


Luton certainly appear to have the support and pedigree to climb out of the division and were certainly amongst the pundits

The stadium itself is a testament to the beliefs of the chairman, Dale Vince, and features amongst others, a rainwater recycling system to feed both the facilities and the pitch, solar panels to power the whole stadium and even a computer powered robot mower for the pitch, don't tell Buzzer! WHO ARE YA?



MANAGER NATHAN JONES

WELSHMAN Jones was appointed as John Still's successor in January 2016. A former coach and assistant-manager at Brighton & Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town, he was a player at Kenilworth Road in 1995 but left without making an appearance. Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend,

Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances. The 44-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014. In March 2016 Jones signed a new three-and-a-half year contract with the Hatters to tie him to the club until 2020. His first full season in the hot-seat ended with

a fourth-placed finish and qualification for the League Two play-offs.



ASSISTANT MANAGER PAUL HART

THE vastly experienced Hart played at the highest level as a defender for Leeds United, Nottingham Forest and Sheffield Wednesday, among other clubs, before moving into management with Chesterfield in 1988. He has since bossed

Forest, Barnsley, Rushden & Diamonds, Portsmouth, Queens Park Rangers and Swindon, as well as working with great success at development level at several clubs, including Leeds and Charlton, where he first worked with Nathan Jones



in 2012-13. Named Hatters number two in May 2016.


DAN POTTS

Defender. Potts is predominantly a left-back whose aerial ability also makes him an option at centre-half. The 23-year-old joined the Hatters in summer 2015 from West Ham United, Whilst with the Hammers he also represented the USA at Under-20 level in 2011, before being selected for England Under-18, 19 and 20s.



GLEN REA

Highly-rated Republic of Ireland Under-21 international who can operate as a holding midfielder or centre-half. Rea joined the Hatters on loan from Championship club Brighton & Hove Albion in March 2016, making ten appearances, and signed permanently in June 2016.



SCOTT CUTHBERT

Capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back, Cuthbert signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2015 having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He has been capped at B level for Scotland and came through the youth ranks at Celtic, before moving south of the border.



JAMES SHEA

A goalkeeper who started in Arsenal's academy before his release in 2013. The 26-year-old continued to train with Wenger's squad, but returned to the League by signing for AFC Wimbledon in 2014. He helped the Dons to promotion from Sky Bet League Two in 2015-16, & made 43 appearances for them last term. Signed a one-year deal with the Hatters as a free agent in July 2017.




JOHNNY MULLINS

An experienced centre-half who started out at Reading, who then spent two years at both Mansfield and Stockport before joining Rotherham in the summer of 2010. He helped the Millers win promotion to League One in 2012-13, but left to sign for Oxford the following summer. He joined the Hatters after the U's gained promotion to League 1.



JUSTIN JAMES

A local born defender who first signed in as an Under 11 in 2005. Made his senior debut as a substitute against Exeter on the final day of the 2015-16 season and has gone onto make 39 first team appearances in 2016-17. He signed a new two-and-a-half-year contract in December 2016, and scored his first senior goal in the 4-1 win at Accrington.



MAREK STECH

A Czech Republic international – winning one cap in 2014 – the 27-year-old joined the Hatters in June 2017 from Sparta Prague. He started his career in his home country as a schoolboy with Sparta, before joining West Ham United at 16 and gaining experience on loan with clubs including Wycombe Wanderers and Yeovil Town.



JACK STACEY

A Reading youth product, who can operate at right back and in midfield. He had three loan spells, with Barnet, Carlisle United and Exeter City, but really found his feet with the Grecians last term.



LUKE GAMBIN

Maltese international who became Nathan Jones' second signing of the January 2017 transfer window when he moved from Barnet for an undisclosed fee. Gambin had been with the Bees since joining as an apprentice in 2009 and had made 136 appearances, scoring 15 times, while helping the club win the Conference title in 2014-15. He penned a two-and-a-half year contract with the Hatters, and he scored his first goal for the club in the 3-0 home win over Hartlepool in February.



LAWSON D'ATH

An attacking midfielder who joined the Hatters from Northampton Town in January in 2017. He started his career at Reading, but his League debut came during a loan spell playing alongside manager Nathan Jones at Yeovil Town in 2012. He joined Northampton in 2014 after various loan spells. He made almost a century of appearances in a two-and-a-half-year spell at Sixfields and won the League Two title in 2015-16 and made 13 appearances, during his first half-season with the Town.



OLLY LEE

Central midfielder Lee joined the club on an initial short-term deal, before quickly earning a contract to 2018. The brother of Town striker Elliot, Olly started on the books of West Ham. He had loan spells at Dagenham & Redbridge under former Hatters boss John Still, who brought him to Kenilworth Road, and one at Gillingham before signing for Barnet for 2012-13. He joined Birmingham City before the season was out, but was released by the Championship side in 2015 after a spell on loan in League Two with Plymouth.



JORDAN COOK

A former Sunderland youngster who penned a two-year contract in 2016 having turned down the offer of a new deal at Walsall. Cook first worked with Town boss Nathan Jones at Charlton, and after spending two years at Walsall in League One, he jumped at the chance to be reunited with his old coach last summer, making 42 appearances and scoring four goals in his first campaign at Kenilworth Road.




ALAN SHEEHAN

A Cultured defender who joined the Hatters on loan from Bradford City in January 2016, becoming Nathan Jones' first signing after taking over as manager. After 2 spells at Notts County Sheehan also counts Leeds United and Swindon Town among his former employers, as well as loans with Mansfield, Crewe, Oldham and Peterborough United, after starting out at Leicester City.



ANDREW SHINNIE

Signed on a season-long loan from Championship side Birmingham City. He adds a fair amount of experience to midfield, having played over 200 first team games across the top three tiers in Scotland as well as the English second tier with spells at Rangers, Inverness, Dundee, Birmingham, Rotherham & Hibs.



AKIN FAMEWO

A powerful central defender who signed his first pro contract in July 2016. Injury restricted his progress last season but the teenager finished the campaign with six first-team appearances.



PELLY RUDDOCK-MPANZU

A former West Ham United academy graduate was an instant hit when signed on-loan by then-boss John midway through the Conference title winning campaign of 2013-14, scoring a memorable goal in crucial win at Dartford. Able to play in central defence, midfield, on the wing or even up front he is a real crowd favourite and he passed the 100-game mark for the Hatters during 2016-17.



DANNY HYLTON

A London-born forward who joined Luton last summer from Oxford United. He started his career with Aldershot Town before joining Rotherham United in 2013. He played just one game for the then-League One club, however, and was loaned out to Bury and AFC Wimbledon prior to his move to Oxford two years ago, where he hit 30 goals in 84 starts.



JAMES COLLINS

The Coventry-born former Republic of Ireland U21 international has won promotion three times from League Two; twice with Shrewsbury and once during his loan at Northampton Town in 2016 and has netted over 100 career goals. He joined the Hatters this summer from Crawley Town for an undisclosed fee, having scored 22 times last season.



ELLIOT LEE

Brother of current Town midfielder Olly and son of ex-England and Newcastle United midfielder Rob, Elliot Lee is in his second spell at the club and he joined the Hatters in July 2017 on a two-year deal. Whilst at West Ham, the forward had loan spells with Colchester United, Southend United and Blackpool, before leaving in 2016 to join Barnsley. Having found game time limited at Oakwell, making just six appearances,




ALAN MCCORMACK

The 33-year-old defensive midfielder joined the Hatters officially on 1st July 2017, after his contract expired with Sky Bet Championship side Brentford. With a number of promotions to his name, including from League Two with Swindon Town and League One with the Bees, The Irishman has proven his versatility over the years with the likes of Southend and Charlton, playing in both midfield and at right-back.



JOSH MCQUOID

Attacker McQuoid arrived at Kenilworth Road in 2015 from Bournemouth. That was the forward's second spell at the Dean Court club either side of a stint at Millwall. The 27-year-old hit five goals in 33 appearances in his first season with the Town, and netted twice in eight appearances during 2016-17 before finishing the campaign on loan at Stevenage.





The game was end to end with both defences looking vulnerable and Liam Nolan came close to giving Stanley the lead on 29, when his thunderbolt hit the underside of the bar, then the back of the diving Flinders before bouncing away from goal.

Cheltenham should have taken the lead when, after a slick free kick routine,



Graham fired over from close range with only Chapman to beat.

It was the visitors who took the lead when a bouncing ball in the box was not dealt with by either Forbes or Chapman and Eisa hooked the ball over the Stanley keeper and into the empty net.

Two minutes later with 39 on the clock Kayden Jackson raced onto Jordan Clark's through ball and fired across Flinders and into the far corner in front of a delighted

Clayton End.

Unfortunately the home striker only lasted 10 minutes of the second half before hobbling off to be replaced by Mallik Wilks and despite all efforts the game petered out into a stalemate.

Neither keeper were unduly troubled until Aaron Chapman had to make two fine saves late on, tipping over a deflected effort from Sellars and then keeping out a Hinds effort as time ran out for both sides.



TWO goals from Billy Kee, ensured Stanley returned North with 3 points against a struggling Port Vale. The Reds started brightly with plenty of possession but unfortunately they were unable to create any meaningful openings and the first effort came from the home side.

On 11 minutes a corner ran kindly for Whitfield but his effort on the turn came back off the bar with Aaron Chapman beaten.

The keeper was troubled again, eight minutes later, when Barnett climbed high but his looping header bounced off the top of the crossbar with Chapman right behind it.

The home side's pressure paid off when they took the lead on 22, when Barnett released former Stanley loanee, David Worrall, into the box and he easily placed his shot beyond a static Chapman and into the far

corner to record his first goal for the Valiants.

Stanley continued to play neat passing football with no significant outcomes until, with 36 played, when Kayden Jackson latched onto Chapman's long clearance, his effort was blocked but fell kindly to Billy Kee who swept home from the edge of the box to register with Stanley's first effort on target of the half.

Stanley started the second half buoyed by the goal but suffered a setback when Kayden Jackson again had to be replaced by Mallik Wilks when obviously struggling with injury.. Once again the home side had the first effort on target as a low cross from

the left was met by Pope but his effort was saved by the legs of Chapman at close quarters.

Stanley gained the lead on 62, when a right wing McConville corner was partially cleared and found its way out to Mark Hughes way out on the Stanley left, he swung a super cross back into the home box, which evaded everyone apart from McConville who squared the ball back across the box from near the by line for Billy Kee to tap home from close range, right in front of the travelling Stanley fans.

The home side immediately made changes but despite all efforts failed to really test Chapman which was testament to the endeavours of the side and particularly the imperious Hughes as they dealt with all that was thrown at them. A couple of late corners caused panic in the Reds defence but they held out to record another welcome victory. A solid if unspectacular performance.





JORDAN THORPE



“WE ARE EXPECTING ANOTHER TOUGH TEST AGAINST LUTON BUT WE ARE CONFIDENT IN OUR ABILITY AS A SIDE TO TAKE ANOTHER POSITIVE RESULT AWAY.”

JORDAN Thorniley arrived at Stanley in August, looking to cement a first team place for the first time.

The 20-year-old on-loan from Championship side Sheffield Wednesday in August is thrilled with his first taste of Football League action with the Reds so far.

The Warrington-born defender is a product of the Everton Academy, making his way through the ranks up to the Under 23 squad, before moving to Hillsborough in search of regular football.

He came through at Everton alongside current first team regulars, Tom Davies and Jonjoe Kenny and the same side that featured rising star Ryan Ledson who was tipped for greatness by Roberto Martinez, before joining Oxford United on a permanent deal.

Thorniley now hopes to carve out a similar career to his former teammate.

“It’s crazy to see lads like Davo [Tom Davies] and Jonjoe [Kenny] playing in the first team at Everton.

“I enjoyed my time there but I have no regrets in my career, I moved to Sheffield Wednesday last summer and now I’ve got a great opportunity here at Accrington.

“Ryan Ledson went down a similar path to the one I have and he’s making a real name for himself now in League

One, it would be great to work my way back up like he has.”

Thorniley insists that the Reds flying start to the season has been no surprise to him.

“No I’m not surprised by our start to the season,” he said. “Nobody in the dressing room is because we’ve got a really good squad here, we play football the right way and with the players we have that can only bring good results.

“I’m enjoying it here, we’ve played some good football against some good sides, it’s a really physical league and I’ve enjoyed that challenge, I think it can only help me get better.”

Thorniley, a centre-half by trade, has made the Stanley left-back position his own since arriving from the Owls – and the former-Everton academy man is happy to help his new teammates out wherever he can.

“This has been my first real taste of playing left-back,” he said. “I played there a couple of times during my scholarship days at Everton but in competitive football it’s a new experience.

“It’s physically much more demanding but I’m happy to do a job wherever the gaffer wants me to play, I’m learning more with every game that I play. “On a personal level I think that my understanding of the game and game

management has really improved since I arrived, knowing when to play it short, when to go long, making decisions in a much quicker-paced situation than I’ve been used to.”

After missing out on the matchday squad against Cheltenham last month, Thorniley returned to the side that beat Port Vale and has been a mainstay ever since.

The defender has praised the effort of his teammates recording back-to-back away league wins for the first time this season.

“We’ve had a couple of hard earned away victories,” he added. “We all had to dig-in together, everybody put a shift in and if you do that you will get what you deserve.

“Obviously the pitch at Port Vale was massive and I could really feel it in the last 20 minutes, we were hanging on but I think that was the most rewarding win we’ve had since I’ve been here.

“You expect struggling teams with a point to prove to maybe come flying out at the start, but I think at Chesterfield and Port Vale we dominated the early stages, it just takes one decision or one chance for them to get their tails-up and believe they have a chance.

“We are expecting another tough test against Luton but we are confident in our ability as a side to take another positive result away.”

A comedy of errors gifted Luton a second when Beckles headed back to Rodak and it looped over the keeper and into the net four minutes into the second half.



HIT THE ROAD, ACC

AFTER AN INCONSISTENT RUN OF FORM, STANLEY WERE TRAVELLING TO YET ANOTHER LOWLY LEAGUE 2 SIDE IN PORT VALE. STANLEY REALLY NEED TO DIG DEEP TODAY, AS DO I IF I'M TO MAKE IT TO THE GROUND ON TIME.

FITNESS DIFFICULTIES

16.00 - Due to the wisdom of the University of Central Lancashire I am only on campus for two hours between 4 and 6, meaning it really is in the balance for whether I can make it to Vale Park or not.

18.00 - I'm making my way to Preston station in hope my first train is on time, any delays, and its curtains for me, I will have no hope in getting down to Staffordshire then.

18.17 - Leg 1 of the journey has begun, Preston to Crewe is the first train journey. Looking at the train times beforehand I'm aware that I only have a 10-minute leeway to change at Crewe. Luckily it is only 3 stops away from Preston and I doubt I'll encounter any trouble.

18.58 - Richard Branson has got me to Crewe on time and for that I am forever indebted to him. Now comes a quick check to see if the second train is running as it should.

A quick glance to the arrivals board is a welcome sight, the two-carriage train is pulling in and I have 10 mins to spare. Beautiful.

19.27 - I can't quite believe I've managed to arrive at Longport station without being delayed. It's a miracle I've got this far bearing in mind I only left Preston just over an hour ago. Unfortunately, the hardest part of the journey is now to come, I have a near 2-mile journey left, and it will have to be on foot. Luckily, I have my running shoes on.

19.38 - Google maps is telling me I have just over half a mile left to go, I've run all the way so far and due to the vast majority of the roads being uphill and me being an unfit asthmatic who's carrying a heavy backpack, I have no choice to but to slow the pace down.

It really looks like I've failed in my bid to arrive on time, which I always knew was a longshot. However, I have a

final trick up my sleeve as I see a smattering of taxis parked up across the road. What have I got to lose? (apart from the ability to breathe)

19.43 - The driver pulls up near to the away stand in Burslem, I have just enough air left inside me to make a dash to the ticket office and then to the away turnstiles, all the staff were very helpful in getting me into the ground quickly and I can't thank them enough for that. All will be revealed soon regarding whether the match has kicked off.

19.44 - As I burst through a set of doors leading into the away stand from the concourse I am a hot sweaty panting mess. Nevertheless, 5 seconds later the match kicks off, I'm astounded I've managed to get here if I'm honest. I fully expected to be forced to travel home from Crewe due to train issues or something along those lines. Anyway, now I'm here, this better be good.

VISION DIFFICULTIES

19.50 - This is my first ever trip to Port Vale and don't get me wrong, the stadium is definitely of a higher standard than League 2. But, I've never seen a pitch look more like a square than here, it's wider than Adebayo Akinfenwa's waistline. Anyhow, both teams are off to a steady start as I try and look for a pair of binoculars to see the other end of the pitch.

20.04 - Stanley are under serious pressure at the moment, Barnett and Whitfield and have already hit the bar as Vale pile on sustained pressure, I'm not sure how much longer we can hold out here.

20.07 - I didn't want to be proven right reds! Vale take the lead with a lovely goal as Barnett cheekily flicks the ball to Worrall who runs into the box and curls the ball into the far corner of the net. Vale take a deserved lead, let's hope our lads can bounce back from this setback.

20.21 - We needed a moment of magic to get us back in this match, step forward Billy Kee. The dangerman pounces on a loose ball and drill into the bottom corner of the home side's net. It took us all in the away stand a few seconds to realise it had gone in. We were so far away from the action and had to rely on the celebration of our players to understand we'd levelled things up. Get in there lads.

20.32 - Half time beckons

and Stanley go back into the dressing room a bit lucky to be level in all honesty, although Billy Kee has the ability to step up for our club when we are in difficulties as he proved once again. Hopefully, we're given an improved second half performance in order to come home with all 3 points. I didn't come close to collapsing for a draw.

20.48 - The second half begins with the Reds shooting towards their own supporters. No changes at half time and we seem to be playing with a bit more vigour in these early stages since the interval.

21.05 - It's that man again, it just had to be. Hughes crosses into the back post where McConville cleverly plays the ball back across the goal. What next? Billy buries the ball into the empty net. As if there was any doubt he was ever going to miss that, the man is just a machine. Stanley lead 2-1 after a very encouraging start to the half.

21.34 - Stanley are heroically holding out here as they clear wave after wave of Vale pressure. They'll have 3 more minutes of added time to

withstand. I want to put my hands over my eyes but it wouldn't make any difference to what I can see as the action is at the far end of the pitch.

21.39 - Goalkeeper Roos goes up for one last Vale corner, it's cleared away and there goes the final whistle. The Reds made hard work of that but were clinical when they ventured forward. We keep the promotion push well on track.

HEART DIFFICULTIES

21.50 - Luckily, there is a spare seat or two on the OASSC coach and I manage to secure one for the way home. Everyone is in a joyous mood; a win is a win however it comes. Although, a tight win is not good for the nerves in the slightest.

23.30 - We're home safe and sound and another successful away trip comes to an end. It wasn't the prettiest of football matches but Stanley found a way to come back with all 3 points. Next up is another meaty away trip on Saturday to Forest Green Rovers.



Stevenage railway station is about one mile from the Stadium and there is an arriva bus shuttle service costing £1 return. The journey from Accrington takes 4hr 1 mins and involves a change at Leeds. There is a return that departs at 21.57, again changes at Leeds but gets back to Accrington 07.14 the following morning!



Approximate return cost £74.15.

DISABLED SUPPORTERS:
Disabled / wheelchair users are housed in the North Terrace disabled enclosure and tickets can be booked on 01438 223223. There are just 12 places available and the area is shared with home supporters and in front of the home North terrace. Tickets are priced as per the relevant age prices with a free carer.

There is the Broadhall suite on site, see Food & drink.

Otherwise there is not much in the way of pubs close to the ground. There is the Roebuck Inn on London Road which is about 10 minutes walk away from the away end. It's a real ale pub and a Best Western Hotel. Across the roundabout from the ground is a retail park, Roaring Meg, with a Harvester restaurant as well as McDonalds, Pizza Hut & Burger King.

CLUB SHOP
The club shop for all things Stevenage is situated in the West stand and is open from noon to 19.45. for evening fixtures.



Please keep walkways clear




