – plus Aston Villa in the EFL Cup – we'll relish
the opportunity to upset another higher-level club tonight.

Of course, our main goal for the season is getting to the level Chesterfield are at
and although other results went against us on Saturday to push us out of the play-
off places for the first time, we are fully focussed on getting back up towards the
promotion spots.

At Portsmouth last Monday we suffered a big blow in losing Cameron McGeehan to a

WELCOME CHESTERFIELD

The Hatters would like to extend a warm welcome to tonight's visiting staff, players and fans of Chesterfield for this last 16 match in the Checkatrade Trophy.

The Spireites' run in the competition has mirrored the Hatters, having won two and lost one in the group stages of the competition, before defeating a League One side away in the first knockout phase.

After defeating Wolves Under-21s in their first match in the competition, the Derbyshire club's future involvement became slightly fragile as they slipped to a 4-1 defeat at home to Accrington Stanley.

But a 2-0 win away at Crewe Alexandra secured their place in the draw for the knockout round of the competition, from which they progressed with another 2-0 victory, this time away at Rochdale.

They have struggled in the league, however, and are without a permanent manager after parting company with former Hatters midfielder Danny Wilson on Sunday afternoon following a 2-0 defeat at Bradford City that left them third-from-bottom of Sky Bet League One.

Wilson had steered the Spireites to safety last season after taking over from Dean Saunders in December 2015, eventually finishing 18th and securing their status with a game to spare.

But this season Chesterfield have won only six times in 26 league games, and a run of four defeats in their last six signalled the end for the 57-year-old – who famously scored one of the Town's goals in in the 1988 Littlewoods Cup final win over Arsenal – and assistant Chris Morgan.

Veteran left-back Ritchie Humphreys, who is also the current chairman of the Professional Footballers' Association, will take charge of the team for tonight's match.

RITCHIE HUMPHREYS

The 38-year-old former Sheffield Wednesday man has been placed in caretaker charge following the departure of Danny Wilson on Sunday. The left-sided player spent 12 years with Hartlepool before joining the Spireites in 2013.

BETWEEN THE STICKS

LLOYD ALLINSON

After spending over a decade at Huddersfield Town, the 23-year-old joined the Spireites in the summer of 2016 and has been a regular in his side's Checkatrade Trophy starting XI this season.

IN DEFENCE

GARY LIDDLE

The captain for Chesterfield, the ex-Hartlepool, Notts County and Bradford City defender joined the Spireites on transfer deadline day last February from the Bantams.

LAURENCE MAGUIRE

The 19-year-old has been with the side since he joined as a youth, and has gone onto make several appearances for the Spireites this season, both in the league and cup competitions.

TOM ANDERSON

Currently in his second spell on loan with the Spireites from parent club Burnley, the 23-year-old counts

Chesterfield as the sixth club he has joined temporarily in his career, alongside the likes of Barrow and Hyde.

IAN EVATT

The former Blackpool, QPR and Derby defender rejoined Chesterfield in 2013, after departing the club originally in 2005 for the Hoops.

CONNOR DIMAIO

The Republic of Ireland Under-21 international joined the Spireites on the last day of the transfer window just under a year ago from Sheffield Wednesday.

ACROSS THE MIDDLE

DION DONOHUE

After spells in Non-League with the likes of Sutton Coldfield Town and Holyhead Hotspur, the 23-year-old joined Chesterfield in 2015.

JON NOLAN

After a short but hugely successful six-month spell with Grimsby Town in the second half of last season, in which he helped the Mariners back into the Football League, the 24-year-old signed for Chesterfield and has been a regular for the Spireites this season.

GBOLY ARIYIBI

An American U23 international, Ariyibi has made over 75 appearances for Chesterfield since joining in 2014. His ex-sides include Leeds United and Tranmere Rovers.

DAN GARDNER

The 26-year-old joined Chesterfield in 2014 after spells with Non-League clubs such as Flixton, Droylsden and FC Halifax Town.

JAY O'SHEA

An ex-Republic of Ireland international up to U23 level, the former Birmingham City, Bray Wanderers and Galway United midfielder joined the Spireites in 2013.

UP FRONT

CHED EVANS

The former Sheffield United striker joined Chesterfield in the summer, and has so far notched seven goals for his new side. The 27-year-old's other former employers include Manchester City and Norwich City.

JAKE BEESLEY

The 20-year-old came through the youth ranks with the Spireites and is the son of former Manchester City, West Brom and Port Vale defender Paul Beesley.

KRISTIAN DENNIS

A regular goalscorer for his ex-Non-League sides which include Curzon Ashton and Macclesfield Town, Dennis joined Chesterfield in the summer, scoring his first goal for his side in their Checkatrade Trophy win over Wolverhampton Wanderers U21s.

STORY OF THE MATCH: The Hatters ended 2016 on a real high with a convincing victory over play-off hopefuls Barnet.

Goals from Alan Sheehan, Cameron McGeehan and Alex Gilliead secured the win with efforts of real quality in front of another big Kenilworth Road crowd.

Sheehan bagged his second of the season as he curled a 25-yard free-kick into the top left corner, before Bira Dembele as half-time approached.

McGeehan made it 15 goals in 2016 with an acrobatic finish four minutes after the restart, before Gilliead wrapped up the three points with a clever finish from the edge of the box into the bottom right of Jamie Stephens' goal just seven minutes later.

Manager Nathan Jones said: "We've got a goal from a wonderful free-kick. They scored from a little bit of second phase, so at half-time it was probably a fair result. In the second half, we asked them to come out and lift the tempo a little bit and they did that. We deserved the win."

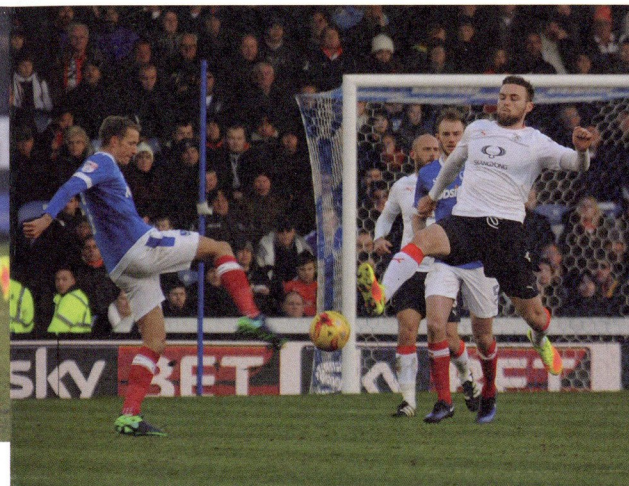
The 21-year-old went to in to a challenge with Pompey captain Michael Doyle and got his foot caught in the turf with 13 minutes gone.

He was stretchered off seven minutes later and just after the half-hour, the hosts took the lead when Christian Burgess

powered home a header from a corner on the left, with Town unable to reply, despite dominating a second half in which Danny Hylton went closest to scoring with a chip that came back off the bar.

"I thought we were poor first half, we lacked bravery," said manager Jones.

"You know when you come here you have got to be brave. You don't come here and try and sit back and contain anyone. Second half was a totally different affair and I thought we were excellent."

STORY OF THE MATCH: The Hatters went crashing out of the Emirates FA Cup on Saturday as Sky Bet League Two rivals Accrington Stanley progressed to the fourth round with a 2-1 win over Nathan Jones' side.

Jake Gray's third goal of the season early on in the second half had dragged the Town back into the match after Sean McConville had fired the hosts in front in first-half injury time.

But Omar Beckles glanced in a winner three minutes later, and although Jones' men had several chances to draw

level before Glen Rea's injury-time dismissal for a second yellow card, it was Stanley who held out in the face of some intense pressure.

Jones said: "I am so disappointed. There was nothing really in the game in the first half. We come out, we are the better side in the second half, we have a number of chances. It's just naïve defending. After that we had enough chances to have got something from the game and take it to at least a replay, but we weren't clinical enough."
