## THE MANAGER

### Welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the first time in what seems like an eternity after the international break!

It's three weeks since we beat Huddersfield here and it's hard to believe that we've only played one match in that time, but a lot has happened, with several players going out on loan and ourselves adding two new members of staff – welcome to Dan Bond and Ryland Morgans.

I want to start by congratulating James Collins on not only making his international debut for the Republic of Ireland, but also opening his scoring account in trademark fashion against Bulgaria.

It didn't surprise me to see him linking the play and then making his way into the six-yard box to get on the end of the cross, as he has done already for ourselves this season – and did so again on his 100th appearance for the club at QPR last Saturday. James has been a pleasure to work with in my time here so far and reaching such career landmarks deserves recognition. Hopefully the half-century of goals isn't long in coming, too.

After three successive wins, it was an uncharacteristic first 30 mins at QPR, but to still be in with a chance of getting something from the game right to the

very last second is one of several positives we can take from that 30-minute mark onwards.

We are scoring goals, we are competing well with some quality teams and every member of our squad is ready when they are called upon, as you saw from the impact the substitutes had at the Kiyan Prince Foundation Stadium.

I was pleased with the showing from several key players who haven't had as many minutes as they'd like when we won a friendly at Brentford on Tuesday afternoon. As well as 90 minutes for ten players at Griffin Park, we have had a terrific week in training, so our whole squad is desperate to get out there this afternoon and build on that first home league win we recorded last time out.

It will be tough. Hull are another big club at this level having spent five of the past 11 seasons in the Premier League, and they are also still finding their feet under a new manager. I offer Grant McCann a warm welcome, along with everyone who has travelled south this afternoon.

On behalf of all at the club, I'd also like to wish their defender Angus MacDonald well in his treatment for bowel cancer. I know some of the lads in our squad were with Angus at Barnsley, and we all hope his operation in the coming days is a success and he is back to full health soon.

Back to today, please continue to show the knowledgeable, patient, passionate support that has impressed me so much here this season. You were fantastic in adversity at QPR, too, so please get behind the lads again this afternoon and enjoy the game.

of the Elite Player Performance Plan (EPPP) to Category 2. We meet most of the requirements except for an indoor dome, which we have planned and budgeted for, but not yet secured a suitable site.

We get less games in the Championship than we have had in lower leagues. Graeme has been able to use the less used members of the squad and those returning from injury in cup games and friendlies, but these are limited and it's important that we find more ways to get the whole squad playing regular competitive games.

We have recently seen excellent performances at Cardiff and behind closed doors at Brentford, which show the value of such matches. In the past we had the Football Combination, which was a reserve league and used to play Saturdays and/or midweek. We were part of it from 1924, but it finally folded in 2012, having been superseded when the Premier League took control of youth development through the Elite Player Performance Plan. Under that scheme Category 1 clubs join Premier League 2 (U23), which is two divisions of 12 clubs (15 Premier, 8 Championship and 1 League One), Category 2 clubs join the 21-strong Professional Development League (U23). There are also various cup competitions.

We are adequately served at U18 level. It is the gap between there and 23 that is missing and being addressed.

It is part of the modern game to have big squads and even in the first team there are at least four substitutes, who won't get a game every week. The problem is in no way unique to us, but I feel confident that Graeme and his team will find a satisfactory solution while we are waiting for EPPP2 and that we will make every effort to speed that process up.

Just a mention from me for the aptly named Welcome Café, which is opening next week at St. Paul's Church in New Town Street. It has the admirable aim of trying to tackle the issues of isolation and loneliness that people face and will provide a space where people can meet.

**Graeme Jones has completed the recruitment of his backroom staff with two further additions during the international break – analyst Dan Bond arriving from Oxford United and Ryland Morgans appointed as technical coach.**

Dan, 29, joined Oxford after completing his studies at Oxford Brookes University in 2011 and has worked under several managers since starting with Chris Wilder, who is now managing Sheffield United in the Premier League.

Having played a huge role in the club's 2015-16 promotion from League Two under Michael Appleton - with current Hatters striker Danny Hylton leading the U's line - then helping them establish themselves in the third tier, Dan has now made the step up to the Championship with the Hatters.

He will add his considerable experience to a role specialising on preparing for upcoming opponents alongside performance analyst Peter Booker and his assistants Tom Spriggs and James Dixon.

Ryland, 42, started out as an apprentice central midfielder at Leicester City, before moving into Non-League football with Newport County AFC, Merthyr Tydfil and Welsh Premier side UWIC.

The latter was while studying at what is now known as Cardiff Metropolitan University for a degree in Sport and Human Movement, a Masters in Coaching Science and a PhD Science in Football.

He has previously worked in the Premier League as coach, performance director and head of performance for Swansea City, Crystal Palace, Liverpool and Everton, as well as in the Championship with Cardiff City.

The UEFA Pro Licence holder has also worked with the Wales squad that took Euro 2016 by storm, and is currently assistant manager to Ibrahim Kamara with the Ivory Coast national team – a role he will continue to combine with his Kenilworth Road duties.

# LUTON'S LOAN RANGERS!

**The Hatters made a new signing earlier this month, with former Wigan Athletic and Blackpool defender Donervon Daniels arriving as a free agent following his spell training with the club.**

The 25-year-old has not been seen since at Kenilworth Road however, as his signing was completed on the transfer deadline day for Leagues One and Two – Monday 2nd September – so he could be loaned out to Doncaster Rovers until January.



Donervon started his career at West Brom, but left the Hawthorns without having made a senior appearance, signing for Wigan in 2015 and helping the Latics to promotion from League One.

He spent last term helping Blackpool to a tenth-placed finish in the third tier, and manager Graeme Jones said: “He is 25, six-foot-two, lightning quick, good on the ball and there’s not many players like that available on a free transfer.

“He has had one or two personal issues in the last six to eight months and we’re now looking for him to get minutes on loan at Doncaster in order for him to get fitter, get sharper and quicker, to see where he is in January.

“He will get brilliant defensive coaching from Darren Moore, who I worked with last season and have known for many years.

“He’s as good as there is at shutting the back door, he speaks the centre-back’s language and he couldn’t be going to a better manager in my opinion to get the right education, because Darren will try and play as well. It’s an investment for the club and we will reap the rewards long term.”

Daniels was joined out on loan with lower division clubs by three of his new Hatters team-mates.



Striker Jake Jarvis joining League Two new-boys Salford City for the rest of the season, teenager Josh Neufville headed to Vanarama National League side Solihull Moors until early January, and goalkeeper Harry Isted is spending a month at Oxford City, in the division below, deputising for ex-Town youngster Craig King as he regains fitness from a knee injury.

Welcome to Donervon (eventually!) and good luck to all the boys in their time away from Kenilworth Road!



## JARROD BOWEN

Since his first full season of senior football in 2017, Bowen has been one of the most prolific attacking threats in the Championship.

The 22-year-old, who operates in a predominantly wide position, has been the club's leading goalscorer for the past two seasons. He netted on 15 occasions in the 2017/18 campaign and last term became the first Hull City player to hit 20 goals in a single season since Stuart Elliott in 2004/05.

Bowen has certainly kept his shooting boots on for this season, having already netted five times in eight league and cup matches during a tough start for the men in orange and black.

# GRANT MCCANN

McCann took over as City boss this summer as the club look to find the correct formula to reach the heights of the 2015/16 season, which saw them promoted back up to the Premier League.

Having spent a five-year chunk of his playing career at Peterborough United between 2010 and 2015, he was appointed their manager in 2016 and took the club to a mid-table finish in League One.

He lost his job in February 2018 he was sacked after a run of seven matches without a win. The 39-year-old then did superbly at Doncaster Rovers last year, leading them to the League One play-offs on the final day of the season before losing over two legs to Charlton.

# CLASSIC CLASH

**CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH  
DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES...**

**20.03.1971 | LUTON TOWN 3 HULL CITY 1 | DIVISION TWO**

**After seven years in the doldrums the Town returned to Division Two (now the Championship) in 1970 in far better shape than when they left it.**

Wealthy backers, a good blend of youth and experience on the playing side and crowds flocking back to Kenilworth Road made it a happy time to be a Luton supporter.

Unfortunately, early season performances were less than encouraging with Bolton thrashing the Town 4-2 on the opening day, to be followed by a dismal 0-0 home draw with Norwich.

A good side did not turn into a bad one overnight, however, and when the players eventually found their feet, with Oxford the unlucky recipients of a 4-0 thumping, the season took off and the long haul back to the top-flight had begun.

After a narrow 1-0 defeat at Leicester on 12th September, the Hatters embarked

on an eight game unbeaten run, which included an amazing 5-1 win at Sheffield Wednesday, that saw them briefly touch top spot as well as make Fleet Street sit up and take notice.


The Town kept up their promotion-chasing ambitions and sat in second place after Christmas when a poor run, centred around a lean spell for ace goalscorer Malcolm Macdonald, saw them sink out of the promotion places.

To compound this fall, off the pitch Tony Hunt and Reggie Burr, chairman and vice-chairman respectively, resigned their positions in the wake of the collapse of their insurance company, Vehicle and General. As their money had underpinned the rapid growth of the club, which was now in unofficial receivership, the departure of saleable assets now seemed inevitable.

Manager Alec Stock was, however, desperate for promotion and the home game with Hull, on 20th March, was seen as a 'must win' contest.

The Town had lost rather unluckily at fellow promotion aspirants Carlisle the previous week and had slipped down to sixth position, albeit with games in hand on the teams above them. Another defeat though would make it very difficult given the tough run-in to the campaign.

Hull, who had never played in the top-flight, were handily placed in third spot and had strengthened their position by splashing out £60,000 on Blackburn's Ken Knighton and £13,000 on Billy Baxter of Ipswich on transfer deadline day.

Both players were in a Tigers side greeted by a Kenilworth Road crowd of 19,566 and the 'Match of the Day' cameras. I can still remember commentator, David Coleman, sneering at the size of the attendance for a Division Two promotion clash!

Viv Busby, who had been out of favour for much of the season, enjoyed an inspired game for the Town running at a slow to turn Hull defence on a muddy pitch. The Tigers, though, were also slick in attack which made good viewing for the television audience.

The deadlock was broken just before the interval when Jim Ryan rolled the ball into the path of John Moore, whose shot took a deflection off Hull player-manager Terry Neill before cannoning in off a post.

Early in the second period Busby steamed through to latch onto a poor backpass from Neill, only to be upended by Hull goalkeeper Ian McKechnie. For the second week running Macdonald wasted the spot-kick and for a while, spurred on by this escape,

Hull gained the upper hand and equalised when Ken Houghton headed in a cross from Ken Wagstaff.

Luckily the Town players stopped feeling sorry for themselves and powered back to regain the lead when Busby took advantage of another short backpass to slot the ball home.

The points were made safe with ten minutes to go when Busby fired in a shot that McKechnie could not hold, leaving Macdonald with a simple task to end his five-game goal drought.

Hull player-manager Terry Neill said afterwards: "With that penalty business I was fouled by Macdonald as I made the backpass. He pushed me with both hands. Still, that's the way it goes. I thought we were the better side and that we contained Macdonald. See, I've still got him in my pocket!"

Luton coach Jimmy Andrews, standing in for manager Alec Stock who was convalescing after an operation, merely allowed the scoreline and the fact that Macdonald had scored to do the talking.

**The Town were sinking fast in this, their second season back in the Championship. After four straight defeats the team had dropped into the relegation places after rising as high as fifth the previous October.**

Manager Mike Newell made wholesale changes to the side for the visit of Hull following the 1-0 defeat at Leeds the previous weekend, dropping skipper Steve Robinson and strikers Bjorn Runstrom and Warren Feeney. In came Kevin Foley, Richard Langley and Drew Talbot while defender Leon Barnett was surprisingly played up front.

The first half was awful as far as the Town were concerned, while the Tigers were only marginally better but produced the only moment of quality when Sam Ricketts sent in a perfect cross for David Livermore to head home from eight yards in the 22nd minute. Matters did not get any better when goalkeeper Marlon Beresford had to be stretchered off after suffering a head injury.

Newell re-shuffled his side at half-time which sparked a brief rally with both loanee Clarke Carlisle and skipper Marcus Heikkinen going close, but a perfect volley from Hull centre-half Michael Turner from the edge of the area just after the hour mark more or less put the game to bed.

Near misses from Dean Windass and Ricardo Vaz-Te threatened to make it an embarrassing night until a lifeline was grabbed on 71 minutes when a free-kick from Dean Morgan was headed in by Talbot.

As the Hatters pushed for an equaliser, gaps appeared at the other end with Hull always likely to extend their lead. Vaz-Te's miss on 76 minutes was typical of the chances spurned.

Newell was dismissed two days later!

What surprised me most was probably how much we played football, and how fearless we are against a team who, at the time, were in a higher division than us and had just come down from the Premier League, where Luton had just come up from League Two. Anfield. The atmosphere was a different level to anything I'd ever played in. We went there in the FA Cup third round with Plymouth and drew 0-0 - and I got man of the match! Klopp was in charge and they beat us 1-0 in the replay. Again, we sat in but we couldn't do much more. We were in League Two and they were near the top of the Premier League. Before the game kicked off, they were defending the Kop first, so I could see it right in front of me and when they sang 'You'll Never Walk Alone' it was unbelievable. 



# CORNICK: QPR CRASH COURSE CAN BE A LESSON!

**Goalscorer Harry Cornick believes the Hatters finished the game against QPR well and the team will learn from the 3-2 defeat.**

After going 3-0 down at the Kiyan Prince Foundation Stadium before the half-hour mark, the forward was brutally honest in assessment of the game.

The 24-year-old said: "I thought we ended the game really well, but you can't come to places like this and be 3-0 down and expect to get a result. It wasn't good enough from us at the start, front to back it was a whole team effort, and we need to pick the bones out of it to try and learn where we went wrong for our next game."

The Town's three consecutive wins were interrupted by the international break, but Cornick refused to attach blame on to that, saying: "You could put a number of reasons towards it, but I think it was just because we weren't good enough. We were sloppy in giving the ball away and in the first half we didn't defend well or take our chances."

The five-goal thriller was an open game and the ex-Bournemouth forward was somewhat surprised there wasn't another goal after strike partner James Collins followed his 36th-minute strike with the Town's second just after half-time.

"There was a lot of chances and I don't think either team finished well," said Cornick. "At 3-2 when you have chances and you can nick a point it would have been a good result in the end but obviously, we didn't get that goal."

Cornick praised Luton's spirit after the defeat for getting themselves back into the contest in the first place, saying: "We don't give in easily and even at 3-0, you still have to believe there is a chance and I thought we came back into the game really well."

And despite insisting that he would rather not score and Luton win, Cornick did manage to score his third of the season and said "You just have to get what you're given really" after QPR's Joe Lumley passed the ball straight to him to score from 35 yards out into an empty net.

Cornick's goals have come in his last four matches, all as a starter, and he added: "I think I know my role more and the manager has really helped me understand my role in the team and has already improved me as a player."

"Hopefully if I can keep improving and the team can too, we can get better and learn from our mistakes in order to put the result right."

# ACADEMY UPDATE



## ELY WAY FIRE

**As reported elsewhere in the programme, we lost our community hub last week to a devastating fire which effectively wiped out our office space and equipment used by our 18 full-time staff.**

However, rather than dwell on the sad consequences, it is fantastic to report that within a matter of days we have managed to convert our external classroom (which used to be the first team's gym) into a working office, and while it will be a little crowded, the Trust are up and running.

Kevin Thoburn, Head of Trust, commented: "CEO Gary Sweet was on site within hours of the fire being extinguished and thanks to his fantastic support, the Club's staff and particularly Peter Kemp, the stadium facilities manager, we have restored power, running water, toilets and wifi on site.

"Our dedicated Trust staff managed to salvage some

furniture and clean and move it across to the old gym, and literally within three days we were able to function on site. I'm really proud to say that so far we have not had to cancel a single event, and when you consider that we deal with over 3,000 people a week, that reflects magnificently on our staff and the whole Club in general.

"I also have to mention and thank the many organisations who have been in contact offering their facilities including the Council and Beds FA."

The Trust are now evaluating the longer term consequences of the loss of their community hub facility and will update supporters and the wider community in the next few weeks.

**Over the past 12 months, here at Luton Town Community Trust we have been busy using our Heritage Lottery Fund grant to engage over 800 local primary school pupils from across Luton with their local history, using the football club as a hook into education.**

Today, as part of National Sporting Heritage Day, we are showcasing some of the work from the project and sharing it with supporters through an exhibition outside the Kenny.

If you have not already seen it, then why not pop down to the main gates outside the Kenilworth Road Stand to see our two heritage banners.

On the banners you will see our newly created Little Hatter characters, which have featured throughout our school heritage

workbooks. The banners explore change and continuity at the football club across the past 134 years, since the club was formed in 1885, focusing on historic kits, badges including the 1885 pink and navy strip, as well as historic badges starting with the club's eight-pointed star badge right up to the club crest worn by the players today.

Historic photographs chart significant events at Kenilworth Road, including an 'illegal' women's football match that occurred at the ground in 1935, the installation of floodlights used for the first time in a friendly match against Fenerbahce in 1953, the move to an artificial pitch in the 1980s and the switch to an all-seater stadium in 1994.



### WHO?

Premier League winners in 2016, the Foxes' fortunes in the build-up to that famous title win had been mixed, narrowly avoiding relegation from the top tier the year before. Now very much an established Premier League side aiming for a place in the top six, Brendan Rogers was brought in from Celtic late on last season and has implemented the passing style of football we have become accustomed to seeing being played under the Northern Irishman.

### STADIUM - THE KING POWER

Leicester moved from Filbert Street in 2002 - where they had been since 1891 - to the King Power, which can fit just over 32,000 supporters in. It was opened by club legend and Match of the Day presenter Gary Lineker, who used a giant pair of scissors after arriving in a Walkers Crisps lorry. The ground has seen plenty of different leagues over the years, with the Foxes at one point plying their trade in League One and more recently in the Champions League.

### HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

In total we have faced Leicester 63 times, of which we have won 19, drawn 21 and lost 23. We more recently met in a pre-season friendly prior to the beginning of the 2017-18 campaign, in which Riyad Mahrez scored the only goal of the game.

### KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU

Now a Leicester City player, James Justin left Kenilworth Road in the summer for the King Power. The defender made over 100 appearances for the club, before becoming a record sale for the Hatters. He will no doubt receive a fantastic ovation on Tuesday night. Hatters captain Alan Sheehan started his career at Leicester after coming over from Ireland as an apprentice, while coach Inigo Idiakez was City's lead youth development coach for three years until he followed Nigel Pearson to Derby in 2016.


