



KEVIN NUGENT WRITES...



Good afternoon and welcome to The Hive London to Barnet FC supporters and also to Nathan Jones, his players, staff, officials and supporters of Luton Town. It is clear from looking at Luton's league position that Nathan is doing a first-rate job at Kennilworth Road and that we will be in a tough test this afternoon.

Looking back on the Cheltenham game is was obviously great to come away with all three points, especially as we had gone behind, but again I have to give credit to the players for staying in the game, so that when we took our chances late on in the game we could wrap up a victory.

To comeback when you are behind is not easy, and to go on and win is even more difficult and I was pleased with bravery that the players showed.

It was a big disappointment to lose Shane Cojocarel so early in the match. I will always give young players a chance if they are knocking at the door and are ready to make the step up. He had started the match in fine form, he was looking bright and was giving the Cheltenham defence more than a few anxious moments.

The local derby result at Stevenage was clearly a disappointment. I know what these games mean to the fans and we had a good number at Stevenage. But I have to tell you that nobody could be more disappointed than I was after the game with the outcome.

Stevenage are in great form at the moment, especially at home

and are scoring goals for fun but you couldn't really say that Jamie Stephens had a busy afternoon. We were successful in limiting a free-flowing Stevenage side to very few chances, but of course to win games you need to also be successful in converting a good percentage of the chances you make yourselves.

We need to continue to limit the opportunities that sides have against us and clearly take a greater proportion of the chances that we are continuing to make.

Against another free-flowing side in Luton we will need to improve to get something out of today's game. But I am confident that the players are, without a shadow of a doubt, more than capable of facing the task that is ahead of them today. Infact in front of a big crowd I have to say that this is a game that we are really looking forward to.

The support that the crowd are showing the players is fantastic and with a large number of Luton fans at the ground today the vocal backing coming from

the Barnet faithful could well be vital.

Behind the scenes there has been an awful lot of hard work by everyone involved to get the side ready for the challenge that Luton will offer today. The attitude of the players is first-rate and allied to your support, where we all have a common goal, almost anything is possible.

Shane is obviously out for the rest of the season as is Ryan Watson with his cartilage injury, but James Pearson and Jack Taylor are getting closer each day to be available once more. Perhaps they will be involved today, or today's match might be a little too early, but in any case it is good that they are getting closer to be playing first-team football again.

WHEN TWO TRIBES GO TO WAR

Alan Oliver and Laurent Robert

On Boxing Day 2002, Newcastle's Premier League title hopes were damaged by a 4-3 defeat to

Bolton. Alan Oliver, the veteran Evening Chronicle reporter, gave (pictured) Robert's performance four out of ten, suggesting the

temperamental winger didn't know what it meant to wear the black and white shirt. The following week, a still incensed Robert stormed into the media room at St James' Park and clocked Oliver with a haymaker before being dragged away by four journalists.

"I accept criticism of my performances," said the Frenchman, who denied

hitting Oliver. "But when I'm told things like that, I lose my temper. I went to him and told him." He sure did.

Hernan Cruzado and Hugo Catalan Loayza

Cruzado, a Peruvian radio journalist, spent much of 2007 publicly attacking Loayza, the director of Peru's Regional Sport Institute.

His accusations implicated Loayza in misappropriation of funds, nepotism, and documented various mistakes and inefficiencies.

It all got too much for Loayza, who gatecrashed a birthday party to confront Cruzado, then proceeded to punch and kick him to the ground before being restrained by a stunned revellers.

Cruzado later explained that Loayza had threatening all of the region's sports journalists, telling them that any further reporting on 'irregularities' would see their children suffer. No action was taken but Loayza was replaced in 2010.

Jim McLean and John Barnes

Having agreed to answer just two questions, the under-pressure Dundee United

chairman Jim McLean (pictured) lost his rag when BBC reporter John Barnes (not that one) persistently asked if he was about to sack manager Alex Smith.

"You think I'm going to answer a stupid question like that?" asked McLean, before turning to the camera and saying "Make sure that's cut". Then, lunging out of shot, the 64-year-old lamed Barnes right in the kisser, saying 'Don't you ever do that to me again'. Barnes was left with a bloody nose and a cut lip. McLean walked straight to the boardroom and resigned.

James McBride and Heath Nielsen

In November 2016, the Baylor University football programme in Texas was in the midst of a sexual abuse scandal.

Nielsen, the programme's director of public image, certainly had his work cut out. So what did he do? Launch a charm offensive?

Nope. He took umbrage at McBride, a photographer taking pictures of players, who alleged that Nielsen picked him up by the throat and snarled "You'll never ****ing work in this business again". Criminal charges were dismissed, though Nielsen is no longer director of public image.



WHAT'S THE BUZZ WITH JOSH PALMER

This extensively researched feature tells you where ex-Bees have landed and is the perfect update on all matters far and wide in the world of football.



A former Bee who is on the move is (pictured)

The 27 year old joined us in May 2015, having previously scored 34 goals in 93 outings for current National League leaders **Lincoln City**, as well as having previously also spent time at **Alfreton Town**, **Macclesfield Town** and **Worksop Town**. Having only made 12 appearances for us in all competitions, the South Yorkshire born forward spent much of last season away on loan, at National League clubs **Grimsby Town**, **Tranmere Rovers** and **Barrow**. He joined **Carlisle United** on March 24th, having been released by us at the end of the January transfer window.

Having picked up a red card in their 1-0 win against **Crawley Town** last weekend, **Newport County's Joss Labadie** has had his appeal rejected. The former **West Bromwich Albion**, **Tranmere Rovers**, **Notts County** and **Dagenham & Redbridge** midfielder picked up the red card following a small fight with Crawley's **Josh Yorwerth**, who also received a red card for the incident. County, who are currently fighting relegation, lost the appeal on Wednesday for their

key player. Therefore, the Croydon born 26 year old will miss the Exiles' next three matches, away to **Exeter City** and **Plymouth Argyle**, either side of a home game against **Yeovil Town**.

Last Saturday saw **John O'Sullivan** score for **Carlisle United** away at **Yeovil Town**. The goal, a first half header, was the first goal that the Cumbrians had scored in 42 days, or 701 minutes of football. Having gone on to win that game by a 2-0 score line, the side had not scored a goal before that since 18th February, when they beat **Wycombe Wanderers** 2-1 at Adams Park.



Another former Bee has recently got a job promotion, in the form of (pictured)

Ömer Rıza. The former **Turkey AZ** international striker played 10 times for us on two loan incantations during the 2000/01 season, a spell which saw him score on four occasions. Having since turned out for the likes of **Denizlispor**, **Trabzonspor**, **Shrewsbury Town** and **Boreham Wood**, he has now taken over at the helm of the Football League's bottom club, **Leyton Orient**. Having previously held management roles at **Cheshunt** and **Heybridge Swifts**, the 37 year old took over at the club at the end of last month after former manager **Daniel Webb** resigned after a poor run of form. However, he was sent to

the stands at half time during his first game, a 2-0 defeat against **Wycombe Wanderers** last week, which also saw a player sent off. Rıza becomes the O's fifth manager of the campaign, and the eleventh in the last 8 years.

Danny Collins, of **Grimsby Town**, has claimed that the club have not yet offered him a new contract for next season. The former **Sunderland**, **Stoke City**, **West Ham Untied** and **Nottingham Forest** defender has played 30 times for the Mariners so far this season, scoring one goal. The 36 year old former **Wales** international said that he was told by the clubs' manager **Marcus Bignot** that he was wanted at the club next season when he signed a contract extension back in January. "When I extended, the gaffer said he wanted me here next season as well, but I've not signed anything as such. There's one or two others in the same boat", he told the BBC.

The Sky Bet League 2 title has been conceded to **Doncaster Rovers**, says **Plymouth Argyle** manager **Derek Adams**. With the Pilgrims having led the table for a long period earlier on in the season, the side are currently in second place, six points behind Rovers with six matches remaining. The side will be guaranteed at least a play off spot if they win today. Also talking to the BBC, he said: "we're out of the title race now. Six points behind, Doncaster have a better goal difference - that's out of the question now".



(Pictured) **Jim Bentley**, the **Morecambe** manager, has said that he will assess his position at the club at the end of the season.

The club have been in financial difficulties, and have failed to pay their players in recent months. The 40 year old has been at the helm of the Shrimps since 2011, originally as player manager. "The end product for me is getting to the end of the season and making sure we're a Football League club", he said. The club are currently in 20th place, 10 points above the relegation zone with 6 games remaining. However, the side have lost their last 7 consecutive games, and have only one win in their last nine league games.



Newport County caretaker manager **Mike Flynn**, who took over from

former Bee **Graham Westley** (pictured) last month, has said that he is proud of the squad for "having given it everything" since he was appointed manager. The side were bottom of the table and 11 points from safety when he took over, and now find themselves four points off the bottom spot, and just five points off of safety. "I'm proud of them. They have given everything since I've been here. That determination, that effort and that intensity has got to last every game to the end of the season".

Former **Maccabi Haifa**, **Portsmouth**, **Middlesbrough**,

Everton and **Blackburn Rovers** striker **Yakubu** has been released by **Coventry City**, who are bottom of League

1. The former Nigeria international had signed for the Sky Blues, who won the Checkatrade Trophy last weekend, on 13th February, and only played three games, having received a hamstring injury during a 3-1 away defeat to fellow relegation threatened club **Swindon Town**.

18 year old **Shaun McWilliams** has said that it was a 'dream come true' to have made his debut for his hometown club

Northampton Town. The young midfielder came off the bench in the second half for the Cobblers, with the game away to **Rochdale** last Saturday ending in a 1-1 draw. Having come through the academy side at the Sixfields club, he spent last season on loan at Southern League Premier Division side **Kings Lynn Town**, before signing a two year professional contract over the summer.

The chairman of **Aldershot Tow**, **Shahid Azeem**, has claimed that giving the sides' players one year long contracts are a "calculated risk". The Shots, who are pushing for a play-off spot in the National League this season were in administration as recently as 2014 and had only previously been able to offer players contracts from July to April as a result of this.

"That determination, that effort and that intensity has got to last every game to the end of the season" said Azeem. "It's a calculated risk, but you've got to have some kind of optimism because if you're too careful you lose all these players and

then you end up trying to rebuild the team. I think we've got a good group of people on the board, we've got investments coming in and if we're successful more people will get in".




Last weekend saw former Bees defender (pictured) **David Stephens** get

his first goal for his current side **Boreham Wood**. Having joined us from Scottish side **Hibernian** in 2012, the former **Norwich City** and **Lincoln City** man played over 130 times, scoring twice, for us, including in our Conference winning season in 2015. However, the former **Wales U21** left that summer and subsequently joined the local National League side. Having made over 30 appearances since then he bagged his first goal last weekend, in a 4-2 home defeat to **Macclesfield Town**. He scored an equalising goal after 14 minutes, but could not prevent the side falling 4-1 down at half time.

Also scoring last weekend was **Kieron Cadogan**. The 26 year old, who played 23 times for us during the 2013/14 season, scored an equalising goal for his **Sutton United** side, who also had another former Bee – **Nicky Bailey** – lining up in their squad. However, his goal was not enough, as the U's fell to a 83rd minute goal to lose 2-1 away at Woking.



INTERVIEW WITH JAMIE STEPHENS



STEVE BENNETT, Head of Communications & Media here at The Hive London caught up JAMIE STEPHENS recently found that despite the keeper's tender years he is making numerous plans for the future...

Jamie Stephens found himself on the side-lines for 11 weeks following a grade two tear in his groin, immediately followed by a similar tear in his hamstring.

The time he spent out of action was mentally tough for the shot stopper, and he credits the clubs medical staff with keeping him positive throughout his rehab.

"Mentally, being injured is a lonely place. You watch the lads out on the pitch and want to join in.

"In recovery you have to do the right things for your body, while mentally challenging yourself as well.

"People round me here at the club put me right. They helped me progress and push on again.

We have some great characters on the staff here. Now I'm back feeling good and feeling fit."

Jamie's career path has led him to some big clubs, signing his first professional contract at 17.

He started off playing local league as a youngster before moving to his boyhood club Forest Green Rovers. From there Jamie went to Swindon Town where he was offered a scholarship.

A year into that scholarship Liverpool came knocking and Jamie signed professionally with them at 17. Once his time on Merseyside came to an end, Jamie moved to Newport County for two years before finally making his way to Barnet.

Still only 23, Jamie has plenty of ambition to play at the highest possible level he can.

"I just want to stay fit and play for as long as I can. I'm trying to make as many appearances as I can, and progress with Barnet as far as we can go."

However, Jamie understands that football doesn't last forever and is already laying plans for life after his playing days.

"I'm looking at lots of different options. A sport science degree, a train signalling course, I've done my level two coaching, I help my girlfriend with her business - www.themakeitpersonal.co.uk, there's lots going on! I've been to transitional events and know there are plenty of possibilities after the game."

That said, Jamie is still very much committed to life in between the sticks, and considers signing his second contract here at Barnet as one of his finest achievements.

"I've really enjoyed my time at Barnet so far. The fans have been brilliant to me. Coming here has been a pleasure.

"I've really settled into the area, got to know people, and am really enjoying it."



MESSAGE FROM LUKE COULSON



Two years ago, I lost one of my best friends, Adam Cunliffe.

On the 4th of February 2015, Adam sadly passed away after suffering from an unexpected heart condition, aged just 20 years old.


This year on May 20th, my family and I have decided to challenge ourselves even further by completing the Three Peak Challenge in 24 hours.

The Three Peak Challenge is completed by climbing the three tallest peaks in the U.K, Ben Nevis, Scarfell Pike and Snowdon all within one day.

Our plan is to drive from Bristol to Scotland and begin climbing Ben Nevis at 7.30am on the Saturday morning. After our descent, we will begin our long drive to the Lake District and begin climbing Scarfell Pike around 7pm in the evening. Our second mountain will hopefully be completed by 11pm and the final drive of the journey will get us to Snowdon at 4.00am on Sunday morning. Our challenge will be completed by racing to the top of the mountain for 7.30am and thus finishing within the 24 hour time.

FAB FOUR



MALCOLM MACDONALD

Striker Malcolm Macdonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Luton in July 1969. He was twice top scorer including their 1969-70 promotion success when 'Player of the Year' and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974 and League Cup finalist in 1976, he joined Arsenal for £333,333 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield and now works in the media.



RICKY HILL

England international midfielder Ricky Hill was 'Player of the Year' when Luton Town won the Second Division title in 1981-82.

Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in May 1976, he was also 'Player of the Year' in 1980-81 and starred as Luton were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85. He also featured in two consecutive League Cup finals including the Hatters' 1988 Wembley triumph and netted 54 goals in 436 League games before moving to Le Havre in July 1989. Reuniting with David Pleat at Leicester City in August 1990 and later as a coach at Sheffield Wednesday and Spurs, he briefly rejoined Luton as manager.



BRIAN STEIN

England international striker Brian Stein was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1987-88, scoring twice in that season's League Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in

October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted 'Player of the Year' again in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall before joining Barnet in August 1992. His younger brother Mark also played for Luton.



MICK HARFORD

England international striker Mick Harford was Luton Town's 'Player of the Year' in 1988-89. Initially with Lincoln City, he played for Newcastle United,

Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in December 1984. He starred as the Hatters were League Cup finalists in two consecutive seasons, including their 1988 Wembley triumph, also FA Cup semi-finalists on two occasions. Moving to Derby County in January 1990, he returned to Luton in September 1991. Joining Chelsea in August 1992, he then appeared for Sunderland, Coventry City and Wimbledon. He has since been coach and manager of Luton.

MANAGING TO SUCCEED



DAVID PLEAT

David Pleat managed Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981-82. A former winger, he played for


Nottingham Forest, Luton, Shrewsbury, Exeter and Peterborough before appointed Nuneaton's player-boss. He rejoined Luton as coach in July 1972, becoming manager in January 1978, guiding them to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1984-85. Taking charge of Spurs in May 1986, he led them to the 1987 FA Cup final, then managed Leicester City before rejoining Luton in June 1991. He took the Hatters to the FA Cup semi-finals in 1993-94, leaving in June 1995, then was Sheffield Wednesday's boss and Spurs' director of football.



RAY HARFORD

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 League Cup final triumph. A centre-half with Charlton Athletic, Exeter City, Lincoln, Mansfield, Port Vale and Colchester, he was appointed youth team coach at Layer Road. He joined Fulham in a similar capacity in June 1981 and was manager for two years before moving to Luton as assistant-boss in July 1986. Becoming manager in June 1987, he also guided them to the Simod Cup final and FA Cup semi-finals in 1987-88, then the 1989 League Cup final. Sacked in January 1990, he later had spells managing Wimbledon, Blackburn Rovers, West Brom and QPR. He died in August 2003.

CLASSIC CAMPAIGNS



1954-55

Gordon Turner (pictured) scored 32 goals as Luton Town won promotion to the top-flight for the first time in 1954-55. The Hatters began with a 3-0 victory at

home to Nottingham Forest and soared up the Second Division table with six straight wins. Gordon Turner grabbed a hat-trick as Luton trounced Blackburn 7-3 and they triumphed 5-1 at Nottingham Forest. Dally Duncan's side maintained their challenge, slamming four goals past Hull City, Rotherham United, Liverpool and Port Vale. Tom Aherne and Shay Dunne were ever-present as Luton pipped Rotherham to the runners-up slot on goal average with a 3-0 win at Doncaster.

1973-74

Luton Town regained top-flight status after an absence of 14 years in 1973-74. The Hatters recovered from a 4-0 defeat at Nottingham




Forest on the opening day to hammer Carlisle 6-1, embarking on an eight-match unbeaten run. Harry Haslam (pictured) signed Alan West from Burnley and Jimmy Husband from Everton as

GREATEST HITS

Luton maintained their promotion challenge. Husband netted a hat-trick in a 3-1 victory over rivals Orient, then leading marksman Barry Butlin scored three in a 4-2 win over Preston. Alan Garner and Bobby Thomson were ever-present and other stars included Peter Anderson and John Ryan as Luton finished runners-up.

1981-82

David Pleat guided Luton Town to the Second Division title in 1981-82. The Hatters had



narrowly missed promotion in the previous two years and Tony Grealy (pictured) was swapped for Brighton's Brian Horton. They raced to the top by winning their first three games and hammered rivals Watford 4-1, then Steve White scored four times in a 6-0 demolition of Grimsby. Richard Money arrived from Liverpool and was an influential figure as Luton were unbeaten in their last 14 matches. Leading marksman Brian Stein, Mal Donaghy, Kirk Stephens and Steve White were all ever-present as Luton won the title with 88 points.



1987-88

Ray Harford plotted Luton Town's 1988 League Cup final triumph. Danny Wilson (pictured) replaced Peter

Nicholas in midfield, while Micky Weir arrived from Hibernian and Mike Newell moved to Leicester. The Hatters won 5-2 at Oxford and Ian Allinson was signed from Stoke in October, with Luton losing just twice in 12 matches including a 7-4 win in the return match against Oxford, finishing ninth in the top-flight. They defeated Wigan 5-2, Coventry 3-1, Ipswich 1-0, Bradford City 2-0 and Oxford 3-1 in the League Cup before beating Arsenal 3-2 in the final. Luton were also FA Cup semi-finalists and Simod Cup finalists.




MANAGER – NATHAN JONES


1 STUART MOORE


3 DAN POTTS

4 JONATHAN SMITH



appearance coming on in the 1-0 home win over Accrington Stanley in November 2016.




6 SCOTT CUTHBERT


7 JAKE GRAY


10 JORDAN COOK


17 PELLY RUDDOCK MPAMZU

Maltese international who joined Luton in January transfer window when he moved from Barnet. Gambin had been with the Bees since joining as an apprentice in 2009 and had made 136 appearances, scoring 15 times. Penned a two-and-a-half year contract upon signing at Kenilworth Road, with the Hatters having an option to extend it to 2020. Scored the first ever competitive goal at The Hive for Barnet.

24 LAWSON D'ATH

The attacking midfielder joined the Hatters from Northampton Town during the January transfer window. He started his career at Reading, for whom he only made one senior appearance, but his League debut came during a loan spell playing alongside manager Nathan Jones at Yeovil Town in 2012. He has also enjoyed loans at Cheltenham Town, Exeter City and Dagenham & Redbridge before joining Northampton in 2014. He made almost a century of appearances in a two-and-a-half-year spell at Sixfields and won the League Two title last season.

27 TYREEQ BAKINSON

The left-footer can operate at either full-back or in central defence, and has made over 300 appearances in his career with the majority coming during two spells with Notts County. 

Brief Directions by Road
The M4 and onto the M5 and junction 29 is a very straight forward way to get to Exeter but the much more pleasant - and it covers a lot less miles - is the M3 westbound until junction 8 and onto the A303.
