THE MANAGER



Good evening and welcome to Kenilworth Road for tonight's Checkatrade Trophy third round tie against Peterborough United.

I'd like to welcome everybody making
the short trip from London Road –
directors, officials, supporters, their
manager Grant McCann, his staff and
their players – and I hope they have a
safe journey home after the game.

We have seen some cracking games
here in this competition against
higher level opposition over the past
two seasons, and the win over West
Ham U21s to reach this stage was
among them.

That game came a couple of days
after a long FA Cup trip to Gateshead,
and it's a similar situation tonight
– albeit with an extra 24 hours for
us to recover from the third round
tie at Newcastle United on Saturday
afternoon.

Although we came away from
St James' Park disappointed with
the overall result, with nine
minutes in which we gave them the
opportunity to take control of the
game before half-time proving our
downfall, we could also travel home
with a lot of pride.

We gave a Premier League side a real
good game, especially in the second
half when we scored two legitimate
goals – although one was incorrectly

ruled out – and hit the woodwork. As
staff, as a team and as a club, we
can take a lot from the experience.

And what fantastic support you gave
us! To take over 7,500 on a 500-
mile round trip is remarkable, but it
doesn't surprise me. I know you'd
travel to the moon in numbers if we
had a game there.

You showed the club in a great light
on a national scale, with the extra
interest that FA Cup third round
weekend generates, and I hope you
all had a great night out on the Toon.

The club is in a real good place
at the moment, with our league
position and all the positivity around
Kenilworth Road and The Brache, and
I was delighted to commit my future
by signing a new four-year contract
last week. I've loved every minute of
my two years here so far and long
may that continue.

We hope to increase that feel-good
factor tonight by moving a step closer
to Wembley in a competition we've
enjoyed since its reformat, so please
get behind the team and enjoy the
game.

by for Grant McCann's side. Marcus Maddison leads the assists charts, and who is he teeing up? Former Hatter Jack Marriott. The striker made 91 appearances for the Kenilworth Road outfit netting 28 times, before signing for Peterborough in the summer. He has been in prolific form for his new side, scoring 23 times already, including two in their FA Cup win at Aston Villa on Saturday.

With wins over Southampton Under-21s and Cambridge United in the group stages, as well as a draw and

penalty shoot-out defeat against Northampton Town, Posh comfortably reached the knock-out stages of this season's Checkatrade Trophy.

They defeated Southend United in the second round, with Gwion Edwards and Maddison finding the back of the net in a 2-0 win.

The Posh have a good recent history in the competition, having won it back in 2014 as they defeated Chesterfield 3-1 at Wembley, with current Hatter Josh McQuoid opening the scoring that afternoon.



Watford, the former England Under-21 went out to Brackley Town, Forest Green Rovers, Dagenham & Redbridge and Bury, before joining the Royals in 2015. He made 14 appearances for them in his first season there, before heading out on loan last season to Gillingham, where he made eight appearances.

THE WALL

STEVEN TAYLOR



Bar a short loan spell to Wycombe Wanderers in 2003, the 31-year-old spent over 20 years with Newcastle United having joined as a

youth in 1995. After making over 250 appearances for Newcastle, he departed in 2016, joining MLS side Portland Timbers, before having a short spell with Ipswich Town last season. The vastly experienced defender joined Posh on a two-year deal in July.

THE MAN IN THE MIDDLE

MARCUS MADDISON

Maddison also began his career at Newcastle, but left in 2013 without making an appearance. He had a brief loan spell with Blyth Spartans before his departure, going on to sign for St Johnstone. He left the Scottish Premiership outfit later in 2013 without making an appearance, but it was the club he then signed for where he made his mark. A fantastic season with National League outfit Gateshead in 2013/14 earned him a move to Peterborough.



THE DANGERMAN

JACK MARRIOTT



A familiar face in these parts, Jack played at Kenilworth Road for two seasons before departing for Peterborough United in the summer, signing a four-year deal. He began his career at Ipswich Town, making three first team appearances for the Tractor Boys, as well as enjoying loan spells with the likes of Woking and Colchester United. He joined the Hatters in 2015, going onto make 91 appearances and scoring 28 times.






The Hatters reached the last 16 of the Checkatrade Trophy in early December as they put four past West Ham United Under-21s without reply at Kenilworth Road.

It was an evening of firsts for the Hatters, as Lawson D'Ath, Aaron Jarvis and Kavan Cotter all opened their scoring accounts for the Town, whilst Jordan Cook got his first for the campaign. D'Ath headed in Luke Gambin's perfect cross from eight yards just before the half hour mark, with Aaron Jarvis firing in on the half volley 11 minutes in to the second half to round off a brilliant 11-pass period of possession. Cotter then hammered in from 12 yards, before Cook pounced on an attempted clearance by keeper Nathan Trott, diverting it into the back of the net in injury time.



JONES:

"We go about these games in the right way and we see what test we are going to get. I thought at times we were very good. We managed the game well, we knew they were a good footballing side, they want to press you. We changed slightly in our approach and we got in from that. I thought we scored three good goals and one that we earmarked if they want to be very expansive and the keeper wants to play in his own six-yard box, then we will press them."


