THE MANAGER



Good evening and welcome to Kenilworth Road for tonight's opening game in this season's Checktrade Trophy, against Tottenham Hotspur.

I'd like to welcome everybody making the short trip from north London – directors, officials, supporters, their Under-23 manager Wayne Burnett, his assistant Justin Cochrane and their players – and I hope they have a safe journey home after the game.

It's Tottenham's first foray into the competition and I'm sure their young players will gain a lot from the experience, as our own talented youngsters did last season.

As has been well-documented, we used the Checktrade matches to blood several of the youth players from the excellent academy here, and despite victories over Gillingham and West Brom in the group stage, we were fined by the EFL for doing so.

Thankfully the rules have been tweaked for this year to enable us to pick virtually who we want, which is important. We believe in giving talent an opportunity here at Kenilworth Road, regardless of age, and we'll utilise our full squad again this term.

We had a terrific run last season to reach the semi-final, and it was one of the biggest disappointments of my career when we lost to Oxford. So we'll always treat the competition with the utmost respect and aim to progress as far as we can, with a Wembley final the incentive.

Providing they suffered no adverse reaction to training, Danny Hylton and James Justin will get some much-needed game time tonight as they step up their return to full fitness. They are two big players for us and both, as you can imagine, have been chomping at the bit to get back on a pitch.

PERFORMANCE

We've had a mixed bag of results so far, from the exhilaration of the 8-2 win over Yeovil on the opening day, through the excellent performance against Championship opposition – despite exiting the Carabao Cup to Ipswich – to the disappointment of Saturday at Barnet when we never got any real fluency in our play.

Tonight presents the opportunity to get straight back on the bike before we return to league action on Saturday against Colchester. Please get behind the lads as you always do and enjoy the game – and we'll see you back here in four days' time.

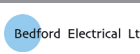

WELCOME TOTTENHAM HOTSPUR

Tonight we extend a warm welcome to Tottenham Hotspur, their staff, players and supporters as the Hatters kick off this season's Checkatrade Trophy competition at Kenilworth Road.

Spurs are one of four new entries to the competition this season among the 16 invited EPPP Category One academy sides, along with Manchester City, Newcastle and Fulham.

In the regionalised first round group stages, the north London club and ourselves will compete in Southern Group F with our Sky Bet League Two rivals Barnet and League One side AFC Wimbledon.

Like last season, the invited academy sides are predominantly Under-21 teams, with the selection criteria for them stating that 'six players from the starting 11 must be under the age of 21 as of 30th June 2017.'

That means that Tottenham could include some more recognised names than the talented prospects detailed on the next page, as was the case last term when West Brom arrived at the Kenny with first-team players Boaz Myhill, Jonas Olsson, Craig Gardner and Callum McManaman.

The Spurs side tonight are managed by their Under-23 coach Wayne Burnett, who was appointed this summer to take on the role previously held by former England defender Ugo Ehiogu, who passed away in tragic circumstances last April, aged 44.

Burnett, the 45-year-old former Leyton Orient, Plymouth, Huddersfield and Grimsby midfielder, began his

managerial career in Non-League football with Dulwich Hamlet, Fisher Athletic and Grays before becoming part of John Still's coaching staff at Dagenham & Redbridge.

Burnett succeeded Still as Daggers boss when the latter came to Kenilworth Road in 2013, and had a two-and-a-half year spell in the Victoria Road hot-seat until December 2015.

Alongside Burnett in the Spurs technical area is Justin Cochrane, the 35-year-old former Crewe, Rotherham and Yeovil midfielder who once scored for the Hatters reserve side against Stevenage in a 2006 trial!

Another relatively familiar face in the Spurs squad is striker Shayon Harrison, who played for Yeovil here in the quarter-final of this competition last season, when the Hatters won 5-2 to progress to the semi-final against Oxford United. Harrison scored seven times in

12 appearances for Tottenham's Under-23 side in Premier League 2 last season, as well as twice in five matches in the Under-19 UEFA Youth League – in which fixtures mirror the first team's in the Champions League – before his switch to Huish Park from January until the end of the season.

The Tottenham U23 side kicked their Premier League 2 season off last Friday night when they travelled to Sunderland, who came from a Kazaiah Sterling goal down to extend the Spurs youngsters' winless streak against the Black Cats to five matches, despite an inspired performance from goalkeeper Brandon Austin.

Although this is the first time the Hatters have faced a Tottenham academy side, Luton v Spurs matches date back to 1895 with the clubs meeting on 80 occasions. The Town have won 22 of those games, Tottenham 33 while 25 have finished all-square.

THE MAIN MEN

IN BETWEEN THE STICKS

ALFIE WHITEMAN



An England youth international goalkeeper who was born and bred in Tottenham. The 18-year-old joined the Tottenham

academy full-time in the summer of 2015 and has won international caps for England at all levels between Under-16 and U19, including being the first-choice keeper at the FIFA Under-17 World Cup two years ago. Last season first-team manager Mauricio Pochettino named Whiteman on the bench for the EFL Cup third round win over Gillingham, and he travelled with the senior squad on matchdays on a handful of occasions, as well as on the recent pre-season tour of the USA.

THE WALL

JADEN BROWN



Comfortable on the left side of a back four and developing his game as an attacking wing-back, 18-year-old Brown

can also fill in at centre-half when required. The Lewisham-born defender is another England youth international who was part of the national U16 squad that won the Montaigu Tournament in April 2015, and has gone on to be capped at U17 and U18 levels. As well as playing in the Under-18 Premier League and Under-19 UEFA Youth League last season, he made six appearances in Premier League 2 for Spurs' U23s, scoring twice. Also recently travelled on the first-team pre-season tour.

MAN IN THE MIDDLE

LUKE AMOS



Industrious central midfielder who experienced senior football for the first time last season, travelling

on Tottenham's pre and post-season tours, as well as being named on the bench for the EFL Cup fourth round trip to Liverpool. The 20-year-old former England Under-18 international spent the second half of last season on loan to League One club Southend United, making three appearances. He also started 14 games for Spurs' U23s in Premier League 2 last term, wearing the captain's armband on several occasions. Hailing from Welwyn Garden City, Amos normally plays in the holding role but can also play at full-back.

THE DANGERMAN

SHAYON HARRISON



Left-footed striker who has experience of twice playing against the Hatters last season while on loan at Yeovil,

including in this competition. One of the 20-year-old's five starts for the Glovers came at Kenilworth Road in the quarter-final, before appearing as a sub in our 4-0 win at Huish Park in March. The Hornsey-born forward scored one goal in his 16 appearances for the Somerset club, in a 3-3 draw with Exeter, but had already scored for Spurs' first team last pre-season in a 6-1 win over Inter Milan. Made his senior debut for the north Londoners as a sub at Liverpool in the EFL Cup.

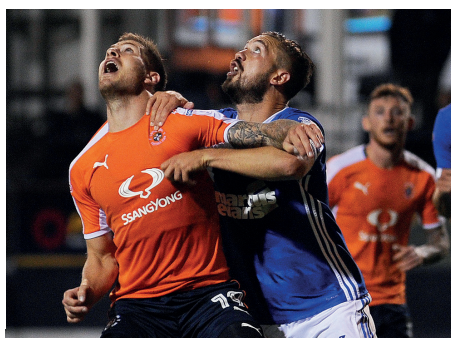

"There are still elements of naivety because they've got real Championship quality and David McGoldrick has been one hell of a player for a good while. That

THE MAIN MINUTES

- K0** Nathan Jones keeps the starting XI the same from the 8-2 win over Yeovil, one change on the bench though as new signing Harry Cornick takes Jack Senior's place.
- 17'** Fantastic save from Jamie Stephens in the Barnet goal. Sheehan's corner is met by Dan Potts who heads towards goal, but the keeper somehow manages to tip it onto the bar!
- 54'** Marek Stech is forced into a good save as he gets down low to his left to palm away Campbell-Ryce's deflected effort from 20 yards out for a corner. Sound reflexes from the Town stopper.
- 68'** Collins cuts in from the left of the Barnet box, dribbles in and smashes an effort across the face of goal with his left boot, that beat everyone – and the post. Very close from the striker.
- 90+1'** GOAL to Barnet. Substitute Jack Taylor receives the ball 22 yards from goal and curls it beyond Stech into the bottom right corner. 1-0 to the hosts.
- 90+4'** Sheehan delivers a corner from the left that sub Elliot Lee meets with a thumping header, tipped over by Stephens to prevent an equaliser.



JONES:

"We just didn't do the basics well enough. We didn't pass the ball well enough, we didn't cause them enough problems. We

didn't win our headers, we didn't win the second balls. We didn't get a foothold in the game. We didn't do it, we absolutely didn't do it. The pitch didn't help, it's a real sticky pitch. It wasn't conducive for a fluent game, but if we do the basics right, we get a draw."

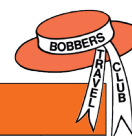
