Welcome back to Kenilworth Road for what is an unusual Sunday lunchtime kick-off for us in Sky Bet League One, with the game being screened live on Sky Sports.

Coventry City are one of my former clubs, albeit briefly, and we all know of their traditions as a top-flight or Championship outfit. A couple of difficult years led to their relegation to League Two, but they came back up with ourselves as play-off winners last season and we know from the games we've had against them in the past 18 months that we are in for a tough test in front of the cameras this afternoon.

I know Mark Robins well, having played against him many times during the terrific career he had and he's since forged a career as a widely respected manager. He was one of my successors as Rotherham manager a few years ago and he's done a fine job in his second spell in charge at the Ricoh Arena. I sincerely hope their current issues surrounding the stadium are resolved and they can look forward to a secure and successful future.

Thankfully, our own club is in a hugely positive state on and off the pitch at the moment, with the new stadium planning consent granted for Power Court and the second leg to come with the Newlands Park council meeting on March 11th.

2020 have done a brilliant job for Luton Town since becoming custodians ten years ago and I was only too pleased to be able to help them focus on those massively important matters for the club's future by continuing as manager until the end of the season when I was asked last week.

At the risk of repeating myself, this group of players make it easy. They are a squad everyone should be proud of and I'm absolutely thrilled that they have written their names in the club's history books with that win at Fleetwood last week. You have to celebrate such achievements and I asked for the picture of the players to be taken in the dressing room. That they called the staff in to join them shows the togetherness there is within the club.

What has pleased me even more is their determination to get straight back to work this week, with their feet firmly on the ground, and look to continue with their form. I'm the lucky one who has been asked to steer them, but the players and staff are a credit to Luton Town Football Club and I know they are fully focussed on the main goal, which is to win promotion.

The support you have shown us all in recent weeks has been unbelievable. Another 1,000-plus travelled to Fleetwood after a sell-out here against Wycombe. Despite the game being on TV, I know it'll be the same again today.

Let the lads know you're here, because the support you have given them has definitely played a part in the unbeaten run here this season. Enjoy the game.

FROM THE BOARDROOM

WITH DIRECTOR MIKE HERRICK

It is our pleasure to welcome all connected with Coventry City to Kenilworth Road today for this Sunday lunchtime Sky Bet League One fixture.

It is perhaps a measure of the attractiveness of the brand of football that we are playing these days, coupled with opponents who are also known for playing exciting, attacking football, that makes this game an obvious choice to bring to a wider audience in front of the Sky cameras today.

In all my years supporting the club I don't think I've ever experienced quite so much that eager anticipation of waiting for the next game. They just don't seem to come round quickly enough – so the thought of having to wait an extra day this week is not easy!

When we played the reverse fixture in December in continuous freezing rain it was the coldest I've ever been at a football match and the post match interviews, outside in the Arctic weather, were painful even to watch.

Though still mid-February we hope that the temperature today will be many degrees higher, helped, no doubt, by the exhilarating atmosphere that is generated in this wonderful old stadium we call home (currently).

With the March 11th date fixed in the calendar for the determination of the Newlands Park development it will not now be long before we might be able to map out our longer-term future more clearly. Without a doubt this is by far the most important fixture ahead – not just for the football club but for the transformation and regeneration of the whole town. Since our planning applications were submitted in 2016 we have certainly learnt the art of patience and we thank you all for your unwavering support – matched only by your enthusiasm at our games all season.

In fact, it is pleasing to report that many of our remaining fixtures have already sold out and tickets for the others are now in short supply. It is so heartening for us to see things coming together both on and off the field, and we say this first and foremost as diehard fans ourselves rather than as directors.

On the pitch, our record-breaking run continues unabated and last week at Fleetwood we broke the 19-game-unbeaten barrier with another competent victory.

I remember so clearly the 1967-68 season when we achieved the first of these 19 game runs. On the 18th game a 1-0 win away to Halifax (Rioch free-kick outside the box with about 10 mins to play) clinched the first ever promotion I'd seen us achieve (after a gradual and painful descent lasting 10 years and with three relegations), followed four days later by the 4-0 win at home to Crewe to clinch the title ahead of Barnsley with three games to spare. What joyous scenes there were that night!

What I think I'll remember most about the current run, though, is the scintillating football that we've played throughout the campaign – that and the togetherness of the squad and the fans. Little things like Alan Sheehan picking out a young lad from the crowd at Fleetwood to join in the half-time warm-up with the subs. What a memory for him!

It is a fact of life that players at any club are, by their nature, transitory, but our current crop have really bought into Luton Town FC and their efforts can be seen off the field as well as on. They are happy to give their time to charitable causes and today's game is the dedicated matchday for the

players' chosen charity 'Kids in Action'. Amongst other events, each player has donated a pair of their boots (cleaned I hope!) which will be auctioned to raise funds for the charity. Just think – you could own Collo's boots that have struck fear and terror into League One defences this year, or maybe bid for the boots of a future England international (now who might that be?).

Keep your eyes peeled on the club website and social media for the online auction that will start next week, for your chance to help a terrific local charity devoted to children and young adults with disabilities – and the opportunity to have in your possession a pair of boots, or goalie gloves, that have been part of the record-breaking run.

So, let's hope that we can keep it going. I know lots of people are trying to take the credit for this by always wearing certain 'lucky' items of clothing, and I'm proud to have done my bit with my insistence on wearing the same socks, shirt and pants for every game. This has clearly had a major impact. Just to be sure, I never clean my shoes after a win. Trouble is, my wife just doesn't understand and has no idea of the importance of these rituals, no matter how often I try to explain it to her. Is it just me or does anyone else have this problem? I'd probably prefer not to have to get a new one.



I'm off on holiday for the next couple of games, but rest assured we've always won when I've been away – and I'll be wearing my usual matchday kit on the beach as I watch from afar.

Enjoy the game and bring me sunshine!

HATTERS PUT THE BOOT IN FOR KIDS IN ACTION!

Today is the designated matchday for the Hatters' players' charity of the season Kids In Action, and you will see their volunteers collecting at various locations around the ground.

The Dunstable-based charity was established in 1996 to provide a weekly youth club for children with special needs, and this runs every Saturday from 10am to 4pm.

In recent years, as the children who used the facilities have grown into adults, the charity's founder Paul Bowen-James and manager Tracey Hammond have started to run an Over-18s club for existing members which takes place every Monday from 6-9pm.

Many young people with disabilities experience isolation and loneliness, and Kids In Action's work helps to alleviate these negative experiences and is often described as lifeline by parents. By providing facilities and support to young people, this has enabled the organic growth of extended support to families who have a shared experience of caring for a family member with disabilities.

Earlier in the season, Hatters stars James Shea, Jack Stacey, Harry Cornick and Harry Isted visited the charity and spent the afternoon playing table tennis, computer games and other activities with the youngsters.

We also shared a video of Danny Hylton speaking to 13-year-old Curtis, who lives with cerebral palsy, on FaceTime. Danny promised his No.1 fan Curtis tickets to a game, then surprised him with the opportunity to be mascot for the Wycombe FA Cup tie last November.

Now the players are hoping that their idea to auction their boots and goalkeeper gloves will help Kids In Action towards their goal of raising £750,000 needed to purchase the building they currently use in Boscombe Road, Dunstable.



The Hatters players have worn these boots during the recent record-breaking unbeaten run, so you will be buying a piece of club history if you bid and win one of the auctions that will start on Monday March 4th on the club's website and social media channels.

Shea said: "We had a great afternoon taking the kids on at FIFA, Connect Four, table tennis and other games when we visited, and it showed exactly how important it is for youngsters with disabilities and learning difficulties to have an environment like that where they are comfortable and happy."

"All the boys were up for doing whatever we could to help raise £1,000 – and hopefully more – for their Key To The Door appeal. Please donate what you can at the Coventry game and then if you feel able to bid for the lads' boots and gloves from myself, Marek and Harry, it'd be fantastic."

CLUB STATEMENT



It has been fantastic to witness home sell-out attendances at each of our last four league games. Kenilworth Road, when full, creates a very special atmosphere and it is no coincidence that our home record is so good - your support is unrivalled and we fully recognise the tremendous part you have played - and have yet to play - this season as we seek to win a second successive promotion.

With over 10,000 spectators inside Kenilworth Road we are experiencing some logistical pressures which we would like to address with your help.

We have received a small number of communications from home fans about these issues, primarily fans standing in gangways making it difficult for people to move freely around the stadium and to see past those who have decided to stand.

Kenilworth Road is a licensed all-seater stadium and failure to comply with this licence could lead to a review of that licence, which could affect capacity levels in areas where people continue to stand. No-one wants to see a reduction in the number of seats available to home supporters, but this is a sanction available to the Sports Ground Safety Authority and Luton Borough Council.

Please can we ask all supporters to comply with ground regulations, and with requests from stewards to sit in their correct seat at all times.

Our stewarding team always try to be polite and friendly, and will ask people standing in gangways or

blocking the view of others to sit down – failure to comply with this request could lead to ejection from the stadium.

There has also been some evidence of people migrating from their purchased seat to sit or stand elsewhere in the stadium. This then has a knock-on effect of displacing someone else and can lead to people standing.

To prevent this, a more stringent ticket check will be taking place at the remaining home games this season. We ask you to ensure that you bring your full season ticket book with you and not just the correct match voucher removed from the book. Failure to bring your season ticket book could delay your entry to the stadium and potentially a refusal of admission.

Luton supporters are amongst the most passionate fans around – we love and respect that and want it to continue, but we also ask that all our supporters have respect for each other and club staff.

Be loud – be proud – be respectful of our fellow Hatters' fans!

WELCOME COVENTRY CITY



The Hatters would like to extend a warm welcome to today's visiting staff, players and supporters of Coventry City.

It was a bit of an early start for all of us today, but the three points up for grabs will no doubt be the wake-up call we need and could be vital for both teams in their pursuits for some sort of achievement this season.

Cov currently find themselves just outside the play-off spots in terms of position – ninth – but were seven points behind sixth placed Doncaster prior to Grant McCann's side's game against Scunthorpe yesterday (print deadlines and all that means at the time of writing we weren't sure what the outcome of that was!).

After a patchy start, Coventry began to find their stride in the third tier, going on a five-game winning run in October. Mark Robins picked up the Manager of the Month award for his team's performances, but the award's curse struck and the Sky Blues didn't win another game until Boxing Day.

Their form has recovered though, and they've won five out of their last ten, as they – like the Hatters – attempt a double promotion. The Sky Blues are a bit of a weird one for the sort of side they do better against, having picked up points against teams across the division, beating both relegation

threatened Bradford and promotion chasing Barnsley. In fact, against the top six they have been decent, winning three out of their seven encounters, losing only twice.

Promotion was sealed last season via the play-offs, when they beat Exeter City at Wembley, after pummelling Notts County 5-2 (on aggregate) in the semi-finals. The final proved to be top scorer Marc McNulty's last game for the Sky Blues, as he made the move to Sky Bet Championship side Reading in the summer. They have struggled to replace his goals having found the net the joint sixth least amount of times in the division so far this campaign – just 3 – and are the only team in the top ten to have a goal difference on minus. On the flip side though, defensively they have been similarly good to last season, conceding 37 goals so far.

Today's visitors will no doubt be hoping to mimic their result from their last outing here, when they took all three points in a 3-0 win, with the motivation no doubt even greater having been defeated on their own turf earlier on this season by the Hatters, when Matty Pearson and James Collins grabbed the goals in a 2-1 win.

MEET THE SQUAD

THE GAFFER

Mark Robins | Age: 49

A striker in his playing days, Robins began his senior career at Manchester United in 1988. He retired in 2005 but soon found his way into management when he took over at Rotherham United as caretaker manager in 2007. The gaffer moved to Coventry City in 2017, although this wasn't the first time he had been in charge of the Sky Blues. Originally the boss in 2012, Robins lead the team from relegation favourites to play-off contenders that season. The 49-year-old did experience success at Wembley eventually with the club though, winning the Football League Trophy 2016-17 as well as the League Two play-offs last term.



THE STOPPER

Lee Burge

Age: 26

The shot-stopper is a product of the Sky Blues' academy, signing his first professional contract with the club in 2011. The only time Burge has spent away from the West Midlands was in 2013, where he spent half a season on-loan with Nuneaton, gaining some first team experience at the age of 19. He claimed a clean sheet against the Hatters that season too, proving to be a vital signing with 10 shut outs in 17 matches to steer the side away from relegation. The keeper has gone on to be City's number one for the last three seasons and played in both Wembley victories in the last two seasons.



GOALKEEPER

DAVID STOCKDALE

Age: 33

The veteran keeper signed on-loan this month from Reading, providing some competition and experience to the number one position at the club.

DEFENDERS

DOMINIC HYAM

Age: 23

Signed from Reading in 2017 after graduating from the Royals' academy in 2013. Hyam has also made five appearances for the Scottish U21 side.

DUJON STERLING

Age: 19

The highly-rated defender has represented England at U16, U17 and U19 level. Currently on-loan from Chelsea, Sterling has been an integral part of City's team this season.

DID YOU KNOW?

During his playing days, Town boss Mick Harford joined Coventry for £200,000 from Sunderland in July 1993. The then 34-year-old would go onto play just once for the Sky Blues though, coming on in the 15th minute as a substitute against Newcastle United and scored the only goal of the game – a back injury stopping him from appearing again. He left a year later for Wimbledon.



THE WALL

Jordan Willis | Age: 24

Another player from City's academy, Willis is living the dream by playing for the team he followed as a boy. Born in Coventry, the defender has stayed with the club since signing his first senior contract in 2011 - making just under 200 appearances in that time too. His hard work at the back earned the recognition of the EFL last term, being named in their team of the season as well as skippering his side to play-off glory at Wembley. He set the right example that afternoon by netting the first of the match. The centre half's only goal this season came against Barnsley in an important 1-0 win at the Ricoh Arena.

IN THE MIDDLE

Liam Kelly | Age: 29

Kelly was born just up the M1 in Milton Keynes, although his Scottish roots made him eligible to claim his one and only senior international cap in 2012 - a 2-1 win against Luxembourg. Kelly also began his career in Scotland with Kilmarnock, playing more than a century of matches for the Killie until he moved to Bristol City in 2013. The midfielder had stints with Oldham Athletic and Leyton Orient before putting pen to paper with the Sky Blues in 2017. Injury halted Kelly last season over the festive period, but he made it back in time to secure promotion at Wembley.



JUNIOR BROWN

Age: 29

Played alongside Jamie Vardy and Steve McNulty in the Fleetwood Town team to win promotion from the Conference for the first time in the club's history.

BRANDON MASON

Age: 21

Signed for City in July last year following his release from Watford. Made his Premier League debut for the Hornets in 4-1 defeat against Tottenham.

JACK GRIMMER

Age: 25

The Scot began his career with Aberdeen before signing for Fulham in the Premier League. Scored the third goal at Wembley which secured promotion back to League One last season.

TOM DAVIES

Age: 26

Won promotion to League One with Portsmouth in 2016-17 and did it all over again a year later with the Sky Blues. Played at Manchester United as a boy.

MIDFIELDERS

TOM BAYLISS

Age: 19

An England U19 international and an important part of the Sky Blues team. Bayliss was handed his first start last season in the EFL trophy and has ended up playing nearly every league game since.

JORDAN SHIPLEY

Age: 21

Scored his first goal for Coventry at Kenilworth Road with a thumping free-kick in last season's 3-0 defeat. The strike even won goal of the month.

LUKE THOMAS
AGE: 20

On-loan from Derby County. Thomas earned his big move to Pride Park in 2016 after some impressive performances for Cheltenham Town who were non-league at the time.



WATCH OUT

Jordy Hiwula
Age: 24

The forward graduated from the Manchester City youth system in 2012 and stayed with the club until 2015. Huddersfield Town were the next side to acquire Hiwula, but once again a series of loan moves followed as he struggled to hold down a permanent spot with his parent club. The Sky Blues bought the 24-year-old for an undisclosed fee at the start of the season, allowing him time to settle into the first team. Now on seven goals for the season, Hiwula notched his first goal of 2019 in the side's last away match against Rochdale.

CLASSIC CLASH WITH THE SKY BLUES

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES...

7TH MARCH 1990 • LUTON TOWN 3 COVENTRY CITY 2

The summer of 1989 saw more player departures from Kenilworth Road as the victorious Littlewoods Cup winning side of a year before was dismantled with undue haste.

Ricky Hill left to play in France for Le Havre, while Steve Foster joined his former Brighton team mate Brian Horton, now manager at Oxford United. With full back Rob Johnson going to Leicester as part of a deal that brought Mick Kennedy to Kenilworth Road, the supporters were quite rightly worried that the heart was being ripped out of the side.

All these misgivings disappeared in an instant though when, out of the blue, the Town broke their transfer fee record in paying £850,000 to Odense for Danish international striker Lars Elstrup.

The season started slowly but manager Ray Harford was not helped by a long injury list which saw namesake Mick and three central defenders out with long term injuries. Gradually, the occasional wins turned to draws and then defeats as the Hatters slipped down the table with matters not being helped off the pitch as Chairman David Evans stepped down to be replaced by Brian Cole, who presided over the £1 million sale of Roy Wegerle to QPR and was then allegedly critical of Ray Harford's supposed lack of charisma!

This sort of allegation would only end in tears with Harford leaving the club 'by mutual consent' to be replaced by his assistant Terry Mancini, who was in charge for just one game – a dismal 4-1 defeat to Division Two side Brighton in the FA Cup.

The club adhered to its policy of promotion from within with coach and former player Jim Ryan next in line. Ryan's first game in charge was away at league leaders Liverpool, where a creditable 2-2

draw was achieved with a young side and teenager Kurt Nogan silencing the Kop with a goal on his debut.

One of Ryan's first jobs was to sell Mick Harford to Derby for £480,000, with the view taken that the sum of money on offer was too good to turn down for a 30-year-old player who was increasingly prone to injury.



By the time of the visit of Coventry in March the Town had only one win (a rare away victory at Wimbledon) from the previous 15 games and were in the relegation positions.

A bid to bring in striker Ronnie Rosenthal from Standard Liege for a fee of £500,000 was just about to hit the buffers as, given the continued boardroom upheaval at Kenilworth Road, there was not the will to sign a cheque for this amount. Rosenthal was willing to come but got fed up with waiting and promptly signed for Liverpool. The rest is history!

Ryan was still without long term injured defenders Darren McDonough, Graham Rodger and Dave Beaumont, had seen Elstrup back on the treatment table following his second cartilage operation in two months and was missing the suspended Kennedy.

It was therefore a young Luton side that turned out in front of a crowd of 8,244, the lowest of the season, to take on a Sky Blues outfit that was in sixth spot.

The Town almost scored after 15 seconds when a cross from Jason Rees just eluded the onrushing

Iain Dowie, but after a few nervous moments in defence a 25 yard shot from Kingsley Black put the Hatters in front after 20 minutes.

Defender Richard Harvey, injured in the defeat at Manchester United the previous weekend, was playing because needs must but did not return to the field after the interval, to be replaced by Marvin Johnson.

Coventry, taking advantage of the lack of experience in the Luton defence, levelled the score on 49 minutes when Kevin Drinkell expertly floated that ball over Alec Chamberlain in the Luton goal.

Another walking wounded player, David Preece, who had also gone off injured at Old Trafford,

was replaced by another teenager, Paul Gray, just before Cyrille Regis blasted the Sky Blues in front with barely ten minutes left.

The crowd hardly had time to vent their frustrations before Gray was on the end of a Tim Breacker cross to net his first League goal and set up a grandstand finish.

And what a finish! With four minutes to go Dowie lunged at a pass from Black to lob the ball past the advancing Coventry goalkeeper Steve Ogrizovic and with it three points that took the Town out of the bottom three.

The match was marred at the end with Johnson carried off with broken jaw after clashing with Coventry's Kevin Gallacher.

THE LAST TIME COVENTRY CAME TO TOWN

CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH REPORTS ON THE SKY BLUES' LAST VISIT TO KENILWORTH ROAD

28TH OCTOBER 2017 • LUTON TOWN 0 COVENTRY CITY 3
SKY BET LEAGUE TWO

The Hatters had gone ten games unbeaten in all competitions and, following a 4-1 win at Exeter on 17th October, were now top of League Two.

Visitors Coventry had not scored a goal in five games but were still handily placed in eighth spot – they had probably been told beforehand that the Sky Blues had a pretty decent record at Kenilworth Road and if their goal drought would end, today would be the day!

James Collins nearly opened the scoring after four minutes with a volley that whistled over, while at the other end Liam Kelly hit the woodwork from 40 yards following a rushed Marek Stech clearance.

On 17 minutes the Sky Blues got the breakthrough they craved when a cross from Jodi Jones found Marc McNulty free in the box to head past Stech.

Coventry then set themselves up to defend the lead and did so resolutely, blocking efforts from Danny Hylton and Andrew Shinnie with Lee Burge in the Sky Blues' goal keeping out a volley from the latter with a tremendous save.

Hylton was then put through one-on-one with the keeper but was unable to convert on what was becoming a frustrating afternoon.

As the referee signalled eight minutes of stoppage time, Glen Rea bundled over McNulty on the edge of the box and was dismissed. Making the afternoon more miserable, Jordan Shipley curled in the resulting free-kick into the top corner of the net.

City then added gloss to their win when Duckens Nazon saw his deflected shot find the net on 96 minutes.

Fortunately, the Town were able to put this result down to a 'blip' and proceeded to go on a 12-game unbeaten run.

► December 1946





► August 1949

► April 1952




▲ May 1984

DEADLY DUOS

FOOTBALL HISTORIAN LEIGH EDWARDS PROFILES FOUR NOTABLE POST-WAR COVENTRY CITY GOALSCORING PARTNERSHIPS

GEORGE HUDSON & KEN HALE

Popular centre-forward George Hudson was top scorer in Coventry City's 1963-64 Third Division title triumph. Starting with Blackburn Rovers, he joined Accrington Stanley in July 1960 and equalled their goalscoring record in 1960-61.

He moved to Peterborough United in October 1961, then Jimmy Hill paid a club record £22,000 for him in April 1963. Grabbing a hat-trick on his Coventry debut, he netted 62 goals in 113 League games before sold to Northampton Town for £22,000 in March 1966. He later played for Tranmere Rovers and Altrincham, then worked on the Daily Mirror printing presses in Manchester.

Inside-forward Ken Hale featured prominently as Coventry City won the Third Division title in 1963-64. Initially with Newcastle United, gaining top-flight experience, he joined Coventry in December 1962 and appeared in their 1962-63 FA Cup run, netting 27 goals in 99 League outings prior to joining Oxford United in March 1966.

He featured in their 1967-68 Third Division title campaign and moved to Darlington in May 1968, having a spell as their player-boss before becoming Halifax Town's player-coach in January 1973. Later Hartlepool's manager, he became a newsagent in Sunderland and died in January 2015.

IAN WALLACE & MICK FERGUSON

Scotland international striker Ian Wallace was Coventry City's leading marksman in three successive seasons. He impressed with Dumbarton before moving to Highfield Road for £60,000 in August 1976, forming a notable partnership with Mick Ferguson. Voted 'Player of the Year' in 1977-78, he netted 57 goals in 130 First Division games for Sky Blues prior to joining Nottingham Forest for £1,250,000 in July 1980.

Following a spell with Brest, he moved to Sunderland in January 1985 and appeared in that year's League Cup final. He later played for CS Marítimo, Melbourne Croatia and became Dumbarton's YDO.

Striker Mick Ferguson was Coventry City's top scorer in 1976-77. Signing professional at Highfield Road in December 1971, he made his League debut in Coventry's 0-0 draw at Leeds United in January 1975 and netted 51 goals in 127 First Division games before sold to Everton for £280,000 in August 1991. Moving to Birmingham City in November 1982, he had a loan spell back at Coventry and helped to preserve top-flight status at Birmingham's expense in 1983-84. He joined Brighton in September 1984, then had spells with Colchester United and Wealdstone, becoming community officer at Sunderland, then Leeds United.



Cyrille Regis

MARK HATELEY & GARRY THOMPSON

England U-21 striker Mark Hateley was Coventry City's leading marksman in 1981-82. The son of Tony Hateley, he turned professional at Highfield Road in December 1978 and starred alongside Garry Thompson as Coventry reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1980-81.

He netted 25 goals in 92 First Division outings for Sky Blues prior to joining Portsmouth for £190,000 in June 1983. Gaining the first of 32 England caps shortly before his £915,000 move to AC Milan in June 1984, he joined Monaco in June 1987, then played for Glasgow Rangers, QPR, Rangers again and had a spell as Hull City's player-manager.

England U-21 striker Garry Thompson was top scorer as Coventry City reached the League Cup semi-finals in 1980-81. Signing professional at Highfield Road in June 1977, he was given his League debut in Coventry's 3-2 defeat at home to Aston Villa in March 1978 and netted 38 goals in 134 First Division games before following Ron Wylie to West Brom for £225,000 in February 1983. 'Thommo' joined Sheffield Wednesday for £425,000 in August 1985, then played for Aston Villa, Watford, Crystal Palace, QPR, Cardiff City and Northampton Town. He later had a brief spell as Bristol Rovers' manager.

CYRILLE REGIS & DAVID SPEEDIE

England international striker Cyrille Regis was an important figure in Coventry City's 1987 FA Cup final triumph. Initially with Hayes, he moved to West Brom in May 1977 and was leading marksman three times prior to joining Coventry for £250,000 in October 1984. He gained his fifth England cap in October 1987 and helped Sky Blues reach the League Cup semi-finals in 1989-90. Twice top scorer, he netted 46 goals in 236 League games, moving to Aston Villa in June 1991, then Wolves, Wycombe Wanderers and Chester prior to rejoining West Brom as a coach.

Awarded an MBE, he became an agent and died in January 2018.

Fiery Scotland international favourite David Speedie was capped five times while at Coventry City. Initially with Barnsley, he moved to Darlington in June 1980 and was leading marksman in 1981-82. He joined Chelsea in June 1982, starring in their 1983-84 Second Division title and 1986 Full Members Cup triumphs. Moving to Highfield Road for £780,000 in July 1987, he was twice 'Player of the Year' and netted 31 goals in 122 First Division games for Coventry prior to joining Liverpool for £675,000 in January 1991. He later played for Blackburn Rovers, Southampton and Leicester City, becoming a players' agent.



Town striker James Collins continued his fine form in front of goal as he beat Ryan Allsop at his near-post for his 19th goal of the season just after the half hour mark.


George Moncur's goal record at Kenilworth Road since he joined the club in January was further

The Hatters' longest-serving player, Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu, has now written his name in the club's history books twice, having also been part of the team to go 27 matches unbeaten in the Conference-winning season of 2013-14 under John Still.

Either way he couldn't handle it. But I'll take the goal, it put us 2-0 up and we felt comfortable until the last 30 seconds when they put the ball in the box."

With another sell-out crowd expected at the Kenny this afternoon, the midfielder thinks the fans have played a big part in this season's momentum so far.

He added: "The fans are a great part of the club, they fill it out every week, so we've just got to give back to them. We're winning games and they're coming and supporting in their thousands so it's all good for us. Hopefully we can continue that until the end of the season."

"You've got Bez as well, who's been quality, so it's going to be hard to keep a place in the team but everyone is great, we all get on and hopefully we can just keep getting the wins no matter who plays."

Moncur was also delighted to see Mick Harford stay on as interim manager until the end of the season, adding: "Personally I'm over the moon. He was a big part of me coming here in the first place.

"The way he sets you out to play takes all the fear off your back, all the pressure goes, and he just lets you go and play your stuff, so it's superb."

MAN OF THE MATCH



Every season as members of the EFL and as the club's registered charity, the Hatters Community Trust receives central funding from both the EFL Trust and the Professional Footballers' Association as part of their commitment to see Community Player Engagement at the heart of all professional clubs' social responsibility work.

With a split two week half-term in Beds and Herts this month, we've had almost the entire first team visit our official soccer camps which has been fantastic for everyone, and when you add up the numbers that's hundreds of local youngsters having genuine contact with the club.

Monday sees the start of Term 3 of this seasons Skills Performance Centre talent identification programme. We have 11 regional football development centres, with three in Luton, open to all youngsters aged from school year 2 up to year 6.

The Skills coaching centres offer a nine-week programme ending with a trial match for everyone. Successful boys then progress onto our centre of excellence and pre-academy development centres

Not all of them are Hatters fans as lots of people like to point out on twitter – pictured in their Premier League shirts – but as they become older and realise Luton Town FC can offer real live football on their doorstep, we do see dozens of converts turning up in the family section in the Kenny Rd end – all having a great time.

Last season our player visits over the whole club totalled over 450 separate

appearances with over 150 of them on specific Community Trust projects and events. It is hard to describe sometimes the impact player visits have in the community, and of course it is great for the club's profile especially in the Sky/BT dominated Premier League age we live in.

But to the hundreds and hundreds of schoolchildren and disadvantaged young adults we come into contact with, the impact of meeting a professional footballer from Luton Town FC cannot be underestimated – especially as they are all potential future Hatters fans!

with eventual pathways into our youth academy.

Our successful 'Skills' Development Programme is now in its 12th year of operation and provides high quality coaching for up and coming young footballers. Whether you're an ambitious player wanting to progress towards becoming a professional, or a newcomer wanting to develop the basics, the Skills Programme has something to offer you. To date almost 100 players have been signed into our development programme through the Skills

programme, which has proved our most successful recruitment tool in the past.

The cost is £45 per nine-week term, which includes practical sessions and one assessment match. In addition to the trial match, all players receive a report on their personal development during the programme. If our coach feels you have shown the right levels of ability and attitude during the term you will be given the opportunity to progress.

Our weekly centres run in Bedford, Biggleswade, Dunstable, Flitwick/Amphill, Harpenden, Kempston, Luton (three) and Wheathampstead.



A true football journeyman, Salford born Mick played

over 500 League games spanning ten clubs, who paid over £1 million for his services, and earned a reputation as a midfield enforcer and self-styled hard man in a long career.

Starting off at Halifax, Mick rarely stayed longer than two years at a club apart from Portsmouth, who he helped to the top flight in 1987. The Hatters were one of the sides he stayed with for only 12 months, but the 1989/90 season was not without incident as Mick worked under three managers, was sent off twice and made sure that Derby did not score by fair means or foul after coming on as substitute in the final day 3-2 win at the Baseball Ground, which saved the Town from relegation. After finishing playing, Mick ran a 'Soccer School' on the west coast of Ireland.

Jack, our Republic of Ireland Under-19 right-back, will continue to help Havant & Waterlooville in their fight to avoid relegation from the Vanarama National League.


While Frankie, 21, will continue his development under the watchful eye of former Town player and youth coach Joe Deeney at National League South side Hemel Hempstead Town.

WHO?

A side who have only achieved promotion a handful of times in their history, have been a Sky Bet League One outfit for five seasons now. They've bounced between the third and fourth tier since the 1920s, but had a brief spell of yoyoing between 2009-14, eventually settling in League One. Their best finish since then was eighth in 2015, whilst it took until the final day of last season for them to secure their third tier status. Ian Henderson has been their top goalscorer for the past four years and looks very much on course for a fifth having bagged 15 so far this campaign.

STADIUM - CROWN OIL ARENA

The Crown Oil Arena, or as it's more commonly known, Spotland, was built in 1878, and was first host to St Clements Rugby Club, before variations of the football club started to use it as their base at the turn of the 20th century. With a capacity of just over 10,000, it hosted a Rugby League World Cup game, when Fiji and Ireland played each other.

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

Town have played Rochdale on 18 occasions and have a fairly strong record, winning nine of those encounters, drawing five and losing four.

Our last meeting was probably one of the toughest games the Hatters have been involved in, with James Shea putting in a Man of the Match performance to keep Keith Hill's side at bay.

RESULTS SO FAR

After their 2-1 win over Blackpool on Boxing Day, Dale found themselves nine points clear of the relegation zone and sitting quite comfortably in mid-table. However their form has dropped off the edge of a cliff and they've only picked up four points since then, which leaves them just a point above the drop zone. They did however get a vital win against relegation rivals Walsall at the beginning of the month.

KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU

Former Norwich City and Colchester United striker Ian Henderson had a brief spell with the Hatters after leaving the Cobblers in 2009, making 18 appearances and netting once. He has been at Rochdale since 2012, bagging 101 goals in 277 appearances. Calvin Andrew began his career with the Town, before signing for Crystal Palace in 2008, having played 67 times for the Hatters, scoring on six occasions.

HOLD THE BACK PAGE

Fleetwood's Highbury Stadium was another ground ticked off my list last weekend. I missed the Conference trips there, so now only five of the current 92 remain.

I've managed to miss tips to Rochdale and Morecambe, while the other three are all new grounds. Having covered visiting teams at the Goldstone Ground and the Withdean Stadium, I've yet to visit Brighton's new stadium, and the same goes for Swansea. But unlike Brighton, I never reported from Swansea's previous home, which meant I missed out on the Hatters securing promotion there back in 2002. My late colleague Ian Pearce used to recall the climb up the rickety ladder to the gantry at the Vetch Field, with the Swansea hordes looking on and giving suitable vocal support!

The other new ground still to be ticked off is Rotherham. I reported from Millmoor on several occasions, and of course commentated on Luton away to Rotherham at the Don Valley stadium back in 2008.

I mention that because it was early on in the season which started with Luton on minus 30, and ended with relegation. Mick Harford has referred to that on a number of occasions in recent weeks, and how he still feels responsible. I can vividly recall interviewing him at the end of that defeat at the athletics stadium – the Press box was level with the finish line rather than the football halfway line – and Mick firmly believed the 30 point deficit could be overcome.

I'm sure nobody holds him responsible, but he has used that memory as a motivation for his current role, and it certainly seems to be working.

My first encounter with the legend was way back in November 1988. I was working for the Luton Herald group in Milton Keynes, but was drafted in to cover the Hatters at Coventry when the regular

reporter was away. My brief was the usual report for the next Thursday's paper (no online in those days), manager quotes from Ray Harford afterwards, but also to try and grab a word with Mick Harford who was rumoured to be leaving.

The match at Highfield Road was not especially memorable, and Luton lost 1-0. It was not one of their better days. So there was I, faced with the prospect of a defeated Ray, and having to ask Mick about rumours he was being sold on.

Ray wasn't especially chatty after a victory, never mind a defeat, but fortunately he handed over Press conference duties to his assistant Ritchie Barker. Phew.

So with the help of a friendly steward I then went in search of my second assignment. I think Mick took pity on me, and came up with the quotes every Luton fan wanted to read. He was staying.

I have interviewed him many times since of course, including after the infamous sacking when he and Joe Kinnear were sent a letter by mystery new owners. We even covered a story, sparked by colleagues at Radio Five, that he was to be the new Watford manager in 2005.

Now he could lead the Hatters to promotion. My 3CR colleague Mike Naylor, a former sports producer and now responsible for our Sunday morning religious programme, wondered in the office recently whether securing Championship football next season would see Mick elevated from "Sir Mick" to sainthood by Luton fans. Saint Michael of Luton? Maybe, but if it wasn't already I think promotion would confirm the name of one of the stands at the proposed new stadium.
