LUTON TOWN



The Hatters are flying high at the top of the Sky Bet League Two table and they are certainly the team to beat this season as we approach 2018.

Managed by talented young coach Nathan Jones, Luton have been almost unstoppable so far this term as they've swept aside all before them to take their place at the summit. The tone was set on the opening day as they cruised to hugely impressive 8-2 victory over Yeovil Town, while they have put seven past Cambridge United and Stevenage and four past Exeter City.

Luton boast a squad packed to the brim with experience and quality and their efforts this season have been spearheaded by Danny Hylton, who leads the league in scoring with thirteen goals. The frontman is a proven performer at

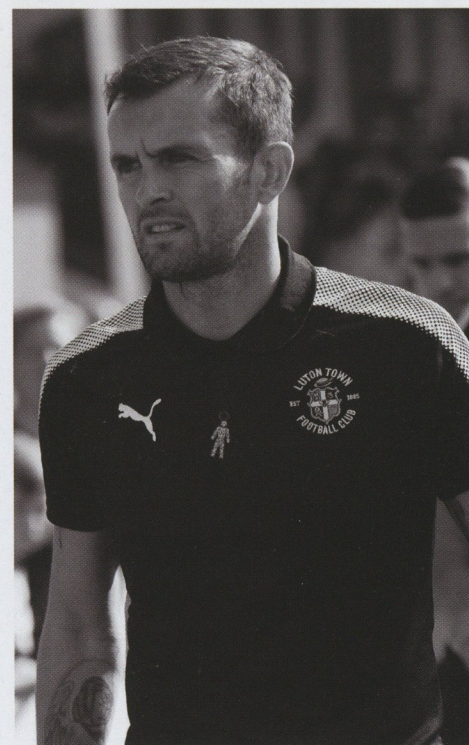
this level and his current fine form will be crucial to the Hatters' hopes of clinching promotion come May.

Town also have plenty of talent in other areas too with the likes of James Collins, Alan McCormack and Alan Sheehan amongst their ranks - all well known to Swindon fans of course. Marek Stech is arguably one of the best goalkeepers in the division and Scott Cuthbert forms part of a stingy defence. Olly Lee and Luke Berry provide plenty of style in the middle of the park and there is plenty of strength in depth too.

However, Dave Flitcroft's side got the better of Luton when they met earlier this season with goals from Luke Norris, Chris Hussey and Paul Mullin sealing a comfortable 3-0 victory for the Reds at Kenilworth Road.

HEAD COACH NATHAN JONES

Jones was appointed as John Still's successor as the new Manager of Luton Town in January 2016.

A former coach and assistant-manager at Brighton & Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town, he was a player at Kenilworth Road in 1995 but left without making an appearance. Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances.

The 44-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014. In March 2016 Jones signed a new three-and-a-half year contract with the Hatters to tie him to the club until 2020.

His first full season in the hot-seat ended with a fourth-placed finish and qualification for the League Two play-offs. Jones passed 100 games in charge of the Hatters in October 2017 - the same month in which he picked up his first Sky Bet League Two Manager of the Month award.

Jones has forged an exciting side at Kenilworth Road with his team flying high at the top of League Two this term after producing some scintillating displays, putting eight goals past Yeovil and seven past Cambridge United. With an array of lower-league stars at his disposal, Jones looks a good bet to finally be the man to lead Luton back to the third tier of English football.

MAREK STECH

A Czech Republic international – winning one cap in 2014 – the 27-year-old joined the Hatters in June 2017 from Sparta Prague. He started his career in his home country as a schoolboy with Sparta, before joining West Ham United at 16 and gaining experience on loan with clubs including Wycombe Wanderers and Yeovil Town. The 6ft 5ins stopper earned cult hero status in Somerset after signing permanently in 2012, helping the Glovers to promotion to the Championship for the first time in the club's history before leaving following their immediate relegation in the summer of 2014 to play in the Europa League with Sparta. Also has 12 Under-21 caps to his name.

ALAN SHEEHAN

Cultured defender Sheehan, and another ex-Town player on the books of Luton, joined the Hatters on loan from Bradford City in January 2016, becoming Nathan Jones' first signing after taking over as manager. The Irishman made 20 appearances and captained the team for the final seven matches of 2015-16 after Scott Cuthbert suffered a season-ending injury. The left-footer can operate at either full-back or in central defence, and has made over 300 appearances in his career so far with the majority coming during two spells with Notts County. Sheehan also counts Leeds United and Swindon Town among his former employers, as well as loans with Mansfield, Crewe, Oldham and Peterborough United, after starting out at Leicester City. He signed a permanent deal with the Town in May 2016 and made 41 appearances in his first full season, including his 50th in a Luton shirt in a 0-0 draw at Carlisle. He has four goals to his name for Luton, including three stunning free-kicks that were all nominated for 2016-17 goal of the season.

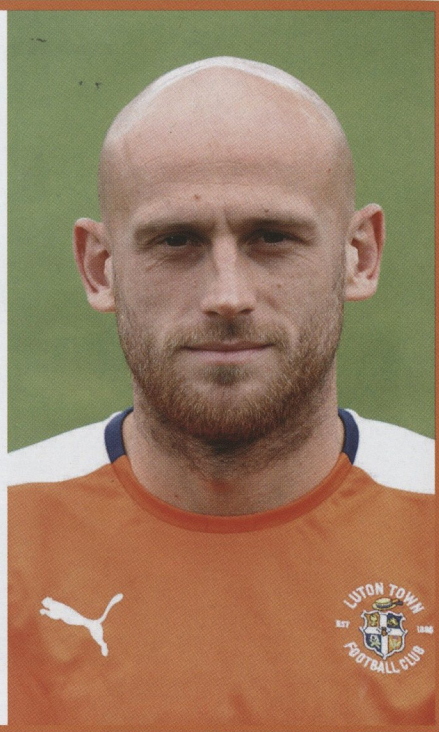
DAN POTTS

Potts is predominantly a left-back whose aerial ability also makes him an option at centre-half. The 23-year-old joined the Hatters in the summer of 2015 from West Ham United, where he made 13 appearances after being handed his debut in a Championship win over Barnsley in December 2011. Whilst with the Hammers he also represented the USA at Under-20 level in 2011, before being selected for England at Under-18, 19 and 20s level. Potts gained valuable Football League experience on loan at Colchester and Portsmouth before agreeing a two-year deal with the Town. After making 44 appearances in his first two seasons with the Hatters, he signed a new one-year deal in the summer of 2017 and started the new campaign in fine style, netting five times by mid-November after only opening his account for the club in play-off semi-final at Blackpool the previous May.

SCOTT CUTHBERT

Capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back, Cuthbert signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2015 having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He helped the O's reach the League One Play-Off Final the season before last, and prior to that his influential performances enabled Swindon to do the same. He has been capped at B level for Scotland and came through the youth ranks at Celtic, before moving south of the border to SN1. Made 40 appearances in his first season at Kenilworth Road, and took over the captaincy when Steve McNulty left for Tranmere in October 2015. The club captain activated a clause in his contract to extend his stay at Kenilworth Road until the summer of 2018 after making his 50th start against Carlisle United in December 2016.

JACK STACEY

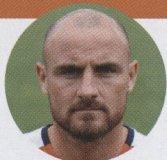
A Reading youth product, the 21-year-old – who can operate at right back and in midfield – played six times for the Royals in the Championship. Between 2015 and 2017, he had three loan spells, with Barnet, Carlisle United and Exeter City, but really found his feet with the Grecians last term. A full season at St James Park saw him flourish as he made 38 appearances as well as scoring a fantastic late winner in Paul Tisdale's side's 6-5 aggregate win over the Cumbrians in the League Two Play-Off Semi-Final. He then started in the Wembley final, which they lost 2-1 to Blackpool. Joined the Hatters on a two-year contract after Town agreed terms with the Madejski Stadium outfit.

ALAN McCORMACK

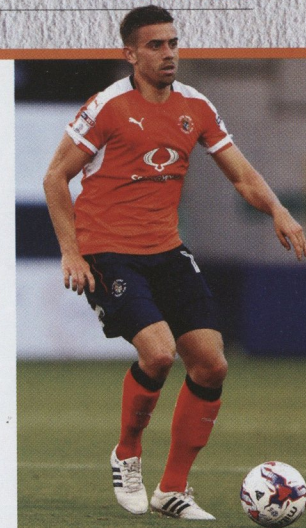
The 33-year-old defensive midfielder joined the Hatters officially on 1st July 2017, after his contract expired with Sky Bet Championship side Brentford. With a number of promotions to his name, including from League Two with Swindon Town and League One with the Bees, McCormack's arrival was a signal of intent for what Nathan Jones aims to achieve in the 2017/18 season. The Irishman has proven his versatility over the years with the likes of Southend and Charlton, playing in both midfield and at right-back while amassing over 450 career appearances before signing for the Hatters.

OLLY LEE

Central midfielder Lee joined the club on an initial short-term deal in August 2015, before quickly earning a contract to 2017 which was then extended to the summer of 2018 at the end of an impressive first campaign with the Hatters. Like his brother – Town striker Elliot – Olly started on the books of West Ham. He had two loan spells at Dagenham & Redbridge under former Hatters boss John Still, who brought him to Kenilworth Road, and one at Gillingham before signing for Barnet for 2012-13. He joined Birmingham City before the season was out, but was released by the Championship side in 2015 after a spell on loan in League Two with Plymouth. By the end of 2016-17, Lee had made 80 appearances in a Town shirt, scoring four times. Lee made the headlines in November 2017 with his 70-yard strike in the 7-0 win over Cambridge.

LUKE BERRY

The midfielder joined the Town on a three-year deal for an undisclosed fee from Sky Bet League Two rivals Cambridge United in August 2017.

One of the top scoring midfielders in the division in recent seasons, the 25-year-old netted 22 times in 2016-17 for the club with whom he started his career.

Berry made his professional debut in 2010 and went on to play 135 times for the Cambs Glass Stadium outfit before departing for then-League One side Barnsley in 2014.

After one season with the Tykes, he returned to Cambridge, where he made a further 105 times – scoring 35 goals – before becoming Nathan Jones' tenth signing of the summer transfer window.

DANNY HYLTON

Arguably Luton's star man so far this season, the London-born forward joined Town last summer alongside Oxford United team-mate Johnny Mullins, after the pair had helped the U's to promotion to League One and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final. Hylton started his career with Aldershot Town, where he made over 200 appearances in the Conference and League Two before joining Rotherham United in 2013. He played just one game for the then-League One club, however, and was loaned out to Bury and AFC Wimbledon prior to his move to Oxford two years ago. While at the Kassam Stadium Hylton hit 30 goals in 84 starts, but turned down the offer of a new contract in order to pen a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. The club's top scorer last season with 27 goals, having passed his previous season's best tally of 16 in January, Hylton came in the top three shortlisted for the EFL League Two Player of the Year award as voted by managers in the division, and was also named in the PFA Team of the Season for the division and won four club Player of the Year accolades in a memorable campaign. Has thirteen goals to his name so far this term.

JAMES COLLINS

Having netted over 100 career goals – most of which have come in the fourth tier – Collins adds even more firepower to the Town frontline, after signing in June 2017 for an undisclosed fee from Crawley Town on a three-year contract. Since leaving Aston Villa, the 26-year-old pursued a career in the lower leagues, going onto score regularly for the likes of Shrewsbury Town, Swindon Town and the Red Devils. A season in the Scottish Premiership with Hibernian didn't prove as fruitful as planned in the 2013-14 season, but he netted 54 goals upon his return to England before signing for Luton, including 22 last term for Crawley. The Coventry-born former Republic of Ireland U21 international has won promotion three times from League Two; twice with Shrewsbury and once during his loan at Northampton Town in 2016.

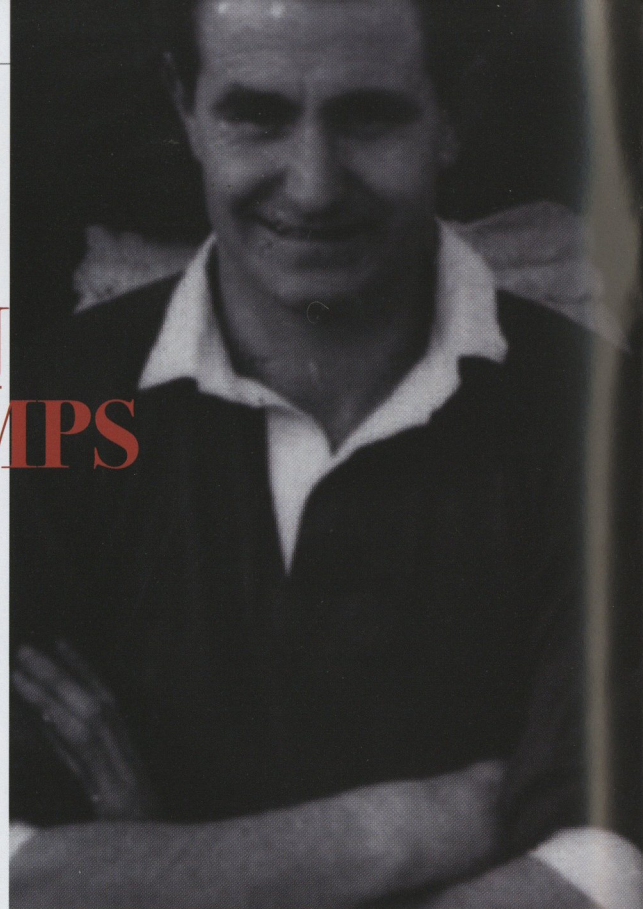

JAKE FINDLAY

After six years as a pro at Villa and seven with Luton, Jake lasted just seven weeks at the County Ground! While at Kenilworth Road, he had helped the Hatters achieve promotion to the top tier in 1982. Lou Macari signed him in readiness for Town's fourth season in the basement division, but Jake soon fell foul of his fellow Scot's strict disciplinary code at the club and he was released after 52 days. Ken Allen was brought in to replace him. STFC 6 apps / LTFC 187

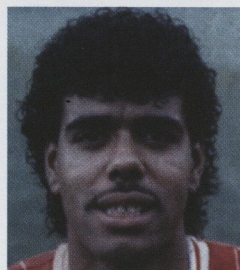
BERNIE HARRIS

Bernie had made over forty top flight appearances for his home town club Sheffield United before joining Luton in October 1928. All his appearances there were at left-back, his last being in a 5-3 win over Swindon in March 1929. Bernie then signed for Queens Park Rangers, but had played for Southern League Ilanely for a season before arriving at the County Ground in June 1933. Most of his appearances here were at right-back. SOL DAVIS

Cheltenham-born Sol joined Swindon at 15, playing in the last five games of 1997/98 while still a trainee. Tenacious, but sometimes over-zealous with his challenges, Sol picked up almost forty cautions during his senior career at Swindon - 14 coming in 2000/01 alone. At the end of the following season he refused terms and signed for the Hatters six days into 2002/03. Sol suffered a stroke in October 2006, but made a full recovery after two months out of the game. 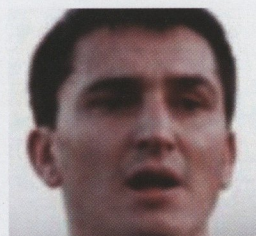
CHRIS KAMARA

Signed from Portsmouth at 19 by Danny Williams, Chris scored within fifteen minutes of his League debut for Town - on his way to an 11-goal tally in 1977/78. He returned to Fratton Park in 1981 but was brought back by Lou Macari in 1985. Injuries restricted his appearances in the Fourth Division title-winning campaign that followed but he was a key figure in the 1986/87 promotion season. Chris joined Luton in the top flight in November 1991. STFC 298 apps / LTFC 54



ADI WHITBREAD

Adi was brought to the County Ground by John Gorman at the end of July 1993 to replace the recently departed Colin Calderwood. But, with no previous experience in the top two divisions, Adi and his partner in central defence Shaun Taylor struggled to adjust to the Premiership. 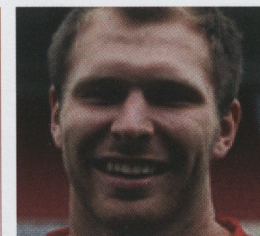
RICHARD DRYDEN

Coupar scored twice on his debut but managed only ten more in two seasons. He took a year out of the game in 1900/01, continuing to live in Swindon while working as a GWR engine fitter! 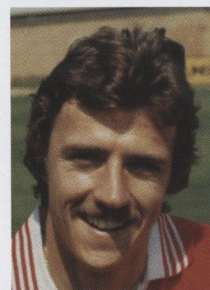
SAM PARKIN

Sam's debut hat-trick against Barnsley in August 2002 soon earned him the 'Super Sammy' tag that stuck as he notched 73 goals in his three seasons at the County Ground, helping to guide Town into the play-offs in 2004. Sam spent a similar period at Luton, but injury restricted his appearances and he registered only ten goals while at Kenilworth Road. 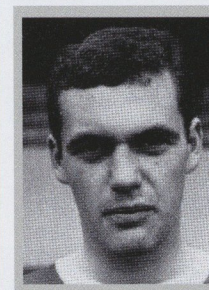
STEVE WHITE

Steve signed for both Luton and Swindon following stints at Bristol Rovers and additionally had a one-month loan spell at Kenilworth Road early in 1983. In eight years at the County Ground free transfer signing 'Chalkie' netted 111 goals, with over 20 in both 1986/87 and 1989/90 - and he won the penalty that led to Town's promotion to the Premiership. 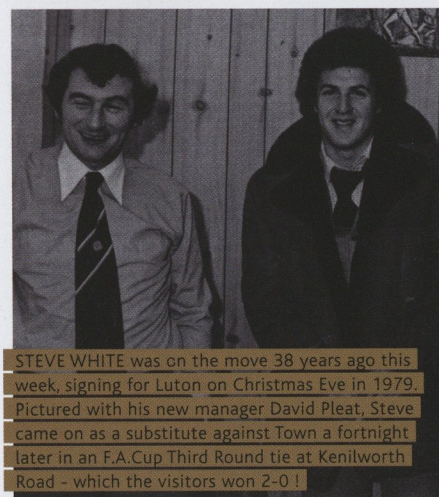
DAVID MOSS

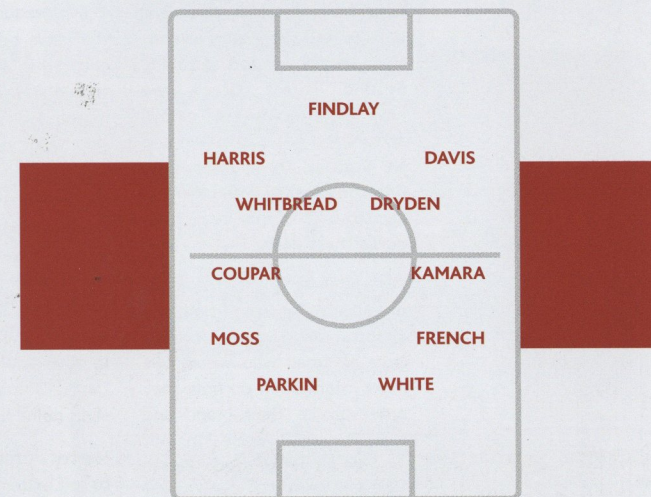


GRAHAM FRENCH

Signed in 1963 by Bert Head for a then substantial fee for an 18 year-old, £10,500, Graham failed to make the same impact as another winger of the same age but who cost nothing - Don Rogers. 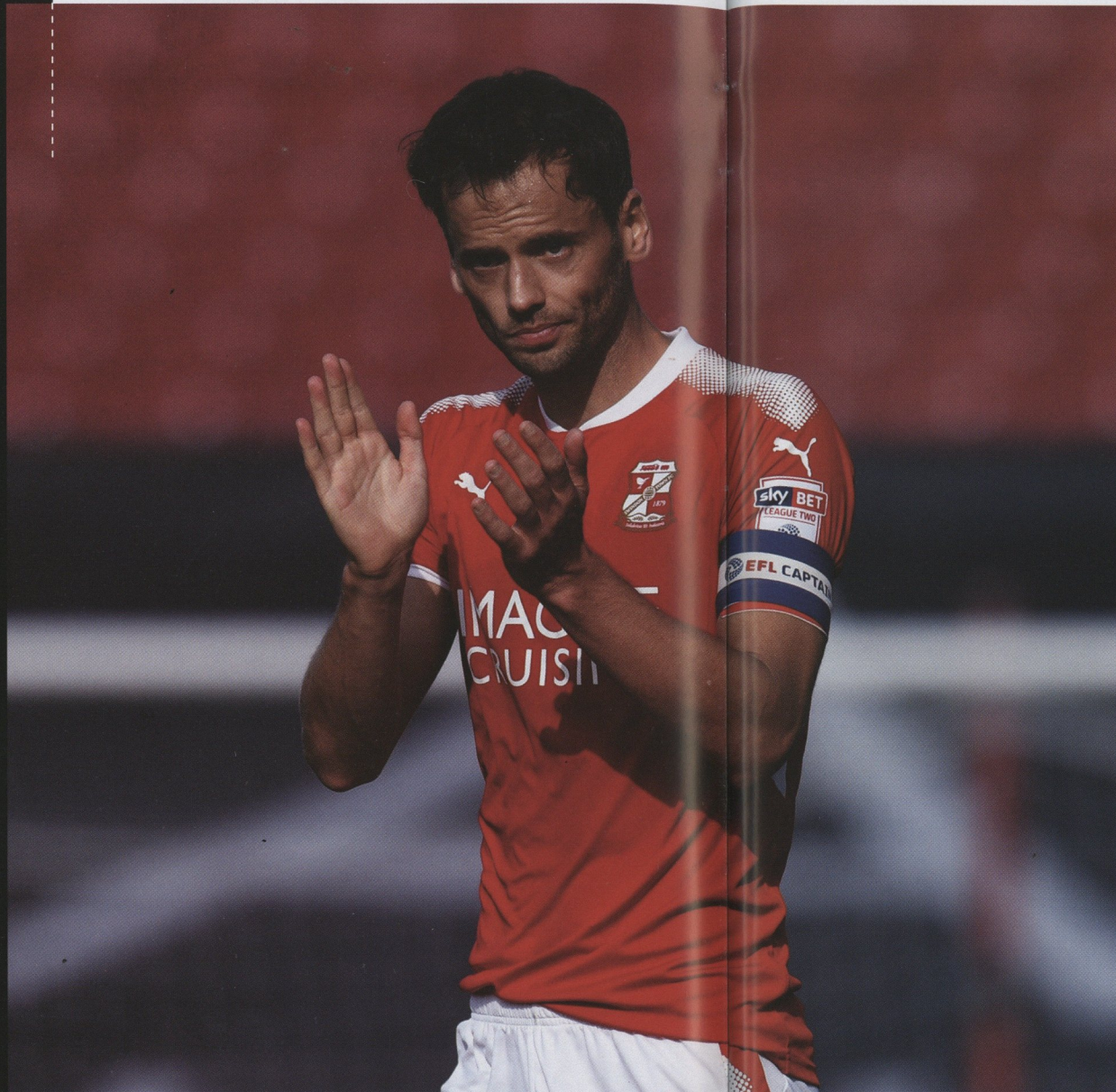
IN-DEPTH WITH...

Ben, results have taken a turn for the worse in recent weeks but is it just a case of putting the hard work in on the training ground and the form will pick back up again?

It is funny because I spoke to people prior to the Grimsby game and I felt like we probably weren't going to lose another game for the rest of the season. We were in great form, we were getting goals from all over the pitch and defensively we looked solid but then, for whatever reason, we had a set-back against Grimsby and we seem to have lost our way a little bit. I take what you say about keep doing what we are doing but also we've got to address any issues and the main problem areas. We do that, we look at the videos and we'll look at where we've gone wrong, we'll look at what we are perhaps not doing as well as we were three weeks ago and we'll take it from there.

Our last outing here, the 3-2 defeat to Colchester United, probably summed up recent frustrations in terms of the way that game went didn't it?

It was a frustrating game. On a personal level I was struggling with an injury throughout the first-half so it was frustrating on that level and it was also frustrating because I didn't feel like Colchester particularly dominated the game, they didn't have a hatful of



chances but what seems to be happening is that when teams do have chances they seem to be good opportunities and other teams are clinical. There wasn't much in the game, there wasn't much between the two teams and it is really how you perform in both boxes. That makes the difference.

Looking at the positives, with League Two being as tight as it is a few wins on the bounce will take us right back up there again, so it is important to focus on that isn't it?

We were at a point where we were grinding out the victories and we were putting points on the board. You come in every week and there are always shock results - anyone can beat anyone really. The league is tight and all it takes is to string a run of results together. That being said, stringing together a run of results isn't easy so you've got to really focus on each and every game, respect the opposition and make sure we apply ourselves in every single game and hopefully we will pick up some points over the Christmas period.

The home form is obviously something that has been talked about a lot, is it getting that balance right though between obviously putting the work in to rectify it but also not putting too much emphasis and pressure on the situation?

You don't want to make too much out of things and you don't want to create problems when they are possibly not there, but then you don't want to ignore things and be blind to things. We've spoken a lot as a team about the home form and it is possibly a case of needing to remove that fear element, not just necessarily home games or away games but just playing with an instinct and a freedom. If you look at the results that Everton have picked up under Sam Allardyce recently, it is almost like they've gone back to what makes them good footballers and they are playing with that freedom now. They are playing instinctively and that is what we need to get to. We can't get bogged down with what has gone previously because there isn't much you can do about that, other than learn from it.

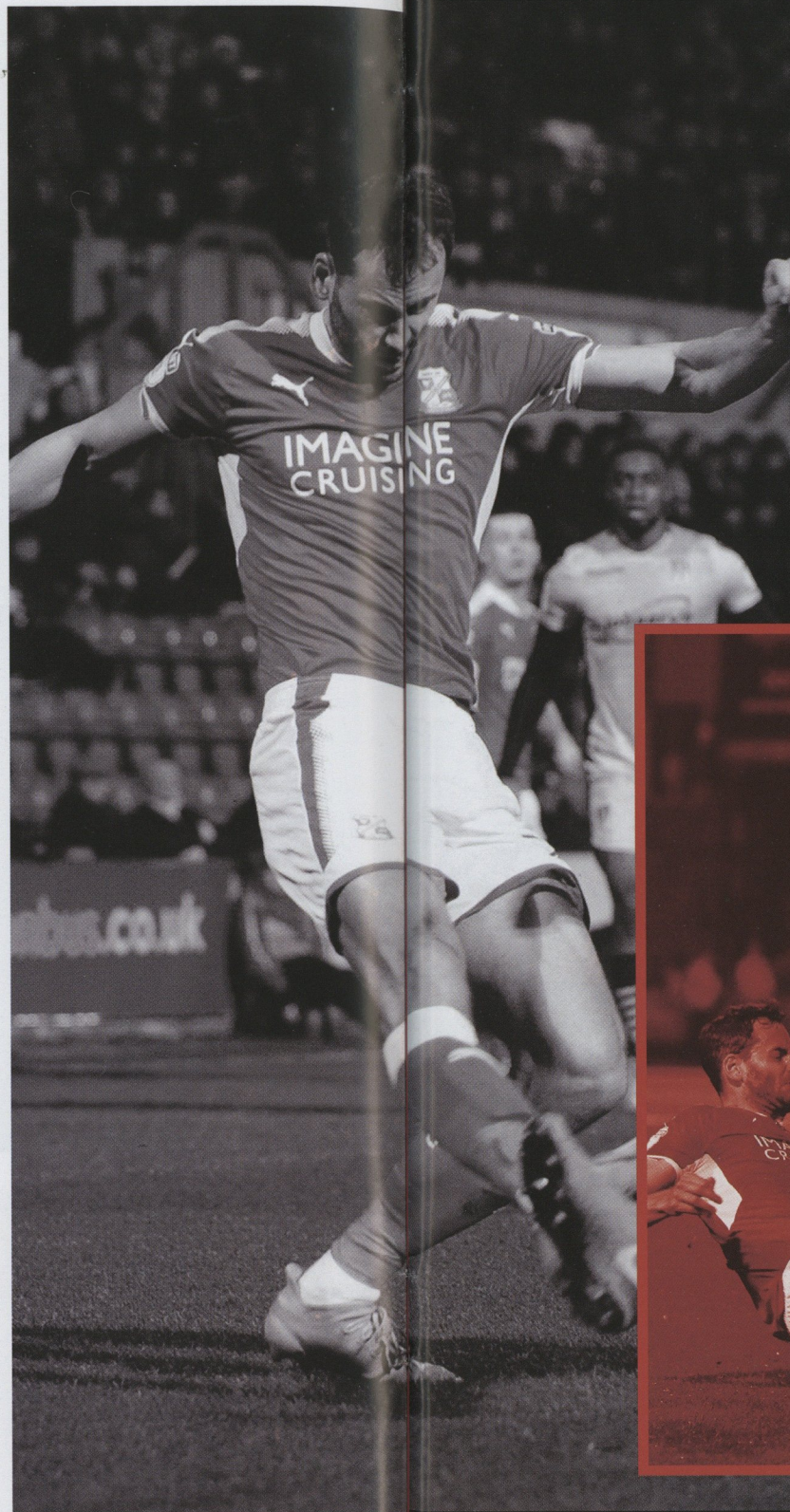
We're at the halfway point of the season now and you've been a virtual ever-present in the league, so how have you rated your form on a personal basis?

If I'm being honest over the first eighteen games I was really pleased and I felt like I performed consistently and I did really well. However, I've maybe had a couple of issues in terms of injuries and just general wear and tear over the past couple of weeks and that has probably set me back a tiny little bit, but I'll always put my hand up, I'll always get out there to help the team if I believe I can do a job and I believe I've got the experience and knowledge of this league and the one above to manage games. I'm hoping over the Christmas period to get things sorted and really hit the ground running.

It has also been a busy time for you off the field recently due to your new role as Chairman of The PFA. Does having that focus off the field help you on it too?

Massively so. It has been an interesting period over the last month or so for me personally. I am really enjoying the role and I hope it helps to aid my focus and help my performances. I want to get back to my form I had at the start of the season.

We are coming to the New Year where everyone seems to set resolutions but, for you, will you set any targets going into 2018?



I haven't really set personal targets this season - it is more about looking at the team and looking at the collective. We have a goal as a team, we're falling a little bit underneath that at the moment and my job is how I can help the team, how I can support the team whether that is by helping getting clean sheets, trying to drive forward and putting attackers in better positions to score or deliver and go one-v-one against people. I have no personal targets like appearances and things like that, I just really look at it from a team point of view with the focus on getting this club back a little bit closer to where it belongs.

Luton are the visitors today, they are flying at the moment and are top of the table on merit, but can we take encouragement from our display at

their place earlier in the season going into this afternoon?

You've got to take a few things, one is encouragement, conversely if I was in their camp I would be thinking that 'hang on a minute, they beat us 3-0 at our place earlier in the season' so they will know what we are about, they will be aware of the threat that we pose and they will be aware that we are a decent outfit and we are able to compete and outplay them. We are expecting a really tough game, a really tough challenge but we need to impose ourselves on the game like we did at their place earlier in the season. Throughout the season when we've been challenged, when we've been away at some of the top teams, that's when some of our best performances have come out. Hopefully that is something we'll be looking at today.

BY ROAD

Leave the M1 at Junction 4 and take the A41 towards Edgware. At the first roundabout take the third exit onto the A410 towards Harrow and Stanmore. At the next small roundabout turn left at the Esso Garage/McDonalds towards Edgware. After passing through a set of traffic lights with the Masons Arms on one corner and then a Peugeot Garage on the left, turn right at the next set of traffic lights into Camrose Avenue. The entrance to the Hive Stadium is down this road on the right.



PARKING

There is a large car park at the stadium with 500 spaces - costing £5 per car. However, with only one exit available it is wise to expect some delays in leaving the car park after the game. Otherwise, there is street parking available although not on Camrose Avenue. There is also 150 spaces at Canons Park Tube Station, which costs £2 to park there for the day. It is a ten-minute walk from the station to the Hive Stadium.



BY TUBE

The nearest London Underground station is Canons Park which is on the Jubilee Line. It is around a ten-minute walk from the away end of the Hive Stadium. As you come out of the station, turn left and at a convenient point crossover to the other side of the road. You will come to some metal railings where there is an entrance to some playing fields which you can walk through to the ground. This also brings you out at the North End of the stadium which is reserved for away fans.



PUBS

Away supporters are treated to their own bar within the stadium, which is located behind the North Stand. This spacious bar has a large screen showing Sky Sports. It serves beers such as Fosters and John Smiths (£3.80) and Heineken (£4). The bar is open throughout the game and for a short time after the final whistle. Alternatively, there is the Moranos Pub on Station Road, only a short walk from Canons Park Underground Station, and a Wetherspoons pub called JJ Moons close to Kingsbury Tube Station.

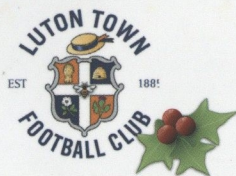
