

THE MANAGER



NATHAN JONES

Good afternoon and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the first time for a competitive game since we celebrated promotion from Sky Bet League Two. I hope you have all enjoyed the summer break and are ready to get behind the team at the higher level.

I'd like to welcome everyone connected with Sunderland to Bedfordshire, including supporters, directors, officials, manager Jack Ross, his staff and their players. Jack has made the move down from Scotland and of course, I wish him well for the season and a safe journey back to the north-east tonight.

We kicked off our League One campaign last week at Portsmouth and I felt we were outstanding in our performance, but now we go up a level and we might not get away with the odd error. They had one chance and they scored one goal, which effectively stopped us getting anything out of the game.

Sonny Bradley, Matty Pearson and Jorge Grant are players we have tracked for a long time and were our top targets for the summer. They have all done well against us in the past for Plymouth, Accrington and Notts County, and we have high hopes that they can replicate that form and be even more effective in our environment.

Phenomenal

I know that you'll back them, and the other players, as you always do. To take almost 2,400 to Portsmouth last week was phenomenal and those who travelled were outstanding, just as you were throughout last season.

The team's performance certainly silenced the Pompey Chimes, and all you could hear was our fans who really got behind the team, but sadly we couldn't get something out of the game, which we deserved. Hopefully today will be different.

We had some wonderful atmospheres here last season, so let's embrace the challenge of the higher level and make the place rock again.

Enjoy the game and the nine months that lie ahead.



FROM THE BOARDROOM

WITH CHAIRMAN DAVID WILKINSON

Good afternoon everyone. Isn't it great to be at Kenilworth Road for the start of a new season and to be back in League One after a ten-year absence. Last week was our tenth anniversary as custodians of the Club. What a roller-coaster ride it has been!!

Our visitors today are Sunderland and we welcome all the officials, players and supporters from the Black Cats to this, our first home game of the season.

It truly demonstrates the vagaries of football when you think that five years ago our clubs were five divisions apart. However, we understand more than any other club that adversity can make you stronger and the lows make you appreciate the highs even more.

We last played each other just prior to our relegation from the Championship in 2007 and were hammered 5-0, a result which ensured their promotion to the Premier League as champions.

Their recent fall and experience of others only goes to prove how increasingly competitive the leagues have become. It was interesting for me to find that every team in the Championship this year has spent some time in the Premier League or its equivalent.

Those of you who were at Portsmouth last weekend saw a tremendous performance not matched by the result. Even their directors admitted that we were unlucky not to take anything from the game. Some of the play was scintillating to watch. Let's hope we can keep it up.

Activity on the transfer front has been a bit quieter and slower this Summer due in part to the World Cup. Nevertheless, we say goodbye to Olly Lee, Johnny Mullins, Lawson D'Ath, Jordan Cook, Scott Cuthbert, Kavan Cotter and six second year scholars.

They will always be welcome at Kenilworth Road and we wish them all well in their future careers.

We are delighted that we have been able to attract Nathan's main targets and welcome Matty Pearson, Sonny Bradley and Jorge Grant. We hope they have a long, happy and successful stay with us.

We welcome Ian Montone as a new member of our Vice President's club. Ian is based in California and is the founder of music management business Monotone Inc. whose clients include the White Stripes and Vampire Weekend.

He joins as a VP and adds to the musical award winners already present in Emma Banks and Rob Stringer. We are very proud of our international fan base and along with other foreign connections being established it is exciting for the long-term to see such diversity coming together at the Kenny (or Power Court).

Shortly after the play-offs are over and the season finally finishes, the EFL holds its Annual Conference and AGM at which all 72 clubs are represented by owners and management. The purpose of the event is to provide an opportunity for Clubs to meet and discuss matters affecting the game and to approve or otherwise changes to rules and regulations. This year there has been a welcome doubling of prize money in the FA Cup, and there were some minor rule changes – perhaps the most notable being that managers and coaches will now be subject to yellow and red cards for bad behaviour in the technical area.



When the players return from their break after an intense few days of testing and training they head out for a pre-season tour, which normally lasts a week. This year it was held at a ski resort in the north-west of Slovenia (pictured), close to the borders of Austria and Italy. It was an excellent facility. A short walk to a full-sized pitch with an excellent playing surface and all the necessary training aids including a gym, which was supplied with our own equipment driven in a white van all the way from Luton.

For the last few years Mike Herrick and I have tagged-along, and it gives us the opportunity of not only watching everyone perform, but also the chance to get to know the coaches and players a bit more and see how things tick. I think we've all noticed how much more technical and scientific it becomes each succeeding year. In the old days it was a kind of boot camp, which mainly involved tough fitness training without a ball in sight, but now although just as tough it seems to an untrained eye that it is more designed to increase intensity and speed of thought with and without the ball.

Ambition

Finally, but most importantly, we come to an update on Planning. As we have said before, and most of you are aware, we can have no genuine ambition until we have a new state of the art stadium. In fact, it will be virtually impossible to survive without it.

It is now more than two years since we put forward our plans and, like you, we are all very frustrated by the time the process has taken so far. However, we believe we are on the last lap now and do understand that such major projects need thorough scrutiny before the plans can be regarded as sound. The independent retail impact assessments have been published, proving the impact on our town centre is below minimal, and the consultation period has started, after which the Planning Officer will write his report and recommendation for the Council development committee to consider and approve or otherwise. So hopefully we are getting close and will do everything we can to help progress the issue.

Let's hope for good news on this front in the next few months and more performances like that at Portsmouth, but with better results.


THE SKIPPER


Let's try and carry on our home form from last season into this one with a good result today. We're going to need you every step of the way, so get behind the boys and enjoy the game.

AGE: 26


STATUS: FREE AGENT AFTER DEPARTING PLYMOUTH ARGYLE





WHO?

Tuesday night's hosts have lifted the League Cup on the same amount of occasions as the Hatters – the Baggies winning the competition in 1966. They were also runners-up in 1967 and 1970. Their eight-season stay in the Premier League came to an end in May as they were relegated, finishing bottom of the table. But there is hope of an immediate return – new boss Darren Moore saw his side go on a decent end of season run, which they will be looking to carry into the new term.



STADIUM - THE HAWTHORNS

Home to the Baggies since 1900, the record attendance at the ground is 64,815, for an FA Cup Sixth Round tie against Arsenal. Interestingly (or not!) the ground is the highest out of all the 92 league teams, sitting over 150m above sea level. There's 93 miles between Kenilworth Road and the Hawthorns, if you travel via the M6.

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

The last time we faced the Baggies was back in October 2016, when the Hatters defeated them 2-0

in the Checkatrade Trophy. Alex Gilliead and Jake Gray grabbed the goals for the Town. That was the 43rd meeting between the two, with Town winning ten, drawing nine and losing 23.

PUBS

The Vine is a 15-minute walk from the Hawthorns, with away supporters welcome. The address of the venue is 152 Roebuck Street, B70 6RD.

TRAVEL

As we said above, via the M6 the route is about 90 miles. You can head down the M40 as well, which is just over 100 miles. Bobbers Travel Club are charging £24 for adults and £21 for concessions. The train journey from Luton isn't ideal – four changes and just over three hours, one way. However, the journey from Milton Keynes is kinder, taking under an hour-and-a-half.

RESULTS SO FAR

The Baggies have yet to record their first win of the new season, after an opening day defeat at home to Bolton was followed up on Tuesday by a 1-1 draw at Nottingham Forest. Matt Phillips struck an 87th-minute leveller for the Baggies, who gave a debut to Dwight Gayle, the striker signed on season-long loan from Newcastle.



Ross has unsurprisingly bolstered his side with real quality, bringing in Charlie Wyke from Bradford City and Luke O'Nien from Wycombe Wanderers amongst many others, with big players who came down with them from the second tier now off the wage bill.

It's little wonder as to why his services were sought after, the Scotsman opting for the Black Cats over Championship outfit Ipswich Town, as well as turning down Barnsley's advances last season.

His team got off to the winning start they would have no doubt wanted last week – after falling behind to a penalty against Charlton Athletic, Josh Maja got them back on level terms before Lynden Gooch grabbed a winner in the 96th minute at the Stadium of Light.




THE GAFFER

Jon McLaughlin

Age: 30

A Scottish international having made his debut against Mexico in May this year, the 30-year-old was born in Edinburgh, but made a name for himself south of the border in Yorkshire. Non-League spells with Harrogate Railway Athletic and Harrogate Town were followed by a move to Bradford City in May 2008. After being in and out of the first team for much of his time there, the stopper played in every league game of the 2013-14 season, before joining Burton Albion. Part of their double promotion winning side that went from League Two to the Championship, he signed for Hearts of Midlothian last season, before returning to English football this campaign with Sunderland.



DID YOU KNOW?

Sunderland's most recent FA Cup win – a 1-0 win over Leeds United in 1973 – at the time was the first time a second-tier side had won the competition since 1931. Manager Bob Stokoe made his name as a player at north-east rivals Newcastle United,

but will be forever remembered by Mackems as he sprinted down the touchline at Wembley in a mackintosh and trilby after his team beat Don Revie's United side packed with international players. A statue outside the Stadium of Light is dedicated to Stokoe.


THE WALL**Glenn Loovens**
Age: 34

The experienced centre-back started his career in his homeland with Feyenoord. Progressing through the youth system, he made his first team debut in the 2001/02 season, playing alongside Robin Van Persie. He spent spells out on loan with Excelsior and De Graafschap, as well as Cardiff City. He made the move permanently to Wales in 2006, where he remained for two seasons before switching to Scotland to play for Celtic. A season in La Liga with Real Zaragoza came in 2012, before he signed for Sheffield Wednesday. He made 150 appearances in five years at Hillsborough, moving to Sunderland in the summer.

**IN THE MIDDLE****Dylan McGeouch**
Age: 25

The midfielder signed for the Black Cats in the summer after a four-year stint at Hibernian. His youth career saw him start at Celtic, before signing for Rangers. He returned to Celtic after Neil Lennon visited his house to convince him to go back. He made 27 appearances for the Bhoys, as well as going out on loan to Coventry City for half a season before signing for Hibs on a loan deal in 2014, making it permanent the following year. Under Lennon, the 25-year-old helped the Edinburgh side win promotion back to the Scottish Premier League in a midfield that included Andrew Shinnie.

McGeouch made his international debut for Scotland in May, in a 2-0 defeat to Peru.

**JACK BALDWIN**
Age: 25

A climber from Non-League, he started his career with Faversham Town before earning a move to Hartlepool United and then Peterborough United. A utility player, he signed a two-year deal in July.

DONALD LOVE
Age: 28

Signed by the Black Cats alongside Paddy McNair from Manchester United for a combined fee of £5.5m, he made one Premier League appearance for the Red Devils.

REECE JAMES
Age: 24


Released by Wigan Athletic in the summer, the defender signed a one-year deal with the Black Cats in July. Started his career with Manchester United.

CLASSIC CLASH WITH THE BLACK CATS

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES...

18TH OCTOBER 1979 • LUTON TOWN 2 SUNDERLAND 0

After narrowly missing out on relegation to Division Three (now League One) at the end of manager David Pleat's first full season in charge of 1978/79, Luton Town supporters were hoping for much better in the coming campaign.

Pleat had already stated that stabilising the club was a three-year exercise and was determined to make the squad stronger ready for a promotion push. To this end he paid £200,000 to Mansfield for centre-half Mike Saxby and a tribunal fixed £150,000 for Orient midfielder Tony Grealish. The 'Os' had originally demanded £350,000 for Grealish, but Pleat manipulated the new tribunal system to his advantage, as he was to do so many times again in the future.

The Town adopted a new strip which placed less emphasis on the orange of the previous six seasons and for the first time a sponsor's name, 'Tricentrol', was emblazoned across the players' shirts.

Despite all the expectation the season got off to a poor start with a two-legged defeat to Gillingham in the League Cup before Cambridge United arrived at Kenilworth Road for the first league game and returned with a point after a drab encounter.

David Moss had been signed the previous summer but Luton supporters had not seen the best of the mercurial winger due to a deep-seated groin injury which affected his effectiveness. Now fully fit, Moss scored twice at Bristol Rovers in the next game, but the Town still lost 3-2 with future Hatter Steve White netting two of his own for the Pirates.

The first win eventually came in game three when Orient were narrowly seen off at Kenilworth Road, but the season suddenly sparked to life with a 3-1 win at promotion favourites Leicester watched by the 'Match

of the Day' cameras, who saw Moss clinch victory with a stunning shot in the final minute.

A combination of attractive, newly-promoted Swansea and the previous week's exploits at Leicester meant that a crowd of 10,004 turned up at Kenilworth Road the following week. They were rewarded with a five-star show and a 5-0 win with every goal out of the textbook.

An unusual combination of results actually took the Town to the top of the Division Two (now Championship) table for the first time since 1970, but the team dropped back a place following hard fought draws away at Notts County and at home to Oldham.


The bandwagon continued to roll with a 3-1 win at Fulham, followed by a temporary set-back in the shape of a 2-1 defeat at Cardiff – a game the Town should have won at a canter.

Back at Kenilworth Road a first-half hat-trick from wily striker Bob Hatton set up an easy win over Bristol Rovers, leading up to one of the highlights of the season; a home clash with Sunderland.

Sunderland were always attractive opposition and the cameras were present again, together with a best of the season crowd of 13,504. This was seen by David Pleat to be the toughest test of the campaign so far and he was soon proved correct.

Sunderland dominated the early exchanges and put the Luton defence under extreme pressure. Both John Hawley and Barry Dunn hit the woodwork for the visitors and only a stream of fine saves from Hatters' goalkeeper Jake Findlay kept the score level.

With the Luton supporters hoping to go in at the interval without conceding a goal, an opportunist strike from Moss turned the game on its head and gave the scoreline an unrealistic look.

Showing instant control to kill a long cross from Hatton, and surrounded by defenders, Moss chipped a delicate shot over Sunderland goalkeeper Chris Turner for what was regarded by the BBC as one of the 'goals of the season'.


The second half started with the Town showing far more purpose and it was the Sunderland defence that was now on the end of a battering. It therefore

came as no surprise when Moss increased the lead on the hour after cleverly side-stepping Turner to stroke the ball home.

Sunderland came more into the game in the final quarter and only a couple of excellent saves by Findlay kept the Luton goal intact, but the final action saw Brian Stein unleash a 20-yard drive that thudded against the crossbar.

Sunderland manager Ken Knighton felt that his side were unlucky not to secure at least a point, but he had to agree that the game was an excellent advertisement for Second Division football.

THE LAST TIME SUNDERLAND CAME TO TOWN

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH REPORTS ON THE BLACK CATS' LAST VISIT TO KENILWORTH ROAD

28TH AUGUST 2007

LUTON TOWN 3 SUNDERLAND 0 (CARLING CUP ROUND 2)

Following relegation from the Championship at the end of 2006-07, manager Kevin Blackwell set about ringing the changes at Kenilworth Road and over a bewildering summer, players arrived or departed almost daily.

This led to nine players making their Town debuts in the opening day 2-1 win over Hartlepool at Kenilworth Road with two of them, Darren Currie and Alan Goodall, netting the all-important goals to get the season off with a bang.

A victory at Dagenham in the Carling Cup and a home win over Gillingham sandwiched a poor display and defeat at Swindon, as the new players continued to gel. Next up was a visit from Sunderland in the second round of the Carling Cup and an early chance to get even with the Black Cats.

Sunderland had won 5-0 at Kenilworth Road on the final day of the 2006/07 campaign as they clinched the championship on an awful afternoon when the Town players appeared to throw in the towel.

Sweet!

Sunderland manager Roy Keane put out a strong side of Premier League quality, but they were made to look second best as goals from David Bell and veteran striker Paul Furlong earned a comfortable interval lead.

The visitors tried to push on in the second half but the dismissal of Greg Halford for two yellow cards within ten minutes did not help their cause.

It was left to Furlong to cap off a masterful display with the Town's third goal after 76 minutes and with it a comprehensive victory. Revenge was sweet!


► January 1937

► November 1955

The Hatters, newly promoted to Division One (now the Premier League), go goal crazy with an 8-2 home win in front of 25,802 ecstatic supporters. Bob Morton nets a hat-trick against a side that stands top of the table at the start of play.


► August 1956


► February 1958


► February 1976

The Hatters win 2-0 against promotion chasing Sunderland in a pulsating game at Kenilworth Road in front of a crowd of 15,338. Bobby Moncur scores an own goal after Jimmy Husband forces an error, with Ron Futcher adding a late clincher.



► September 1978

The Town beat FA Cup holders Sunderland 1-0 at Roker Park courtesy of a goal from Barry Butlin. Scant revenge though for the defeat at Roker in the previous season's FA Cup quarter-final.



► September 1983

In this, the first home match of the season, the game is scoreless at the interval but efforts from Ricky Hill, Paul Walsh, Brian Stein and an own goal from Iain Munro in the second period end in a convincing 4-1 victory.

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES FOUR NOTABLE POST-WAR SUNDERLAND GOALSCORING PARTNERSHIPS

LEN SHACKLETON & TREVOR FORD

Skilful England international inside-forward Len Shackleton gained five caps while at Sunderland. A former Arsenal amateur, he joined Bradford Park Avenue in December 1940 and created a big reputation in wartime football.

The 'Clown Prince of Soccer' moved to Newcastle United for £13,000 in October 1946 and scored six goals on his debut, joining Sunderland for a then record £20,050 in February 1948. Starring as they were twice FA Cup semi-finalists, he was joint top scorer in 1951-52 and netted 98 times in 320 League games until injury ended his career in September 1957 and became a journalist. He died in Kendal, Cumbria in November 2000.

Welsh international centre-forward Trevor Ford was Sunderland's top scorer in 1952-53. Signing professional for Swansea in December 1944, he joined Aston Villa for £12,000 in January 1947 and was leading marksman three times before moving to Sunderland for £29,500 in October 1950.


Joint top scorer in 1951-52, he netted 67 goals in 108 League games for The Lads prior to joining Cardiff City for £30,000 in December 1953 and helped them win the Welsh Cup in 1956. He moved to PSV Eindhoven in November 1956, then played for Newport County and Romford. Later working in the motor trade, he resided in Swansea until his death in May 2003.

BILLY HUGHES & BRYAN ROBSON


Scotland international striker Billy Hughes featured prominently in Sunderland's 1973 FA Cup final success. The younger brother of Celtic striker John Hughes, he turned professional with Sunderland in February 1966 and was ever-present in their 1974-75 promotion near-miss, gaining his solitary cap against Sweden.

He helped win the Second Division title in 1975-76 and netted 74 goals in 288 League games while at Roker Park before briefly joining Derby County in August 1977, then played for Leicester City, Carlisle United and San Jose Earthquakes. Later a licensee in Derby, he became club steward at Stressholme Golf Club in Darlington.

Former England U-23 striker Bryan 'Pop' Robson was leading marksman in Sunderland's 1975-76 Second Division title triumph. He began with Newcastle United in November 1962, helping to win the Second Division title in 1964-65 and Fairs Cup in 1969. Moving to West Ham in February 1971, he joined Sunderland in June 1974 and was also leading scorer in 1974-75. He returned to West Ham in October 1976, rejoining Sunderland in June 1979 and was top scorer again in 1979-80. Later with Chelsea, Carlisle United and Sunderland for a third spell, he netted 60 goals in 154 League games overall for The Lads. He became Sunderland's chief scout.

MARCO GABBIADINI & ERIC GATES

England B international striker Marco Gabbiadini was leading marksman in Sunderland's 1987-88 Third Division title triumph. Initially with York City, he followed Denis Smith to Sunderland in September 1987 and also starred in their 1989-90 promotion campaign.

He scored 74 goals in 157 League games before being sold to Crystal Palace for £1.8m in October 1991, then played for Derby County, helping to win promotion in 1995-96. After spells at Stoke City and York, he joined Darlington in July 1998 and was twice leading scorer. He helped reach the Third Division play-off final, then had spells with Northampton Town and Hartlepool.

Ex-England international striker Eric Gates was 'Player of the Year' in Sunderland's 1987-88 Third Division title success. The younger brother of Middlesbrough centre-half Bill Gates, he turned professional with Ipswich in October 1972, starring in their 1973 FA Youth Cup and 1981 UEFA Cup triumphs. He joined Sunderland in August 1985 and also featured in their 1989-90 promotion campaign, netting 43 goals in 181 League games while at Roker Park before moving to Carlisle United in June 1990. Later assisting Hartlepool, Newton Aycliffe, Staindrop and West Auckland, he worked for Century FM North East radio prior to becoming a pig farmer.

NIALL QUINN & KEVIN PHILLIPS

Republic of Ireland international striker Niall Quinn was 'Player of the Year' in Sunderland's 1998-99 First Division title triumph. Signing professional for Arsenal in November 1983, he featured in their 1987 League Cup final success and moved to Manchester City in March 1990. He was top scorer in 1990-91, reuniting with Peter Reid at Sunderland for £1.3m in August 1996. Overcoming a knee injury, he starred alongside Kevin Phillips as they were First Division play-off finalists in 1997-98, netting 61 goals in 203 League games before retiring in November 2002. Later Sunderland's manager, then chairman, he became a Sky Sports pundit.

England international striker Kevin Phillips was Sunderland's top scorer in six successive seasons. Initially with Southampton, he moved via Baldock to Watford in December 1994 and joined Sunderland for £325,000 in July 1997. Starring as they were First Division play-off finalists in 1997-98 and won the First Division title in 1998-99, he netted 113 goals 208 League games, moving to Southampton for £3.25m in August 2003. He joined Aston Villa in July 2005, then was a promotion winner with West Brom in 2007-08 and Birmingham City in 2008-09. Following a spell at Blackpool, he helped both Crystal Palace and Leicester City to clinch promotion.


Fight


SUMMARY

SIX DAY COMMUNITY STADIUM EVENT REACHES OVER 5,000 PARTICIPANTS

Seems only five minutes since we were celebrating automatic promotion last season and no play-off drama! One of the big benefits to the Trust of this meant the Club were able to donate the stadium to us for an unbelievable five days before the new pitch was laid. In those five days we managed to engage with over 5,000 participants as we invited young and old to take part in a series of projects and events.

First up was the culmination of our Football for Peace project. Luton Council and Luton Town FC Community Trust have joined together with Football for Peace to enable young people to work together within communities to create greater mutual understanding and respect, while developing personal skills in the process. Whilst learning sports leadership skills, during the course training, the young ambassadors aged 16 and 17 attended a variety of workshops looking at issues such as

equality and diversity, learning ways to tackle prejudice, hate crime and extremism, while developing skills such as conflict management. On the day, boys and girls from local schools arrived and to emphasise the nature of the event, the squads were given names such as "diversity", "cohesion" and "equality". Spectators included both the Town's MPs Gavin Shuker and Kelvin Hopkins, LBC Mayor Ayub, LBC CEO Trevor Holden, Luton Town CEO Gary Sweet, Chairman David Wilkinson and club legend, Mick Harford. Cllr Aslam Khan, LBC portfolio holder for Safer, Stronger Communities, said: "Today was a fantastic event. The town recently united to celebrate the achievements of its sporting heroes and initiatives like Football for Peace are another great way of drawing people together. These enthusiastic ambassadors have learnt a great deal. While in some ways the tournament marks the end of their programme, I'm sure their energy and



enthusiasm will continue to inspire others from all sections of our community for many years to come."

Following straight after our Football for Peace event we continued with the community cohesion theme by holding an U16 PL KICKS tournament on the pitch. Teams from Stevenage, Milton Keynes, Leyton Orient and West Ham travelled to take on our Luton Town teams which were made up from boys across the town. In all over 150 boys attended the event and as part of the evening the boys attended an anti-knife crime workshop that included a 'real life' story from Channitta Lendore of Dynamic Decisions, who told the story of her brother Isaac's death from a gang knife attack in Bedford two years ago.

We also held our first 'Luton Street League' football championships for local young men over two nights of our six-day community stadium event and were delighted to welcome first teamer and Luton boy James Justin to present the trophies. The 'Luton Street League' project is a joint project between the Hatters Trust and East Cricket that also seeks to use sport to improve community cohesion and life chances for young people in Luton. The overall project involves investment from both the Trust, our partners East Cricket and the European Union through the European Social Fund with Luton Council managing the project.

Squeezed in between our cohesion events was the small matter of the Hatters Youth Football Cup that saw 1,200 youngsters take part in one of the biggest two day stadium tournaments in the south of England, and we followed this up with another two days of schools tournaments that saw a further 20 local primary schools take part.

We finished off the six days with a charity adult football tournament, which raised £2,500 for the Foxley Kingham 50th Anniversary Foundation, which is aiming to raise £50,000 this year to support local charities.

Phew! Six days non-stop – you could almost hear the grass sigh after everyone had left. Can't wait for next May – no play-offs please!

A warm welcome back to Kenilworth Road for this, the first League One fixture here in ten years, and just over 11 years since we last played today's visitors in a league fixture.

In May 2007 Sunderland came to a sold-out Kenilworth Road looking to win the Championship title, which they did with a 5-0 victory and were promoted back to the Premier League, as Luton dropped into League One.

It has certainly been two very contrasting stories for the clubs since our last league meeting as Sunderland have had ten consecutive seasons in the Premier League, whilst Luton had spent five seasons playing Non-League football before returning to this level.

The two sides did, of course, meet in the League Cup just a few months after that League fixture with Luton winning 3-0 courtesy of a brace from Paul Furlong, after David Bell had opened the scoring.

Overall there have been 23 league meetings between the sides and five Cup fixtures. The Hatters have won 11, there have been four draws and Sunderland have the slight edge overall with 13 victories. Luton have scored the most goals though: 55 to 49. The Hatters' last victory came on a very wet December afternoon in 1994, a 3-0 win as Scott Oakes netted twice with John Hartson also scoring.

The Hatters started their League One campaign at Portsmouth last weekend and, despite a positive

performance and dominating the game, lost by a solitary goal. The performance certainly deserved more and it was good to see over 2,300 travelling fans on their feet and applauding the squad off the Fratton Park pitch at the end of the match.

It was great to be back behind the mic and commentating once again on iFollow, just a shame that there was no trademark goal celebration to enjoy on the opening day! With a little bit of luck and the difference of an inch or two, both Alan Sheehan and James Collins could have been celebrating instead of seeing their efforts coming back off the woodwork.

There was a terrific response on social media from those overseas who are now able to enjoy the commentary alongside the iFollow video coverage. UK subscribers aren't missing out either as they have access to watch a full match replay, which also now has the commentary included.

Looking back, I've noticed that the last Football League match Luton played on this date was also the last time we were in League One back in the 2007/08 season. Hartlepool were beaten 2-1 that day; here's hoping that we're celebrating the same outcome over visitors from the north-east today!
