



Welcome back to the Energy Check Stadium at Gigg Lane for this afternoon's Emirates FA Cup second round tie with Luton Town, also welcome to Nathan Jones, his staff, directors, players and all supporters that have made the long trip to be with us this afternoon.


On Tuesday evening we claimed another three points with the 4-1 win over Cheltenham, and if I am being honest – the goals are irrelevant for me. It's all about the points for me and I am happy that we collected three points.

For me it was all about individual performances and the team performance. I asked the lads for a reaction from the Cambridge United game last weekend, and I saw that reaction as individuals and as a team on Tuesday. The point from Cambridge has now turned into a good point following the result on Tuesday. The players took everything on board from the weekend, they've used that disappointment and put it to good use with that performance.

We also saw on Tuesday some very well worked team goals. That's a credit to the lads, I know they can produce moments like that. We put session on for them and show them what needs to be done. We want them to do the right things and get the ball into the right areas. We have goal scorers within the squad, and they will ultimately find the back of the net.

It was also good to see Nicky Maynard amongst the goals the other night; good strikers do not go on barren runs. Nicky hasn't scored for two or three games,

A glance at the League Table will show you that we are the league's top scorers. As a former striker that does please me. At one point some may have wondered where the goals were coming from. It's down to hard work. Hard work pays off. Ultimately when you have good players in the building, it does make it a little easier.

It's 33 points now, I'm just happy with the points. I've seen the table, you cannot but notice the table, but we know that we cannot take anything for granted. The table is tight with plenty of good teams in and around there. We will just keep doing what we are doing, we will go about our business quietly and see where it takes us.

We've scored goals in games, we've scored four goals or five goals. That will not always be the case. For me, it doesn't matter if its 4, 5 or just one – as long as

I have three points – then I am happy. At the moment, everything is great but for me, it's about the performance and the points. Don't get carried away, its one game at a time and it will need patience. Patience is vital for all of us.

We know we are in for a game this afternoon, Luton are very similar to ourselves. On a good run of form, scoring goals and doing well in their league. We are all massively looking forward to this game, and I personally think they are the best team's in League One. They have fantastic players. I know Nathan Jones well, he's a good lad. He has a great group and they play football the right way.

It's an exciting FA Cup tie, and we are all looking forward to this. We will of course need your help this afternoon and I ask you to continue to back the lads as you have been doing in recent weeks.

THE GAFFER:



NATHAN JONES

Welshman Jones was appointed as John Still's successor in January 2016. A former coach and assistant-manager at Brighton & Hove Albion, Charlton Athletic and Yeovil Town, he was a player at Kenilworth Road in 1995 but left without making an appearance.

Jones spent a year in Spain before returning to the UK and playing for Southend, Brighton and Yeovil, making over 500 appearances. The

45-year-old began his coaching qualifications while still a player with Yeovil, initially coaching the Ladies team, and achieved his UEFA Pro-Licence in 2014.

In March 2016 Jones signed a new three-and-a-half year contract with the Hatters to tie him to the club until 2020. His first full season in the hot-seat ended with a fourth-placed finish and qualification for the League Two play-offs.

Jones passed 100 games in

charge of the Hatters in October 2017 – the same month in which he picked up his first Sky Bet League Two Manager of the Month award. He went onto win it again in November and April to complete a memorable hat-trick as he masterminded the club's promotion to League One.

Penned a new four-year contract with the club in January 2018, shortly before the FA Cup third round trip to Premier League Newcastle United.

Keeper: James Shea

After coming through the academy at Arsenal, the keeper had loan spells with Southampton and Dagenham & Redbridge before plying his trade in Non-League football with Needham Market and Harrow Borough after his release by the Gunners in 2013. The 27-year-old continued to train with Arsene Wenger's squad on a full-time basis during his year outside the pro game, but returned to the League by signing for AFC Wimbledon.



James Justin

Luton born Justin signed a professional contract with the club at the same time as youth team colleague Frankie Musonda in November 2015. First joined the Hatters in 2005 and along with Musonda, won the Aarau Masters as an Under-11.



Dan Potts

Predominantly a left-back whose aerial ability also makes him an option at centre-half. The 24-year-old joined the Hatters in summer 2015 from West Ham United, where he made 13 appearances after being handed his debut in a Championship win over Barnsley. McCormack had a number of promotions to his name prior to his arrival, including from League Two with Swindon Town.



Alan McCormack

The 34-year-old defensive midfielder joined the Hatters in July 2017, after his contract expired with Sky Bet Championship side Brentford. McCormack had a number of promotions to his name prior to his arrival, including from League Two with Swindon Town.



Danny Hylton

London-born forward who joined the Town in 2016 after he played his part in helping Oxford United to promotion to League One and the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final. Hylton started his career with Aldershot Town, where he made over 200 appearances in the Conference.



Elliott Lee

Brother of former Town midfielder Olly and son of ex-England and Newcastle United midfielder Rob, Elliott Lee is in his second spell at the club – this time on a permanent deal – having had a short loan spell from West Ham United in 2015.



Andrew Shinnie

Initially signed on a season-long loan from Championship side Birmingham City, before joining permanently in summer 2018 on a free transfer, Shinnie adds a fair amount of experience to Nathan Jones' midfield, having played over 200 first team games.



Midfielder: Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu

Former West Ham United academy graduate Mpanzu was an instant hit when signed on-loan by then-boss John Still from the Hammers midway through the Conference title winning campaign of 2013-14, scoring a memorable goal in a crucial come-from-behind win at Dartford. Versatile to play in central defence, midfield, on the wing or even up front, Pelly is a real crowd favourite and he passed the 100-game mark for the Hatters during 2016-17.



Defender: Sonny Bradley

Centre-half who joined the Hatters in the summer after rejecting a new contract at Plymouth, penning a three-year deal. The 26-year-old started his career with hometown club Hull but gained initial first team experience on loan at Harrogate and Aldershot, where he spent a season-and-a-half in League Two. At the end of the 2012-13 campaign he signed for Portsmouth on a permanent deal, then a year later switched to Crawley Town.



Matty Pearson

A summer capture from Sky Bet League One outfit Barnsley, Pearson is a versatile defender and for someone aged just 24, brings a huge amount of experience with him having made over 250 career appearances. The Yorkshireman began his career at Blackburn Rovers.



Jack Stacey

A Reading youth product, the 22-year-old – who can operate at right back and in midfield – played six times for the Royals in the Championship. Between 2015 and 2017 he had three loan spells, with Barnet, Carlisle United and Exeter City.




Luke Berry

The midfielder joined the Town on a three-year deal for an undisclosed fee from Sky Bet League Two rivals Cambridge United in August 2017. One of the top scoring midfielders in the division in recent seasons, the 25-year-old netted 22 times in 2016/17 Season.



Harry Cornick

Pacey 23-year-old forward who joined the Hatters from Premier League club Bournemouth in August 2017 for an undisclosed fee. Cornick was originally on the Town's radar as a teenager in Non-League football. He signed for the Cherries in January 2013 as a 17-year-old.



Glen Rea

Highly-rated former Republic of Ireland Under-21 international who can operate as a holding midfielder or centre-half. Rea joined the Hatters on loan from Championship club Brighton & Hove Albion in March 2016, making ten appearances, and signed permanently in June 2016.



Jorge Grant

Joined the Hatters on a season long loan from Sky Bet Championship outfit Nottingham Forest in July 2018. A skilful, clever central midfielder, he was Notts County's top scorer last season, as he netted 19 times in 56 appearances.



Striker: James Collins

Having netted over 125 career goals – most of which have come in the fourth tier – Collins adds a hefty amount of firepower to the Town frontline, after signing in June 2017 for an undisclosed fee from Crawley on a three-year contract, a deal that was extended by a further year following promotion to League One. Since leaving Aston Villa, the 27-year-old has enjoyed a prolific career in the lower leagues, scoring regularly for the likes of Shrewsbury and Swindon.




Premier league primary starts PSHE

SEASON TICKETS

How to get your Bury FC cashless card?

Initially Bury FC cashless is available to season ticket holders. Your season tickets are cashless cards. Season ticket holders can have their cards mailed to them or choose to pick them up from the Energy Check Stadium ticket office from 25 June.

How to top up?

You can top up your cashless cards at the club shop or ticket office during opening hours throughout the week. You can top up as many times as you'd like. We will also provide online top-up facilities, so you can add credit from the comfort of your home or on your mobile.

How to pay?

Your Bury FC cashless card is accepted at all areas throughout the Energy Check Stadium. Simply hand over your card when you want to pay, and you'll be back in your seat before you know it.

What if I want to claim back my money?

You can cash out at any time throughout the season at the ticket office and club store. Cash out available until May 20, 2019.

What if I lose my card?

Please contact the club shop to cancel your card. We can reissue a new card and transfer any funds that remained on your old card. Please note there is a £5 admin charge payable before any new card is issued.

Is cash still accepted?

You will still be able to pay by cash in most outlets but expect longer separate queues.

Can I transfer my money to someone else's card?

Yes, your credit is transferable.

Can I combine the cashless card with other payment methods, i.e. card or cash?

No, at the moment, your card can't be combined with other

payment methods.

How long is the card valid for?

Cards will be valid for the 2018-19 season.

I'm visiting for an away game. Can I use the cashless system?

Bury FC's cashless solution is currently exclusive to the Energy Check Stadium at Gigg Lane







ON THIS DAY IN OUR HISTORY

The club's long history records a total of 19 games played on 2nd of December, the first of which took place in 1893 and a friendly game away at 'South Shore'.

South Shore were a Blackpool based side and would eventually merge with Blackpool, bizarrely after they had played each other in a Lancashire League fixture in the 1899/00 season. History records that after the two clubs played each other on 9 December 1899, an agreement was made for South Shore to merge into the Blackpool club with their league record expunged.

The meeting with the Shakers was to end with a 3-2 defeat in front of 3,000 supporters with the two Bury goals coming from Tom Wylie and George Ross.

The first Football league game took place in 1899 with Bury making the trip to play West Bromwich Albion for a Division One fixture. George Ross (pictured below) was again on target for the Shakers as Bury recorded a 1-0 victory in front of 3,000 supporters.

With war blazing across Europe, the North West War League of 1916 saw Blackburn Rovers visit Gigg Lane. Just 2,000 supporters were in attendance as a solitary goal from Edward Connor was enough to hand the Shakers a 1-0 win.




1922 brought Clapton Orient to Bury for a Division Two clash. The game attracted a strong crowd of approximately 10,000 supporters, who were thoroughly entertained with a Bury 5-1 win thanks to goals from the following James McCrae and four goals from Norman Bullock.

Preston North End were the visitors for a 1933 Division Two clash. 9,253 fans watched as Bury ran out winners with a 2-1 victory, the goals coming from George Anderson and Les Vernon.

Still in Division Two in 1950, Bury made the trip to Doncaster's Belle Vue stadium. The game finished 1-1 in front of 22,000 supporters with Johnny Walton scoring the Bury goal.

Bury would draw again on this day, this time in 1967 when Tranmere Rovers visited Gigg



Lane for a Division Three game. 6,757 supporters were in attendance as the game finished 3-3. Alec Lindsay, Alex Dawson and Jimmy Kerr claimed the three Bury goals.

Tranmere provided the opposition again in 1989, though this time at Prenton Park where 6,207 supporters watched as Bury left with all the points following a 4-2 win thanks to goals from Charlie Bishop and a Liam Robinson hat trick (including two penalties).



1998 brought a strange away fixture for the Shakers as they played away – in St Lucia. This mid-season friendly game against the national side was certainly a successful one, with 3,000 supporters watching the Shakers claimed a 2-0 win.

The last recorded game played on 2 December last season when the Shakers made the short trip to Walsall for a Checkatrade Trophy game. Nicky Ajose scored both goals as the Shakers ran out 2-1 winners.
