We come into the game having extended our unbeaten run in all competitions to eight matches with a hard-earned victory at Plymouth Argyle last weekend. Mark Cullen's third goal of the season proved to be decisive, as we kept our fourth consecutive clean sheet away from home in the league.

We obviously finished the Plymouth game with nine men and appealed those decisions earlier this week. We're pleased to see that Marc Bola has now had his ban overturned, but we're disappointed to now lose Donervon Daniels for the next three matches.

Competition throughout the squad is strong this season though, and I'm sure we'll have players relishing the opportunity to return to the starting line-up and perform. I know Gary Brabin needs no introduction to the Blackpool fans following his time here as a player, but I'm delighted to bring him in as my assistant, while Ian Dawes steps up to the first-team permanently after assisting in the interim. All the staff are really hard working and I'd like to thank them all for their continued dedication.

Finally, I would like to say a big thank-you to our supporters for their well-wishes since I took the job on as manager, as well as give a special mention to the 162 fans who made the very long trip to Plymouth. I'm delighted that we could reward your efforts with three points.



BLACKPOOL vs LUTON TOWN

HOW THE TEAMS SHAPE UP

Just two points separate Blackpool and Luton Town ahead of this afternoon's meeting at Bloomfield Road, with both sides having made solid starts to the new Sky Bet League One campaign.

The Hatters, promoted to this division in April, picked up their third league victory of the season against Bristol Rovers last weekend, while Blackpool did likewise at Plymouth Argyle.

In terms of team news, Luton's loan signing Eunan O'Kane has returned to parent club Leeds United after fracturing his tibia and fibula against Bristol Rovers, while Luke Berry faces a spell on the sidelines with a knee problem.


Blackpool will be without the services of defender Donervon Daniels, who serves the first of a three-match suspension. However,

Marc Bola has won his appeal and is expected to retain his place in the starting line-up. Jimmy Ryan and Joe Bunney remain sidelined with injury.

FACING FORMER CLUBS

Ex-Pool loan players Lloyd Jones and Elliot Lee are both part of the Luton squad now, with the latter featuring eight times so far this season.

Meanwhile, Mark Cullen, signed by Blackpool from Luton Town in 2015, will hope to come up against his former employers and add to the three goals he has scored since August.



SONNY BRADLEY

IN PROFILE....

AT THE BACK - SONNY BRADLEY

Former Plymouth Argyle centre-back Sonny Bradley joined Luton Town in the summer, having made 96 appearances in two seasons with The Pilgrims.

An uncompromising presence in both boxes, the 27-year-old was named in the Sky Bet League Two Team of the Season in 2017 and found the net against Blackpool 12 months ago.

He has made eight appearances for his new club so far this season, helping The Hatters to keep four clean sheets in the process.

IN THE MIDDLE - PELLY RUDDOCK

Initially signed on loan from West Ham in 2013, Pelly Ruddock has been an instrumental player in two promotions from Luton Town.

The powerful midfielder, also capable of playing on the wing or in defence, has made 161 appearances for The Hatters and proved to be a real fans' favourite.

UP TOP - JAMES COLLINS

Promoted four times from League Two, striker James Collins proved

to be a key signing for Luton Town's ambitions last summer.

The 27-year-old joined the club from Crawley Town, where he hit 22 goals in 51 appearances. That form continued in a Luton shirt, with 20 goals scored in 45 games.

In fact, his goal stats have been consistent throughout his career with the likes of Hibernian and Shrewsbury Town previously.



IN THE DUGOUT MANAGER - NATHAN JONES


Welshman Nathan Jones accepted his first managerial role with Luton Town in January 2016.

The 45-year-old, who played for the likes of Southend United and Yeovil Town in his playing career, swapped a first-team coaching role at Brighton & Hove Albion for the gig at Kenilworth Road.

His decision to do so has proved the right one, with a successful two-and-half years in charge so far. The Hatters reached the League Two play-off semi-finals in 2017, before achieving promotion to this division in April.

TEN YEARS ON FROM MAKING HIS PROFESSIONAL DEBUT FOR ASTON VILLA, NATHAN DELFOUNESO CONTINUES TO STRIVE FOR FURTHER IMPROVEMENT AND SUCCESS IN HIS CAREER. HERE HE TELLS HIS FOOTBALL STORY IN THE FIFTH OF A SERIES OF SPECIAL PLAYER FEATURES...

Being totally honest, I hated football when I was a kid. It seems strange to say that now, but it was through one of my dad's friends that I tried it out and then never looked back since.

I was spotted at the age of eight, playing Sunday football, by Aston Villa and joined the Villa academy. I remember my dad picking me up from school and asking the question whether I wanted to go and train with them. It turned out to be a trial and I started to enjoy football more and more.

I had to work hard year on year to be kept on, before making my first-team debut at 17. I had coaches pushing me all the time and a very supportive manager in Martin O'Neill who saw a lot in me. He had a lot of belief and faith in me, and to this day I still believe it was a shame when he left the club. I owe him a lot for how he brought me through.

While at Villa, international recognition also came along. After trials with England at a young age, I represented my country at various youth levels, won the Victory Shield, scored some goals and played right the way up to the under-21s. I am very proud of that, especially when you consider such a big pool of players that can be picked from.

I left Aston Villa permanently in 2014, having had a few loan spells at different clubs. My most

successful loans came with Blackpool, so it was Bloomfield Road where I came back to. The people around the place - the staff, the players and the fans - really took to me and I really appreciated that support. I've always been given an opportunity to go and play here.


My time with the club has been full of ups and downs, but nothing ever runs smoothly, even in life. My permanent return to Blackpool ended in relegation and me leaving the club again, only to return in 2017 and achieve promotion. All those experiences have taught me a lot and helped me to grow as a person. I've also had big family support growing up with football, and I wouldn't be at this point now without my family.

I'm feeling really good right now and I feel the team this season has a lot of potential to achieve something. I also believe that I can achieve individual targets, in terms of numbers, with the support of my team-mates.

There was a point in my career where I feel like I stood still for all sorts of different reasons, but I feel like I'm now building and improving. I finished last season strongly, scoring and creating goals, and that's something I want to continue to do now.

I've always been a big fan of Thierry Henry, Andy Cole and the Brazilian Ronaldo. Those three were players that I watched a lot. Samuel Eto'o and Didier Drogba were another two I kept an eye on to try and learn from. To this day, I still watch some of their clips on YouTube to see if I can learn new things and adapt them to my game.

I'm not a youngster anymore, but I can still learn and progress. And that's what I'm looking to do.

WELFARE STAFF CPD WORKSHOP

Blackpool FC Community Trust recently delivered a Welfare Staff CPD workshop to staff members at Our Lady Primary School.

The Trust delivers free Welfare Staff CPD workshops as part of the Premier League Primary Stars programme. The workshops are beneficial to schools, staff and for the children there as it enhances their playtime and lunch time provision.

Lunch time is a fantastic opportunity for young people to increase their level of physical activity, improve relationships with others through fun and games and to also enjoy taking part in a range of activities. Through this workshop, we aim to increase the knowledge of welfare staff to be able to have a bank of games and activities readily available to organise and play with all children in the playground.

Throughout the CPD event, we also cover how best to use equipment to enhance the time out on the playground. This includes introducing games and activities using a range of the schools own equipment, as well as going through rules of activities that require no equipment. This workshop provides us with a chance to influence participation numbers in school while directly working with the staff from that school.

If the group think it is appropriate, we then can provide the school with handbooks with a list of games they can use and hopefully feel more confident to set up.

Hope Dunn, who is Physical Education Officer for Blackpool FC Community Trust said, "The workshop is a great chance to interact with staff. We often work alongside and introduce new activities to them, to ultimately enhance 'play' times for the young people in our area, so they are very positive."

Well, it took a while but common sense prevailed, so it's congratulations to Terry on his appointment as manager.




