

THE CHAIRMAN

I WOULD FIRST LIKE TO WELCOME THE DIRECTORS, PLAYERS AND SUPPORTERS OF LUTON TOWN TO BRUNTON PARK THIS AFTERNOON.



I would then thank all those fans who made the journey to Morecambe last Saturday which brought us the unusual outcome of the away support outnumbering the home support. Our supporters showed they were right behind the team but, unfortunately, we could not come up with the correct result to send them home in good spirits. The run the team are on is remarkable, but we have failed to score the number of goals we required and that has led to us drawing too many games.

We had our Fans' Forum a couple of weeks ago where a number of fans were pretty much straight to the point with complaints about the running of the club. Some were critical that we didn't inform fans enough on a number of issues. I hope we answered them correctly, but I feel that from all of my time with the club the last few years have seen us give more information than ever before. Not only do we now have members from CUOSC on both boards, but since Nigel Clibbens joined us he has written extensive articles and given numerous interviews in an effort to keep you up to date with the happenings at the club.

One difficult area for us is the information we give on transfer fees - received or paid - when players leave the club. I say it's difficult because these days more and more clubs ask us not to release information relating to the deals we do. If we go against these requests, and release details when asked not to, it damages relations with the clubs concerned.

Another pressure on the club at the moment is to release information on players being told whether or not they are to be retained beyond the end of the season. In recent years, particularly under Keith, this information is given (both to those

being offered and those being released) during the week after the season is over. As an added bit of information on this, playing contracts finish at the end of June, and players who are released also get a month's severance pay.

One new facility, hopefully to be introduced next year with the help of club sponsors Heineken and CUOSC, is a Fan Zone which will be situated at one end of the car park. I do hope it will be supported and enjoyed on match days.

Some people complained at the forum that we have not put enough money into the facilities at Brunton Park. When we are able to, we do this, and one example is the new roof which went onto the EVM stand. We also have a new Sponsor's Lounge, where our old admin offices were prior to the floods, and our Sunset Suite was completely refurbished.

Today we are playing one of the top teams in the division. Luton have been trying to get back to League One for a number of seasons, so they will be a big test for our players.

The statement released last Saturday from Bradford City announced that Greg Abbott is to undergo surgery for prostate cancer and will be taking a period of time to recover away from the club.

I would like to let everyone know that I have spoken to Greg prior to his operation and I have sent all our best wishes from the staff and supporters of Carlisle United to both him and his family. He was in good spirits, as always, and I am sure nothing will stop him from achieving a speedy recovery.




MEET THE OPPOSITION MANAGER

NATHAN JONES

WELSHMAN JONES WAS APPOINTED AS JOHN STILL'S SUCCESSOR IN JANUARY 2016. A FORMER COACH AND ASSISTANT-MANAGER AT BRIGHTON & HOVE ALBION, CHARLTON ATHLETIC AND YEOVIL TOWN, HE WAS A PLAYER AT KENILWORTH ROAD IN 1995 BUT LEFT WITHOUT MAKING AN APPEARANCE.

Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances. The 44-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014. In March 2016 Jones signed a new three-and-a-half-year contract with the Hatters to tie him to the club until 2020. His first full season in the hot-seat ended with a fourth-placed finish

and qualification for the League Two play-offs. Jones passed 100 games in charge of the Hatters in October 2017 – the same month in which he picked up his first Sky Bet League Two Manager of the Month award. He then won it again in November, before signing a new four-year deal in January 2018.






9. DANNY HYLTON STRIKER




London-born forward who joined the Town last summer alongside Oxford United team-mate Johnny Mullins, after the pair had helped the U's to promotion to League One and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final. Hylton started his career with Aldershot Town, where he made over 200 appearances in the Conference and League Two before joining Rotherham United in 2013. He played just one game for the then-League One club, however, and was loaned out to Bury and AFC Wimbledon prior to his move to Oxford two years ago. While at the Kassam Stadium Hylton hit 30 goals in 84 starts, but turned down the offer of a new contract in order to pen a two-year deal at Kenilworth Road. The club's top scorer last season with 27 goals, having passed his previous season's best tally of 16 in January, Hylton came in the top three shortlisted for the EFL League Two Player of the Year award as voted by managers in the division, was named in the PFA Team of the Season for the division and won four club player of the year accolades in a memorable campaign.

19. JAMES COLLINS STRIKER



Having netted over 100 career goals – most of which have come in the fourth tier – Collins adds even more firepower to the Town frontline, after signing in June 2017 for an undisclosed fee from Crawley Town on a three-year contract. Since leaving Aston Villa, the 26-year-old pursued a career in the lower leagues, going onto score regularly for the likes of Shrewsbury Town, Swindon Town and the Red Devils. A season in the Scottish Premiership with Hibernian didn't prove as fruitful as planned in the 2013/14 season, but he netted 54 goals upon his return to England before signing for Luton, including 22 last term for Crawley. The Coventry-born former Republic of Ireland U21 international has won promotion three times from League Two; twice with Shrewsbury and once during his loan at Northampton Town in 2016.



1. MAREK STECH

GOALKEEPER


A Czech Republic international – winning one cap in 2014 – the 27-year-old joined the Hatters in June 2017 from Sparta Prague. He joined West Ham United at 16 and gained experience on loan with clubs including Wycombe Wanderers and Yeovil Town. The 6ft 5ins stopper earn cult hero status in Somerset after signing permanently in 2012, helping the Grovers to promotion to the Championship for the first time in the club's history before leaving following their immediate relegation in the summer of 2014 to play in the Europa League with Sparta. Also has 12 Under-21 caps to his name.



2. JAMES JUSTIN

DEFENDER


Luton-born Justin signed a professional contract with the club at the same time as youth team colleague Frankie Musonda in November 2015. Made his senior debut as a substitute against Exeter on the final day of the 2015/16 season and went onto make 39 first team appearances in 2016/17.



3. DAN POTTS

DEFENDER

Potts is predominantly a left-back whose aerial ability also makes him an option at centre-half. The 23-year-old joined the Hatters in summer 2015 from West Ham United, where he made 13 appearances after being handed his debut in a Championship win over Barnsley in December 2011. Potts gained valuable Football League experience on loan at Colchester and Portsmouth before agreeing a two-year deal with the Town.



4. ALAN MCCORMACK

MIDFIELDER


The 33-year-old defensive midfielder joined the Hatters officially on 1st July 2017, after his contract expired with Sky Bet Championship side Brentford. With a number of promotions to his name, including from League Two with Swindon Town and League One with the Bees, McCormack's arrival was a signal of intent for what Nathan Jones aims to achieve in the 2017/18 season. The Irishman has proven his versatility over the years with the likes of Southend and Charlton, playing in both midfield and at right-back while amassing over 450 career appearances before signing for the Hatters.



5. JOHNNY MULLINS

DEFENDER

Experienced centre-half who started out at Reading but left in 2006 without adding to the 50 appearances he'd made during two lengthy loans with Kidderminster. Mullins then spent two years at both Mansfield and Stockport before joining



6. SCOTT CUTHBERT

DEFENDER

Capable of playing at either centre-half or right-back, Cuthbert signed for the Hatters in the summer of 2015 having spent two years at Leyton Orient. He helped the O's reach the League One play-off final the season before last, and prior to that his influential performances enabled Swindon to do the same. He has been capped at B level for Scotland and came through the youth ranks at Celtic, before moving south of the border.



7. JACK STACEY

DEFENDER

A Reading youth product, the 21-year-old – who can operate at right back and in midfield – played six times for the Royals in the Championship. Between 2015 and 2017, he had three loan spells, with Barnet, Carlisle United and Exeter City, but really found his feet with the Grecians last term. A full season at St James Park saw him flourish as he made 38 appearances. Joined the Hatters on a two-year contract after Town agreed terms with the Madejski Stadium outfit.



8. OLLY LEE

MIDFIELDER

Central midfielder Olly started on the books of West Ham. He had two loan spells at Dagenham & Redbridge under former Hatters boss John Still, who brought him to Kenilworth Road, and one at Gillingham before signing for Barnet for 2012/13. He joined Birmingham City before the season was out but was released by the Championship side in 2015 after a spell on loan in League Two with Plymouth.



10. JORDAN COOK

STRIKER

Former Sunderland youngster Cook flew out to Hungary to join the Hatters squad at their pre-season training camp in 2016, where he penned a two-year contract having turned down the offer of a new deal at Walsall. The 27-year-old began his career in the Premier League, making his Black Cats debut as a substitute against Manchester United on Boxing Day 2010. He gained experience on loan at Darlington, Walsall and Carlisle, before heading south to sign for Charlton Athletic in 2012. Cook first worked with Town boss Nathan Jones at The Valley, and after spending two years at Walsall in League One, he jumped at the chance to be reunited with his old Addicks coach last summer.

11. ANDREW SHINNIE
MIDFIELDER

on a season-long loan from Championship side Birmingham City, Shinnie adds experience to Nathan Jones' midfield, having played over 200 first team games across the top three tiers in Scotland as well as the English second tier.



14. HARRY CORNICK
STRIKER

Pace, 22-year-old forward who joined the Hatters from Premier League club Bournemouth in August 2017 for an undisclosed fee. Cornick was originally on the Town's radar as a teenager in Non-League football. He signed for the Cherries in January 2013 as a 17-year-old after impressing on trial but continued playing for Wessex League club Christchurch until the end of that season while completing his A-levels. The Poole-born player made his only professional appearance for Bournemouth as a sub in an FA Cup tie against Rotherham in January 2015, but gained experience on loan at Welling United, Aldershot, Havant & Waterlooville, Yeovil, Leyton Orient and Gillingham.



15. JAKE JERVIS
STRIKER

The former Birmingham City, Portsmouth and Ross County forward became manager Nathan Jones' third signing of transfer deadline day in January 2018 when he moved from Plymouth Argyle for an undisclosed fee. Wolverhampton-born Jervis, who also includes loan spells with Hereford, Notts County, Swindon, Preston, Carlisle and Tranmere – plus a spell in the Turkish Super Lig with Elazigspor – on his CV, had spent the past two-and-a-half seasons with Plymouth.



16. GLEN REA
MIDFIELDER

Highly-rated Republic of Ireland Under-21 international who can operate as a holding midfielder or centre-half. Rea joined the Hatters on loan from Championship club Brighton & Hove Albion in March 2016, making ten appearances, and signed permanently in June 2016.



17. PELLY-RUDDOCK MPANZU
MIDFIELDER

Former West Ham United academy graduate Mpanzu has just enjoyed his longest sequence of matches after an injury-disrupted couple of years. The direct, pacey youngster was an instant hit when signed on-loan by then-boss John Still from the Hammers midway through the Conference title winning campaign of 2013/14.

18. LUKE BERRY
MIDFIELDER

The midfielder joined Town on a three-year deal for an undisclosed fee from Sky Bet League Two rivals Cambridge United in August 2017. One of the top scoring midfielders in the division in recent seasons, the 25-year-old netted 22 times in 2016/17 for the club with whom he started his career.



20. FLYNN DOWNES
MIDFIELDER

Brentwood-born Downes joined the Hatters on loan from Ipswich Town on January transfer deadline day until the end of the season. The 19-year-old has been one of the bright stars of the Championship side's season so far, having penned a three-year contract at Portman Road soon after turning professional in the summer.



21. JACK SENIOR
DEFENDER

A 2016 summer transfer deadline day signing from Huddersfield Town, left-back Senior won the Professional Development League 2 Championship in the 2015/16 season with his former side. The 20-year-old left the Terriers after a nine-year association with the club, signing for the Hatters on a two-year deal.



22. LUKE GAMBIN
MIDFIELDER

Maltese international who became Nathan Jones' second signing of the January 2017 transfer window when he moved from Barnet for an undisclosed fee. Gambin had been with the Bees since joining as an apprentice in 2009 and had made 136 appearances, scoring 15 times, while helping the north London club win the Conference title in 2014-15 and establish themselves back in League Two.



24. LAWSON D'ATH
MIDFIELDER


The attacking midfielder joined the Hatters from Northampton Town at the beginning of the January transfer window in 2017 on an 18-month deal, with the club having the option to extend it for an extra year.



27. AARON JARVIS
STRIKER

Teenage frontman who joined the Hatters from Southern League Premier Division side Basingstoke Town just minutes before the transfer deadline in August. The 19-year-old progressed through the Hampshire Non-League club's academy and scored 17 times in 2016/17, his first season in senior football, before making the step up from the seventh tier.

28. LLOYD JONES
DEFENDER

Defender who joined the Hatters for an undisclosed fee from Premier League giants Liverpool on transfer deadline day in August 2018. Plymouth-born Jones started out in the youth ranks at his hometown club Plymouth Argyle, before Liverpool paid a reported six-figure fee to take him to Anfield in 2011.




33. KAVAN COTTER
MIDFIELDER

Strong, hard-working midfield player who was offered his first professional contract at the end of his second year as a scholar. Cotter, who joined the club as an Under-13 having previously been at Arsenal and QPR, played a key role in the youth team's run to the FA Youth Cup quarter-finals in 2015/16, then captained the Under-18s the following season.



35. ARTHUR READ
MIDFIELDER

Skilful, tricky midfield player who signed his first professional contract just four months into his first year as a scholar, in November 2016. The Leighton Buzzard youngster joined the club at Under-9s and is comfortable playing on either side of midfield or off the front.




40. HARRY ISTED
GOALKEEPER

Young goalkeeper who joined the Hatters in August 2017 after a pre-season trial following his release by Premier League club Stoke City. The 20-year-old put pen to paper on a one-year contract to become the third signing between the sticks at Kenilworth Road during the close season, providing competition for Marek Stech and James Shea.




36. JAMES SHEA
GOALKEEPER

After coming through the academy at Arsenal, the keeper had loan spells with Southampton and Dagenham & Redbridge before plying his trade in Non-League football with Needham Market and Harrow Borough after his release by the Gunners in 2013.



37. FRANKIE MUSONDA
DEFENDER

Centre-half and captain of 2015/16's hugely successful youth team that won the Under-18s' Football League Youth Alliance league and cup double, as well as reaching the quarter-finals of the FA Youth Cup. The 19-year-old penned his first professional contract with the Hatters in November 2015, making his debut as a substitute at Mansfield the following January, having joined the club's centre of excellence in 2006.




38. ELLIOT LEE
STRIKER

Elliot Lee is in his second spell at the club – this time on a permanent deal – having had a short loan spell from West Ham United in 2015. The 22-year-old was an instant hit at Kenilworth Road, netting with his first touch away at AFC Wimbledon, before scoring

twice against Wycombe Wanderers at home. Whilst at West Ham, the forward had loan spells with Colchester United, Southend United and Blackpool, before leaving in 2016 to join Barnsley. Having found game time limited at Oakwell, making just six appearances, he joined the Hatters in July 2017 on a two-year deal.

39. AKIN FAMEWO
DEFENDER

Powerful central defender from Beeston near Sandy in Bedfordshire, who joined the club as an Under-11. The 18-year-old signed his first pro contract in July 2016 after travelling to Hungary for the senior squad's pre-season training camp, and made his debut as a substitute in the 2-1 win over Newport County in August.



40. HARRY ISTED
GOALKEEPER

Young goalkeeper who joined the Hatters in August 2017 after a pre-season trial following his release by Premier League club Stoke City. The 20-year-old put pen to paper on a one-year contract to become the third signing between the sticks at Kenilworth Road during the close season, providing competition for Marek Stech and James Shea.




44. ALAN SHEEHAN
DEFENDER

Cultured defender Sheehan joined the Hatters on loan from Bradford City in January 2016, becoming Nathan Jones' first signing after taking over as manager. The Irishman made 20 appearances and captained the team for the final seven matches of 2015-16 after Scott Cuthbert suffered a season-ending injury. The left-footer can operate at either full-back or in central defence, and has made over 300 appearances in his career so far with the majority coming during two spells with Notts County. Sheehan also counts Leeds United and Swindon Town among his former employers, as well as loans with Mansfield, Crewe, Oldham and Peterborough United, after starting out at Leicester City. He signed a permanent deal with the Town in May 2016 and made 41 appearances in his first full season, including his 50th in a Luton shirt in a 0-0 draw at Carlisle.

A double substitution after the break provided the spark for Carlisle United which took them on to an amazing victory which saw them come from two goals behind to grab three dramatic match-winning goals.

The Hatters looked bright from the off as they passed the ball on the edge of the United box but it was the visitors who created the first opening when Asamoah tricked his way behind the back line. His cross was met by Miller but he couldn't keep his header down and it flew over the bar.

Carlisle used their goal kick to good effect when Lawless picked the loose ball up in midfield. He fed it to Marriott and the former Carlisle loanee made no mistake as he took a touch, spun and thumped an unstoppable shot into the back of the net.

Tails were up in the home ranks and Ellis had to be on his guard as Green bent a free kick into the six-yard box. The clearing header was quickly returned but Raynes did well to slide in and stop Marriott from going for goal.

A clearly buoyed home side started to

press on and a raking pass from Lee took Lawless out wide. His cross brought a header from McQuoid and Gillespie was relieved to see it zip over the bar.

Green was next to try his luck with a long range rasper which zipped over the target, but Carlisle almost grabbed an equaliser courtesy of a long throw from Ellis. A ricochet invited Miller to shoot but Tyler dived low to complete a fantastic save.

A 25-yard free kick from Green was little to write home about as Luton continued to probe, and Miller was unlucky at the other end when he got onto a clipped cross from Hery. His connection had power but he couldn't quite find the direction it needed.

Carlisle knocked on the door again when a Grainger free kick from the half way line was nodded on by Raynes. The keeper came out to get it, but it fell loose, with plenty of blue shirts in attendance. Asamoah stretched out a leg but his toe-poke went well wide.

The visitors suddenly looked the better side and some neat passing between Hery and Kennedy gave Grainger the chance to cross. Raynes leaped high but Tyler stood strong to make a block.


Another glanced header from Raynes found Ellis with time at the back post and he put his head in his hands as he lobbed the ball into the stands as Tyler crept off his line. It was one-way traffic and the Luton keeper had to use quick feet to beat another Raynes head from under his bar as it threatened to creep over the line.

CUSC LONDON BRANCH UPDATE



LAST SUMMER THE LONDON BRANCH DECIDED TO GET BEHIND TONY HOPPER'S CAMPAIGN TO RAISE FUNDS FOR THE MOTOR NEURONE DISEASE ASSOCIATION.

It was not until January that we were able to unveil the banner that you can now see at the Waterworks End. Hopefully this will remind everyone that this is an on-going problem that affects many individuals and their families in the north-west.

For a number of years my son has suggested that I take part in the local, to me, St Albans Charity Cycle Ride. I have always had a good reason for declining. This year I seemed to have a good reason to give it a go so that I could help "The Tony Hopper Fight Back Fund" to reach its target as it now so very close to the £10,000, with less than £1,000 to go.

I now cycle nearly every day as part of my constant exercise routine to deal with the lack of cartilage in my right knee and osteo-arthritis in both of them. The 40 mile route will represent a challenge; particularly given I lost nearly all of last summer due to severe problems with my knees. But challenges are only there to be met and overcome.

I shall be using an elderly Dawes bicycle I discovered in the excellent Recycle centre in one of the arches below Carlisle Station and behind the swimming pool. As well as restoring bicycles the centre offers employment opportunities. I calculate the bicycle and I will have a combined age of over 150, possibly the oldest partnership taking part in the ride. I could have gone for something spectacular to grab the media's attention. I had contemplated a marathon tapas tour through Andalucia, a 48 hour sunbathing endurance session in Crete and a paddlathon along the beaches of the Algarve. Carrying or pushing a toilet

and cistern had also entered the permutations. Nothing had so far gripped the imagination and awakened enthusiasm but then I was presented with the opportunity to cycle from some disused cow sheds near St Albans to the outskirts of Hitchin and back again. Quite simply, it was a no brainer.

40 miles through the inhospitable, barren wasteland they call "The North." Yes, North Herts. is fraught with dangers, endless smiling girls on huge horses filling the road, frequent elderly walking groups armed with sharply pointed poles and never mind the threat from some mongrel alsetter or Rottwoxer hurtling into you and a distant cry of "Fenton!" from beyond the hedge.

The sting does come in the tail, as it will after 40 miles on my bicycle seat, because this is the bit where I ask if you would kindly put your hand in your pocket to help this worthy cause. The money raised by the "Tony Hopper Fight Back Fund" will be used in the North West area to help individuals and families afflicted by MND.

The St Albans Charity Cycle Ride takes place on Sunday May 13th but very early in the morning so there is no expectation of crowds cheering us on our way. You can find more details if you look at www.saccr.co.uk



"We've seen in the recent past that there are some very good players over there who fall out of the system at all ages, from clubs like Sunderland and Newcastle United, but they're still good enough to go on to have very successful careers."

"I've been talking to Park View for a long time now, and they have a structure which fits with our own professional ethos," he added. "It's an exceptional facility, and the players will get a high standard of educational opportunities alongside their football needs."

"If players develop as we think they will, the opportunity will also be there for them to play over here. Having looked at the campus, met the staff and explored the vision and pathway, it's become clear that it is going to be hugely beneficial to all parties."

"Park View will be playing in the National Football Youth League which is primarily for those lads who have been released at 16, and those who are extending their scholarship having moved on from clubs at 18. We think there will be a wealth of talent for us to take a very close look at." Lewis Pendleton, the Director of Sport at Park View Academy, said: "We founded

Park View Academy of Sport are based at the Emirates International Ground Riverside Chester-le-Street. This new partnership will provide pathways for 16 to 19-year-old footballers who are not affiliated to professional club's academies the chance to be part of a football scholarship scheme, representing Carlisle United in a National League structure. "Moving across here to live in digs adds pressure to what is an already intense two-year period, but we've been very

the academy last year, and it's effectively a third campus of Park View school which is dedicated to sport.

"We're based at the Emirates International Cricket Ground in Durham and we have world class facilities, which includes full-sized grass pitches, a 3G pitch and a centre showcase pitch with an athletics track.

"The push for us at the moment is to develop the 16 to 19-year-old programme alongside Carlisle United. That means we are basically expanding Carlisle United's academy into the north-east."

Another managerial success this year has been that of **Danny Cowley** at **Lincoln City** and – fresh from lifting the Checkatrade Trophy in their first visit to Wembley Stadium – the former Braintree boss has confirmed he is close to signing a new contract. Cowley and his assistant, brother Nicky, only signed new deals in January 2017 and their current deals at Sincil Bank run until 2021. But with the promotion-winning manager reportedly drawing interest from Championship outfit Ipswich Town, director Clive Nates and Cowley himself have been quick to state that the boss is set to sign a new deal.

Cowley said: "That [staying] has always been the plan. I keep saying it but no-one seems to listen. It came as no surprise to see Neil Warnock going ballistic about it, but I very much doubt he would have acted any differently had the boot been on his own foot, and it's not as if Nuno Santo didn't try extremely hard to shake the hand of the Bluebirds boss after he finished his celebrations with the Wolves players.

I've never been a good loser to be perfectly honest, so I can't 100% say I wouldn't have cracked a little bit of a huff in similar circumstances, but the issue for me is more that managers and players are always crying

out for more passion to be shown, both on the pitch and from the stands, but then when someone does that they complain bitterly about it. If the Wolves coaching staff can't show a massive amount of passion after an ending to the game like that, then when can they? It strikes of an oft seen situation in football where some people only want to see passion on their side, and not the other.

As far as the two missed penalties were concerned, I have to say that I had very little faith in our old friend Gary 'the Goal Machine' Madine as he stepped up to take the first one, and I would imagine a good deal of Warnock's frustration was aimed that way after shelling out up to £6million for the ex-United man in January. On the second spot-kick the pressure on Junior Hoilett must have been immense, and so it was no surprise to see him blast the ball onto the underside of the crossbar.

Then after all that in such a huge match with the enormous carrot of the riches of the Premier League dangling, some people are going to make an issue of Nuno Santo not shaking Warnock's hand first before charging on the pitch to celebrate? For my money it was great to see how much it meant to the coaching staff in this day and age, when it often seems the trend as a manager to

sit there looking glum faced and miserable when your side have scored, although no-one will ever do it as well as the former Dynamo Kyiv boss Valeriy Lobanovskiy.

One thing about goal celebrations though, at least the massively choreographed ones seem to be dying a little bit of death, despite the best efforts of Dele Alli. It's probably an age thing as far as I am concerned, but it does rather grind my gears when I see two grown men on thousands and thousands of pounds a week doing some ridiculous kind of Patty Cake extravaganza after a goal. Just a simple stiff handshake and a trot back to the half-way line will do for us middle-aged men thank you very much.

There is a middle ground though and it's great to see such passion as there was at the Cardiff against Wolves match, and it's even better of course when you see it at Brunton Park from our own players and staff. But, if you're hankering back to those Carlisle United days when we saw the rowing boat celebration at Cambridge in 1997 I think it was, then I fear you've had it as time has moved on. Hopefully though it will still be us celebrating some goals this afternoon however tough a game it looks on paper.


