



Mark Robins looks ahead to today's game against Luton Town, and reflects on recent matches.



Good afternoon and welcome to the Ricoh Arena for our game against Luton Town.

I would like to extend that welcome to Nathan Jones, his staff, players and the supporters from Luton today.

Again, there seems to have been a long period between home matches and we are pleased to be back here and playing in front of our own supporters again. In the coming weeks, we have three games out of four at the Ricoh Arena, in what is always a busy Christmas period.

Last time here, we drew 1-1 with a strong Peterborough side. After going behind late in the game, we showed tremendous character to go straight up the other end and level the game through Conor Chaplin's goal. They play in a way that tries to put you under pressure all the time, but I thought we played well and were deserving of more in the match.

On the Tuesday following that game, we had the long trip to Fleetwood and were disappointed with the result. I would like to thank all of the fans who made the long midweek journey there, and we were disappointed that we didn't get the result your dedication warranted.

In terms of performance, we were strong in the first-half but less so in the second and that cost us the game. Their goalkeeper was awarded man of the match, which says something about the game, and if we had put away some of the chances we created then it becomes a different contest and possibly a different result. As it was, Fleetwood finished the few chances they created and came away with three points.

Due to the FA Cup, we had a bit of a break which was required for everyone, especially with the number of fixtures that take place over the

Christmas and New Year period and the need to try and keep players fresh.

Last Saturday at Walsall, we were again backed by a superb travelling set of supporters. Our performance was a good one, ultimately up until the final three minutes of the game, and we should have been talking about a strong, professional away performance. We created three or four very good chances when we were one nil up, which would have given us the cushion in the game that we needed.

It was pleasing to see Luke Thomas find the net again. He has now added goals to his game recently, and is developing well and becoming a very real threat to teams in this league.

It was a case of poor decision making that cost us the win. Lee had just seconds earlier made an outstanding save, which shouldn't be forgotten - such is the life of a goalkeeper. It is an experience Lee will bounce back from. Then to add insult to injury, the referee gave a soft penalty decision. Towards the end, we had stopped doing the things which had given us the lead in the first half and kept us ahead for 91 minutes, that was a harsh lesson for us to learn.

The good thing about this time of year in football is that there is no time to dwell on anything, it's fast moving and thankfully we move on to today's game, and we face a Luton Town side who are currently sitting second in the league table. They were promoted as runners-up from League Two last season, and have adapted well to the challenges that League One poses.

They are the highest scorers in the league currently, so it is important that we are aware of the threats that they pose, act accordingly and keep concentration levels high. It is also important that we keep creating goal scoring opportunities as we have done in recent weeks, and we relax in those moments to take more of those chances.

Today is the Club's first ever Jimmy Hill Day, which I think is a fantastic initiative. Not only is it great to celebrate the club's history and the achievements of one of its true legends, but it is also excellent to raise money and awareness for the Legacy Fund named in his honour too.

As today is my last set of programme notes until Boxing Day, I would like to wish all supporters a very Happy Christmas.

Enjoy the game.

Good afternoon and welcome to this afternoon's match against Luton Town - I would also like to welcome the players, staff, officials and supporters from Luton to the Ricoh Arena this afternoon.

Today is our first Jimmy Hill Day, which we hope will become a regular event. We're delighted to hold this event, not only to celebrate the achievements of Jimmy but also to raise money for the Legacy Fund established in his honour. We're pleased to welcome players from Jimmy's team of the 1960s as our guests today.

Over the last few weeks, our future at the Ricoh Arena and the future of the club itself has been at the forefront of everyone's mind.

While our owners Sisu choose to continue their court actions and Wasps choose not to negotiate a deal, the Football Club and its supporters are left to watch all this play-out from the side lines.

Our open letter last week caused some debate amongst supporters. I felt it was important to Lay out the outcome and consequences if this impasse continues and a deal is not agreed.

It is important that we continue to highlight the commitment made in 2014 by Coventry City Council to "the security and future of Coventry City Football Club" when they sold the Ricoh Arena to Wasps, which the Council now claims had an expiry date of four years only. This was not stated at the time, was certainly not minuted and was not reported in the media. It does seem a little odd that such a critical and fundamental feature of the Council's commitment to the football club should go undocumented.

It was also important that the open letter highlighted to supporters that there is no legal or practical reason that Wasps cannot sit down with the Football Club to agree a deal to play at the Ricoh Arena while legal challenges from the Owners continue - this situation has existed in prior years when previous deals have been agreed and completed whilst the court action was ongoing. We are more than willing to sit down with Wasps and negotiate a deal.

There was some criticism that the letter did not point to the actions of the Owners that have contributed to this impasse. The Football Club has regular communication with the Owners and we make strong representations on the current situation to them. Everyone is aware of the consequences of a no deal scenario.

The Football Club took no part in deciding whether the Club owners should pursue an appeal in the Supreme Court. It is the Club Owners who are taking this legal action and pursuing an appeal. This was publicly confirmed by Coventry City Council and Wasps last week.

All of this, however, is not contributing to resolving this dispute. Media statements do not resolve disputes. Unmoveable 'red lines' do not resolve disputes. The only way this dispute can be resolved for the good of Coventry City Football Club, its supporters, the City of Coventry and our community is if the landlord and tenant sit down together and talk constructively.

We made that offer publicly in our Open Letter, and have since written to Wasps and Coventry City Council to put that offer in writing to them. We keenly await their response, and are willing to meet anywhere, anytime to resolve this impasse. We enjoy an excellent day-to-day working relationship with Wasps, and would like to improve our relationship with Coventry City Council - especially as we approach Coventry being 'City of Sport' in 2019.

We met with the Supporters Forum on Wednesday night to update them on the situation, and answer the questions of them and those who they represent.

While our focus is of course on resolving this situation, the day-to-day running of the Football Club continues. Some of the notable things which have happened lately include:

Community Day announced for our game vs Gillingham in February, multiple wins at the Coventry and Warwickshire Sports Awards, CCFC Race Day at Warwick Racecourse announced for April, Christmas Hospital visit by players, Players attending the Christmas Light Switch On, Sky Blues in the Community project visits by players, JSB Party announced for 3rd January at the Ricoh Arena, meetings of the Leamington and Warwick and the Bedworth and Nuneaton Supporters Clubs, Groundsman Matt Skingle winning Young Sports Turf Person of the Year, the opening of the new Indoor Pitch at the Alan Higgs Centre, the Recruitment Department working hard in the build-up to the January transfer window.

Myself and everyone at the Football Club, on and off the pitch, are working hard to build a Club that you as supporters can be proud of - hopefully you have seen improvements over the last couple of years in that respect.

Whether it is the work to secure a deal at the Ricoh Arena, or the things I have outlined above, we will all continue to work tirelessly to do that.

Finally, I would like to wish everyone a Merry Christmas.

Coventry City were big winners at the Coventry and Warwickshire Sports Awards on Thursday night at the Ricoh Arena.



The Sky Blues scooped the Team of the Year award on the back of last year's historic promotion campaign, with Mark Robins taking home the Manager of the Year prize after guiding the side to that success.

In the emotional final award of the night, FA Cup winning Manager and former player John Sillett was presented with the Lifetime Achievement Award.

Sky Blues midfielders Michael Doyle and Tom Bayliss were finalists in the awards for Professional Sportsman and Young Professional Sportsman of the Year prizes, while Ron Bannister was a finalist in Volunteer of the Year for his work with Sky Blues in the Community.

Sky Blues goalkeeping coach and club legend Steve Ogrizovic was on hand to present an award on the night, as was fellow 87 hero Dave Bennett and star of the 60's Dietmar Bruck.





INTRODUCING LUTON TOWN



The Hatters moved into the automatic promotion places after last weekend's home win over Fleetwood. Now unbeaten in the league for over two months, Luton have won their last four league games in a run that has also seen them progress into the third round of the FA Cup.

While their sensational home record is attracting attention Luton's prowess on the road has seen them win three and draw one of their last five away trips in the league. It is an exciting time for the club who have ambitious plans for a new 17,500 capacity stadium as they target a second successive promotion.

Bringing in Scotland international Andrew Shinnie from Birmingham, Matty Pearson from Barnsley, Sonny Bradley from Plymouth and former Brighton winger Kazenga LuaLua after his release by Sunderland, Luton geared up for their new level by bringing in men who mainly are used to playing at a higher level than they are experiencing this season. Bringing in two players on loan from Championship clubs who have contested European Cup finals also illustrated the wish for

quality although the broken leg suffered by Leeds' Republic of Ireland international Eunan O'Kane three months ago today was a blow.

One point from the opening three games didn't look too good but as the table has taken shape it can be seen that those first fixtures were against a trio of League One's pace-setters in Portsmouth, Sunderland and Peterborough.

Kenilworth Road is a place teams don't relish visiting, consistent wins propelling the Hatters up the table with Plymouth and Accrington on the end of heavy defeats. Having taken only two points from their first five away trips Luton have since demonstrated they have acclimatised to the higher level.

Luton tend to play with a diamond shape in midfield, Elliott Lee scoring regularly from the forward tip of it. Harry Cornick and James Collins are often the front two while skipper Glen Rea anchors the midfield with Andrew Shinnie and Pelly Ruddock-Mpanzu the workhorses. Usually the back four consists of Jack Stacey, Matty Pearson, Sonny Bradley and James Justin ahead of 'keeper James Shea.

BACK STORY...

In existence since 1885, Luton's highest point came in the same era as Coventry's. When Luton lifted the League Cup in 1988, the Sky Blues were the FA Cup holders. From 1982 to '92 Luton were a top flight team who as well as winning the League Cup also reached the final 12 months later as they sought to defend the only major honour they have ever recorded. Luton were also losing finalists in the FA Cup final in 1959.

Amidst the glory of runs to Wembley and top level football there have been some tough times for Luton supporters. A decade ago financial problems led to three successive relegations that saw the club sink from the Championship to the Conference a 30-point deduction resulting from financial problems being a contributory factor. Ironically Luton dropped out of the league having just won the Football League Trophy.

After a period of stabilisation the road back began with promotion back into the Football League in 2014. Finishes of 8th and 11th provided the basis for a fourth position two seasons ago and after losing in the Play-offs automatic promotion came last season. With a terrific home record and continual improvement on the road Luton are in the running to return to the Championship they left in 2007.

Having cost Luton a fee from Welsh football when he was 22, Nathan Jones left Kenilworth Road without playing a game but he evidently wasn't finished with them. He moved to the second division in Spain but wasn't gone too long before coming back to top 100 games for Southend, over 150 games for Brighton and close to 200 for Yeovil, who he captained at Wembley in a Play-off final.

It was with Yeovil that he moved into coaching, starting with the club's Ladies team before becoming assistant manager of the men's team. After a spell coaching Charlton's Under 21 side he moved further south to Brighton, having a 10-day stint


as caretaker boss five years ago this month, winning one and drawing one.

Given a first managerial appointment Mr. Jones got off to a flying start with the Hatters. Having taken the club to the Play-offs in his first full season, he did even better in his second full campaign winning automatic promotion last season when he won the League Two Manager of the Month award three times. So far this term his Luton side continue to improve and progress and with a win ratio of over 50% from in excess of 160 games in charge he continues to prove to the club that let him go as a player that they were right all along to bring him to the club.

Incredibly he also was called upon to train with England during 2010 when a goalkeeping crisis as Fabio Capello's squad trained at Arsenal's training ground resulted in him being whisked from an Arsenal reserve session to train with the national team.

It was at the more modest AFC Wimbledon that Shea started to really make his name. His first clean sheet for the Dons came at Kenilworth Road against Luton while in 2016 helped Wimbledon to promotion.

Player of the Year with Harrow Borough in 2015, Shea is nothing if not switched on. All those debates you've ever heard about it not being worthwhile protesting to the referee were rendered redundant last season when the keeper convinced the referee not to send him off after he had been shown a red card! Match official John Busby dismissed him in a cup-tie against Barnet only for the Luton custodian to remind the referee that a recent change in the Laws of the game meant a player couldn't be sent off for a genuine attempt to play the ball.





Rob Mason traces the tale of meetings with today's visitors

HEAD TO HEAD »

Coventry hold the upper hand in an almost century long run of meetings.

Coventry have a significant lead in the series with 37 victories and 21 losses against Luton. There have been 14 draws. In League games Sky Blues superiority has been more pronounced as four of those Hatters wins have come in cup ties, whereas only one of City's wins came in a cup game.

The only drawn cup encounter came in the very first meeting of the clubs almost a century ago. Goals from Billy Walker and Fred Jones (his last for the club) were cancelled out by Tom Parker and an own goal as second division Coventry were held by Southern League Luton to a 2-2 draw at Kenilworth Road in January 1920 but if Bantams supporters thought their side had done the hard part they were mistaken as Luton came to Coventry and won with a goal from Syd Hoar

Luton haven't won in Coventry since New Year's Day 1987. That was the first of seven successive home wins in this fixture, a sequence disturbed by last March's draw.

Luton were last here in March when they showed their own promotion credentials by fighting back to take a draw after trailing 2-0 at half time. City joy at seeing Marc McNulty double the third minute lead established by Peter Vincenti was wiped out as James Collins levelled with a header two minutes from time. Scott Cuthbert had put the visitors back in the game 10 minutes after the re-start.

A crowd of 8,863 saw the equaliser cost Coventry two vital points as they edged into the final Play-off spot, a point ahead of Lincoln. Luton meanwhile would have gone top had they won but were left comfortably in second place, nestled in just behind Accrington.

BIGGEST WIN »

13 is an unlucky number for Luton when it comes to clashes with Coventry. That is how many times City have scored four or more against them. In 1983, 1963 and 1938 four goals were scored by Coventry at Luton while in 1991, 1952 and 1929 five were scored against them at home.

The best of those victories came in August 1991 when a 5-0 victory was assisted by Luton centre-forward Sean Farrell's early red card. Coventry were already ahead thanks to Kevin Gallacher's seventh minute opener and



by half time were three to the good after an overhead kick by Gallacher was added to when Robert Rosario was first to the rebound after David Smith drove against the post. Smith would get on the scoresheet after the break with the scoring wrapped up by Paul Furlong's first goal for the club. It was only August but it proved an important three points. City stayed up with two points to spare - ahead of Luton.

WORST DEFEAT »

Coventry have conceded four goals to Luton on three occasions. The heaviest of these defeats came three days before Christmas in 1934 when Sam

Bell, Wilf Crompton and Jack Ball, who got two, made it a happy Christmas for the home side, for whom this was the second of three consecutive games where they scored four.

FANCY THAT »

There were 18 goals scored in three games with Luton during the 1963-64 promotion season with Jimmy Hill's side never failing to register at least three. City started the sequence with a 3-1 win at Luton in September and returned there 11 days later to win 4-3 in the League Cup. Come January there was another goal-fest in the league return at Highfield Road where just under 21,000 saw the sides draw 3-3.


Having set a divisional points record of 103 with Wolves in 2013-14, Portsmouth boss Kenny Jackett seems set on breaking his own record. With 47 points from their first 20 games by last weekend the Fratton Park side had a six-point lead on second placed Luton, who Sky Blues fans will get the chance to see this afternoon. That lead may have been extended following Pompey's mid-week meeting with Coventry's next visitors Charlton.

Last weekend Pompey had the game wrapped up early on, the final score of a routine 2-0 home win over mid-table Southend being registered before the half-hour mark. An even more routine 2-0 home win was that of Luton over Fleetwood who have lost more than they have won under Joey Barton this season. Unbeaten in 15 home games and enjoying their best home run in over quarter of a century the Hatters top the form table over the last six games.

One team suddenly out of form are Barnsley. Having previously lost just three times they have lost their last two and face leaders Portsmouth at Oakwell this afternoon, already 12 points behind the men from the south coast.

Peterborough similarly are losing ground, last week's home draw with improving Oxford being their third stalemate in their last four games, leaving Posh in fourth place despite striker Ivan Toney scoring six in his last seven appearances in all competitions.

A record sell-out crowd at the Wham Stadium saw a wash-out as Accrington's home game with Sunderland was abandoned mid-way through the

second half in a game where for the second successive trip the travelling support filled two sides of the ground. The Wearsiders have started beaming away games back to the Stadium of Light where today Bristol Rovers visit for the first time with manager Darrel Clarke under immense pressure. Beaten 4-0 at home by Doncaster last week, the Gas have lost their last four league games in addition to being bundled out of the FA Cup by non-league Barnet. Donny on the other hand are in splendid form with 18 goals in their last six games in all competitions - a run where the only game not won was an away derby draw at Barnsley.

Today Donny entertain Scunthorpe. Play-off semi-finalists last season, the Iron are fifth bottom following one win in 10. The most recent of those losses came at home to Gillingham, for whom the division's top scorer Tom Eaves took his seasonal tally to 13, only to discover it was an unlucky number when he spurned the opportunity for number 14 by sky-ing a spot-kick.

Only the top two have taken more points than ninth placed Wycombe from the last six games. The Chairboys' most recent win over Barnsley established a club record sixth successive home win, a run stretching back to before

October's defeat at Coventry. Just outside the Play-off places Blackpool leap-frogged Charlton by beating them with a late goal at Bloomfield Road.

Two clubs with new managers picked up one point between them last weekend. Under Wally Downes AFC Wimbledon drew 1-1 at home to Rochdale but ex Wrexham boss Sam Ricketts saw his new Shrews lose 2-1 at mid-table Burton, the only one of the relegated teams not in the top six. Shrewsbury at least have a regular scorer, Feji Okenabirhie hitting his sixth goal in as many games. Shrewsbury and Rochdale are locked together in lower mid-table with Gillingham on 24 points, while the Dons are kept off the bottom merely by goal difference ahead of Bradford. The other Bantams are fast improving however. Their only defeat in their last six games in all competitions was at high-flying Luton. Last weekend Bradford shared six goals with third bottom Plymouth where manager Derek Adams has had the vote of confidence.

Last and least is the story of Luke Leahy. One goal in his previous 69 games and 90 minutes had elapsed in his 70th when the Coventry born Sky Blue supporter scored twice in injury time to enable Walsall to overturn City's goal advantage.





What is the Jimmy Hill Legacy Fund?

Who Have the JHLF Helped So Far?

The Jimmy Hill Legacy Fund opened grant applications in January 2018 with a maximum submission of £1000. The aims of the grant process were to increase opportunities to take part in sport, health and physical activity, improve community relations, reduce crime and antisocial behaviour and improve educational attainment.

Applications that were approved included:

- Coventry Sphinx Junior Football Club U14's received £500 to give them the opportunity to buy new playing kits for 16 players. The club actually managed to fundraise and add to this amount to enable them to purchase both a home and away kit - using The Jimmy Hill Legacy Fund as a front of shirt sponsor for both!
- Bulkington Sports and Social Cricket Club received £500 to enable them to train a volunteer to become a qualified coach and also gave them to funds to send coaches into schools to raise awareness of the club. The funding helped the club to retain numbers and increase physical activity participation across the community.
- Friends of Castlewood School received £1000 to update the playground equipment at the school. Being a Special Educational Needs school, many of the children do not have the imagination, social skills or communication to enable them to play games in the same way as mainstream children. They fitted a new trampoline which is built into the floor, meaning it is accessible to most. They also fitted additional music related equipment which entertains the children during break and lunchtime.
- The Family Zone received £1000 to allow them to update their facilities. Jimmy Hill was a big believer in engaging the younger generation and increasing the participation levels on home games. The Family Zone do a fantastic job of entertaining and appealing to Sky Blue fans from a young age. They used the money to purchase new TV's and PlayStation equipment. They can now cater for more families and attract a higher number each week!

Weight Management Football

Our Weight Management Football programme in Leamington is coming to the end of its first 16 weeks and we are proud of the success that the men we are supporting have made.

Leamington Weight Management Football is a programme for men who want to lose weight in a safe, controlled, and lasting manner, and want to enjoy that weight loss whilst playing football with other men in the same situation. Each programme lasts for 16 weeks, with weekly weigh-ins, waist measures at weeks 1, 9, and 16, an hour of football, behaviour change support via WhatsApp, and two support booklets.

Men know that excess weight, affectionally known as 'timber' by our group, has a detrimental effect on health, but whilst there are many appealing options for women there are very few options that put men first in supporting their weight management journey. Our programme does just that - we listen to what men want and then tailor the weight management programme to meet their needs. The current course attracted men with an average starting weight of 109kg, and an average starting BMI of 34.5; this is aimed at bigger guys. We have seen some fantastic success stories on the scales, with 3 guys shedding 10% of their bodyweight and a further 3 shedding 5% of their bodyweight. Our men also average losing 2cm off their waist per month







Sky Blues midfielder talks return to fitness and reflects on his City career to date.



As the song goes 'Kelly in the middle' is exactly the place you'll have found centre-midfielder Liam Kelly in his first 48 appearances, as he approaches his 50th game for the Sky Blues.

Having joined during the summer of 2017 after departing Leyton Orient following their relegation, Kelly has been a key figure in the City midfield.

Featuring regularly throughout the Sky Blues promotion winning campaign of last season, Kelly, who predominantly featured alongside captain Michael Doyle became an influential man in the starting eleven.

The midfielder is no stranger to the Football League, having played for the likes of Bristol City, Oldham Athletic and Leyton Orient before joining the last year.

Now, after suffering minor injuries which has kept him out for parts of the 2018/19 season, Kelly is looking forward to staking a claim for the starting eleven.

He said: "I'm glad to be back and to start at the weekend against Walsall, after spending the majority of the season out injured or on the bench, it was nice to get a start.

"I'm back to 100% now and feeling fit and I'm just looking forward to playing games because that's what you love to do and that's what you're all footballers so I'm just looking forward to getting a good run of games.

"The result wasn't what we wanted against Walsall however, football can be cruel sometimes and to get that defeat in the last few minutes of the game shows you how quickly football can change.

"We will be looking to make sure that doesn't happen again this season and make sure we do the right things in pivotal moments of games.

"I think last year was a long, long season, I think from the start of pre-season to the play-off final it was about eleven months and I think it took a toll on the body.

"Then, it was just one niggling injury after the other, but I'm glad to be back now fit and fighting and try to help the football club finish in a good position come the end of the season."

The midfielder currently sits on 48 appearances in a Sky Blues shirt, with the first landmark of 50 only around the corner.

During his time with City so far, Kelly has enjoyed a run in the FA Cup as well as helping securing promotion back to League One at the first attempt.

Looking back over his 18 months or so with the Sky Blues, Liam admitted he is hoping that


the run of success continue whilst he remains at the club.

"I've definitely enjoyed it." Kelly said.

"There's been some great games, you look at last season and the play-offs were great accomplishments and you just strive to hopefully get more and more of those sort of games throughout your Coventry career.

"It was a brilliant day at Wembley and for an eleven month season to come down to one game I think it's tough on the fans, players and staff, it's an incredibly stressful time.

"To come out winners is an emphatic feeling and something everyone needed after having suffered the relegation the season before, so it was a welcome relief to get some success back at the football club.



"It's a long season this year and if we can get ourselves in a position to hopefully get there again then it's something I'm really looking forward to during the next two and a half years."

The Sky Blues currently sit middle of the road in the SkyBet League One table in 12th position, six points off the play-off places Kelly eluded to.

In what has been a season of ups and downs already in terms of results for City, Kelly believes last season's campaign can be used as a marker in comparison.

"I think we probably got off to a slow start and then we pushed on well, but in recent games the performances haven't matched the results like last weekend for example.

"It's a long season and it's where you are come the end of the season which matters.

"If you look back to last season, I'm sure most of the fans forget about the times we dropped out of the play-offs, but come the end of the season we got promotion and that's when it matters.

"So, we are looking to build up that points tally game by game and if we can get ourselves in a good position come the end of the season then anything can happen."

City will be looking to get back to winning ways this afternoon, as they host fellow League Two promotion winners, Luton Town at the Ricoh Arena.

The fixture gives Kelly and his team mates an opportunity to bounce back from last

weekend's cruel blow at Walsall against a 'good' Luton side.

Kelly said: "They're a good team, we saw that last season when we played against them twice.

"They're a team that score a lot of goals, so we will need to make sure that we're on the top of our game and perform well to keep the goals out of one end and making sure we finish our chances at the other.

"We do create a lot of chances and we've been unlucky in recent games not being able to convert them but we know the capabilities in our squad.

"Luton have started the season well, so if we want to be up there competing these are the teams that we need to be getting results against."

The U's then took the lead against the run of play when Ryan Clampin pulled the ball across goal for McKeown, who fired into the top of the goal.

The Sky Blues looked to find an immediate response and they almost found it through Jonny Ngandu as his shot went just over the bar.

After the half-time break, Corey Addai made a good stop to deny Todd Miller who's shot towards the bottom corner was well stopped by the City keeper.

Jak Hickman almost found a leveller when he watched on as his free-kick flew wide of the hosts goal on 55 minutes.

However, moments later the Sky Blues were level as Jack Burroughs broke into the box and slotted home a fine finish to make it 1-1.

With minutes left on the clock, City continued to pile on the pressure and were almost rewarded but were denied by the U's keeper who got down well to earn his side a point.

Reflecting on the game, Sky Blues Under-23s Coach, Jason Farndon was disappointed to only come away with a point.

He said: "I thought we were excellent box to box, we controlled and dominated the majority of the game, across midfield and going forward.

"However, it was in that final third where we just lacked that killer instinct to put the ball in the back of the net.

SKY BLUES Supremos

Mark Robins is the latest in a long line of Sky Blue Supremos, the men who have tried to bring success to City. In this series PUSB reflects on the highs and lows on those who have occupied the hot-seat.

Dick Bayliss was Coventry City's first post-World War Two manager. Appointed in June 1945, the former player of today's visitors Luton was in charge until April 1947, when he passed away three weeks before what would have been his 48th birthday.

When appointed, Bayliss was not a fresh face for the brave new world of the post-war era. He already knew Coventry inside out and back to front, having been at the club since 1931. Throughout that period of close to a decade and a half - an era that away from football had witnessed the depression and the rise and fall of Nazi Germany, and Coventry as a city suffering more than most - he had been the right hand man of Harry Storer, a role that included Bayliss being chief scout.


Storer's story had seen City climb into the Second Division having been promoted for the first time in 1935-36 as champions of Division Three South. After the war Storer decided to have a fresh start himself, taking over at Birmingham City, although there would be another chapter to be written about him at Coventry where he would return in November 1948.

Storer was a tough disciplinarian so perhaps some of the players saw Bayliss as a lighter touch once the old gaffer was gone, especially as Dick inherited an ageing side who were largely the pre-war squad who had seen it all before.

Hardly surprisingly, Bayliss concentrated on trying to bring new young players into the ranks. He had a successful track record of recruitment, a talent which even today is notoriously difficult. Nowadays the internet, highlights reels commissioned by agents, who in 90 seconds can make plodders look something like Pele, and the motorway network can make scouting a lot simpler than it was seven decades ago. Tragically it would be such a scouting mission that would be responsible for the early death of a man who gave so much of his young life to Coventry City.

It was testimony to his dedication that despite the notorious winter of 1947 Bayliss still undertook an arduous January scouting trip, looking as always for new talent to bring to his club. Sadly, his health took a turn for the worse after picking up a chill on that spotting trip to Scotland when he was stuck in a snowstorm in Yorkshire as he tried to get home. For weeks afterwards he was unwell but still came to work at the club before it was discovered that he had an incurable kidney disease.

On 5 April 1947 Dick Bayliss passed away at home in Coventry following a short stay in a nursing home in Kenilworth. He was survived by his wife Ethel. That same afternoon nineteen and a half thousand came to see Coventry pay their own tribute, beating Sheffield Wednesday 5-1 at home with George Lowrie scoring four of City's goals. News of their manager's death must

have been a sombre postscript to a big victory that left the club ninth in the table with an impressive home record, having lost just one of 16 games.

City had done well under Bayliss. For his first season after the war the Football League did not resume. Instead Coventry participated in a competition called Football League South. It was a campaign of 42 games with almost all of the fixtures played as double-headers at home and away to the same club. Impressively the team of the thirties, Arsenal, were beaten 2-0 at home in Bayliss' first game - Lowrie scoring the first goal of his reign - with a goalless draw achieved at Highbury the following Saturday.


Luton were in the same league and won at Highfield Road after Coventry had won on their patch. City twice scored seven at home, against Newport and Millwall but 70 years ago today lost heavily at Highfield Road, 5-2 to West Ham who completed the double a week later when City's three goals were only half as many as the home side notched.

Coventry finished 13th of the 22 clubs, five of which would be top flight outfits when the Football League resumed the following season. Although City weren't short of games given the Football League South competition, due to the lack of competitive games being experienced by some clubs in the north, for one season only it was

Sky Blue Story 50 Years On...

First away win ends 12 game run without a win

The Sky Blues travelled to Stoke's Victoria Ground on the second Saturday of November 1968 with confidence following their excellent performance against Southampton the previous week, when only a superb goalkeeping performance by Gerry Gurr stopped City getting the elusive win to end an 11-game run without a victory. Noel Cantwell kept an unchanged side for the trip to the Potteries to face an experienced Stoke team. A noisy following of City fans made the trek too.

City had the first attack and Ernie Hunt headed Ian Gibson's cross just over the bar with Gordon Banks groping to reach the ball. On seven minutes City's promising start was rewarded with a Tony Hateley goal. Ernie Machin slung a long high cross into the home goalmouth and Hateley ran in full pell to head well out of Banks' reach into the top of the net.

Chances came and went at both ends but City were definitely on top and Neil Martin and Hateley were causing lots of problems for the Stoke defence. Dobing had Stoke's best chance of the first half but Glazier rushed out and forced him to chip the ball wide. Four minutes before break Hateley made it 2-0 with a fine bit of opportunism. Hunt's shot struck Alan Bloor in flight and as the ball fell loose 'Big Tone' rammed it past Banks.

Stoke threw everything at City after the break but they stubbornly refused to yield despite being pegged back for long periods. Glazier saved well from Dobing and Stoke appealed in vain for a penalty when Glazier's punch sent David Herd to ground. On 68 minutes City made it 3-0 when with Gibson on the ground following a foul by Dobing, they broke down the left. Willie Carr timed his pass outside to the marauding Dave Clements. Neil Martin


met the pinpoint cross and guided his header past the flailing arms of the best goalkeeper in Britain, if not the world.

City saw out the last 20 minutes comfortably to record their first away win of the season and only their second since promotion from Division Two.

Seven days later Leeds United came to Highfield Road to face an unchanged City team, however there was a change on the bench with Gerry Baker replacing John Tudor who had been sold to Sheffield United for £65,000 in the week. Leeds, who had topped the league until a 5-1 hammering at Burnley a month before, had drawn their three previous league games 0-0 but had beaten Napoli 2-0 in the Fairs Cup in midweek. They were virtually at full-strength with the exception of

Paul Madeley deputising for Peter Lorimer.

Over the 90 minutes City created more chances, had more of the ball and caused Gary Sprake in the Leeds goal all sorts of problems but they could not score and the game was decided by a Madeley goal in the 21st minute. Bremner's high centre was cleared from the goalmouth but, without hesitation, Madeley caught it flush on the outside of his right boot and bent a fierce shot past Glazier. Leeds played their usual 'professional' game, giving little away and fouling when danger lurked. Hateley headed goalwards past Sprake but Jack Charlton cleared in front of goal. Then Martin shot high and wide after Hateley had beaten Sprake in the air again. Near the end Hateley got in a fierce shot which bounced off the 'keeper's' chest before Terry Cooper cleared.



City fans in the 33,000 crowd left at the final whistle wishing that City could be as hard to beat as Leeds.

City's relegation rivals all lost with Leicester losing 4-0 at West Ham and the Sky Blues lay 19th in Division One. At the top leaders Liverpool won 2-1 at Hillsborough but second-placed Everton were snapping at their heels after a 4-0 home win over bottom of the table QPR.
