JOHN COLEMAN

WELCOME TO NATHAN JONES, THE PLAYERS, STAFF, DIRECTORS AND FANS OF LUTON TOWN TO THE WHAM STADIUM FOR OUR FINAL HOME GAME OF THE REGULAR SEASON.

I am still gutted about the Newport defeat last week which ended our 15-game unbeaten run. Luck really deserted us on the day as we had some great chances which we just didn't put away.

I couldn't see them scoring and then there were three or four mistakes which, if we had eliminated one of them, their goal wouldn't have happened.

They took their chance and we didn't take ours and then I was disappointed we didn't respond after they scored. We seemed to think it was game over and that's really frustrating.

A 15-game unbeaten run, with nine wins, should have really taken us into the play-offs or even automatic promotion spots but we were starting from a low position we should never have been in. We should have started that run at least nine points better off and the sickening thing is, while we have beaten all of the top three, we have a terrible record against the bottom four. We have only won one of eight games against the bottom four and that's something we have to put right next season. That's really tough to take.

The first objective, at Christmas, was to finish in the top half of the table and that's still

the aim to give ourselves a platform for next season.

We know it will be a hard game today, Luton are a good side but we want to put Saturday behind us and do our best to put it right today.

We need to start scoring goals again, we have scored one goal in three games and not scoring is what plagued us in November and December so, while we are making chances, we want to start converting them again.

We were good value for our win against Luton in the FA Cup earlier in the season and we were disappointed to lose at their place so it should be a good game.

They need one point to secure a play-off place and I am sure they will be a disappointed they haven't gone up automatically but they will want to finish on a high, as we do.

At least, after it being foggy in the FA Cup match here, we should be able to see the game this time!

A huge thank you to the fans who have supported us this season and beyond – you have made a big difference and we appreciate you spending your hard-earned money to watch us week in, week out.

The new facilities behind the Clayton End are a pristine as the day they were built and again, a massive thank you for looking after the FanZone, catering and toilet facilities.

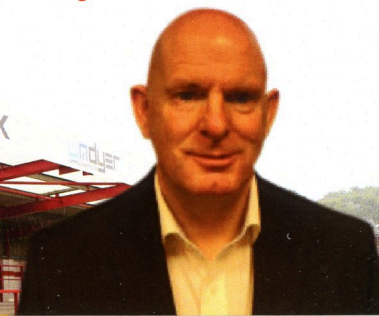

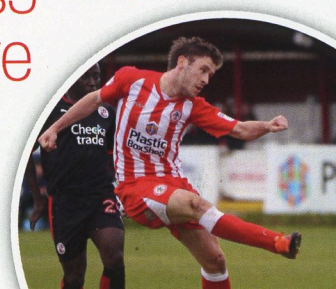

FORMER Plymouth Argyle striker Isaac Vassell became manager Nathan Jones' seventh signing of the close season after impressing on trial. The 22-year-old is a cousin of former England international Darius Vassell, and for the past two seasons has combined life working on a building site with playing part-time for Truro City following his release by the Pilgrims in 2014. Vassell helped his hometown club win promotion from the Southern Premier Division and then qualify for the National League South play-offs in his two years at Trexew Road. Vassell scored his first Town goal in a 2-0 win over Morecambe in November, has since signed a new deal and scored his 11th goal of the season against Leyton Orient on Good Friday.

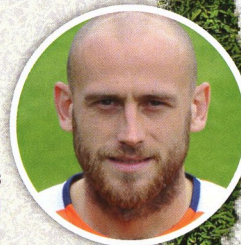
STUART MOORE GOALKEEPER

The 22-year-old stopper joined the Hatters on loan from Championship side Reading on deadline day in January 2017. He made his full debut for Luton that evening, in a 3-2 defeat to Cheltenham Town at Kenilworth Road. Having been with the Royals since 2011, he has been on loan to Basingstoke Town where he made 48 appearances, as well as four appearances for Peterborough United last season.



SCOTT CUTHBERT DEFENDER

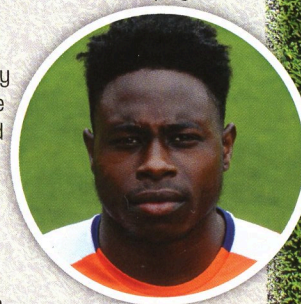
The defender is capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back. He signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2015 having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He came through the youth ranks at Celtic and has been capped at B level for Scotland. He took over the captaincy at Luton when Steve McNulty left for Tranmere in October 2015. The club captain recently activated a clause in his contract to extend his stay at Kenilworth Road until the summer of 2018.



PELLY RUDDOCK MIDFIELDER

Former West Ham academy graduate Ruddock Mpanzu is a direct, pacey youngster and was an instant hit when signed on-loan by then-boss John Still from the Hammers midway through the Conference title winning campaign of 2013-14. Versatile to play in central defence, midfield or on the wing, Pelly is a real crowd favourite and recently passed the 100 appearance mark for the Hatters. Netted his first goal of this season in the 4-0 win at Yeovil in early March.

He scored his first goal of the season in Crawley's recent 2-1 loss to Plymouth.

CHARLIE HAS WON OVER STANLEY HEARTS

FUNDRAISING FOR FOUR-YEAR-OLD'S CANCER BATTLE

BRAVE cancer sufferer Charlie Procter will be cheering on Accrington Stanley today.

Charlie, who celebrated his fourth birthday on Monday, was diagnosed with Hepatoblastoma, a rare form of liver cancer in 2016.

He first led Stanley out before the 1-0 victory over Crawley Town on Easter Monday to a rapturous ovation by both home and away supporters.

Now, brave Charlie will be on the pitch at half-time at today's game against promotion-chasing Luton Town - after leading the teams out at Blackburn Rovers - with Stanley helping for a big push for funds by holding a bucket collection to help the family achieve their goal to send him to America for specialist treatment.

Stanley Managing Director David

Burgess, said: "We've seen such a groundswell of support for Charlie in the local community and beyond since he led us out before our win over Crawley.

"We thought it was our duty to keep the momentum going and get this wonderful young boy the money that he needs to get better. It will be another wonderful occasion today at the Wham Stadium and I just hope we can raise some more money to get him on that plane."

One person who was deeply touched by Charlie's story was Stanley midfielder and fans favourite Matty Pearson who was instrumental in encouraging owner, Andy Holt, to pledge 50p (up to £25,000) for every retweet he received from a post highlighting Charlie's cause.

Charlie's mother, Amber, said of the continued support: "It really has been overwhelming

the amount of support and kind words we have received, and the help from the club has been unbelievable.

"I'd obviously like to thank Andy for his incredibly generous offer after the last game and everyone else at the club who has supported us. I hope we can put a bit more money in the Kitty today to help my little boy. I really have no doubt that we will - considering how generous strangers have been so far."

The family is attempting to raise £315,000 to fly Charlie to the USA, where innovative treatments not available in the UK could significantly improve his chances of survival.

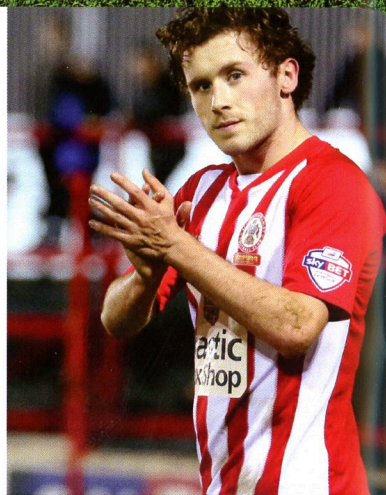
"The power of football continues to be used to improve people's health and wellbeing and provide increased opportunities to develop individuals' education and career prospects.

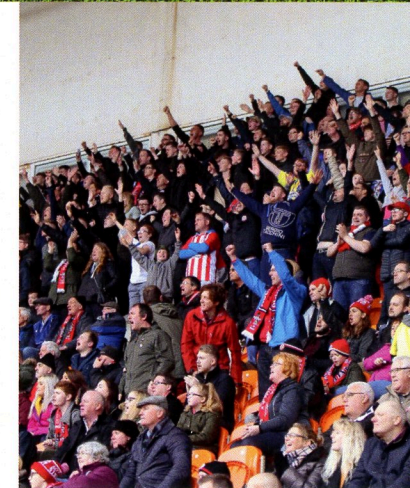

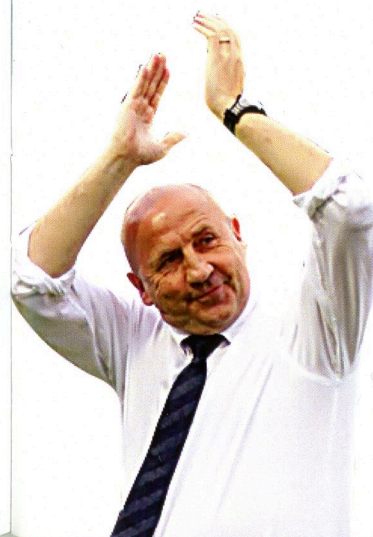

LATE TACKLE



THE last time Brighton kicked a ball in England's top flight, Spandau Ballet were top of the charts and Chris Hughton was a young full-back at Spurs. But after a storming season capped by victory at Wigan on Easter Monday, the Seagulls are returning to the summit for the first time in 34 years.

For those who remember - and those who don't - it's been a hell of a wait. Yet Brighton are only seventh on the list when it comes to waiting for another shot at the top flight - here are the sides who eclipse them.

1. BRADFORD CITY 77 YEARS

When the Bantams followed bottom-of-the-table Manchester

United (whatever happened to them) out of the 22-team First Division in 1922, little did anyone realise it would take seven decades to slog their way back. So severely did fortunes slump that City were twice forced to seek re-election to the Football League before Paul Jewell eventually hauled them back to the Premier League in 1999. The dream lasted two seasons before crushing debts sank them back to the basement.

2. OLDHAM ATHLETIC 69 YEARS

Rocked by the departure of long-serving manager Herbert Bamlett - who also refereed the 1914 FA Cup final aged 32 - the Latics were relegated a year after Bradford. So followed a similar path of lower league ignominy before the legendary management of Joe Royle yielded a Second Division title, three years of Premier League football and an FA Cup semi-final in the early nineties.

3. BRISTOL CITY 65 YEARS

Clive Whitehead's promotion clinching strike against Portsmouth at a packed Ashton Gate on Good Friday 1976 remains, for many City fans, the finest moment in the club's history.

Which is understandable -

nobody could remember the last such moment in 1906, when the Robins had fought off the likes of Leicester Fosse, Glossop and... Manchester United.

4. NOTTS COUNTY 55 YEARS

County - who had last played a top flight match in 1926 - were at a low ebb in the summer of 1980. Rivals Forest had just won the European Cup and a limp 17th place finish saw bookies offer odds of 66-1 on the Magpies winning the Second Division.

But with a young Howard Wilkinson pulling the strings behind manager Jimmy Sirrel, County's revolutionary passing game secured the title with a game to spare - and ended half a century outside the top flight.

5. CARDIFF CITY 51 YEARS

Cardiff's return to the top flight in 2013 was like waiting years for your favourite band to release a new album only to hit play and discover it's earache. Two generations starved of top-flight football were forced to endure managerial upheaval, stodgy football and finally relegation at the hands of an overpromoted Ole Gunnar Solskjaer. Hopefully they won't be forced to wait 51 years for another shot.

A GLIMPSE OF THINGS TO COME

SEAN MCCONVILLE BELIEVES THE REDS HAVE SHOWN WHAT LEAGUE TWO CAN EXPECT IN 2017/18 WITH THEIR STRONG FINISH TO THE CURRENT CAMPAIGN.

WINGER Sean McConville has been around for plenty of Stanley's recent history and thinks the current crop of Reds have a bright future ahead of them regardless of how the current season ends.

The Reds play their final home game of 16/17 this afternoon before the trip to Stevenage in a week's time and though defeat at Newport was a big blow to play-off hopes John Coleman's side remain in contention in the top half of League Two.

As one of the most experienced players in the squad McConville is keen to stress that the important thing is to go out on a high, even if the chances of a top seven finish look slim.

"Stranger things have happened but it looks a long shot," he said. "We just have to play the game today, take the three points and then I'm sure lads will be in the changing rooms after the game looking at their phones and looking at what's happened. Either we'll have a little sneak of a chance going to Stevenage

or we won't. Even if that's the case everyone remembers last season and what Stevenage did to us. They came here and inevitably stopped us from going up. Maybe we'll end up going there and spoiling it for them?

"When we had our bad spell, a couple of months without winning, we played the four teams who are now down at the bottom and we didn't win.

Over the season we've taken no points from Newport, one point from Hartlepool, three points

from Orient and one point of Cheltenham. That has cost us. Our failure against the teams lower down has probably cost us this season. The players will know that come the end of the season.

"We can't forget that we lost nine or ten big players in the summer and we've still had two great cup runs and finished the season strongly but we'll all look back at this season and wonder what if. There's quality in this squad and we wouldn't be out of place in those play-offs."

It's that quality that McConville is hoping will stay at the Wham Stadium for 2017.

The wide man has experienced two play-off campaigns with the club, last season and in 2010-11 and is confident that this group of players can achieve something this time next year. With only a few players with deals which expire in the summer McConville is hopeful that the fine run of form in March and April can be replicated in August.

"It's probably the first year that the gaffer might not be stressed out on his summer holidays

trying to sort contracts out," he smiled. "I think there are only a few out of contract this time. Hopefully he'll be able to enjoy his summer rather than worrying about whether lads will sign again or whatever. The only thing to worry about is teams coming in to buy people because there are lads who can play higher and kick on and would command a fee. That's probably the only decision to make in the summer, whether we decide to sell or keep everyone together. With the core of this squad there's no reason why we can't challenge for promotion for next season.

"If we can finish this season strongly and take it into next season with the bulk of the personnel I'm certain we can be successful. We've been consistent (during the recent run) and I don't think there have been many changes to the team in that time, probably 14 or 15 players involved regularly. Earlier in the season we were chopping and changing trying to find the right formula and once you get it you tend to stick with it.

"A repeat of the last time we played Luton would be more than welcome today. A nice three points to send the home

fans into the summer happy and a nice goal for me to top what's been a good season."

On a personal note McConville admits he's well aware he's not been a favourite among fans at times during his two spells with Stanley but after topping the League Two assists charts this season and weighing in with some important goals he's seeing a bit of a change in that regard.

"Hopefully it's turned a little," he concluded. "It's about performances. I understand it. I'm a fan myself and when you see someone not playing well then it's something that you do as a fan to be unhappy or maybe get on their back. But when that player is playing well they'll support you.

"This has probably been one of my most consistent seasons to be honest. Looking back I can say I've enjoyed it and just want to finish it off well in the last couple of games.

"I think my performances overall have been really good this season and I've definitely seen and appreciated that support from everyone."

Please keep walkways clear

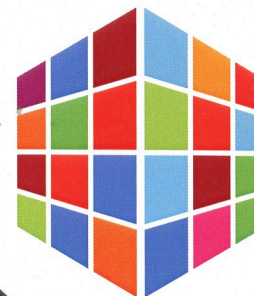
