 the game. Come on you Glovers!



Good afternoon everyone and welcome back to Huish Park – it feels like a while since we were last here so it's good to be back in front of our home faithful again.

As a manager, this part of the season gives you so many things to think about: the eight games to go, loan players returning, players out of contract, teams fighting for something at both ends of the table and the pressure that can build and affect performance.

With that in mind, preparation and mental toughness will be key for the remaining fixtures that we have left.

I've been very pleased with our last three performances on the road. We've shown discipline, organisation and a determination that has lasted the duration, something made more pleasing by the historic result at Coventry on Monday.

We have some great challenges to come as we take on eight teams in the top 10, but the result at the Ricoh Arena shows that we can go toe-to-toe with the best.

Our young squad have taken valuable experience this season from games against Manchester United, Wolves, Southend, Bradford, Shrewsbury, Fleetwood, AFC Wimbledon and Plymouth, with many of them overcoming a fear factor to perform on a consistent basis.

It's taken two-and-a-half years in football management to change the vision and future of the football club, undergoing a rebuilding process which has seen us lay the foundations to future success.

We can see those foundations standing firm by the number of contracted players we have next season. Two were subject to January bids and the club boasts three internationals whose services are tied to the club.

On a personal level, I had an operation a fortnight ago which went very well so now I begin my recovery.


I'm feeling very positive about everything; the surgeon did a great job and Mike the physio will become my best mate over the summer to get me back to full fitness as quick as possible!

Town's quartet of internationals enjoyed a successful time away representing their countries. Bevis Mugabi (Uganda), Rhys Browne (Antigua & Barbuda), Shaun Donnellan and Corey Whelan (Republic of Ireland Under-21s) spent time across the globe on international duty.

The trip to East Africa was of special significance to 22-year-old Mugabi, who picked up his first two caps for his country, whilst Browne netted his first international goal by

opening the scoring in Antigua's 3-2 win over Bermuda.

Closer to home, loanee Whelan ran out in the Republic of Ireland Under-21s' 3-1 friendly win over Iceland and the UEFA U21 European Championship qualifier against Azerbaijan. Having sat out the friendly, Donnellan proved to be the hero against Azerbaijan playing the full game and scoring a vital 96th minute winner - his first for Eire.

All at Yeovil Town FC would like to congratulate the quartet on their achievements.

Winger Rhys Browne is relishing the chance to finally establish himself as a Football League player after several false starts.

Despite suffering an ankle ligament injury mid-season, Browne has emerged as a key player for Yeovil, whether deployed on the right or left wing.

His spell at Huish Park comes after spending time with Norwich City, Charlton Athletic and Grimsby Town without making a first team start.

And while Browne had proved his ability with impressive spells in non-league football in the National League with Aldershot and Macclesfield, he's delighted to have made the step up with Town this season.

“YOU NEED TO BE FIT TO PLAY AS A WINGER BECAUSE THE GAFFER EXPECTS US TO GET FORWARD AND THEN ALSO DEFEND OUT OF POSSESSION”

The wideman said: "I'm pleased with how it's gone so far, although obviously my progress was hampered by the injury I picked up.

"The season started well and I was enjoying playing regularly and scoring goals before I injured my ankle.

"I'm glad that I'm back now and I've got a couple of 90 minute performances under my belt which is important.


"You need to be fit to play as a winger because the gaffer expects us to get forward and then also defend out of possession.

"And although it's great being back I still think I can do more and I think the best is still to come from me.

"Things didn't work out at Grimsby for whatever reason and I think an injury that I had there contributed

to me not making a proper breakthrough there.

"But I was pleased to come here in the summer to the club where my dad used to play, and the move has worked out well for me so far."

Rhys' father Steve was a midfielder and played for the Grovers between 1995 and 1998, making 88 appearances.

Steve passed away in January last year after a battle with cancer, having also had a distinguished career as a manager in non-league football.

Rhys said: "I know my dad played here and it's great to follow in his footsteps but I'm my own man and a different player and I'm here to make a name for myself as a Yeovil player."

Browne recently resumed his international career with Antigua and Barbuda, a country he qualifies to represent through his grandfather.

The pacy winger also scored his first international goal and is looking forward to further call-ups in the future.

He said: "It's always an honour to be called up and to cap it off this time by scoring my first ever goal for my country was a special feeling.

"My granddad was from Antigua and I always look forward to getting called up and flying out to the Caribbean.

"We play our home games at the cricket ground in Antigua and obviously the country has rather more history in cricket than football.

"But we've got more games coming up including qualifiers for some of the big tournaments and we're also in the Gold Cup, which is a big deal for countries in the Caribbean and Central America."

Browne had an impressive youth career, being part of the Norwich Under-18 squad that won the FA Youth Cup in 2013 before moving on to Charlton.

But it was at Aldershot where he really caught the eye as a goalscoring winger, while he played and scored at Wembley last May for Macclesfield in the FA Trophy final.

"I'd done well in Non-League

football and now it's great to be proving myself at the next level up," said Browne.

"When I came here I signed a two-year contract which I knew would give me time to develop and ensured I wasn't put under too much pressure.

"The gaffer here seems to like playing with wingers and he'd given lots of game time to Jordan (Green) and Otis (Khan) as well as me.

"We all offer him something a bit different and I'd like to think that he likes the way we can attack the opposition and hopefully excite the crowd.

"I scored a few goals before my injury and I've got one since I came back so I'd like to add a few more between now and the end of the season.

"The injury I got was unfortunate because I originally did it in training and thought I'd be ok.

"But then I aggravated it and made it worse in a game and ended up being out for a couple of months.

"The challenge now is to make up for lost time and do as much as I can to help the team between now and the end of the season."

Five days can be a long time in football, but I think those of us who were inside the Ricoh Arena on Easter Monday will recall that result like it was yesterday for some time.

You can never get more than three points no matter what the outcome, but some results get stored in the 'I was there' category and the trip to Coventry earlier this week certainly falls into that remit.

Many of you here today (including myself) will have fond memories of Town's 6-1 win over Oxford United on this very ground back in 2004 and nearly 14 years on, that historic result finally has a partner to sit alongside it.

The 6-2 win in the West Midlands was the first time the Grovers have scored six goals on their travels as an EFL club, surpassing the 5-1 win

at Leyton Orient in 2011.

A slightly surreal afternoon, the trio of braces for Alex Fisher, Francois Zoko and Sam Surridge will be recalled by Yeovil fans for many a year.

Of course, there's still mathematical safety to ensure but if there's a result to act as a catalyst for a strong end to the season, the win over the Sky Blues is the perfect example.

High-flyers Luton are today's visitors and act as the latest in a series of top eight sides the Green & Whites will encounter between now and the end of the season.

A highest league finish (including the most goals scored) for three years is all but ensured, meaning we're already seeing buds of optimism for 2018/19.

But let's not get too far ahead of ourselves, let's enjoy the Coventry win some more and see if fond memories can be made for a second match running.





Luton Town are in their fourth season in Sky Bet League Two after returning from Non-League in 2014.

Finishing higher up the table every year since returning to the EFL, the Hatters are looking to better last season's fourth place finish which saw Nathan Jones' side defeated by Blackpool in the play-off semi-final.

Looking to do just that, the Bedfordshire outfit signed 10 players

in the summer and began 2017/18 in scintillating fashion to lead the pack from the start.

Comfortably the highest scorers in the division this time around, Luton boast the attacking potency of Danny Hylton and James Collins who have more than 35 goals between them.

Looking for a return to the higher echelons of the Football League, the Hatters have endured something of a blip in recent months, allowing Accrington Stanley to close the gap and start a race for top spot.



With an eye for goal - especially from set-pieces - he has three goals so far this season and had three free-kicks nominated for 2016/17 goal of the season.




★ MIDFIELDER - OLLY LEE

The club's top scorer last season with 27 goals, Hylton came in the top three shortlisted for the EFL League Two Player of the Year award as voted by managers in the division, was named in the PFA Team of the Season for the division and won four club Player of the Year accolades in a memorable campaign.

Yeoovil Town were now finally closing in on the Conference title. With five games to play and a healthy 14-point advantage, all Town diehards knew that victory over Telford United on Saturday, April 5 might be good enough to crack open the champagne. They did, however, need Gravesend & Northfleet to do them a favour and get a result against Yeovil's long-term rivals Chester City.

With this in mind, it was no surprise to see a whopping 7,558 crowd pack the park as history came ever closer. Gavin Williams returned from suspension to fill the attacking midfield role behind the twin terrors of Kirk Jackson and Kevin Gall. Abdel El Kholti had to be satisfied with a space on the bench as a result.

Early on, Telford looked bright but failed to really threaten Chris Weale's goal. The same couldn't be said for Telford's Paul Edwards who twice denied Michael McIndoe and also thwarted Lee Johnson, Yeovil's two best players on the day. He also saved well from Jackson as at times, it seemed to be a one-man defensive unit playing against the Grovers.

On the half hour, after Weale had finally made a save, Yeovil took the lead. Gall had sprinted down the flank to control the ball and, spotting McIndoe on the far flank, found him with a pinpoint pass that McIndoe smashed home on the volley. Jackson and Johnson were then denied by Edwards before right on half time, Johnson found Jackson with a cross that the Yorkshiremen headed home.

After the break, Yeovil played some nice football and could have extended their lead. Gall hit the bar, Williams chipped just wide and then

poked another cross just past the post. The third goal was coming and on 76 minutes, it arrived to seal the game. McIndoe found space and curled one in with his right foot to make it 3-0. At the end, there were mixed emotions as the news of Chester's win over Gravesend tempered the celebrations and everyone would have to wait just a little longer.

Before then, the small matter of a Somerset Premier Cup semi-final loomed large as Gary Johnson's men travelled to the Hand Stadium, Clevedon. Eleven changes were made, not surprisingly, with an eye to Saturday's trip to Doncaster, and there was a routine 4-0 win for Yeovil.

A Nick Crittenden double along with goals from Chris Giles and Kim Grant saw the greens through to the final. But no one was looking past Belle Vue four days later and that chance to clinch the title.



The end of the season is closing in on us quickly, and owing to the events of the last week, it's apparent that the time is right for another column highlighting the travails of ex-Glover, Alan Pardew.

A wretched four-month tenure at the Baggies finally came to an end over the Easter weekend, a spell that even when viewed in the most generous light cannot be described as anything other than an unmitigated disaster - Pardew's one line of reasonable defence being that he was playing with a squad inherited from Tony Pulis, but even that argument could be tempered somewhat in that in his one transfer window in charge, Pardew put all his eggs in the basket of Daniel Sturridge, a man who in five injury-plagued years at Liverpool has played less than 100 times. Predictably, he's been injured since pretty much the day he signed.

The bigger mystery with Pardew is he is another one of the club of British managers at the top end of the game who repeatedly find employment despite failure following them around like a bad smell. Think Mark Hughes, David Moyes, Steve McLaren. The aforementioned Pulis, Sam Allardyce, and to an extent Roy Hodgson just about scrape a pass due to a track record of (limited) success with limited resources, but Pardew has repeatedly courted controversy and failure in recent seasons, and yet still finds gainful employment. He epitomises the total lack of depth in the English coaching system.

As for West Brom, the writing has been on the wall this season since even Tony Pulis, the master of the attritional grinding out of three points, found the Hawthorns a place where results were hard to come by. That West Brom's worries should be deepening at the exact same time that newly-minted Black

Country rivals Wolves are sauntering to the Championship title must hurt even more, but one worries that West Brom's biggest concerns may lie closer to home.

Sunderland, destined for League One next season, have shown that downward momentum is hard to stop, regardless of parachute payments, and there exist plenty of other examples of former Premier League clubs teetering on the brink in the bottom half of the Championship table.

West Brom's next managerial appointment will be of utmost importance. Pardew's next steps are less clear. Either way, this unhappy four-month marriage, and subsequent divorce, has made the future just a little bit more insecure for everyone involved.



Some players don't have to don Green & White for years on end to leave their lasting mark on the club. Chris Cohen is one of those players, having spent just two seasons at Huish Park before joining Nottingham Forest as part of a £1.2m deal which also saw Arron Davies head to the City Ground.

The box-to-box midfielder made 81 appearances for Town playing an integral part in the Grovers reaching the League One play-off final in 2007, a time the 31-year-old remembers fondly.

"When Yeovil came in, it meant I could stay with my dad, as he actually lived in Yeovil. It was just great as I played a lot of games which was brilliant for me.

"I remember my time there fondly as one of the best times of my career, I always look out for the results.

"The result wasn't what we wanted,

but walking out at Wembley is a real highlight of my time in football so far."

Named in Town's 'Team of the Decade', Cohen became just as big a fans' favourite in Nottingham, earning the captain's armband and making over 300 appearances. Notably, the midfielder scored a vital goal in Forest's 3-0 win at Ipswich on the final day of last season to retain the club's Sky Bet Championship status.

However, plagued by injury the West Ham apprentice has ventured into the next chapter of his career.

Suffering from ongoing knee problems, Cohen has for now turned his attention to co-managing the Under-23s team.

Having spent more than 10 years at the City Ground current manager Aitor Karanka has left the door open for the stalwart to return to playing action.

Whatever Cohen's next step, he'll always be fondly remembered for his time in Somerset.
