# FROM THE BOARDROOM SPECIAL

WITH CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER **GARY SWEET**  
AND DIRECTOR **MIKE HERRICK**



**It is with great relief and delight that we heard on Wednesday that our two planning applications will finally be decided upon by the local authority in January; on Wednesday 16th for Power Court and Wednesday 30th for Newlands Park.**

**It's magnificent that we've got to this exciting stage in the planning process in**

**what will be a genuine milestone in the history of Luton Town Football Club and, I believe, a genuine milestone for Luton given the value of both developments and what they will bring to our town.**

Whilst we naturally remain frustrated and disappointed by the length of time the process has taken since we submitted back in July 2016, and therefore the loss in our progress, we must also acknowledge the complexities in magnitude and the cautious diligence Luton Council's planning team have needed to manage the process. Consequently, we thank the planning team for their efforts and commitment to get their reports written in readiness to be distributed ahead of these committee meetings.

You may wonder why the two applications are being dealt with separately. We understand that this is largely because Power Court will be ready first and the local authority has a duty not to delay a decision once it's ready to make it, which we're not going to stand in the way of.

It is also our strong view that each application stands firm on its own independent merits from a planning expectation – we simply cannot fathom why anyone, individual or business, cannot objectively see the hugely positive benefits these developments will have on our own town. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to promote our Club and our town up the leagues sustainably and who honestly wouldn't want that?

As has been explained previously, we will need the commercial benefit of both schemes to be able to fund the stadium in a way that enables the Club to be sustainable going forward.

Getting a positive decision on Power Court will be like winning at half-time, so a positive decision on Newlands Park will be just as crucial to us.

In terms of scheduling, the good news is that the planning officer's report will be published around a week before each meeting, which means you will all be able to read what his recommendation will be, then to be discussed and decided upon at the committee meeting once any objectors have their say. The venues of the committee meetings are still to be decided upon (at the time of writing this) but, again, this is a public meeting anyone can attend should you wish to do so.

If, then, we make a big assumption in that we get a positive determination for both, it doesn't mean we start laying bricks in February, unfortunately. There are still several hurdles to jump including dealing with any challenges that may be seen as worthy, followed by a detailed application phase and a huge amount of preparation, planning and partnering.

Therefore, your patience – which I understand may be in short supply – will still be very much needed.

However, let's not take the gloss off this week's news which is a colossal step forward for the Club and could lead to the first time in over 115 years that Luton Town has received planning permission for a new stadium.

So, with these meetings committed to, with the run of fixtures in both the Football League and the FA Cup and a testing transfer window for us that may define our season, January has just turned from a big month to possibly the biggest month in the Club's history, on and off the pitch.

This is our town, this is our time!

In recent years our main shirt sponsors have selected a match where they hand their sponsorship to the club charity of the year. So, for today, the team will run out with the Luton Foodbank logo on their shirts instead of the customary 'Indigo Residential'. Supporting local charities is something we care passionately about and we thank Indigo for this very kind gesture.

Volunteers from Luton Foodbank will be collecting cash donations at the game and after the match, today's shirts will be auctioned on eBay to help

raise further funds for the charity. All of the money raised for them by the Club this season will go towards helping people living within our community who are in desperate need of short-term help from Luton Foodbank, so we'd like to thank everyone in advance for their donations and for taking part in the auction.

Fleetwood were last here in November 2011 – the season in which they swept all aside in winning the Conference title, helped in no small part by a certain Jamie Vardy who scored against us that day. The return on the last day of that season confirmed our place in the play-offs, but we were to be again denied in our bid to regain our place in the Football League.

Times have changed, however, and this season is proving to be one of the most enjoyable for many



years. The standard of football has been exhilarating and the atmosphere at Kenilworth Road really is something to savour.

Imagine my disappointment at having to fulfil a long-arranged holiday recently which meant I missed the game against Plymouth Argyle. Fortunately, I was able to follow the match – although I did twice fall out of my hammock on a sun-kissed Caribbean beach whilst celebrating the goals! There must be a lesson to be learnt there somewhere.



As we all hoped, the last home fixture against Bradford City provided more of the same and we were pleased to welcome Jim White of Sky Sports and talkSPORT to that game. It was his first ever visit to Kenilworth Road, but it seems we all made quite an impression on him and he left having thoroughly enjoyed the experience.

Last week's match up at Bury in the second round of the FA Cup was a fascinating game. Pitting the highest scorers in Leagues One and Two against each other, it was bound to be a dull, goalless draw. Instead we were treated to a game full of attractive football.

Bury certainly showed their credentials with a slick passing style which belied their League Two status. In the end, though, we had a little too much for them and we won through courtesy of Harry Cornick's fifth goal of the season. Our reward is a trip to Hillsborough to meet the only club in the top two divisions that we have never previously played in the FA Cup – one to really look forward to.

Wednesday night's game in the Checktrade trophy against Southend United ultimately ended in disappointment despite a young side, with eleven changes from last weekend, who acquitted themselves really well. It's always a lottery once a game goes to penalties. We had previously had an excellent record in these shoot-outs, but it wasn't to be this time and the result rather unfortunately takes the gloss off of Arthur Read's superb strike for his first goal for the club.

All in all though, a very satisfactory month – added to by the news that Elliot Lee has been awarded the Sky Bet League One Player of the Month for November. Well done Elliot, and here's to many more accolades hopefully to come for Nathan and his team over the next few months!

Enjoy today's game and as these will be my last notes of 2018, let me wish every Hatter a wonderful Christmas and a happy new year!

## NATHAN JONES

**Welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the second time in four days as we entertain Fleetwood Town this afternoon.**

I'd like to extend the welcome to our opponents, their manager Joey Barton, his staff, players and all the officials and supporters who have made the long trip down from the Fylde coast. They're an established side at this level and will pose a serious test for us, after which we wish them a safe journey back to the north-west tonight.

Since my last notes for the Bradford game, we've made further progress up the league table and reached the third round of the FA Cup for the third season in a row, before suffering the disappointment of a penalty shoot-out defeat in the Checktrade Trophy on Wednesday night, although I was proud of how we played against a full-strength Southend side.

Kicking off with the league, the 4-0 win over Bradford a couple of weeks ago helped us finish November unbeaten with three straight wins and earned a second successive nomination for manager of the month for me and my staff.

Lee Bowyer deservedly took the award for winning four out of four at Charlton, but I was delighted to be shortlisted again because it shows that we, as a coaching staff and squad of players, have shown a high level of consistency at the same stage of this season as last year when we won two manager of the month awards, but this time at the higher level.

It also shows how we have developed and adapted following the toughest of starts to the current campaign, and the award for player of the month for Elliot Lee underlines that.

I'm delighted for Elliot because he's in a completely different place to what he was when he first came here on loan from West Ham, before experiencing a tough time at Barnsley.






Companies can also benefit by signing up to one of the charity's corporate volunteering days, similar to the one that our commercial team went on.



# WELCOME FLEETWOOD TOWN



**The Town would like to welcome the staff, players and supporters of this afternoon's match, Fleetwood Town.**

A huge shout out to those Fleetwood supporters who have made the long journey south today, we hope you have a safe trip back up to Lancashire!

It's difficult to talk about the Cod Army without mentioning their ridiculous climb up the leagues. A North West Counties League Division One side in 2004, they won six promotions in ten years to climb all the way up to League One, where they have resided since 2014.

The club has folded and begun again twice since its inception in 1908, spending a majority of their existence in the lower reaches of Non-League, mainly the Lancashire Combination League.

Joey Barton was handed his first job as a manager by chairman Andy Pilley in the summer, after finishing his playing career with Burnley in 2017. Much was made of his appointment, but after an opening day defeat to AFC Wimbledon, the Cod Army went on a seven-game unbeaten run in the league. That run came to an end in mid-September and since then Fleetwood have been particularly inconsistent, losing, drawing and winning in their last three games ahead of today's game.

Plymouth, who for much of the campaign were in the relegation zone, defeated them a fortnight ago,

but a convincing 3-0 win over promotion chasing Coventry City casts further doubt as to what sort of Fleetwood side we can expect.

That also reflects in their home and away form, with neither particularly outstanding, sitting mid-table in those form tables.

One thing Fleetwood can be certain of though is the fire power they possess up top. Ex-Yeovil and Scunthorpe striker Paddy Madden bagged his 100th career goal in English football on Monday night in the FA Cup win against Guiseley. Former Wales international Ched Evans partners him up front, and the loanee from Sheffield United is starting to find his goalscoring tough again, with seven goals and three assists to his name this campaign.

They'll have a job on their hands though if they're to match the goalscoring exploits of one of Fleetwood's recent heroes, Jamie Vardy. The striker bagged 34 goals in his one season there as he helped them climb out of Non-League football for the first time. That form saw him become the first million-pound signing from outside the top four tiers when he joined Leicester City. Not sure what he went on to achieve there.

With 239 Premier League appearances to his name, 130 of which were with Manchester City, Joey Barton had a highly commendable playing career. The ex-midfielder was a fierce presence in the middle of the pitch, terrorising opposing teams with his aggression, as well as causing problems for goalkeepers when he rifled a shot from outside the penalty area. Barton took his first managerial role with the Cod Army in April, although his first game in charge was at the beginning of the season. Although the ex-QPR man has only managed to lead the club to 12th so far, the squad is more than capable of winning matches, including a remarkable 4-0 away victory at Doncaster, where the Hatters were beaten 2-1 in September.

**PAUL JONES  
AGE: 32**

An experienced shot-stopper who has a combined total of more than 300 appearances for the likes of Portsmouth, Crawley Town and Exeter City.

## DEFENDERS

**ASHLEY EASTHAM  
AGE: 27**

Signed for Fleetwood in 2016-17 following his release from Rochdale. Won Fans' Player of the Year last season, appearing 52 times in all competitions, scoring three times.



**JAMES HUSBAND  
AGE: 24**

On-loan from Norwich City until next month, Husband has already tasted success at this level, winning the title with Doncaster Rovers in 2012-13.

## THE STOPPER

**Alex Cairns | Age: 25**

The keeper began his career at Leeds United but never made an impact with the Whites and settled out on loan at Conference North side, Stalybridge Celtic. Cairns helped the club reach the final qualifying round of the FA Cup, just missing out on the first-round proper after a thrilling 5-3 loss to Stockport County. At the end of the campaign, the shot-stopper received Player of the Year, Players' Player of the Year and Supporters' Player of the Year for his efforts in between the sticks at Bower Fold. Cairns joined Fleetwood in 2016, managing 34 clean sheets in 81 matches across his first two seasons.



## DID YOU KNOW?

Fleetwood Town are mentioned in the Guinness Book of World Records after their former defender Nathan Pond's appearance on the opening day of the 2014-15 League One season meant that he had represented the same club at seven different levels of the football Pyramid. The 33-year-old signed from Lancaster City in 2003 when Fleetwood were in the North West Counties League First Division and was a cornerstone of their rise through the Northern Premier's two divisions, Conference North, National and League Two before departing for Salford City last summer.

## THE WALL

**Lewis Coyle | Age: 23**



The Leeds United player is now on his second loan spell at the club after a brilliant season with Fleetwood last term meant Barton extended his deal for another six months when he took over. Coyle was part of the squad to hold Premier League Leicester City to a goalless draw in last year's FA Cup campaign. The 23-year-old made an instant impact upon his arrival at the Highbury Stadium, winning multiple man of the match awards as well as Player of the Year and Junior Cod Army Player of the Year at the end of the season.

**CRAIG MORGAN  
AGE: 33**

The skipper signed for Fleetwood in the summer, taking over the arm band straight away. Morgan oversaw promotion with Wigan Athletic on two occasions.



**NATHAN SHERON  
AGE: 21**

A product of Liverpool's youth academy, Sheron joined Fleetwood in 2016 although he's only recently made more of an impact on the first team, with eight starts.

**CIAN BOLGER  
AGE: 26**

A big part of Southend United's play-off winning campaign in 2014-15, sealing victory with the wining penalty in the shoot-out against Wycombe Wanderers at Wembley.

**RYAN TAYLOR  
AGE: 34**

The defender endured relegation from the Premier League with Newcastle United in 2009-10, but assisted the Magpies in bouncing back, gaining promotion the following year from the Championship.

**MIDFIELDERS  
JASON HOLT  
AGE: 25**

On-loan until the end of the season from Glasgow Rangers. Featured 33 times for the Ibrox side last season and won the Scottish Championship and Challenge Cup double in 2015-16.

## IN THE MIDDLE

**Wes Burns | Age: 24**

Already on five goals for the season, including one against Coventry in the Cod Army's last league match, the 24-year-old is already on par with last season's total. The Welshman started just across the border at Bristol City, making 44 senior league appearances and netting four



times for the Robins. Burns made his way out on loan to many teams including Fleetwood in 2016, impressing the Fishermen enough to entice his signature permanently a year later. The ex-Forest Green Rovers, Oxford United and Cheltenham Town midfielder also has 18 Welsh U21 caps under his belt, scoring on six occasions for his country.

**ROSS WALLACE**  
**AGE: 33**

More than a century of appearances for both Sheffield United and Burnley, the highly talented midfielder signed in September after a successful trial period.

**DEAN MARNEY**  
**AGE: 34**

Played with Joey Barton at Burnley, winning two promotions with the Clarets in 2014 and 2016. Also played 21 times in England's top flight in 2016-17.

**KYLE DEMPSEY**  
**AGE: 23**

Signed permanently in the summer 2017 after a fantastic season-long loan with Fleetwood in 2016-17. Began his career with Carlisle United, winning Player of the Year in 2014-15.

**JAMES WALLACE**  
**AGE: 26**

Capped for England's national side at U19 and U20 level as well as making a Europa League appearance for boyhood club Everton against Sigma Olomouc.



**WATCH OUT**  
**Paddy Madden**  
**Age: 28**

Madden became a Yeovil Town legend in 2012-13, winning the Sky Bet League One golden boot on 23 goals, as well as scoring in the Glovers' Sky Bet League One Play Off final victory over Brentford, securing the club's promotion to the Championship for the first time in their history. Failing to score after promotion, the Irishman was put on the transfer list and snapped up by Scunthorpe United, also aiding the Iron's promotion from League Two in 2013-14. The striker arrived at Fleetwood in January, scoring six times. Now on seven for this season so far, Madden is sure to add significantly to his total before the end of the campaign.

A best of the season crowd, at that stage, of 8,415 turned up to see a tight contest settled by a late goal from Robbie Willmott which brought the house down. Another point gained from a re-arranged midweek game at Gateshead meant that one more point was needed from the final match to be certain of a play-off place.

The only slight problem was that the Town would be away at Fleetwood, who had already been crowned as champions. They had been beaten only four times that season, had enjoyed a 29-game unbeaten run, had racked up 103 points, and had both Jamie Vardy and Steve McNulty in their ranks.

Having finally seen off the challenge of Wrexham, who in most normal seasons would have clinched the title with 98 points, Fleetwood's unbeaten run had ended on the penultimate Saturday with defeat at Cambridge and all the Town could hope for was that they were now in holiday mode!

The Town applauded the champions on to the pitch and then set out to put in a thoroughly professional and resolute performance in front of their 683 travelling fans. An early lead certainly settled the nerves when, after nine minutes, a cross from Craig McAllister was deflected by Cod Army defender Nathan Pond into his own net.

Fleetwood did apply some pressure but the Luton defence, out to keep its fifth clean sheet in a row,

Fleetwood received their trophy at the end of the game but in a corner of Highbury the Luton fans celebrated reaching their third successive play-offs.

As it turned out Kidderminster lost 3-0 at home to Mansfield that afternoon so we need not have worried, but we were now on a roll ready for Wrexham in the play-off semi-finals.

# THE LAST TIME FLEETWOOD CAME TO TOWN

CLUB HISTORIAN **ROGER WASH** REPORTS ON **THE COD ARMY'S** LAST VISIT TO KENILWORTH ROAD

**5TH NOVEMBER 2011 • LUTON TOWN 1 FLEETWOOD TOWN 2**  
**CONFERENCE**

When pre-season title favourites Fleetwood visited Kenilworth Road in November 2011, they were set to face a Town side who had already lost at home twice at that stage in the season.

Defeats by Cambridge United and Wrexham at fortress Kenilworth Road coupled with too many away draws meant that the Town were already playing catch-up in their bid for automatic promotion back to the Football League.

Well-funded Fleetwood had won three games in a row following a shock home defeat at the hands of Newport, and were in second spot, but were playing with a settled side that had Steve McNulty and Nathan Pond as the rocks at the back and a certain Jamie Vardy up front. To add spice to the occasion they also employed pantomime villain Richard Brodie in their line-up!

A crowd of 6,361 turned up to see Fleetwood frustrate the Town in the early stages, soak up the pressure and hope to pick up a goal on the break. This tactic was proved to work to perfection as the Hatters huffed and puffed, but could not find a way through at the same time, leaving themselves open to the counter attack.

On 11 minutes Fleetwood took the lead in controversial fashion. Amari Morgan-Smith was blatantly fouled and with players half stopping expecting a whistle the referee allowed play to go on, leading to Sean Clancy playing the ball through to the alert Vardy, who chipped Mark Tyler in the Luton goal.

Tempers frayed after this, but it was Fleetwood who kept their cool and when Morgan-Smith fouled Ryan Jackson in the area on 67 minutes, Jamie Milligan fired in the penalty to ensure all three points going back to the Fylde coast.

Janos Kovacs headed home a Jake Howells cross in stoppage time but it was too little, too late on a disappointing afternoon.

# DEADLY DUOS

**FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES FOUR NOTABLE  
POST-WAR FLEETWOOD TOWN GOALSCORING PARTNERSHIPS**

## **ADAM WARLOW & ANDY BELL**

Striker Andy Bell was top scorer in Fleetwood Town's 2007-08 Northern Premier League title triumph. Initially with Blackburn Rovers, where his father Norman had also played, he joined Wycombe Wanderers in September 2003 and scored twice on his League debut in a 5-2 defeat at Oldham Athletic.

Briefly with York City, he moved to Hednesford Town in August 2004 and was leading marksman as they won promotion in 2004-05. He joined Fleetwood in February 2006 and had a loan spell at Kendal Town before moving to Guiseley in March 2010, then played for AFC Fylde, Kendal again, Radcliffe Borough, Bamber Bridge, Nelson and AFC Darwen.

Striker Adam Warlow was an important figure in Fleetwood Town's 2009-10 promotion success, when voted Conference North 'Player of the Year'. Starting with Crewe Alexandra, he failed to make an impact at Gresty Road but was leading marksman in the Conference North with Witton Albion in 2007-08 and moved to Fleetwood in June 2008. He scored in their 2008-09 FA Cup first round victory over Leiston, then repeated the feat against Hartlepool United in the second round. Sadly, he made just a few appearances for the Cod Army during the 2010-11 campaign before leaving football in January 2011 due to off the field personal health issues.

## **MAGNO VIEIRA & GARETH SEDDON**

Brazilian striker Magno Vieira was leading marksman as Fleetwood Town qualified for the Conference play-offs in 2010-11. Starting with Wigan Athletic, he helped Carlisle United to regain Football League status in 2004-05, then had spells with Barnet, Crawley Town and Wycombe Wanderers before joining Ebbsfleet United in August 2009. He was their 'Player of the Year' in 2009-10 and moved to Fleetwood in July 2010. Helping win the Conference title in 2011-12, he netted 31 goals in 64 games prior to joining Forest Green Rovers in May 2012 and has since played for New Zealand sides Wairarapa United, Team Wellington and Kapiti Coast United.

England Semi-Pro international striker Gareth Seddon helped Fleetwood Town to win promotion in 2009-10. Starting with Accrington Stanley, he had spells with Atherstone United and RAF Codsall before moving to Bury in August 2001. He was leading marksman in 2001-02 and 2003-04, joining Rushden & Diamonds in June 2004. Following injury problems, he appeared for Hyde United, then was Kettering Town's top scorer in 2008-09 and joined Fleetwood in September 2009. He netted 26 goals in 98 games before moving to Halifax Town in May 2012, scoring the fastest FA Trophy hat-trick, since playing for Chester, Salford City and Ramsbottom.

**JAMIE VARDY & ANDY MANGAN**

Striker Jamie Vardy has gained England international recognition since leaving Fleetwood Town. A former Sheffield Wednesday junior, he moved via Stocksbridge Park Steels to Halifax Town for £15,000 in June 2010. He was top scorer and 'Player of the Year' in their 2010-11 Northern Premier League title triumph and joined Fleetwood in August 2011. Leading marksman as they won the Conference title and reached the FA Cup third round in 2011-12, he moved to Leicester City for £1m in May 2012. He made his England debut against Republic of Ireland in June 2015 and was leading scorer in Leicester's 2015-16 Premier League title success.

England Semi-Pro international striker Andy Mangan starred as Fleetwood Town won the Conference title and reached the FA Cup third round in 2011-12. Initially with Blackpool, he joined Accrington Stanley in August 2005 and featured prominently in their 2005-06 Conference title triumph. He moved via Bury to Forest Green Rovers in July 2008 and was top scorer in 2008-09.

Following a spell at Wrexham, he joined Fleetwood in June 2011 and netted 24 goals in 53 games before rejoining Forest Green in May 2013. He has since had two spells at both Shrewsbury and Tranmere, under Micky Mellon, helping both win promotion. Now at Accrington.



Antoni Sarcevic

**ANTONI SARCEVIC & DAVID BALL**

England Semi-Pro international Antoni Sarcevic was top scorer in Fleetwood Town's 2013-14 promotion success. Born in Manchester of Italian and Serbian descent, the former Manchester City youth player moved via Woodley Sports to Crewe Alexandra in May 2010. He was loaned to Chester City before scoring on his Football League debut in February 2011. Returning to Chester in November 2011, he helped win the Northern Premier League title and Conference North title.

He joined Fleetwood in June 2013 and scored their winner in the 2013-14 League Two play-off final. Moving to Shrewsbury in May 2016, he has since played for Plymouth Argyle.

Striker David Ball featured in Fleetwood Town's 2013-14 promotion triumph. Signing professional for Manchester City in September 2007, he scored in their 2008 FA Youth Cup final success and was loaned to Swindon Town before joining Peterborough United for £50,000 in January 2011. Helping regain Championship status at the first attempt that season, he had two loan spells at Rochdale prior to joining Fleetwood in July 2012. He was ever-present as they qualified for the League One play-offs in 2016-17 and netted 40 goals in 177 games before moving to Rotherham United in June 2017, featuring in their 2017-18 League One play-off final success.

# THE ROAD TO PART TWO WEMBLEY 1959

**IN THIS OCCASSIONAL SERIES CLUB HISTORIAN  
ROGER WASH RECOUNTS THE HATTERS' 1959 FA CUP RUN**

**Following a 5-1 home win over Leeds in Round Three and a replay victory over Leicester at the next stage, the run towards the 'Twin Towers' was now becoming serious.**

Ipswich manager Alf Ramsey was present to see the Town tear Leicester apart at Kenilworth Road, and probably shuddered to think that his Second Division side were next up to face the rampant Hatters.

As soon as the draw was made, Ipswich decided to make the game all-ticket with a capacity set at 26,700. The Town were allocated 6,000 tickets, which was generally regarded at Kenilworth Road as more than enough but surprisingly, such was the Cup fever enveloping Bedfordshire, they soon sold out.

Fortunately, the decision of the Portman Road board to hike up prices did not go down too well in Suffolk and a further 1,000 spaces were found for Luton supporters, and even then some were disappointed.

The Town players warmed up with a 6-2 home win over Burnley in the League and were confident they could score goals against any opposition, especially one from a lower division.

For the fourth consecutive cup-tie the Town fielded the same 11, although it was a close run thing as mercurial winger Billy Bingham had suffered from a boil on the leg (makes a change from present day broken metatarsals) that had made him doubtful during the week leading up to the game.

He was, though, pronounced fit to play and listened along with the rest of the team as they were told to keep the match tight for the first 20 minutes and then go searching for goals.

As to be predicted, things do not always go to plan! Almost straight from the kick-off, Ipswich centre-

forward Ray Crawford found space down the right and from his accurate cross the unmarked Derek Rees headed the home side into the lead.

The Luton supporters were silenced but found their voices a minute later when Dave Pacey was needlessly brought down on the edge of the area. Picking himself up and then sizing up the situation he hammered the free-kick into the roof of the net with Ipswich goalkeeper Roy Bailey groping thin air.

Suitably stung by the early set-back the Town players then put on a display of devastating football that had the game all but won by the 17th minute. Firstly, some clever interplay between George Cummins and Bingham ended with an Allan Brown shot being parried by the goalkeeper, leaving Bob Morton to fire home.

## **Pummelling**

This was immediately followed by a header from Bingham, who climbed above Ken Malcolm, which soared into the top corner, and then an effort from Tony Gregory who fired in a Brown through ball just as two Ipswich defenders converged on him.

Despite this pummelling, Ipswich refused to surrender and as the interval approached, clever playmaker Jimmy Leadbetter should have done better with a header that bounced off the top of the bar to safety. The danger, as far as the Hatters were concerned, was to concede a goal early in the second period, thus causing a terrific upsurge in fighting spirit.

Of course, the inevitable happened with a poor ball from John Groves being intercepted by Crawford,

whose astute pass set up Rees to gallop through and beat Ron Baynham in the Luton goal.

With more than 30 minutes remaining the Luton supporters feared a barnstorming display from Ipswich, but although they tried desperately hard they were always kept at arms length by skipper Syd Owen and his fellow defenders.

With the game creeping towards a close, a header by Morton from Bingham's pinpoint cross finally made the game safe and allowed the large Luton following to breathe more easily.

The Hatters were now through to the quarter-finals for only the third time in their history, but the draw was not kind with the long trip to Blackpool the reward.




## JONES:



The Hatters reached the third round of the Emirates FA Cup with a hard-fought 1-0 victory over Bury at Gigg Lane.




The second half turned into a bit of a battle as Bury's intensity waned, but they launched a late storm that the Town were able to weather.





## HATTERS PEACE AMBASSADORS MEET HRH DUKE OF CAMBRIDGE

Last month 12 of our young peace ambassadors attended a graduation ceremony attended by Prince William and past and present Premier League players at the Copperbox Arena in the Olympic Park, to celebrate their achievements in encouraging dialogue and uniting young people in Luton to create greater respect across the town's communities.

The Football for Peace project in partnership with Luton Borough Council brought together a team of 30 young people from Luton aged 16 and 17 years who, through a love of sport, committed to organising a programme of inter school 'peace games' to improve community cohesion in Luton.

The project culminated in a showcase event here at the Stadium in May which was attended by both the Town's MP's along with executive members of the Council and board members from the Club.

Community Operations Manager at the Trust, Daniel Douglas, said: "We thought our stadium event would be the highlight of the project and while it was a great day, the trip to the Copperbox took the project to a different level.

Louis Saha, Carlton Cole, Mathieu Flamini and Mamadou Sakho.”



## **WHO?**

The Sky Blues are a club with a decorated history – FA Cup winners in the late 1980s, as well as being a Premier League outfit until 2001. Since then however there has been a steady decline as well as a stadium move, City dropping down to the fourth tier for the first time since 1959 when they slipped out of League One in 2017. Promotion at the first attempt under Mark Robins was achieved, as they defeated Exeter City in the Play-Off final in May.

## **STADIUM – RICOH ARENA**

There's a bit of controversy about this one – there's no doubt that they currently play there – but with issues between the owners of the ground and the owners of the Sky Blues, it could spell the end of Coventry's time at the Ricoh (again). As a result, there is the danger the club would fall out of the EFL. Built in 2005, the Ricoh can hold just over 32,000 supporters. Cov share the ground with Wasps, who play Premiership Rugby.

## **HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?**

We played Coventry twice last season in league games, the first was a 3-0 defeat at Kenilworth Road, whilst a spirited draw after going 2-0 down helped carry us over the line as we won promotion automatically. In total we have played each other 80

times, with Town winning 24, drawing 15 and losing 41 times.

## **RESULTS SO FAR**

Mixed form has hindered Coventry really progressing this campaign. A five-game winning run in October appeared to kick the Sky Blues into life, but the Manager of the Month curse struck – Mark Robins' side failing to win any league game in November, including a 3-0 defeat last weekend against our visitors today, Fleetwood. Notable wins so far this season include victories over Barnsley, Charlton and Doncaster.

## **KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU**

Hatters legend Mick Harford counts Coventry as one of his previous clubs, however due to injury, he only made one appearance. He did score in that cameo as a substitute, a 1-0 winner against Newcastle United. An academy graduate having gone to school at Luton's Cardinal Newman, Kevin Foley, was associated with the club for over a decade. He made 166 appearances for us in total after making his debut in 2002, before leaving in 2007 for Wolverhampton Wanderers. He made 12 appearances for Coventry in the last campaign during a short stint with the Sky Blues.

**Music-loving fans may have read recently that successful singer-songwriter Tom Grennan is having a trial at Luton.**

It's not really a trial. Tom was in the youth team at a few EFL clubs including Luton. But he says now he "totally lacked discipline" as a promising full-back, so his lifestyle was more suited to rock & roll.

Fair enough – the thousands of fans at Tom's gigs don't mind that he's not trying to compete with James Justin, Dan Potts and Jack Stacey for a place in the Hatters team. Tom's return in January to Luton for his training session will show if he's still got it. Doubtless Nathan Jones and Steve Rutter will make allowances for his lack of match practice. Tom has helped promote #saveourtown, so no way is he in for a beating in training. Surely...

## Terrified

The Bedford-raised singer's return to his home club is odd for me personally: it's being organised by an online music TV show I help produce, Red Stripe Presents This Feeling TV, so I'll be there for filming. And I'm frankly terrified.

I've interviewed lots of big music names, from Paul McCartney to Adele, and I'm never nervous with them. Last season, I edited a football website which meant working with many Premier League players. Easy. (And a bit annoying, considering he started his career with that mob up the road, that Ashley Young was the friendliest and funniest of them all.)

Trouble is, none of those players were "one of our own". If you don't play for Luton Town, you're just doing a job. You're lucky to do it, you deserve respect for your skill, but a player at any other club has no place in my heart. Whereas, if you do play for Luton, how can I not be totally in awe?

That's not a job, it's a calling. It means I'll have watched you and your immense predecessors for over 35 years.

## Joy

Any fan will never feel so old as the moment when we accept we'll never get spotted by Luton. It all adds up to believing that the players turning out for Luton – they're the chosen ones. They control our mood for the week. No singer does that. I can leave their concert elated or play their new album over and over, but it won't cause a background feeling of joy or wretched nerves throughout the duration of a football season. So I can talk to a singer, no problem. The prospect of meeting my life's mood controllers? I'm jelly.

I mean, I've interviewed Chris Martin twice. Not that one, I'm talking about the singer from Coldplay. What, you think I could hold down a conversation with the striker who hammered in our equaliser in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy final? Get real!
