

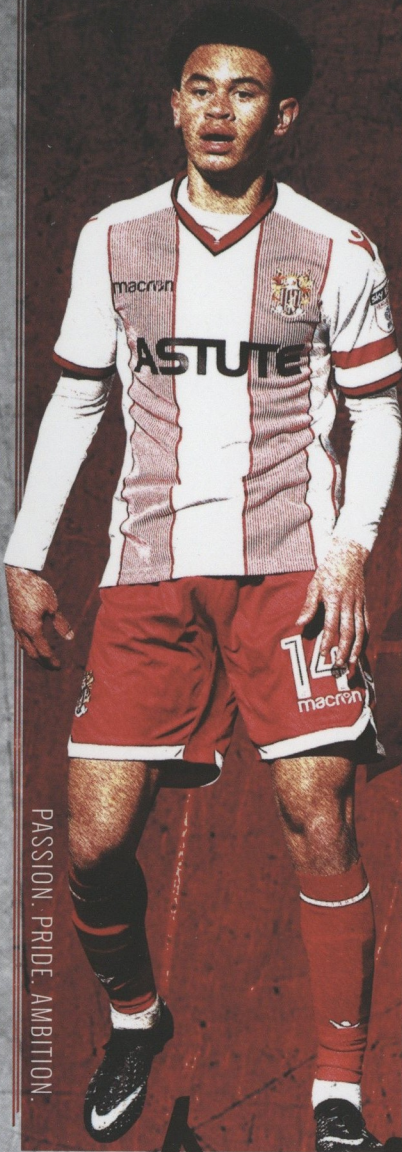

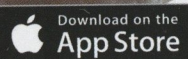

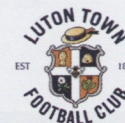

I would also like to welcome Nathan Jones, his staff and all the travelling players.

It was a hugely disappointing ending to the game but we must move on. The group can take plenty of positives from the performance overall and we plan to take those into this afternoon's contest.

Our youngsters are continuing to thrive – accentuated by Mark McKee's first goal at the weekend – and in the medium/long term, our future is bright. This group I feel has greater longevity than the last and at present it requires a patience in supporting and improving our young players and our new signings that are still grasping our ways. However, moving forward we should see less turnover and a more established group for the football club and town to thrive off of.

Today's game is a chance for us to right a few wrongs of our previous meeting in October and we need to restore some lost pride that day.

They showed their quality on the day at Kenilworth Road and we were made to pay.

The group and I all believe we are capable of beating anyone in this league and it is our task today to ensure we play to our optimum level.

You can guarantee that we will fight for every inch and leave everything out there on the pitch.

The support at Accrington was once again fantastic and a real shining light on a day where we were left very disappointed.

Please get back behind the players this afternoon and make yourself heard.

Your support and enthusiasm from the stands plays a big part in our success and today we will need you standing side by side with us. Together we will achieve.

Well, what goes around comes around and hopefully Lady Luck will be with us this week instead, as the lads certainly gave a great account of themselves and deserve it.

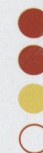
Our opponents today sit at the top of the league and Nathan Jones has put a very good squad together. They are certainly where they are on merit and look certain to move into League One come May. Their gates of consistently 5000+ more than ours dictates that they can go for players we haven't a chance of affording. Combined with some significant income from transfer fees, this really is their year and they've spent their money well. It really is a different world from us financially, but games like today provide the opportunity for us to show that team spirit, organisation and desire can be a great

leveller and we'll be looking to avenge the heavy defeat we took at Kenilworth Road earlier in the season.

Each time we play at home, you'll see a little more of the old North Stand removed. Demolition is scheduled to finish on 25th February and we're hoping to start the groundworks the following week. It will be a while before any steelwork goes up, but by the time July comes around we'd hope to have all the football side of the stand complete, with the internal bar areas being completed during August.

Back to the game - this is a crucial one for both sides. Luton need to win to keep a distance away from the chasing pack and we need to find a run of form that creates wins to take us into the top half of the table. It should be a cracking game, full of entertainment. Whether you're watching or playing.

Tom made an instant impression for the Boro keeping a clean sheet on his debut against Championship side Reading in the 3rd Round of the FA Cup.

The loanee has played every possible minute since joining on the 4th of January and has kept a total of three clean sheets in six games; he has certainly made his presence known at the Lamex.

Tom: "It is a great set-up here and something I couldn't turn down. The manager is great and there is Glenn Roeder and Chris Day to learn off of as well.

"Nicky Shorey is a bit of a hero for me, being a Portsmouth fan. And we've got Joe Martin, who I know well from his time at Millwall.

"It feels good at a new team – new faces, new voices and different coaching ideas."

The Gaffer: "I have always been very impressed by his energy and his athleticism. He brings a bit of tenacity that you do not see at U23 football and he has certainly got that."

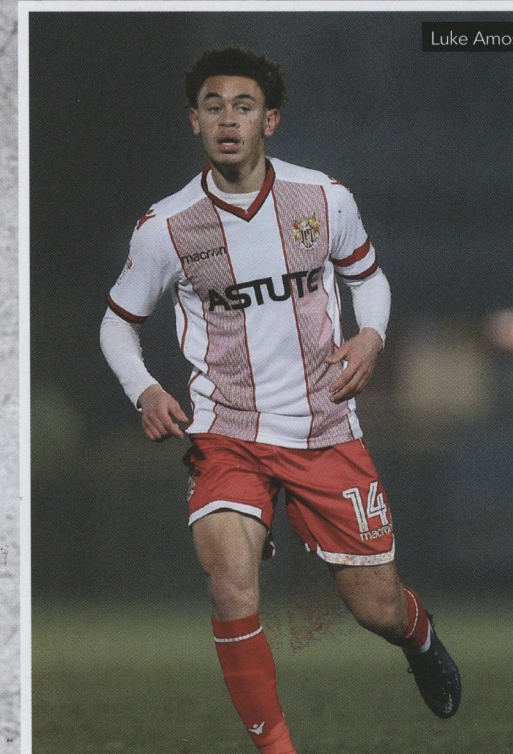
The long-serving forward became our first permanent signing in the January transfer window moving from local side Northampton Town.

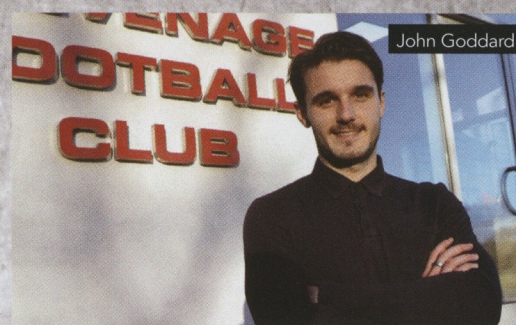

Seen as a direct replacement for Tom Pett, Goddard hopes to enjoy a fresh start at Stevenage.

Johnny: "This year I have not quite pushed on like I would have liked to, so Stevenage were aware that I was available and when you feel wanted by a club, it makes you really want to go and play for that team and that manager."

The Gaffer: "We have to try and get the consistency that he had last year in League One where he played a lot of games for Swindon. We need to try and add the goals he scored at Woking, which was substantial for a wide midfielder."

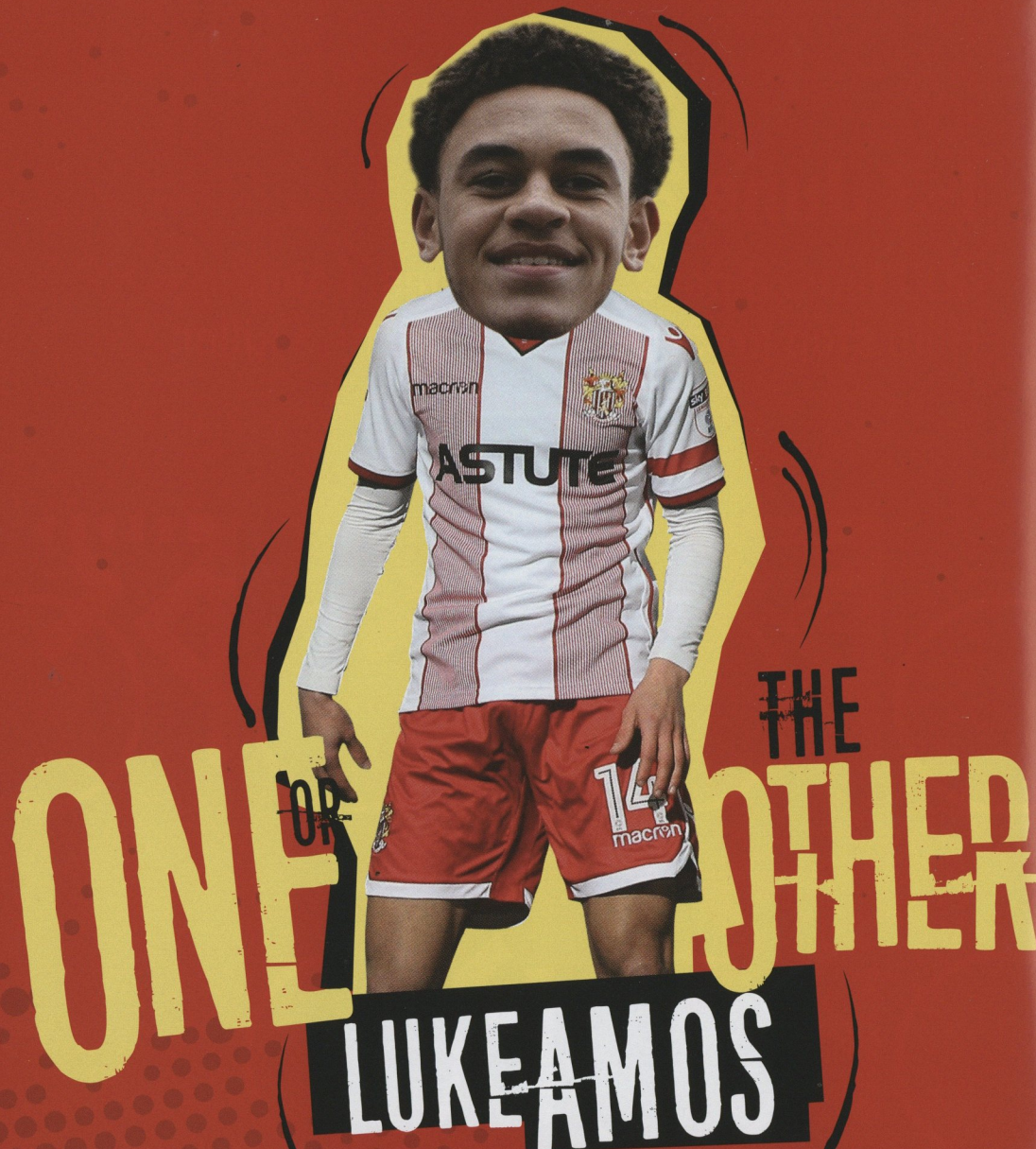

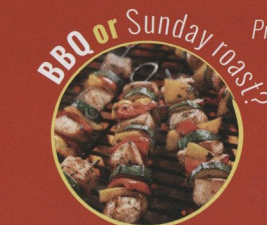

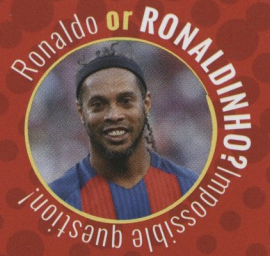

Not only do some of our players get sent out on loan, but we are open to sending our players out to Premier League and Championship clubs for work experience, too. We have been receiving more and more interest in our players and the opportunity to spend time at these top clubs is all beneficial to their development.

As mentioned earlier, all of this enables us to promote our young academy graduates and we have seen 90 appearances from our U16s, of which 31 have started games. We have also used one U15 so far and have begun identifying younger talents who will hopefully be involved at some point in the coming months.

Trials will soon be getting underway for one of our most successful schemes, the Elite Development

Programme. We have had a number of players come through the programme in recent years to go on and represent our U18s. Macsen Fraser has been arguably the EDP's biggest success but we have also had success away from the playing field. Tom Mallindine, our Performance Analyst, progressed through the scheme as an aspiring footballer. Everybody knows that not everyone can make it as a player so we want to provide alternative professional opportunities too.


Tom is currently studying at university whilst supporting our U18 department with excellent analysis work and his role is invaluable.

Finally, I want to wish all the First Team the best of luck for today's derby and as always, I will be cheering the boys on for 3 points.

CHRIS DUNLAVY

POOR OLD NEWCASTLE WERE LEFT HANGING THIS WEEK WHEN DANIEL STURRIDGE SIGNED ON LOAN FOR WEST BROM.

The Magpies had agreed a deal with Liverpool, prepared a welcome party and were simply waiting for the striker to show up at St James' Park.

Alas, he never did. The first time anyone at Newcastle saw the England man, he was wearing a Baggies shirt and a beaming grin.

Sturridge said family reasons were behind his decision; whatever the reason, he certainly not the first player to have a last-gasp change of heart.

WILLIAN

With Gareth Bale on his way to Madrid, Spurs needed a wily schemer in behind the striker. That man was Willian, signed from Anzhi Makhachkala for a hefty £30m.

As the Chelsea song gleefully relates, Spurs paid for the Brazilian's flight, put him up in a hotel, then conducted a medical.

Yet all the while, Blues owner Roman Abramovich was plotting with Anzhi counterpart - and fellow Oligarch - Suleyman Kerimov to gazump Tottenham's offer.

He eventually chucked in an extra £2m and Willian was on his way to the Bridge. "Well, they should have done the medical in secret," chuckled Jose Mourinho.

To this day, Spurs chairman Daniel Levy suspects the move was made purely out of spite after he refused to sell Luka Modric to Chelsea the year before.

MO JOHNSTONE

Striker Johnstone was playing in France for Nantes when he publicly announced he'd be returning to Celtic - the club for whom he'd scored 72 goals in 128 games - at the end of the 1988-89 campaign.

"There is no other British club I could play for apart from Celtic," said the Glaswegian, even posing for a photo alongside Hoops manager Billy McNeill.

In fact, there was. And of all the clubs in all the world, it turned out to be bitter rivals Rangers, who'd offered a lot more money.

Branded Judas by Celtic supporters, he was also shunned by Rangers fans. The kitman at Ibrox even refused to touch Johnstone's shirt or dole him out post-match food. Still, three titles probably softened the blow.

PAUL GASCOIGNE

Arguably the most legendary U-turn of all time, Gazza was supposed to sign for Man United in 1988.

Alex Ferguson called the midfield maestro, turned on the charm and set off on holiday safe in the knowledge he'd snagged his man. "His last words to me were 'Go and enjoy yourself Mr Ferguson, I'll be signing for Manchester United,'" recalled Fergie.

Two days later, Ferguson got a call from United chairman Martin Edwards to say Gazza had signed for Spurs.

The reason? Tottenham chairman Irvine Scholar had bought a house for Gazza's parents, a car for his dad and even a sunbed for his sister. Deal done.

MO SISSOKO

Nobody could quite understand why Everton were so desperate to sign Sissoko in the summer of 2016. After all, the French midfielder had been about as much use in Newcastle as a bikini on Bamburgh beach.

So imagine the surprise when Spurs then snatched Sissoko from under Everton's noses with an eye-watering £30m bid. Turns out he'd avoided Ronald Koeman's calls on deadline day, then bizarrely claimed that Everton had "dithered" over the signing.

Yet if the saga was an embarrassment for Everton, the aftermath was a huge relief as Sissoko predictably bombed at White Hart Lane. Talk about dodging a bullet.

Welshman Jones was appointed as John Still's successor in January 2016. A former coach and assistant-manager at Brighton & Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town, he was a player at Kenilworth Road in 1995 but left without making an appearance.

Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances. The 44-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014. In March 2016 Jones signed a new three-and-a-half year contract with the Hatters to tie him to the club until 2020. His first full season in the hot-seat ended with a fourth-placed finish and qualification for the League Two play-offs.

Jones said: "I am really delighted. It's a great way to bounce back from the disappointment the other day, and bounce back with a clean sheet.

"I wouldn't say it was comfortable because I wouldn't say there was no problem whatsoever. They're a very direct side Exeter, they go into Stockley and he wins. At this level when you've got the Akinfenwas, the Stockleys and the Ameobis of the world, and all it takes is one long ball, one knock down, someone not to go with the runner, and all your 90 minutes of hard work is undone. We didn't do that today.

"It was always in the balance because it's 1-0, but I thought we were excellent. We controlled the game in possession, we were excellent. First half was so, so pleasing. We are a good side when we play like that and we thoroughly deserved the win because it should have been more."

He signed a permanent deal with the Town in May 2016 and made 41 appearances in his first full season, including his 50th in a Luton shirt in a 0-0 draw at Carlisle. 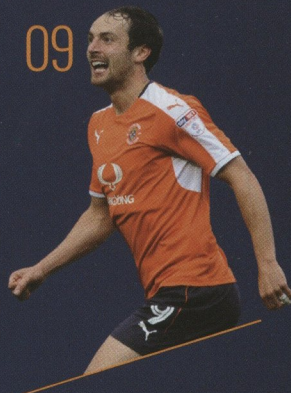
One of the top scoring midfielders in the division in recent seasons, the 25-year-old netted 22 times in 2016-17 for the club with whom he started his career.

While at the Kassam Stadium Hylton hit 30 goals in 84 starts, but turned down the offer of a new contract in order to pen a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. LUTON TOWN DEADLY DUOS

Football historian **Leigh Edwards** profiles five notable post-war Luton Town, goalscoring partnerships

GORDON TURNER & ALLAN BROWN

Long-serving inside-forward Gordon Turner holds Luton Town's all-time goalscoring record.

Signing professional at Kenilworth Road in March 1950, he featured in Luton's 1951-52 FA Cup run and 1952-53 promotion near-miss. He was leading marksman seven times, including 1954-55 when ever-present as they won promotion to the top-flight, also representing the Football League. Netting 243 goals in 406 League outings for the Hatters, he briefly reunited with Jesse Pye at Wisbech Town in July 1964, then played for Kettering Town, Dunstable and Bletchley. He lived and worked locally until his death in December 1976.

Ex-Scotland international Allan Brown was a player and manager at Luton Town. He was a Scottish Cup finalist with East Fife shortly before joining Blackpool in December 1950, moving to Luton in February 1957. Appearing in the 1959 FA Cup final, he netted 51 goals in 151 League games, joining Portsmouth in March 1961. He helped win the Third Division title in 1961-62, then was Wigan's player-boss and Luton's manager from November 1966 until December 1968, plotting their 1967-68 Fourth Division title triumph. Later managing Torquay, Bury, Nottingham Forest, Southport and Blackpool, he died in April 2011.

MALCOLM MACDONALD & DON GIVENS

Ace marksman Malcolm Macdonald was capped 14 times by England after leaving Luton Town. Initially with Tonbridge, he joined Fulham in August 1968 and moved to Kenilworth Road in July 1969. He was Luton's top scorer in two consecutive seasons including their 1969-70 promotion success and netted 49 goals in 88 League games before being sold to Newcastle United for £180,000 in May 1971. An FA Cup finalist in 1974, he joined Arsenal for £330,000 in August 1976 and was an FA Cup finalist again in 1978 before injury ended his career. He managed Fulham and Huddersfield Town and now works in the media.

Republic of Ireland international striker Don Givens was ever-present for Luton Town in 1971-72. Starting with Manchester United, he joined Luton in April 1970 and formed a lethal partnership with Malcolm Macdonald, netting 19 goals in 83 League outings before joining QPR in July 1972. He starred as they won promotion in 1972-73, then were League Championship runners-up in 1975-76. Joining Birmingham City in August 1978, he later appeared for Sheffield United, then was player and coach with leading Swiss side Neuchâtel Xamax. He had a spell as Arsenal's youth coach before managing Republic of Ireland U-21's.

DAVID MOSS & BOB HATTON

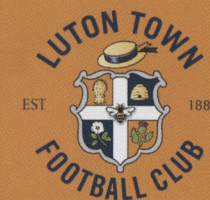
Winger David Moss was Luton Town's top scorer in two consecutive seasons. Initially with hometown Witney, he joined Swindon Town in July 1969 and was twice leading marksman before moving to Luton for £110,000 in May 1978. He featured prominently in their 1981-82 Second Division title triumph and was an FA Cup semi-finalist in 1984-85, netting 88 goals in 221 League games for the Hatters prior to rejoining Swindon in July 1985. Later with Trowbridge Town, he coached under Brian Horton at Oxford United, Manchester City and Huddersfield Town. He has since been chief scout of Liverpool's Academy.

Much-travelled striker Bob Hatton missed just one match for Luton Town in two consecutive seasons. Initially with Wolves, he had spells at Bolton Wanderers and Northampton prior to joining Carlisle United in July 1969. He starred as they were League Cup semi-finalists in 1969-70, then joined Birmingham City in October 1971 and helped to clinch top-flight status that season. Moving to Blackpool in July 1976, he was leading marksman in 1977-78 and joined Luton in July 1978. He netted 29 goals in 82 League games before joining Sheffield United in July 1980, then Cardiff City, becoming director of sales for the PFA.

BRIAN STEIN & MICK HARFORD

England international striker Brian Stein scored twice in Luton Town's 1988 League Cup final triumph. Moving to Kenilworth Road from Edgware Town in October 1977, he was leading marksman in Luton's 1981-82 Second Division success and also starred as they were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88. He joined Caen in July 1988 and moved via Annecy back to Luton in July 1991. Voted their 'Player of the Year' for the second time in 1991-92, he netted 130 goals in 427 League games overall before joining Barnet in August 1992, helping win promotion in 1992-93. His brother Mark also played for Luton.

England international striker Mick Harford played for Luton Town in two consecutive League Cup finals including their 1988 Wembley triumph. Signing professional for Lincoln City in July 1977, he had spells with Newcastle United, Bristol City and Birmingham City prior to joining Luton in December 1984. He starred as the Hatters were FA Cup semi-finalists in 1984-85 and 1987-88, moving to Derby County in January 1990 and returning to Luton in September 1991. Joining Chelsea in August 1992, he then played for Sunderland, Coventry City and Wimbledon. He has since been coach and manager back at Luton.



STEVE HOWARD & TONY THORPE

Striker Steve Howard topped Luton Town's goalscoring charts in five successive seasons. Initially with Tow Law, he joined Hartlepool United in August 1995 and moved to Northampton Town for £120,000 in February 1999. He starred in their 1999-2000 promotion campaign, joining Luton for £50,000 in March 2001. A key figure as the Hatters won promotion in 2001-02 and League One title in 2004-05, he scored 95 goals in 212 League outings before sold to Derby County for £1,000,000 in July 2006. He helped win promotion in 2006-07 and joined Leicester for £1,500,000 in January 2008, then returned to Hartlepool.

Striker Tony Thorpe was leading marksman as Luton Town qualified for the Second Division play-offs in 1996-97. A former Leicester City trainee, he reunited with David Pleat at Luton in August 1992 and was also top scorer in 1997-98. He joined Fulham for £800,000 in February 1998 and helped them reach the play-offs that season. Sold to Bristol City for £1,000,000 in June 1998, he was top scorer three times prior to rejoining Luton in July 2002 after two loan spells. He netted 70 goals in 164 League games overall before moving to QPR in August 2003, then Swindon, Colchester, Stevenage, Grimsby and Tamworth.

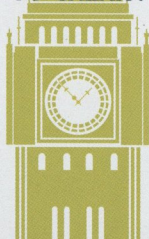

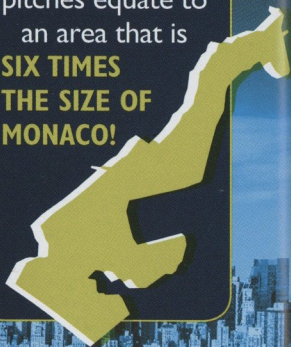

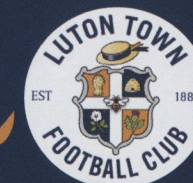

It was an excellent first half of the season, was that a surprise?

Not really - Town have recruited during the summer with promotion as the one thing on their mind for the new campaign.

Having improved a squad that reached the play-offs last term, with some big players joining, then it was always expected they would be mounting a serious promotion charge.

What were the hopes now for the current season?

Without doubt it is to go up automatically, but with 15 games to go and Town having established a healthy lead, then they should be looking to win the League Two title. Downes joined on deadline day from Ipswich and had a wonderful debut against Exeter, giving a performance that belied his 19 years of age.

It's very much an on the front foot style from Nathan Jones as he likes his side to get on the ball and attack the opposition with pace whenever possible. Although he does demand his team keep the ball, they are at their most dangerous when turning over possession and breaking on their opponents as has been proved in some hefty victories this term.

Which players should Stevenage fans look out for?

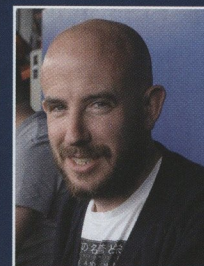

however that the club will fulfil all its engagements this season.

It cannot be complained that the directors are spending too much money on the wages bill. The present team is about the cheapest one they have run for many seasons, and it is said that not one player has received the £4 limit.

A Luton contemporary suggests that it is of little use to send the hat around again, as the help usually comes from the same few men every year, who are getting tired of "shelling out". They suggest that Lutonians may have to go to Watford to see Southern League football. What a catastrophe!"...

The fact that the above article is almost 108 years old did cause a wry smile at the time of reading it. Luton Town fans decamping to Watford? A catastrophe indeed!

Moving on 25 years and the Stevenage Wednesday Football Club pay a visit to Luton Town, who are now a Football League club competing in Division 3. The visit coincided with the same season that Luton's Joe Payne scored 55 goals in 39 games. In one fixture alone (v. Bristol Rovers), Derbyshire-born Joe scored an amazing 10 goals, a Football League record that still exists today.

Stevenage Wednesday were members of the Luton and District Wednesday League and lost every game in their first season.

Being the League's whipping boys, "the Wednesday" did manage to get a team together for every match, and they did fulfil every fixture. In September 1935, members of the Club were entertained to a tea party at the Whipsnade Park Restaurant, where, in the presence of representatives from all of the other clubs in their League, the President, Mr L. Lyons, presented to Stevenage a handsome silver cup in recognition of their sportsmanship in carrying on the previous season, - in spite of a long succession of overwhelming defeats.

Stevenage Wednesday valued this trophy just as much as if it had come to them via winning the championship of the competition.

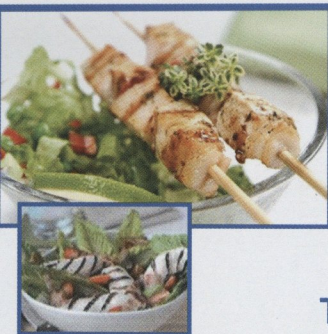

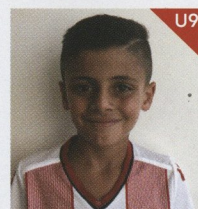

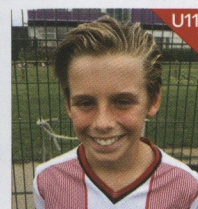

WHAT IS THE NEW LAWN LIKE?

The New Lawn ground is situated on the western edge of the picturesque Cotswold town of Nailsworth.

The name Forest Green is taken from the area of the town where the clubs home is found. Opened in 2006, the New Lawn ground is sited on top of a fairly steep hill and is quite exposed to the elements. It is only a short distance from the site of their old Lawn ground, which has now been redeveloped for housing.

The stadium is dominated by the smart looking Main (East) Stand at one side of the pitch. This stand is all seated and has a capacity of 1,881. It has a cantilever roof as well as row of executive boxes running across the back of it. The team 'dugout' areas are located at the front of this stand.

Opposite is the small open West Terrace, which is only seven steps high. Running along the back of this terrace are four floodlight pylons. Interestingly both ends have to different degrees been relocated from the old Lawn ground to the new stadium.

At the Nymphsfield Road (North) end of the ground, is a covered terrace, the roof of which came from the Barnfield Road side of the old ground. Opposite is the South Stand, which until recently was a covered all seated stand, but has now had the seats removed to make it a terrace for home fans. This stand is of interest as it was the Trevor Horsley Stand which was transported from the Club's old ground and re-erected at the New Lawn. Overall the New Lawn is a small but tidy stadium that is well maintained.

WHERE TO EAT AND DRINK?

There is bar at the ground itself called the Green Man, which is built into the back of the Main Stand.

This bar serves real ale from the Stroud Brewery, hot food is available and it has a number of televisions showing televised sports. However, with promotion to the Football League then this is mostly for home fans only. The Club though have set up a small marquee bar for visiting fans which is located near to the away turnstiles.

Maxwell Meadows a visiting Solihull Moors fan adds: "We went to a pub called the George, which is on Newmarket Road around a 15 minute walk from the ground. It is an extremely atmospheric pub serving a good pint of beer. It is worth seeking out despite the walk back up the hill. To find this pub from the ground then walk back down the main road towards the town centre. Half way down look out for Burma Road on the right and follow it along into Seven Acres Road. Carry on till you see a footpath on your left heading sharply down the hill. It is a shortcut that leads to the back of The George which is in Newmarket Road. It was a bit of a stiff walk back up to the ground but not as far as from the town centre and at least Burma Road is on the level."

HOW TO GET THERE AND WHERE TO PARK?

When planning a trip here, don't try and find Forest Green on your map, look up Nailsworth, south of Stroud in Gloucestershire.

The best way to approach is from the M5 and exit at junction 13 and head for Stroud on the A419. At Stroud turn onto the A46 towards Nailsworth. This will bring you into the centre of the town when you reach the Information Centre take the first right at the mini roundabout into Spring Hill, which goes up a steep hill sign posted Forest Green. The Lawn is at the top of this hill. Turn left at the roundabout at the 'summit' into the stadium entrance. There is no parking available in the club car park for visiting fans unless you are a blue badge holder who has pre-booked a space. A short distance away down Nymphsfield Road is Nailsworth Primary School which offers parking at £5 per car. Otherwise, there is plenty of on-street parking in the area, although please be considerate to local residents.

The Club operates a Park & Ride scheme from the premises of Renishaw plc, which are located on the main A46 Stroud Road (GL5 5EY). There are 200 spaces for cars and cost of £5 per vehicle. Buses up to the ground commence up to three hours before kick off and return after the match has ended.

WHAT CAN BORO SUPPORTERS EXPECT?

Away fans are housed in the West Terrace on one side of the ground.

This terrace has a capacity of around 1,150 fans and runs the full length of the pitch. The terrace is uncovered, so hope that it doesn't rain. Unfortunately, it is difficult to really make some noise from the open terrace which dampens down the atmosphere somewhat. Apart from disabled fans, the Club does not provide any seating to visiting supporters. The entrance to the away terrace is at the back of the stadium from the main entrance and the access paths are quite narrow. Entrance to the ground is via electronic turnstiles, meaning that you need to scan your ticket to gain admittance.

If you are looking for a Meat Pie, Beef Burger or Hot Dog to buy inside the ground, then you will be disappointed, as the Club has decided not to sell any meat products and instead only sell Vegan ones. So on offer, are Veggie Burgers (£3.30), Q-Pies (filled with Quorn £3.50) Chips and Curry Sauce (£3.20), Chip Butties (£3.20) and Chips (£2.70).

My visits to The New Lawn (and the old ground for that matter) have been most enjoyable and it would be difficult to find a more friendly and welcoming club than this one. If the chance arises, a visit to this Gloucestershire ground is a pleasant days outing in a unique setting.

I have been informed that the Club are looking at installing a temporary roof over part or all of the West Terrace and also adding some seating for away fans on that side too.
