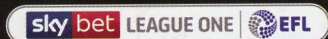

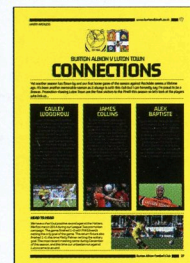

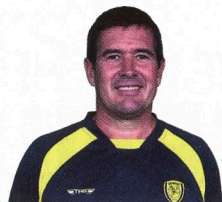

That will be the same today and in our final game at Peterborough next week.

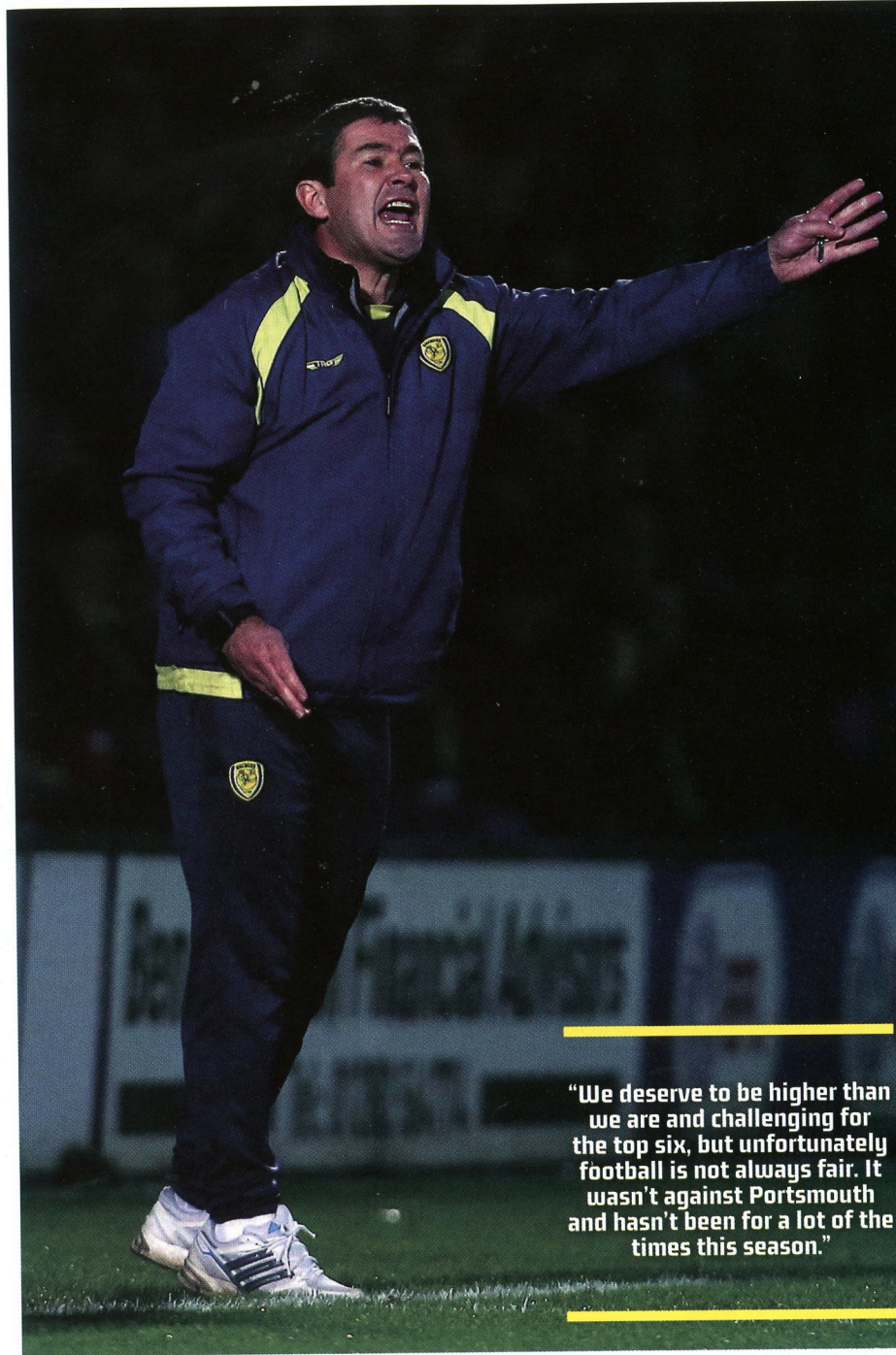
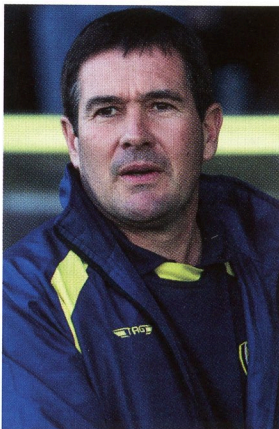
As these are my final programme notes of the season, I would like to thank the Chairman and all the staff at the club for their hard work this year.

YELLOW

SO when did Burton Albion first start playing in our most recognisable colours?

Most Brewers fans will know that, in the earliest years of our existence, Burton Albion played in amber-and-black, rather than the yellow we now recognise as our own.

Initially a half-and-half design, then the popular pinstripes and via several other designs, including four squares on the front, Albion occasionally switched to a yellow kit, the first time coming in 1969 according to historickits.co.uk.

But we reverted back to amber and switched back and forth until 1981 - the first season in charge of one Neil Warnock.

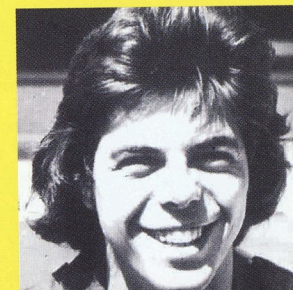
Legend - or rather the memory of the club's Head of Media Nigel Powlson - has it that Warnock preferred us to play in yellow as it was easier for his players to spot their teammates under the Eton Park floodlights when playing in yellow!

And since that season, we have played in yellow-and-black! Although if you remember it differently, do let us know...

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

WHILE our Academy system is relatively new given the history of Burton Albion, our club has always prided itself on giving young players an opportunity to shine and kick on.

Striker Peter Ward may be one of the earliest examples. Spotted playing amateur football in Derby by manager Ken Gutteridge, Ward was an instant success - signalling the

start of his Albion career with a hat-trick in a Midland Floodlit Cup game against Tamworth in September, 1974.

Ward scored 21 times in 50 games before Brighton paid £4,000 to take him to the south coast.

A decade or so later, Richard Jobson made only 18 appearances for Albion - but his clear and evident talent meant that, in October 1982, he was sold to Watford for £25,000, a then club-record fee.

Jobson would go on to play for England, as well as in Europe and the top-flight, for Graham Taylor's Hornets.

More recently, Matt Palmer made more than 150 appearances for Albion in Leagues Two, One and the Championship after graduating from the Academy, and this season we have seen Marcus Harness, Reece Hutchinson, Ben Fox and Joe Sbarra all feature in the first team.

Our Academy continues to produce fine footballers and better people

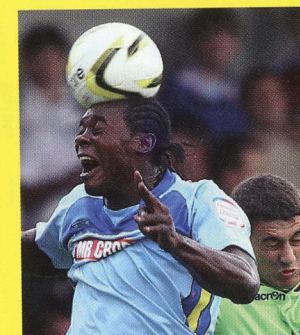
- continuing the club's legacy of developing young talent.

ZOLA, CALVIN

SIGNED initially on loan from Crewe Alexandra in January 2011, Congolese striker Zola signed permanently for The Brewers the following summer and found his goalscoring touch at the Pirelli.

The former Newcastle trainee enjoyed productive spells at Tranmere and Crewe, but having fallen out of favour at Gresty Road Zola kicked on again with us, scoring 14 goals in his first full season and 16 in his second, including a fine brace in our League Two play-off semi-final against Bradford City.

Scoring 30 goals in two seasons was always going to attract interest and indeed, Zola was soon snapped up by Aberdeen in the Scottish Premiership.

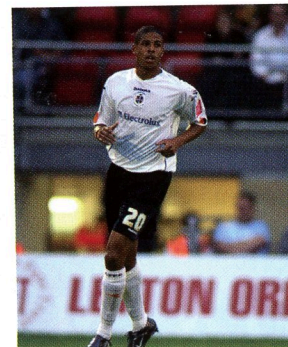

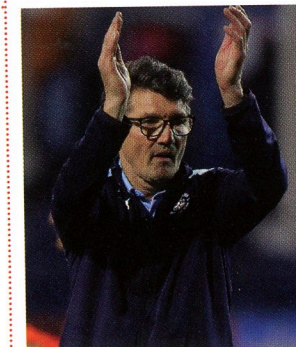

LEAGUE ONE ROUNDUP

THE RESULTS IN LEAGUE ONE OVER THE EASTER PERIOD HAVE SET UP A FINALE TO THE SEASON WITH EVERYTHING ALL STILL TO PLAY FOR AS THE CAMPAIGN GOES INTO THE FINAL WEEK OF THE SEASON.

Steve Seddon's 93rd minute equaliser for AFC Wimbledon at Luton Town on Tuesday evening threw the race for automatic promotion wide open. Victory for the Hatters would have taken them five points clear of second placed Barnsley but two dropped points, after both Barnsley and Portsmouth picked up victories on Easter Monday have tightened those top positions. Pompey still have a game in hand, at home to Peterborough United on Tuesday evening, but the blockbuster fixture of the day today is the game at The Stadium Of Light where Sunderland host Kenny Jackett's side in a repeat of the Checkatrade Trophy final and a game that could have a really significant impact on the race for automatic promotion. The Black Cats' failure to take three points against The Posh on Monday has left them as outsiders now in the race to the Championship even though they too have a game in hand, away at Fleetwood.

The only guaranteed thing at the top end is that Charlton Athletic will be a part of the Play-Offs as they sit in fifth place and there is still hope that Peterborough can sneak into the top six following Doncaster's surprise defeat at home to Accrington Stanley on Tuesday. Posh are three points behind with that game in hand to come away at Portsmouth taking on double significance. Coventry City could still gatecrash the top six but they need both Peterborough and Doncaster to lose both of their last two games.



At the bottom the only confirmed relegation so far is Bradford City but above them there are a number of key fixtures over the last two rounds of games that could be pivotal. Walsall appear to be up against it in their fight for survival, four points from safety with two games to go. Above the Saddlers are Scunthorpe United who have two huge games left. Today they host Bradford knowing that a win would give them every chance of survival if they can also get a result away at fellow strugglers Plymouth Argyle next weekend. The Iron are level on points with AFC Wimbledon who will no doubt be buoyed by their draw at Kenilworth Road that took Wally Downes' side to within a point of safety. The Wombles host Wycombe

who are not entirely safe themselves in today's game before hosting Gary Bowyer's Bantams on the final day. Despite their relegation the men from Valley Parade can still have a huge say in who goes down with them.

Southend are still not safe and will still be looking over their shoulders when they go to Rochdale today, the men from Spotland having pulled themselves clear in the last couple of games to sit five points above the bottom four and all but safe. Southend host Sunderland on the final day in another game to have a big bearing on both ends of the table.

One thing for certain, it's going to be a nervy week at the top and bottom of the table.

LUTON TOWN'S PUSH FOR PROMOTION HAS BEEN A SURPRISE TO MOST, BUT BURTON ALBION FANS ARE VERY FAMILIAR WITH JUST HOW FAR MOMENTUM CAN TAKE A TEAM.

The Hatters and the Brewers followed a similar path after getting promoted from League Two. Albion continued their imperious form all the way to a final day promotion to the Championship with manager Nigel Clough at the helm. Luton, however, could go one better and win the title.

The similarities to that season are frightening. Even down to a mid-season managerial change. Where we saw Jimmy Floyd Hasselbaink depart for Championship Queens Park Rangers in the December of 2015, Luton's manager Nathan Jones left Kenilworth Road for Stoke City in January.

Much like the Brewers did with Nigel Clough, Luton appointed a club legend to plug the managerial gap, something Mick Harford has done admirably.

Luton stand on the brink of a title winning campaign, with stars like ex-Brewers loanee James Collins and former Brighton man Kazenga LuaLua firing them to success, backed up by an impressive defence which features the highly-rated James Justin.

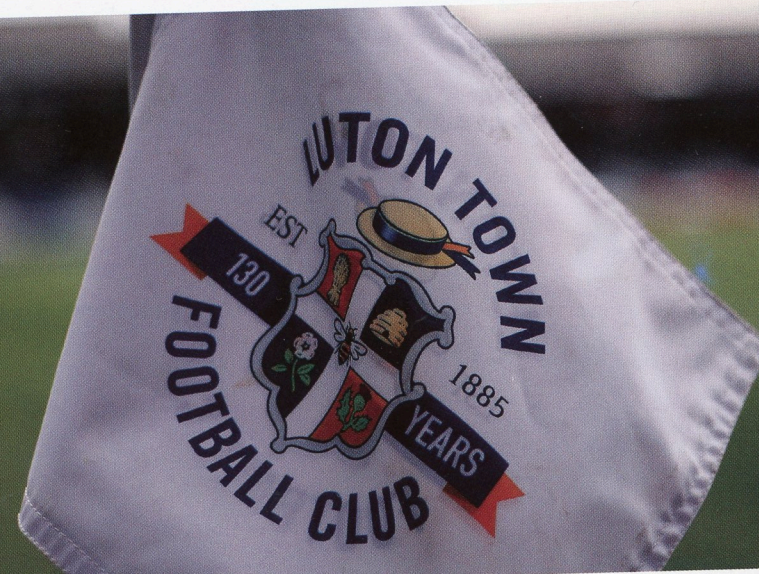
When Albion travelled to Luton in December, fresh off their Carabao Cup quarter-final victory over Middlesbrough, it was not the greatest game of football you are

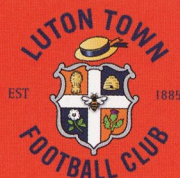
likely to see.

Chances were at a premium as a weary Burton Albion side tried everything to break down the Luton defence. However, it was the hosts' quality when it mattered that would prove the difference.

Luton took what few chances they had to win the game, something which truly showed their promotion credentials more than a four or five goal mauling ever would.

If they are promoted, can they further emulate the Brewers and remain in the Championship for more than one season? That will all depend on if they can continue to ride that momentum and be clinical when they stutter.

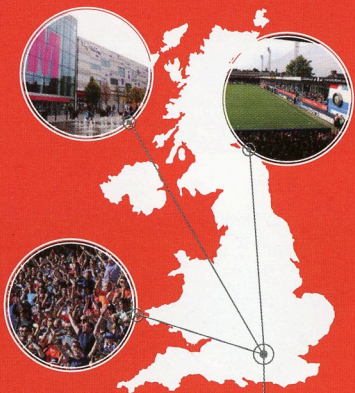




WELCOME

LUTON TOWN FOOTBALL CLUB

THIS COULD BE A MOMENTOUS DAY IN THE HISTORY OF THE HATTERS AS THEY LOOK TO BECOME THE FIRST SIDE SINCE THE BREWERS TO ACHIEVE SUCCESSIVE PROMOTIONS FROM LEAGUE TWO AND LEAGUE ONE.



It has been a decade of rebuilding after the club dropped into non-league in 2009, swapping places with Albion at the same time.

After promotion last season as runners-up in League Two an indifferent start to life back in the third tier saw them eleventh after seven games with just two wins up to the middle of September. When Luton lost at Barnsley on 13th October to the odd goal in five not many could have imagined the run that the side were about to embark on. Seven wins in the next eight suddenly had Town in the automatic places. That run was to extend to a phenomenal twenty-eight games, only coming to an end a fortnight ago at play-off chasing Charlton Athletic.

Just like Albion's charge to promotion The Hatters have had to contend with a change in management as well with the impressive Nathan Jones swapping Kenilworth Road for ex-Premier League side Stoke City as they look to mount a challenge for the top flight again.

Club legend Mick Harford has assumed control since

January and ensured that the progress towards a return to the Championship has not been derailed.

Leading scorer at Kenilworth Road is former Albion loan striker James Collins with 23 goals to his name this campaign ably backed up by Elliott Lee and Danny Hylton ensuring that goals are in plentiful supply.

The timing of the club's success goes hand in hand with ambitious plans to move to a new 23,000 all seater stadium at Power Court the site of a former power station in the centre of Luton. Exciting times it seems for everyone associated with the only Football League club in the county of Bedfordshire.

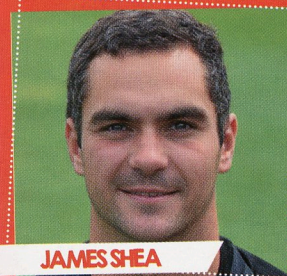

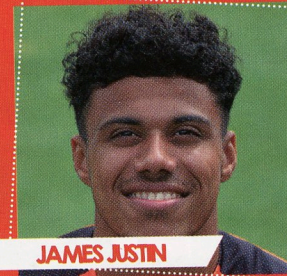

FOUR LUTON TOWN PLAYERS TO KEEP AN EYE ON



JAMES SHEA

After coming through the academy at Arsenal, Shea had loan spells with Southampton and Dagenham & Redbridge before playing his trade in non-league football with Needham Market and Harrow Borough after his release by the Gunners in 2013. He signed a one-year deal with the Hatters as a free agent in July 2017, which was extended until 2020 in February. He forced his way into the first team at the tail end of the season, making eight league appearances, to win a second promotion from the fourth tier.



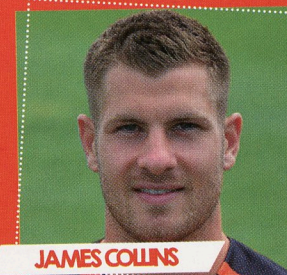
JAMES JUSTIN

Luton-born Justin signed a professional contract with the club in November 2015. He first joined the Hatters in 2005 and won the Aarau Masters as an Under-11, beating Bayern Munich in the final. He scored his first senior goal in the 4-1 win at Accrington in late April 2017 and finished his breakthrough campaign by earning a call-up to the England Under-19 long squad for training camps ahead of the 2017 UEFA European Championships in Georgia.



KAZENGA LUALUA

LuaLua signed as a free agent in September 2018, penning a contract until the end of the season, after a spell training with the Hatters. Having started his career at Newcastle United, where his older brother Lomana had previously starred, the Congolese winger had loan spells at Doncaster Rovers and Brighton & Hove Albion, before joining the latter permanently in 2011 and helping them win promotions from League One and the Championship.



JAMES COLLINS

Since leaving Aston Villa, Collins has enjoyed a prolific career in the lower leagues, scoring regularly for the likes of Shrewsbury Town, Swindon Town and the Red Devils. A season in the Scottish Premiership with Hibernian didn't prove as fruitful as planned in the 2013-14 season, but he netted 54 goals upon his return to England before signing for Luton, including 22 for Crawley in 2016-17. He continued his goalscoring exploits with the Town, banging in 20 goals in his first campaign in an orange shirt.

THE MANAGER MICK HARFORD

A Luton Town legend, Harford returned to Kenilworth Road in January 2016, soon after Nathan Jones' appointment as manager, to head up the recruitment side of the club.

He joined the Hatters as a player in 1984 and spent six years leading the line in the old First Division, before returning in 1991-92 for a second spell.

At the end of his playing career the ex-England international returned as coach, then director of football and finally manager, winning the Johnstone's Paint Trophy in 2009.

Harford is currently the club's interim manager, as the club begin their search for a full-time boss after the departure of Nathan Jones.

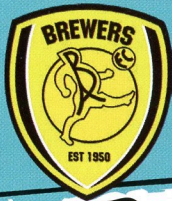

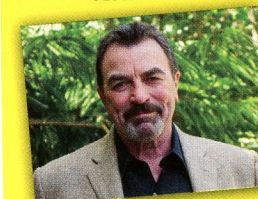

BURTON ALBION V LUTON TOWN CONNECTIONS

Yet another season has flown by and our first home game of the season against Rochdale seems a lifetime ago. It's been another memorable season as it always is with this club but I can honestly say I'm proud to be a Brewer. Promotion-chasing Luton Town are the final visitors to the Pirelli this season so let's look at the players who link us...

CAULEY WOODROW

One of the key factors in our Championship survival campaign. His hold-up play and eye for goal make him an all-round brilliant striker. Five goals in 14 appearances was a good return for a loan striker. I remember his first goal - the 94th-minute winner against Wolves, the atmosphere was incredible that day. It was at Kenilworth Road where he began his career, making his debut at just 16 in an F.A. Trophy fixture. Strong rumours of him returning the season after circulated but never came to be but the memory of that half season are enough for me.



JAMES COLLINS

Collins has been an excellent servant to the Hatters and has been a great asset to a lot of the clubs he's been to. In October 2010 he joined the Brewers on an emergency loan from Aston Villa. In his first three matches he scored twice and earned a nomination for the League Two Player of the Month. In his first season with Luton he scored 20 goals and has already beaten that this campaign.



ALEX BAPTISTE

Baptiste came through the ranks at Mansfield Town. In six years there between 2002-2008 he made over 170 appearances including a month-long loan to the Brewers in 2004. Since then he has played for Blackpool, Bolton, Blackburn. In 2017 he signed for QPR but was loaned out to Kenilworth Road during the January transfer window in 2019.



HEAD TO HEAD

We have a short but positive record against the Hatters. We first met in 2014 during our League Two promotion campaign. The game finished 1-0 with Phil Edwards netting the only goal of the game. The return fixture also finished 1-0, this time Matty Palmer netting the solitary goal. The most recent meeting came during December of this season, and this time our unbeaten run against Luton came to an end.

5 STARS WHO HAVE SHONE IN THIS SEASON'S CHAMPIONS LEAGUE

AS THE LEAGUE ONE SEASON DRAWS TO A CLOSE, WE TAKE A LOOK AT 5 AJAX PLAYERS WHO HAVE REALLY SHONE IN THEIR RUN TO THE CHAMPIONS LEAGUE SEMI-FINALS.

FRENKIE DE JONG

Frenkie De Jong is the first in a potential list of Ajax players who could potentially move away this summer.

In January, De Jong agreed a deal with Spanish giants Barcelona to join the Catalonians for next season.

The 21-year-old has made 15 appearances for Ajax in the Champions League this season including their qualifying matches to reach the group stage as well as their famous victories over Real Madrid and Juventus.

DAVID NERES

Brazilian David Neres has been another key component in Ajax's run to this stage of the Champions League.

Neres joined Ajax from São Paulo in 2016 and originally played for their reserve team until breaking through to the first team in 2017.

In March, he made his only appearance for the Brazilian first team as a substitute against the Czech Republic.

HAKIM ZIYECH

Ziyech only recently featured in a football world five however he makes the list once more having been important in the recent Ajax success.

The Moroccan has scored four goals so far during this Champions League

campaign including the opener against Real Madrid in the Bernabéu.

The former Twente man was originally touted to feature for the Holland national team having played at U19, U20 and U21 level for the Dutch but opted to play for Morocco at senior level.

MATTHIJS DE LIGT

At 19, Matthijs De Ligt has certainly been an important asset to Ajax during their Champions League campaign.

De Ligt, who scored the goal to send Ajax through against Juventus in the last round, is the youngest ever player to have captained their side in the knockout stage of the Champions League.

The Netherlands international also became the only defender to ever win the Golden Boy award back in 2018.

DUSAN TADIC

The final player on the list is former Southampton midfielder Dusan Tadic who has been an important acquisition since joining Ajax in the summer.

Tadic has featured for national side Serbia 62 times during his senior career contributing with 15 goals as well.

He has also been in very impressive form during the Champions League campaign scoring 9 goals in

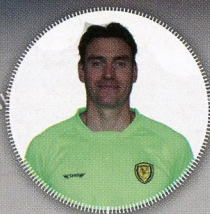

BYWATER EXCITED BY THE YOUNG TALENT EMERGING AT THE CLUB

GOALKEEPER Stephen Bywater is excited by the young talent emerging at Burton Albion - as well as the style of play that has drawn plaudits from managers and professionals throughout League One this term.

The experienced stopper returned to the first-team fold for our League One clash with Portsmouth on Good Friday, with a controversial late winner settling the game in Pompey's favour despite an offside and a handball directly leading to the goal.

With on-loan Chelsea stopper Brad Collins (groin) injured, Bywater kept net in our 3-2 defeat at Southend United on Easter Monday.

Bywater is excited to be playing for Albion, as unfortunate as it is for Collins that the injury has kept him sidelined, and says Albion's attacking style of play has been a joy to watch from between the sticks.

"The team is in form and the lads have been sharp in training, so it's exciting for me to go out there and play," said Bywater.

"Brad has been doing really well and it's just an injury to him that's given me a chance. The lads did really well in front of me (against Portsmouth) but they've been doing well all season.

"It's quick, it's one and two touch. We're playing triangles and we're switching play - but we're doing it every day in training. It's as sharp as that and that's why the lads are progressing.

"I love it and we know teams can't deal with it. They try to press us and they can't deal with how we play around them. If they don't press us, we advance quite quickly.

"It's interesting to see what happens in the future but the top teams that we've played can't believe that we're not up there with them."

Bywater is keen to help the younger players progress - particularly his fellow goalkeepers, Collins and Academy graduate Callum Hawkins, who has made the first-team squad for the first time in the last two games with Collins ruled out.

"I'm quite relaxed, I just want to help the team out and be around the changing rooms, help Brad out and help Callum out," added Bywater.

"I'm here to lead the way in how to be a professional - I want them to look at me and think 'he's been in the game so long, he's still fit enough and strong enough'. I still enjoy it and hopefully they can feed off that.

"Brad is developing himself. He's a young man with a mature head.

"When I was a younger pro, I looked at the likes of Shaka Hislop to see how they operated - nice and calm, focused and professional. You keep yourself in shape ready to play at any time, that's the key thing - you keep yourself physically and mentally strong.

"It's a pleasure to watch people come through - look at Marcus Harness, how incredibly has he done this year? They're all maturing nicely for Burton Albion."

Akins started his career at hometown club Huddersfield Town, spending two years in their Academy, before making his first ever first team appearance towards the end of the 2006/07 season, coming on in the 87th minute during a 1-1 draw at Northampton Town's Sixfields Stadium. In May of 2007, Akins signed a professional contract with the Terriers. Huddersfield gave Akins some limited game time, making his final ever appearance as a late substitute in a 4-0 defeat to Walsall.

Two months into the campaign, Akins signed for non-league outfit Northwich Victoria and would return to Huddersfield in February of 2008, but was not offered a new contract, his existing deal expiring at the end of the year.

Following his release, Akins went on trial with SPL side Hamilton Academical, impressing enough to earn himself a two-year contract with the club, but in January would head out on loan to Partick Thistle.

Akins signed for Tranmere Rovers after his Hamilton release and would

go on to make 38 appearances across the season, finishing the season having made 49 appearances, scoring five times.

Following a season at Stevenage, Gary Rowett signed Akins to The Brewers, and the deal proved a success. Akins scored on his debut away at Oxford United, and finished the season as the club's top scorer, as the Brewers rose into League One for the first time.

A thunderous first season in League Two continued into the third tier, as Akins bagged again in the season's opening game, as the Brewers defeated Scunthorpe United 2-1. Since, Akins has scored the Brewers first ever Championship goal, and has been named Player's Player and

Fans' Player of the Season at the end of the 2017/18 season.

So far this term, Akins has scored 12 times, scoring plenty as the Brewers hit a recent spell of good form, and he will be looking to continue a bright spell as we welcome Luton Town to the Pirelli Stadium this afternoon. Luton have enjoyed an excellent season, and it is bound to be one of our toughest tests yet. So, let's back the boys, and make plenty of noise! Come on you Brewers!!!

BURTON ALBION WILL RUN OUT ONTO HOME TURF FOR THE 29TH AND FINAL TIME IN 2018-19 TODAY, AGAINST LEAGUE ONE TITLE-CHASING LUTON TOWN.

It is a campaign that included thrilling League Cup victories over Aston Villa, Burnley and Nottingham Forest, as well as the semi-final visit of Manchester City.

There has also been the usual mix of dramatic, high-scoring League clashes and cagey, underwhelming affairs.

Burton's home record in the League ahead of kick-off against Luton is won 10, drawn five and lost seven, the eighth-best in the division.

So what have been the standout moments at this ground this season?

The 3-2 win over Nottingham Forest in the Carabao Cup fourth round was an enthralling affair, when the Brewers went toe-to-toe with the Championship side and comprehensively outplayed them.

Consecutive victories over Blackpool, Accrington Stanley and Barnsley brought with them 11 goals and some eye-catching football in recent weeks.

The Accrington win provided a moment of history, too, as Lucas

Akins scored the goal to surpass Billy Kee as Burton's outright leading scorer in the EFL.

There have been frustrating moments for Nigel Clough's side, too.

As well as they played in the second half of the opening-day defeat to Rochdale, that first half-hour was a stark reminder of what a tough division League One can be, after two years in the second tier.

The 3-2 loss to Gillingham in January stands out as well, given how strong they looked when Scott Fraser's double cancelled out the Gills' two-goal lead – only for a stoppage-time goal to go against them.

It has certainly not all gone Burton's way on home soil, although I would say the positive displays outweigh the disappointments by some margin.

The Albion players have one final chance to get the home supporters cheering this afternoon, and perhaps provide another insight into the quality they hope can sustain a promotion push in 2019-20.

FRUSTRATING EASTER CONTINUES

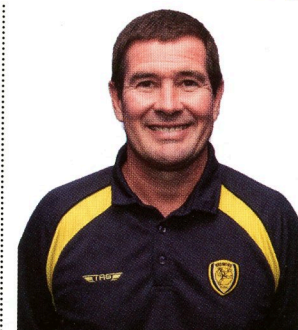
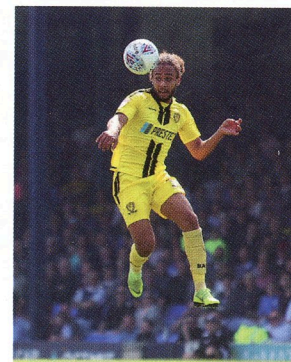
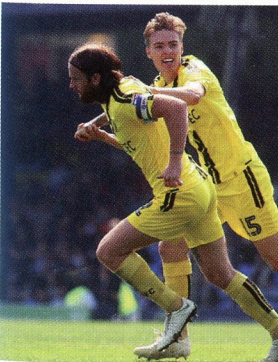
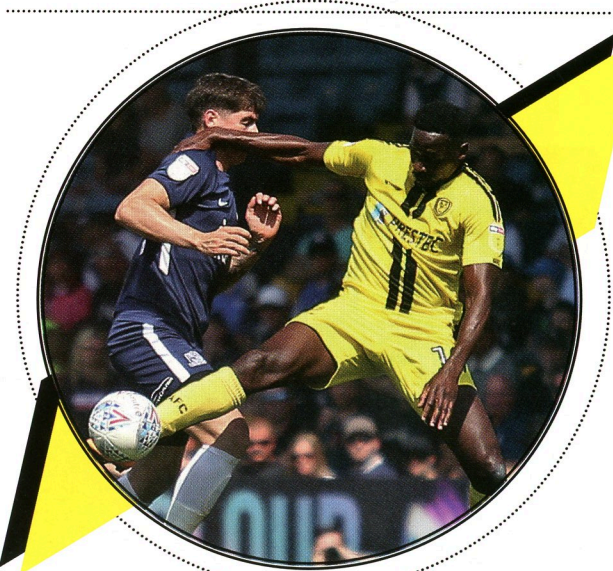

Looking Back

A DECADE OF LEAGUE FOOTBALL



OUR STORY OF THE 2008-09 SEASON REACHES ITS FINAL CHAPTER WITH ALBION LOOKING FOR THAT ONE POINT THAT WOULD SEAL PROMOTION TO THE FOOTBALL LEAGUE AND WITH TWO GAMES REMAINING.

There was a feeling that the fates had conspired to ensure that the Brewers would be crowned champions in front of their own fans at the Pirelli Stadium and a watching television audience on Setanta Sports. All that stood between the Brewers and the Blue Square Premier title were Oxford United who were set to miss out on the play-offs after a four-point deduction for rule breaches earlier in the season.

Managed by Chris Wilder the U's were never going to be an easy nut to crack but with a ground record crowd of 6,192 in the Pirelli and with the game under the lights for that extra special bit of atmosphere Albion set about their task with gusto. There wasn't much to choose between the sides on a tension-packed evening and Albion went agonisingly close to the opening goal when Marc Goodfellow's shot was superbly saved by Billy Turley, Darren Stride picking up the loose ball and putting it back into the six-yard box where Lee Morris somehow failed to make contact with the goal at his mercy. Adam Chapman rubbed salt into Albion's wounds with a fine free-kick before both sides finished with ten men after Chris Willmott and Shaun Harrad saw red.

Heartbreak for Albion and few could believe that the title race was going to go down to the final game. Albion had to go to Torquay, themselves fighting for a place in the play-offs looking for that elusive point or hope that in the event of defeat Cambridge didn't win and overturn a four-goal swing on goal difference.

Nine days later and over 1,000 fans

headed down to Devon expectant, hopeful and nervous for what lay ahead. With Harrad suspended following his red card against Oxford Martin Butler got the nod in attack but it was Marc Goodfellow who sent the away fans into ecstasy with a drilled finish on eight minutes. Torquay were not going to lie down and Chris Hargreaves equalised within five minutes. When Eliot Benyon put the hosts ahead Burton nerves were shredded and all attention turned to Cambridge where Altrincham, with nothing to play for but pride, were putting up a stoic performance to deny the U's. About six minutes from the end of the game at Plainmoor the away end erupted as news filtered through that the final whistle had gone at

the Abbey and Cambridge had drawn 0-0. The last few minutes on the pitch in Devon mattered little—Albion were champions and headed for the Football League. Excitement, joy and probably most of all relief was in the air and caretaker boss Roy McFarland summed it up. "There's no doubt had we not been promoted it would have been Roy McFarland's fault. The last nine days have been difficult and I did see myself hanging from a bridge in Burton because I probably would have been lynched if we hadn't won the league."

Albion's days as a non-league club were behind them. Time for a new era as League football returned to Burton Upon Trent.

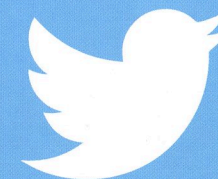



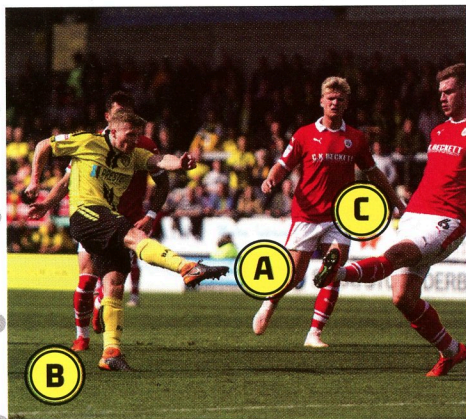

FA WOMEN'S NATIONAL LEAGUE HEADING TO THE PIRELLI STADIUM

THE FA WOMEN'S NATIONAL LEAGUE WILL BE HEADING TO THE PIRELLI STADIUM TOMORROW.

Burton Albion FC will host the FA Women's National League Cup Final.

The game sees a clash between two teams who have already secured their respective divisional titles, Crawley Wasps Ladies and Blackburn Rovers Ladies.

Crawley Wasps Ladies recently wrapped up the FA WNL Division 1 South East title, where they have only lost one league match all season.

"It shows that in a season, you can come on leaps and bounds from coming up (from the Academy), going out on-loan and then coming back and fighting for a place."

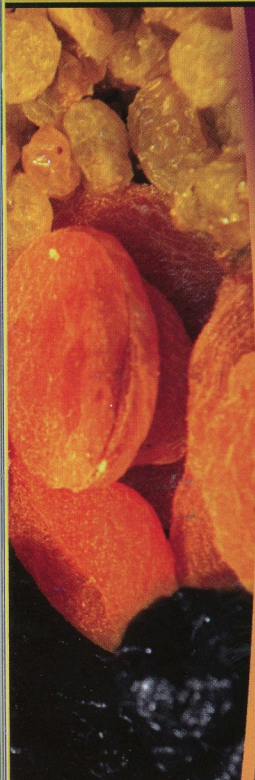
