THE MANAGER



Good evening and welcome to Kenilworth Road for tonight's Checkatrade Trophy second round tie against West Ham United Under-21s.

I'd like to welcome everybody making
the short trip from east London –
directors, officials, supporters, their
manager Terry Westley, his staff and
their players – and I hope they have a
safe journey home after the game.

We saw when Spurs came here
in August that the Category One
academy sides can offer a lot to this
competition. That was an excellent
game featuring some of this country's
exciting young talent – on both sides,
I should point out – and thankfully
we came out on top in the penalty
shoot-out that gave us one of the
bonus points to bring us through to
this stage.

We secured our passage through
to the knockout stages, and home
advantage as group winners, with
another terrific performance against
an AFC Wimbledon side featuring
several players with vast higher level
experience five weeks ago.

Although it looked like we'd be facing
Swindon, I went to watch West
Ham's game at Wycombe last week
to cover all bases and it's good that
I did as Wycombe took the game
very seriously and came out winners,
which meant we'd be facing West
Ham after they finished second in
the group.

As has consistently been the case
in the Checkatrade Trophy, we'll use
the match to give some valuable
experience to some younger players
and game time to others who maybe
haven't played as much recently, but
our team will be a strong one taking
into account the games we've got
either side of it.

On Sunday we had a tough FA
Cup trip to Gateshead, where we
produced a thoroughly professional
performance to win 5-0 and book
a place in the third round, and this
Saturday we have a top-of-the-table
clash with Notts County, so we didn't
want to disrupt a busy, important few
days by rescheduling this match for
any later in the week.

We always treat the competition
with the utmost respect and like
to think we've provided a glowing
endorsement for the Trophy since
it has taken on its current form,
reaching the semi-finals last year and
qualifying for the knockout stages
again this time around.

Hopefully tonight will be another fine
advert for the competition.

Enjoy the game.

WELCOME WEST HAM U21S

The Hatters would like to extend a warm welcome this evening to the visiting players, staff, officials and supporters of West Ham United.

The Hammers' Under-21 side have progressed to this stage of the Checkatrade Trophy by finishing second in Southern Group C, behind our Sky Bet League Two rivals Swindon Town on goal difference after their 2-0 defeat at Wycombe Wanderers last Tuesday.

West Ham had already qualified for the second round by beating the Robins 3-2 at the County Ground in mid-August, before recording a 3-1 victory at League One Bristol Rovers on 31st October.

They are one of just four of the EPPP Category One academy sides – Leicester City, Swansea City and Chelsea being the others – to make it through to the knockout stages from the 16 clubs who were invited to enter this season's competition.

The visitors tonight are under the management of former Hatters boss

Terry Westley



Terry Westley, who replaced David Pleat in the Kenilworth Road hot-seat in the summer of 1995 and oversaw a 16th place finish in Division One (now Championship) in his only full season in charge.

The 58-year-old has been academy director at West Ham since 2014, and despite the loss at Adams Park last Tuesday, he spoke of his pride at steering the Hammers youngsters through to this stage after failing to make it out of their group last term.

"We have to be positive to start with – we have gone through," he said. "Setting the stall out at the start of the season, you ask 'can you go a step further than last year and qualify through the groups?'. So it's a really good achievement, we must not forget that. To be one of four U21 teams to go through to the last-32 is a big achievement for the players at the club."

MEET THE VISITORS

MANAGER: TERRY WESTLEY

NATHAN TROTT

Trott is now the Club's third-choice goalkeeper, and is the U23s' No1. The stopper is a gifted England U20 international who is as good with the ball at his feet as in his hands.

RICHARD MATEVICS

Giant goalkeeper Matrevics is the U23s' current backup stopper. The 6ft 7in teenager is also a Latvia U19 international.

JOSH PASK

Experienced Academy defender Pask joined West Ham in June 2006. The centre-back enjoyed a successful loan spell at Gillingham in League One in 2016/17.

ALEX PIKE

Right-back Pike has established himself as a key player for the U23s during the last few seasons, and went on loan to Cheltenham Town in 2017.

VASHON NEUFVILLE

Full-back Neufville is an exciting prospect who represented England at U16 and U17 level. The left-sider first broke into the U23 side in 2015.

TUNJI AKINOLA

Centre-back Akinola has been with the club since he was eight. The defender is now a regular for the U23 side.

REECE HANNAM

Left-back who has been with the club since he was nine. He made his competitive debut for the U23s at West Brom in 2017.

AJIBOLA ALESE

Centre-back Alese made his U23 debut against Everton in the opening

league game of 2017/18. He joined the club as an eight-year-old.

DECLAN RICE

A centre-back or defensive midfielder, the Republic of Ireland U21 international made his Premier League debut at Burnley in the final game of last season, before starting at Manchester United in this term's opener.

MOSES MAKASI

The U23s' captain, Makasi is the longest-serving player in the academy. The midfielder was on the bench for the senior team twice in 2016/17.

DOMINGOS QUINA

Quina joined the Hammers prior to the 2016/17 season. The exciting midfielder made his first team debut in the Europa League in 2016 and is a Portugal U20 international.

MARTIN SAMUELSEN

Full Norway international Samuelsen traded Manchester City for the Hammers in 2015. The tricky winger scored his first senior goal for his country against San Marino in October 2016.

GRADY DIANGANA

Tricky winger Diangana has been a Hammer since he was ten and has been a regular in the U23 squad for the last couple of seasons.

DAN KEMP

Kemp left Chelsea for West Ham in November 2015 and has excelled in east London. The winger is now an England U19 international and Toulon Tournament winner.

JOE POWELL

Winger Powell joined the Hammers aged eight. After a great run of form for the U18s, he began to feature for the U23s in during the second half of last season.

ANTHONY SCULLY

Scully is a highly-rated midfielder who first signed for the Hammers in May 2011. He has earned international recognition, representing the Republic of Ireland up to U20 level.

Republic of Ireland youth international Coventry recently signed his first professional contract with the Club in 2017. The midfielder plays for his country's U17s.

ALFIE LEWIS

Lewis penned his first professional contract in the summer of 2017. A dictator at the heart of the midfield, the teenager has made a number of appearances for the U23s.

SEAD HAKSABANOVIC

Montenegro attacking midfielder, 18, who joined the Hammers in August 2017 on a five-year contract for an undisclosed fee from Swedish club Halmstads BK. Made his senior international debut in May.

TONI MARTINEZ

Forward Martinez moved to London in the summer of 2016, joining from Spanish giants Valencia. The striker was the U23 squad's top scorer in the 2016/17 campaign.

KORREY HENRY

One of the U18s' key players, Henry is a powerful player who can play anywhere across midfield or attack. Signed for West Ham in April 2011.




