
Manager: Mick Harford

LUTON Town legend Mick Harford returned to Kenilworth EST Road in January 2016, soon after Nathan Jones' appointment as manager, to head up the recruitment side of the club.

Harford first joined the Hatters as a player in 1984 and spent six years leading the line in the old First Division, before returning in 1991-92 for a second spell.

At the end of his playing career, the ex-England international returned as coach, then director of football and finally manager, winning the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2009.

Mick is currently the club's interim manager, as the club begin their search for a full-time boss after the departure of Jones to Stoke City. He was named Sky Bet League One Manager of the Month for March.

James Shea came through the academy at Arsenal and had loan spells with Southampton and Dagenham & Redbridge before plying his trade in non-league football after his release by the Gunners in 2013. The 27-year-old continued to train with Arsene Wenger's squad on a full-time basis during his year outside the pro game, but returned to the EFL by signing for AFC Wimbledon in 2014. He was part of the Dons squad which overcame Stanley in the Play-Off semi-finals in 2015-16 and went on to gain promotion to Sky Bet League One. He signed a one-year deal with the Hatters as a free agent in July 2017, which was extended until 2020 in February. He forced his way into the first team at the tail end of the season, making eight league appearances, to win a second promotion from the fourth tier.



Leading the League One scoring charts, James Collins has notched 22 goals this season and three assists in a prolific season. Collins signed for the Hatters in June 2017 for an undisclosed fee from Crawley Town on a three-year contract, a deal that was extended by a further year following promotion to League One. Since leaving Aston Villa, the 27-year-old has enjoyed a prolific career in the lower leagues, scoring regularly for the likes of Shrewsbury Town, Swindon Town and Crawley. The Coventry-born former Republic of Ireland U21 international has now won promotion four times from League Two - twice with Shrewsbury, once during his loan at Northampton Town in 2016 and once with the Hatters.



wham MATTY'S RETURN

MATTY Pearson scored one of Accrington Stanley's most memorable goals – and now he hopes to celebrate a memorable season for Luton Town.

Defender Pearson returns to the Wham Stadium for the first time since he left in 2017 to join then Championship side Barnsley.

He signed for the table-topping Hatters last summer and has played his part as their record breaking 28-game unbeaten run was only halted last week at Charlton.

For fans of Stanley, however, Pearson will always be remembered for what owner Andy Holt called a '£100,000 goal' as the Yorkshireman fired home the winner in the last minutes of extra-time against Burnley in the EFL Cup to earn the Reds a trip to the Olympic Stadium and face West Ham.

"It was a big time for me at Accrington," said Pearson, now 25. "It put me back on the path back in the Football League.

"I had been at Blackburn, played at Rochdale with John Coleman, and then I was at FC Halifax when Coley signed me.

"I had been in non-league but got the chance to play League Two football and it did me the world of good.

"We had some really good times, the Play-Offs and of course scoring against Burnley and playing at West Ham. I also remember other things like the floodlights going out in the Play-Offs!

"The fans were always great with me, I have a soft spot for them as they were good fans. "I am sure John and Jimmy (Bell) will give me some stick but obviously now I just want to gain promotion with Luton."

Pearson admits, while he expected the Hatters to be up challenging for promotion, he didn't expect them to be leading the way.

"I thought we would be in and around the top but not so much top of the league. We didn't have the best of starts, I think we lost three of our first four games, one was a cup game at West Brom, and we lost to Portsmouth and Peterborough, it was an iffy start.

"Since then we have picked up and we just got momentum and went on an unbeaten run, until last week. It has been special but now we just want to seal promotion as soon as possible.

"I know it's my former club but for me, it's another game of football and a game I want to win. If I score, you want to celebrate as it's important for the team and emotions take over."

The manager has also changed with Nathan Jones joining Stoke City and Mick Harford taking over but it has made little difference to Luton's charge.

"The players didn't change so we just kept doing what we were doing on the pitch," said Pearson, who admitted Luton

has improved him as a player and a person.

"I think it has improved me coming here, I was always at clubs close to home and this took me out of my comfort zone which was something I needed. I am happy here and it's great when things are going well."

The defender has chipped in with six goals so far this season – but admits he was aiming higher.

"I wanted 10, when I was at Accrington I got nine in a season so I wanted to go one better. They tend to be set-pieces, tap-ins or keeper mistakes, I rarely get the spectacular!

"On a par with my Accrington goal against Burnley is my Luton goal against Southend. We won 1-0, I got the winner and it sent us to the top of League One, it was an important goal."

There are still a lot of familiar faces at the Wham Stadium who he keeps in touch with.

"There's Billy (Kee), Seamus Conneely, Mark Hughes, Jordan Clark, Sean McConville and Janoi (Donacien) is back, I still have a lot of friends at the club and it will be nice to see them.

"I was so pleased they got promoted last season as, when I left, you could see the core of players they had would do well in League Two. It should be a good game."



UP CLOSE & PERSONAL

NEVER GIVE UP: ROSS

ROSS Sykes has learnt throughout his short football career so far to never give up – and he believes that has taken him a long way.

The 20-year-old has been one of the stand-out performers this season, forming a solid

partnership at the back with Mark Hughes and chipping in with four goals at the other end, including a brace against Walsall last weekend.

The Burnley-born defender has had various setbacks along the way but believes

these have only made him stronger.

"I always wanted to be a footballer," said Ross, who signed a new three-year deal recently. "I went to Unity College in Burnley, I got a number of GCSEs but I had





already been offered a scholarship by Accrington by then so my full focus was on football.

"I was picked up by Burnley when I was 10, playing for my dad's Sunday League team Paditham Saints.

"It was great to be there, I was there for two years as 'Gawthorpe' was being updated to the 'Barnfield Training Centre' and it was great to see.

"Despite being 6ft 7in now I was never the biggest and they told my mum I wasn't being kept on when I was 13 because I was too small.

"I was gutted at the time, I wanted to give up football but my mum persuaded me to go to Accrington.

"A few of my mates were there, including goalkeeper Jack Little, who I had gone to school with.

"John Townsend was the Academy coach then and he took me on, he is now at Burnley FC.

"There wasn't a lot of difference in the training at Burnley to Accrington, it was Astro Turf and the coaching was good.

"When I was around 15/16 I had a dip in form and that was a worry but thankfully the Academy coach at the time Dave Fitzgerald knew it was because I was growing, I just shot up all of a sudden.

"I was offered a scholarship in October when I was 16, so quite early, as my alternative was to go to Burnley College and study Business Studies."

Ross was part of the Stanley youth side who made it to the FA Youth Cup third round.



"We played Crystal Palace at home and I learnt then that you must never give up. We were 2-0 down at half-time to a good side but ended up pulling it back to 2-2. It was just gutting we lost in extra-time."

Aged just 17, Ross was given a two-year professional deal at Stanley, despite being a first year scholar.

"I wasn't expecting it. The second year scholars were being called in to be told their future and I was just called in at the end of it and told I was getting a pro deal early, I couldn't believe it! Everyone was over the moon, especially my mum."

Ross has grown with the first team, going out on loan to Southport in the Conference North last season.

"The first time I went I played

five games and it was good for me. It was completely different to youth football, it was more physical and more demanding. I learnt a lot from going there."

This summer, as he does every pre-season, he worked hard but this time he put the extra effort in and got his rewards.

"I was running on the beach, I was in the gym every day, I just wanted to be ready for the season.

"I played the first few games and it was superb to take my league debut, I just took it in my stride really.

"I scored my first league goal at Oxford. It's hard to describe as I touched it and hooked it back over me! It was good as it was an equaliser.

"Obviously I have learnt a lot from playing alongside Mark Hughes, Mark talks to

me all the time, he has great experience, you learn how to play out from the back and it gives you more confidence being alongside him."

A groin tear ruled him out recently but he is back raring to go for the end of the season - shown by his Walsall double. "I was out for seven weeks which was a frustrating time as I don't like watching from the sidelines.

"But now I am back and I want to finish the season strongly. "It has been a big learning experience, I have played against some really good players, the likes of David Nugent at Derby where I learnt a lot just in that game.

"It's also great to have four goals although Jimmy (Bell) will say I should have more as I come up for set-pieces!

"I was buzzing all weekend after scoring two but my focus is always just on playing football and not getting carried away with anything.

"There is a lot more to come from me and I just want to keep improving."

ACADEMY UPDATE

Q&A WITH STANLEY ACADEMY COACH AND EX-HATTER ANDY BURGESS

Ahead of today's Sky Bet League One encounter we caught up with current Lead Foundation Phase Coach and ex-Luton player Andy Burgess about his role here at Accrington Stanley and how past experiences have shaped his coaching.

Q. Andy you played professionally for 13 years and are now involved in the game in a coaching capacity. How have you found the transition from playing to coaching?

I started coaching when I was 18, a local grassroots U13 side, then coached all the way through my playing career in grassroots and various elite level women's clubs so I've found the transition quite easy. That said, it's brilliant to be in full-time coaching now at Accrington Stanley Academy and it's something I enjoy immensely. You can't be playing, but being involved on the coaching side is probably more rewarding.

Q. What experiences have you been able to pass onto the players here at Accrington Stanley?

I was fortunate enough throughout my career to win the Conference and League Two titles so I like to think I have the experience to pass on regarding the levels the first team are playing



at now. I played for clubs, including Luton, who had and have high levels of expectation so it was a case of having to perform and work hard week in, week out which I try and make sure the players realise is important.

Q. Did you ever think you would get involved in coaching while you were a player and if so who has helped influence you?

I always hoped I would when my career finished and I am pleased I have the opportunity to do so. Terry Westley was the best coach I ever had. He was married to the game, showed a real intensity and his

knowledge and understanding was second to none. He is now Academy Manager at West Ham United which comes as no surprise.

Q. Finally, I think it's safe to say you are a big Luton Town fan while obviously wanting Accrington to do well. How do you think the season has gone for both clubs?

Obviously from Luton's point of view it's been amazing. At various periods you've felt the wheels might come off and we've just kicked on and kept going. Mick Harford took the reins in January when Nathan Jones moved to Stoke City and Mick's taken us to another

level, which is great to see. He's a real players' manager.

Accrington started well with the momentum from last season's superb title-winning campaign but have found it difficult of late, although had a brilliant win last weekend at home to Walsall. I don't think the team has been far off, just struggled to score goals at key times in games which has cost them. I think the togetherness and spirit in the squad combined with the undoubted quality will see the club stay in the division which I think will constitute a good season, finding their feet in League One.


You will pass a retail park on your left and then at the next traffic lights (which has the Lakeside Pub visible behind it) turn left onto White Rose Way. The Lakeside Shopping Centre is now on your right (the stadium is located directly behind the shopping centre). At the next island turn right onto the industrial estate and after passing the Tesco distribution centre on your right, turn right at the bottom of the road and the stadium is further down on your left.

PARKING

There are 1,000 car parking spaces at the stadium, with 60 parking spaces reserved for disabled fans which must be booked prior to matchday. The cost of parking at the stadium is £5. Alternatively, a number of companies on the nearby industrial park offer matchday parking at around £3-£4 per vehicle. Please be aware users park at their own risk and Doncaster Rovers endorse none of these unofficial car parks.

BY TRAIN

Doncaster Station is just less than two miles away and a bus service is available from the Transport Interchange (attached to the Train Station). If you do have time on your hands and you fancy the walk (around 25-30 minutes) then as you come out of the station turn right and then keep straight on this road (the A6182 Trafford Way) and you will eventually reach the stadium complex on your left.
