

## OSAYI-SAMUEL COLLECTS EFL YOUNG PLAYER OF THE MONTH GONG

Blackpool's Bright Osayi-Samuel recently received the EFL Young Player of the Month award for March.

The winger, 19, has made more than 70 appearances for the club since making his debut against Birmingham City in 2015, including 40 this season.

In March he netted three goals in four matches, with two of them coming against Newport County in a 3-1 victory. The latter of those efforts also saw him pick up the club's Goal of the Season award on the weekend.


Nigerian born Osayi-Samuel, who moved to England when he was 10-years-old, was brought to Blackpool by current first-team coach Richie Kyle, who oversaw his progress in the youth team from the age of 16.

On winning the EFL Young Player of the Month award, he said: "It feels great. I don't win that many awards but I'm glad to win this one. Hopefully I can kick on from here."

Each season EFL Clubs invest more than £60m on identifying, training and educating the next generation of football talent. There are 8,500 young players between the ages of eight and 18 registered with EFL Clubs, making EFL Youth Development the largest centrally coordinated young player programme in world football.



## SKY BET LEAGUE TWO PLAY-OFF SEMI FINAL SECOND LEG TICKET DETAILS



Tickets for Blackpool's Sky Bet League Two play-off semi-final second leg at Luton Town are currently on sale to season ticket holders and members.

Tickets for the fixture, which takes place at 7.45pm on Thursday, are priced at:

- £23 for Adults
- £18 for Young Adults (18-21) and Seniors (Over-65)
- £15 for Golden Seniors (Over-75)
- £11 for Youths (10-17)
- £8 for Accompanied Under-10s

Disabled (non-wheelchair) supporters are charged one category lower than normal price, with a carer ticket issued free of charge, if required (higher/middle rate DLA).

Disabled supporters in wheelchairs are advised to contact Luton Town directly on 01582 416976.

Tickets will go on general sale and be available to purchase online from 9am tomorrow (Monday).

Supporters are also reminded that the club is offering a travel allowance to season ticket holders purchasing tickets for the second leg.

50 per cent of the cost of your match ticket (up to a maximum of £10) will be available to season ticket holders who buy their ticket from the ticket office or over the phone by calling 0844 847 1953 (option 3)\*

Bookings are also being taken on a supporters' coach to Kenilworth Road, with a place on it priced at £23 per person.

## INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN

**A fourth place finish in Sky Bet League Two ensured that Luton Town would face an away trip to Blackpool in the first of two play-off semi-final legs.**

The Hatters, having challenged the top seven spots consistently throughout the season, arrive at Bloomfield Road on the back of strong end to the 46-game league campaign.

A disappointing month of March set the club back in its hopes to seal promotion automatically, though Nathan Jones will be happy with the way his side has responded.

By now participating in the play-offs Luton will be aiming to banish a hoodoo that has seen the club unsuccessful in the last four attempts to achieve success via this format.

Given the club's final league position, however, The Hatters start out as

favourites in the four-team battle to reach League One.

26-goal striker Danny Hylton will no doubt continue to prove crucial to Luton's hopes, while Isaac Vassell and Jack Marriott are also in double figures having finished with a flourish in recent weeks.

The overall squad has a youthful look to it, with the visitors averaging the youngest side in the division based on league minutes.

Both clubs competing this evening will be aiming to give themselves enough of an advantage for the second leg, or at least a fighting chance of getting to Wembley.

The two fixtures in the regular season were edged by tonight's visitors, though it took a 90th minute winner to separate the sides last month.


## LUTON LOWDOWN




#### GOALKEEPER STUART MOORE




#### MIDFIELDER PELLY RUDDOCK



## FIRST LEG ADVANTAGE KEY

### SIMMONDS LOOKING FOR LUTON TO TAKE A LEAD HOME

**Luton News reporter Mike Simmonds believes Luton Town's confidence from recent results will see them take a lead to Kenilworth Road on Thursday and lift any potential nerves.**

The Hatters completed the season in fourth and in good shape for the play-offs, and they'll look to continue the feel-good factor by continuing their strong away form at Bloomfield Road.

Having covered Luton home and away this season, Simmonds is confident Luton can get off to a good start and head home with an advantage this evening.

**Mike, how much of a boost would a lead be for Luton heading into the second leg?**

They'll be positive away from home, their away record is good and they've won at Blackpool already. The home leg will be the bigger game because they tend to get nervy and they've

not been amazing at home in terms of results. I think the players know the tricky game is the home one so a win at Bloomfield Road would be a massive boost.

**How high is confidence in the Luton camp going into the play-offs?**

I'm confident because they've been playing much better recently. It's been the strong end to the season the manager had been asking for. Too many draws scuppered their hopes of automatic promotion really and they had a bad March, but beating Blackpool in April kick-started a good end to the season.

**Luton's strikers have come to the fore in Danny Hylton's absence, how beneficial has that been?**

A lot of the strikers have been scoring recently, with Danny Hylton out through suspension. Jack Marriott and Isaac Vassell have been scoring, and Ollie Palmer's been playing well

so there's confidence. Hylton will definitely come back in however, he's been the star player for them this season.

**How much of a blow will missing James Justin and potentially Alan Sheehan be?**

Alan Sheehan just rolled his ankle so there's definitely a chance he'll be available. I'd be surprised if James Justin was fit because he was stretchered off. He'll be a blow because he won Young Player of the Season, he's had an excellent year and has been in good form.

**Having finished fourth in the table, how much pressure does that add to Luton?**

I don't think the favourites tag will put them under too much pressure because Blackpool are a very decent side, and a big club. If they were playing Accrington or Morecambe there'd be even more pressure because they'd definitely be expected to win. They know they've beaten Blackpool twice this season but I don't think it will have any bearing on the actual matches because a lot more's at stake.

**What were your thoughts when Luton were drawn against Blackpool?**

Blackpool were one of the teams to avoid, coming in late on. They've got some good forward players so I don't know if they'd have preferred a different tie because Blackpool are the hardest team they could have got over two legs. Mark Cullen is ex Luton so he'll want to put one over on them a little bit. They've got good forward players and are an impressive team for this level.



## YOUTH TEAM

### MURPHY: DEVELOPING PLAYERS STILL THE MAIN AIM

**John Murphy** says the youth team's recent league and cup double is a fantastic achievement for the squad, though stressed that the overall aim is to still reach the first-team.

The 40-year-old has been part of the coaching team guiding the under-18s to success this season and is determined to see them develop further.

"It's a fantastic achievement for the players," Murphy said of winning the North West Youth Alliance and Lancashire FA Youth Cup. "Our job is not to win trophies, it's to develop players, but if you're winning trophies then you're doing something right. Hopefully these players will do well from that."

"The ultimate goal is for them to earn professional contracts and first-team appearances, really."

"We won one trophy the other week but this one feels better because it's the league, and most leagues are determined by the best team over eight months. We've played 28 games and managed to win it with our points, rather than goal difference as we thought it may be a few weeks ago."

Three players within the youth setup will now step up to the first-team next season having signed professional contracts. Goalkeeper Jack Sims, captain Caleb Richards and defender Denzel Williams will aim to bridge the gap into men's football and achieve their goals.



"It's great for them and obviously pleasing for us, but this is a very small step in anyone's career. You have two years and if you get a pro contract, you've really got to kick on because a lot of people still see under-18s as not playing men's football," Murphy admitted.

"They're now in the professional game where they could play someone who is 35, instead of someone who might be 15 or 16. They've got to grow up quickly."

Murphy, a former Blackpool striker, has been quite open in passing on his own experiences as a professional and hopes the players in question take the advice on board.

"I try to tell them about my experiences and what you need to, whether they choose to listen or not is down to them. It has to come from them. We've laid all the foundations and given them the advice. They need to do what's required to make it in this game."

### YOUTH TEAM ADD NORTH WEST YOUTH ALLIANCE TITLE TO LFA CUP SUCCESS

The youth team sealed the North West Youth Alliance league title in style with a 3-0 win against Morecambe last Saturday.

Will Dunne broke the deadlock in the first-half before a quick-fire double from Ben Jacobson and Ewan Bange, just after the interval, secured the win.

However, it wasn't all one-way traffic for Blackpool, with Jack Sims saving an early penalty whilst the score was 0-0.

The victory meant that the under-18s finished the league season two points ahead of second-placed Burnley.

Despite a late change to the starting line-up after Denzel Williams injured himself in the warm-up, The Seasiders dominated the early possession.

Shortly after the quarter-hour mark, The Seasiders suffered a scared as

Sebastien Des Pres was dispossessed and the midfielder gave away a penalty when trying to win the ball back.

Luke Fairclough stepped up to take the spot-kick but Jack Sims dived the right way and saved it.

At the other end, Bange poked the ball just wide of the post.

The deadlock was broken in the first-half after a cross was cleared as far as Dunne, who scored with a close-range volley.

Within minutes of the second half, The Tangerines scored twice in as many minutes.

Jacobson doubled the lead with a header at the back post, before Bange pounced on the rebound of Dylan

Sumner's shot to add gloss to the scoreline.

Fin Sinclair-Smith tested Ollie Jumeau with a low shot that the goalkeeper managed to parry behind his goal for a corner.

Shortly after, Dunne curled a shot just off target before Sinclair-Smith hit the side-netting with a volley.

Blackpool then hit the side-netting again, as Dunne volleyed just inches wide of the goal from Sinclair-Smith's cross.

As the final whistle blew, the celebrations started as the under-18s won the North West Youth Alliance League title for the first time since 2014.

# ADDED MOTIVATION

## TAYLOR DETERMINED TO SUCCEED IN PLAY-OFFS

**Skipper Andy Taylor is hoping to use his bleak play-off history as motivation as Blackpool look to cap an impressive season by achieving promotion come the end of May.**

The full-back has lost out in the play-offs with Sheffield United and Walsall previously, but is now hoping it's third time lucky as he attempts to guide Pool to Wembley.

The Seasiders face two legs with Luton Town and Taylor is relishing the opportunity to write personal wrongs, with promotion always alluding him to date.

"My experience isn't good in the play-offs and it haunts me," he admitted. "It's time to put that right now. Losing makes you even more determined to succeed."

"It always helps if you've been there and experienced these situations before. They're big, pressure games that, as a footballer, you want to be involved in."

"You've got to show patience. It's 180 minutes of football, which is a long, long time. You can't get too up or too down, throughout the semi-final there's always going to be twists and turns."

Taylor may have failed to earn promotion, but a glut of his team mates previously have, with the likes of Kelvin Mellor and Jamille Matt winning the League Two play-offs in recent years.

Mellor succeed with Crewe Alexandra in 2012, before Matt followed suit two years on with Fleetwood Town, and that

exact experience could prove invaluable, according to Taylor.

"Winning's a habit and if you get used to winning games you go in full of belief. We've got quite a few lads who've experienced the play-offs before and experienced winning promotion before."

"A lot of these lads have played in big games previously. The little ingredients will help us along the way in achieving our goal of winning the semis and final and getting promoted."

"As a footballer you want to be involved in these type of games, it's horrible when you get to the final few games of the season with nothing to play for, so everyone's buzzing," he said.

Onlookers may have doubted Blackpool's capabilities of finishing in the play-offs, with the club sat in 15th in February, but the noises in-camp remained a constant positive.

"Nobody in that dressing room doubted us. There may have been doubts elsewhere but we've never let it affect us. We've always been full of belief in what we have in that dressing room."

"We've done that and we've worked hard to be here, but we need to make sure we do part two and part three, which will see us promoted."

Taylor's goal against Leyton Orient helped set up this evening's Luton Town tie and the 31-year-old, being deployed as a wing-back, was happy to contribute with his second goal of the season.

On his goal, he said: "It's always nice to chip in with a goal, it doesn't happen often. It was a lovely little pass from 'Cully' (Mark Cullen) and it's about time he gave me one for a change," he joked.

Luton finished in fourth and will host the second-leg at Kenilworth Road on Thursday – something which doesn't faze the experienced Taylor.

"For me, it doesn't matter where you finish in the play-offs. It's a new, four-team competition. You've seen teams finish in any of the positions and win."


"Luton are a good team, they finished fourth in the league for a reason, but so are we, the past couple of months we've been playing really well and picking up good results."

The Seasiders have beaten five of the other six sides in the top seven of League Two, three of them away from home, and Taylor reveals his determination to add Luton to that list.

"We don't fear anyone in this league. We've beaten some of the so-called top teams in this division away from home and we know if we're at our best we've got a really good chance of winning the tie."

"It would be nice to take a lead to Luton but it's a long time 180 minutes and there's going to be a lot of twists and turns and we're excited to give it a good crack," he said.





Tom Aldred, Kelvin Mellor and Bright Osayi-Samuel claimed two awards apiece at the club's End of Season awards last Sunday.

Defender Aldred scooped the big prize on the night, being named the winner of the John Schofield Memorial Trophy as the fans' Player of the Season.

The 26-year-old pipped Brad Potts and Kelvin Mellor to the main accolade, though Mellor was voted Players' Player of the Season by his fellow professionals.

# Slocombe: Experience Counts

BLACKPOOL WELL EQUIPPED,  
SAYS GOALKEEPER

**S**am Slocombe says Blackpool can draw from plenty of dressing room experience when it comes to handling these two play-off matches against Luton Town.

The goalkeeper is one of several players at Bloomfield Road who has gone through the grind of a league campaign and been successful at the end of it.

The 28-year-old, promoted with Scunthorpe United and Oxford United, believes some clever recruitment from manager Gary Bowyer has ensured that the side is well positioned to deal with this situation.

"Anything can happen in the play-offs, and we've got a few players in the squad that have had experience of that, and I think that will stand us in good stead," said Slocombe, who is joined by the likes of Kelvin Mellor, Jamille Matt, Neil Danns and Ian Black in achieving career promotions.

"The manager brought in some good experience in January and even looking at the recruitment in the summer, it kind of appears that he's looked at players that have had promotion before and had to deal with those pressure situations. The make-up of the squad is fantastic, especially with the young talent at the club already."

Experience of knock-out football with Blackpool came earlier this season in the EFL Cup and Emirates FA Cup, with The Seasiders achieving victories against recently promoted League One side Bolton Wanderers and Championship outfit Barnsley.

From a defensive point of view, Slocombe has also played his part in the team keeping 15 clean sheets this season and conceding the fewest goals a Blackpool side has for many a year.

"One of the big things for me is that we've done it with a lot more players than I've had in the past," he admitted. "I think the season I went up with Scunthorpe we had maybe 20 clean sheets for the season and joint-most in the league, but we had the same two centre-halves and myself all season. I think the centre-halves missed one game each and the two full-backs near enough the same for 30 or 40 of the games."

That mean attitude at the back will be required in the play-off matches ahead, with Slocombe expecting tight affairs across the board.

"In those kind of big games it takes a little bit of magic to win it. Teams can be cautious and want to stay in the game. Over the two games if you can stay within touching distance, you give yourself a chance of getting to Wembley and then it's a one-off game and anything can happen."

"I think all four teams are coming into the play-offs with reasonably good form but all we'll do is concentrate on ourselves. The spirit within the squad's high and I'm hoping that over the two games we can give it a real, good go," he added.
