# GRAEME JONES

**Welcome back to Kenilworth Road for a rapid return to Sky Bet Championship action as the league fixtures come thick and fast in the run up to Christmas.**

It is only three days since we were here for the Leeds game, and I saw plenty to admire in this group of players and the way they performed against the team I see as the best in this league.

I asked for a response to the hugely disappointing performance and result at Reading in the match leading into the international break, and we certainly got that.

I was delighted with aspects of the game and felt that for long parts, we nullified a side who I have watched cut through teams time and time again over the past couple of seasons. There was plenty to be positive about.

The boys gave absolutely everything and left all 9,000 Lutonians in the ground in no doubt that this team is playing for each other and the staff. We are all in this together and are working tirelessly to turn this disappointing run of results around.

We were four minutes short of taking a deserved point from a match against a top team, but ultimately we know that this game is all about results, and we need to start picking up points again.

We were in the game again right until the last kick, or header, when you think of Dan Potts' chance at the death. There is only one match so far this season after which we haven't been able to say that, and if you offered me one bad performance out of the next 17, I would take that.

I asked the players to give me exactly the same when they step out here again tonight. Things went against us in terms of crucial decisions, but they know that nobody is going to help them or feel sorry for them. We've got to help ourselves, and that means all of us.

If we can repeat Saturday's performance I'm sure that better results will follow, but we know that Charlton will pose another serious challenge.

They started the season well following promotion and I offer a warm welcome to Lee Bowyer, his staff, their players and all the officials and supporters who have followed the Addicks up from south-east London. We wish them all a safe journey home later this evening.

Of course, I hope they do so with your voices ringing in their ears. The atmosphere against Leeds was fantastic again. You were right behind us throughout the game and your appreciation of the players' efforts at the end was hugely respectful.

Thank you, and please make sure you give them the same tonight.

# STEPHEN BROWNE



**Welcome to Kenilworth Road and I hope you are wrapped up against the elements!**

Tonight we extend a warm welcome Charlton Athletic, Lee Bowyer, his staff and his team.

Like us, they were promoted last season and so this is a big step up, but they've got off to a solid start so far. Hopefully we can put a dent in that start and I'm sure it will be a cracking game under floodlights.

Hopefully we will have better officials than at the weekend and, indeed recently, that can ensure the result is determined by the players rather than unbelievable decisions.

If anyone can explain to me why the foul in the box on Collo in the 22nd minute wasn't given; or the foul on Izzy leading to their goal in the 50th; or the freeze-frame picture of the lino giving Matty offside for the goal that would have given us the lead, then please feel free to write in. Small differences cost results, and that offside flag was ludicrous.

Anyway, we cannot do anything about Saturday and we just look forward. In the last few days the Council and ourselves have issued our respective rebuttals to the application for a Judicial Review regarding Newlands Park – a shell nominee company of Capital & Regional being the sole instigator.

C&R have always only very thinly veiled their reasoning for their continued opposition – once saying their objective was 'To kick it into the long grass' – and that reason is their fear of monetary loss exposed by their huge lack of investment in the town of Luton. C&R and its board of directors are completely out of touch with Lutonians and they have never spent time in the community to understand what the town needs.

The Council and ourselves have been vigorous in our defence of our respective positions, and we all remain resolute that the three claims made by C&R in seeking a Judicial Review are wrong, ill-advised, factually incorrect, and a complete waste of taxpayers money for both Court time and for the Council in providing its defence.

Of course, this also costs the Club. Let alone the legal fees that are involved, there is the longer wait until we can complete both development projects and the people of Luton reap the benefits of increased income from a new stadium. Instead we have to fund staying in a loss-making stadium that's not fit for purpose trying to compete financially with equivalent clubs with bigger stadia.

It will also be longer before the infrastructure can be used by the community, the jobs can be taken and the accommodation will be occupied. It will be longer before we all have a redeveloped town with which we can be proud.

All of this adds up to a huge bill, caused by an out-of-touch Plc with a board that doesn't care.

We are so used to the tactics employed by this one company that the process has become part of the obstacle course we have to overcome. Meanwhile, great unity has been achieved across the town, which is inspiring.

We will prevail. We are not going anywhere. We will see this through. In it together.

For us at the Club, that unity is paramount too. The Club is a big organisation now and the amazing staff run a huge community programme, a wonderful academy, all the catering, multiple retail outlets, ticketing for a sold-out stadium, media

and communication, commercial aspects, multi-site facilities, let alone the development projects and, of course, the first team. For 18 hours a day, every day, someone somewhere is pulling on the Luton badge and is doing something good in the name of the Club.

I am very proud of everyone because they give their all and they completely 'get' what we are trying to do. This culture is deep, and whether you see someone wearing a Luton badge on a Sunday morning football pitch, in the ticket office, at the academy, or in your school, you will see the culture shine.

So when one area is experiencing a tough time, everyone rallies round and does their very best to support each other. We knew, and made no secret of the fact, that getting promoted last season was a fantastic achievement of which every single player, fan, helper should be proud. We had tried to build a team to compete in League One and yet the season saw us at the very top of the tree.

In the same way that there is a big step up to Premier League football, the same is true in the Championship. Other Championship clubs are not under the restraints of needing to break-even to survive. We have to be.

I read an interesting article a couple of weeks ago that talked about the fact that the financial profile of the Championship is very similar to the way the Premiership was circa 15 years ago - the 'haves' and the 'have nots'. No wonder many are now calling the Championship the world's toughest league.

So, how do we compete under these circumstances? Well, firstly we have to recognise what is important for our Club and what that means.

I have already indicated that the only thing that guarantees our Club's long-term future is Power Court, and I outlined the depth of costs associated with the legal process defending the JR, notwithstanding its continued development. We have also decided to raise our academy facilities to one of England's highest levels, which will also help secure the Club's long-term ability to compete at the highest levels.

Add to that the effective loss we incur by preferring not to take any funds from the betting industry - by far the football's biggest source of commercial income.

Finally, and as all readers will know, we will not play with the financial stability of the Club for any reason whatsoever.

We will not risk our stability by gambling on one season. Most supporters should remember where this led us last time (and many other clubs since) and the hurt, the pain, and the years it took us to recover.

Everyone at the Club has to work under these restrictions, but they all do so tirelessly as one team.

It's an easy option to say 'woe is me', giving off negative vibes, point fingers apportioning blame at every decision, or we could chop and change overreacting on our emotions – but none of that would achieve a thing and it would divide us.

Let's all take our results on the pitch maturely, like we have in the past, together.

I am sure that the squad would like more money, the manager would like more transfer funds with the hope that it will result in more points on the board. But to achieve that we would need to compromise our legal defence, or cull our stadium and development ambitions, or plaster Bet365 all over our shirts and stadium.

After three promotions in five years we all knew we had all been privileged to have been enjoying winning football for a decade. We knew that this season was going to be a mountainous challenge. On top of that, we all knew we had a couple of young players that deserved the opportunity of playing at a higher level, and that would make that challenge steeper.

We knew – and explained to everyone – that just to stay up come May 2020 would require an extraordinary effort. There is no cash to splash, no future to risk, no desire for constant change,

no magic bullet. The harsh fact of football is that footballing budget correlates very closely to finishing position.

This is exactly why we want our new stadium and developments – the increased capacity and the variety of income streams means that we would indeed have the ability to provide a truly competitive footballing budget for Gary Sweet and Graeme Jones, and we would be in a position to attract talent of all ages. We need to secure the real prize of financial security and ability to compete, long-term.

Until then, we are where we are so we have to punch above our weight. Every game is like a cup final.

When we get behind the team the atmosphere is electric and we need the 12th man come rain or shine, good times or bad through this long season that will go to the wire testing our emotions.

What's not to love?

We know we're amidst a tough ride but there's absolutely no reason to be worried. There is no need for us to make any rash decisions, risk any futures or make ill-judged U-turns.

If everyone, on and off the pitch, near and far, all stay united will we have the chance to achieve our ultimate ambitions. Let's stay positive, enjoy the ride and let's not forget who the real enemy is.

# LUTON'S LIVING WAGE LUNCH

**Club staff enjoyed a special lunch in the Eric Morecambe Lounge at Kenilworth Road recently to celebrate the start of Living Wage Week.**

In 2014 the Hatters became the first English professional football club to become a fully accredited Living Wage employer, paying the 'Real Living Wage', and we are proud holders of the People's Choice Award from the Living Wage Champion Awards 2019 held in June.

The Living Wage campaign is an independent movement of businesses, organisations and people who believe a hard day's work deserves a fair day's pay.

Employers choose to pay the real Living Wage on a voluntary basis - it provides an ethical benchmark for responsible pay.

The campaign for a Living Wage was launched by members of London Citizens in 2001. Parents in East London found that despite working two, or more, minimum wage jobs they were struggling to make ends meet, and were left with no time for community and family life.

It is an example of how civil society, businesses and organisations can work together to tackle in-work poverty.

On the day of our lunch, it was announced that the UK hourly rate for the real Living Wage will increase by 30p to £9.30, while people living in London will see their hourly pay rise by 20p to £10.75.

Statutory National Living Wage workers aged 25 and above currently receive £8.21 an hour.

Living Wage Foundation director Katherine Chapman said: "In this time of uncertainty, today's new living wage rates give a boost to hundreds of thousands of UK workers. Good businesses know that the real living wage means happier, healthier and more motivated workers, and that providing workers with financial security is not only the right thing to do, but has real business benefits."

This is why it's higher than the government minimum wage, rebranded as the 'National Living Wage'.





# CLASSIC CLASH

**CLUB HISTORIAN ROGER WASH  
DELVES INTO HIS ARCHIVES...**

**29.08.1981 | LUTON TOWN 3 CHARLTON ATHLETIC 0 | DIVISION TWO**

**As the 1981/82 season approached, Hatters manager David Pleat was hoping for third time lucky as he put behind him the disappointments of the two previous campaigns in which his talented side had narrowly failed to win promotion back to the top flight.**

Pleat thought that several players were feeling deep down that the chance of Division One had passed them by but, after much discussion, it was decided to pull together for another season to see if promotion could finally be cracked.

With all this in mind, Pleat decided to freshen up the squad as he knew that below the surface there were youngsters with undoubted promise. He also needed to raise some money to enable the club to run smoothly for another season against the background of the economic recession and its effect on Football League attendances.

The close season transfer merry-go-round left many supporters scratching their heads though when popular local lad and Wales international, Paul Price,

was allowed to go to Tottenham for £250,000, while former skipper Alan West, certainly not over the hill, went to Millwall for £45,000.

To top it all, the swap deal with Brighton involving Republic of Ireland international, Tony Grealish, and veteran Brian Horton smacked of stupidity according to the fans. Pleat, however, knew best and Horton turned out to be the final piece in the jigsaw.

The team built by Pleat was now complete, with a superb blend of youth and experience. In goal, Jake Findlay was catching the eye of the Scottish international selectors with his shot stopping abilities, while at full-back both Kirk 'Basher' Stephens and Mark Aizlewood had become crowd favourites for their cavalier forays down the wing and their biting tackles when forced to defend.

Mike Saxby, signed from Mansfield a couple of years before, had proved to be an excellent 'stopper' centre-half, ably assisted by Mal Donaghy, who effectively swept along the back line.

Horton immediately slotted into the holding midfield role where his abilities as skipper, forceful tackler and cunning user of the ball allowed Ricky Hill to get further forward, where he formed an almost telepathic understanding with ace goalscorer Brian Stein.

Up front alongside Stein was Steve White who, after a fairly slow start to his Luton career following his big money transfer from Bristol Rovers, had now found his feet and his brave play was to be rewarded with goals galore.

Making up the regular side were clever winger David Moss, with his ability to turn any game, and play anywhere Yugoslav, Raddy Antic.

Moss was absent from the opening game of the season through injury and his place on the wing was taken by Godfrey Ingram. Dunstable boy Ingram had been predicted to go all the way to the top after a series of scintillating performances for the England schoolboys team, but had somehow lost his way and was destined to become only a bit-part player at Kenilworth Road.

The Town's opponents on a sunny afternoon were newly promoted Charlton, along with their new manager Alan Mullery, back in Division Two after a 12-month absence. Six players – John Phillips, Steve Harrison, Don McAllister, Leighton Phillips,

Billy Lansdowne and Phil Ferns – were making their debuts for Charlton and it was no real surprise that they took some time to tune in with each other.

The Hatters opened the scoring after 22 minutes when Donaghy headed a rare goal from Horton's left-wing corner and when, only nine minutes later, McAllister put an Aizlewood cross into his own net the game was as good as over.

Charlton had a good spell early in the second half with ex-Hatter Derek Hales hitting a good chance wide and future Hatter Paul Walsh firing against a post, but the Town's third on 57 minutes finished the match as a spectacle.

Horton, who had a brilliant first outing, threaded an inch perfect pass through to White who held the ball up waiting for the goalkeeper to advance before slotting it home.

Although the Luton fans in the crowd of 8,776 went away happy, manager Pleat refused to read too much into one result suspecting that the Town would face much stronger opposition as the season progressed.

**After a tough start to life back in League One with defeats at Portsmouth and Peterborough sandwiching a home draw with Sunderland, the Town had gradually clawed their way up the table.**

By the time of the home clash with Charlton at the end of September the Hatters had pushed up to 12th spot, while the Addicks were six places higher.

The game started evenly as the two sides probed each other before Charlton took the lead after 23 minutes. James Collins was adjudged to have clipped Joe Aribó in the area, but despite protests that the offence took place outside the box, Tariqe Fosu made no mistake from the spot.

The score remained unchanged at the break but in the second period, after a couple of half-time adjustments, the Town were on the front foot and Elliot Lee was denied by Charlton goalkeeper Jed Steer's legs with the rebound hitting a post.

The introduction of Harry Cornick made a difference as, after missing a great opportunity, he beat Steer to Collins' flick on after 74 minutes to find the net.

Steer then made an excellent save from Lee before Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu's shot cannoned off the woodwork with Collins converting the rebound.

Cornick could have wrapped the game up, racing away only to shoot over, before in the closing seconds, Charlton's Chris Solly volleyed home from the edge of the area to level the score. This was Solly's first goal in six years!

Luton manager Nathan Jones said afterwards: "I'm devastated as we should have won the game. Being 2-1 up late on we should have seen the game out. I thought we were excellent, I really did."

Charlton boss Lee Bowyer, however felt: "We definitely didn't deserve to lose – a draw was a fair result."






## AUGUST 1956

The Town make it three wins from three at the start of the season following a 2-1 victory at the Valley. Bob Morton and Mike Cullen are the Luton goalscorers.





Two goals from Ron Futcher secure a 2-0 victory, the Town's sixth in a row as they surge up the table in a late bid for promotion.







Roast dinner. Or a Chinese or curry.



But at the end of the day, we all do want to play. Whoever is playing, we all back each other and it's one of those, best of friends but fiercest of rivalries – the saying is something like that! We don't let it affect us if we're not playing.

**f Leanne Hunt** Which one of your teammates would you least like to face a shot from, and why?

Kazenga LuaLua, because he hits it very, very hard. Very hard. He doesn't know where it's going, so you don't where it's going. It's so quick, so there's no back lift, it just comes and you can't do anything about it.

**f Phil Wain** What goes through your mind when you run into goal before the game? Do you follow any rituals?

I have a quick little chat to myself, 'do your first thing right' and stuff like that. Nothing really though. I put my water bottle down, I have to put my towel on the ground now because it was blocking some of the fans' view, they asked me to move it. That's about it. Just a quick word to myself 'come on now, it's game time'.

**@mattslutontown** What was it like getting our first clean sheet?



Yes. Yes and no. It's great when you're making saves, playing well and everything. But there is no worse place to be when you make a mistake, because nine times out of ten, you make a mistake, it ends up with a goal and that is the worst feeling you can ever imagine - you wouldn't wish it on your worst enemy. You're letting yourself down, you're letting your team mates down.





📍 **madhatterhammer** What is the best thing about being at Luton?

We're in the Championship and for the past two years all we have pretty much done is win. It's a bit different this year, but it was always going to be. It's a great club to be at. It's a club on the up and I love coming in every single day.

📍 **mattslutontown** Best team you have played against?

Leicester City. They were unreal. They were unbelievable, they were so good. Youri Tielemans is a joke. I played against Liverpool when I was at Wimbledon, we lost 2-1. Steven Gerrard scored twice. I was actually the last goalkeeper he scored against in the FA Cup. Little bit of knowledge for you.

📍 **joel.\_wilding** What's the most important save you've made in your time at the Hatters, from your point of view?

I think the one against Portsmouth last year when I tipped it over the bar. That was a great game wasn't it? I made the save and I thought to myself at the time 'good save at a good time'. 


Each of us are also in charge of cleaning the first team players' boots. I have Elliot Lee, George Moncur and Callum McManaman; all three are very kind and genuine guys.

## THE SHARED LEARNING TRUST FOOTBALL ACADEMY - BTEC 16+ EDUCATION WITH THE HATTERS

**In partnership with the Shared Learning Trust, the Hatters Trust's Football Academy is now well underway in its inaugural season of EFL Youth Football Community & Education League (CEEFA).**

Blending sport and education for local 16-year-olds this season, with a L3 BTEC equivalent to 3 A-levels, is the first time a scheme of this kind has finally reached Luton, offering boys who want to pursue a career in sport while still enjoying full time training the opportunity.

The L3 BTEC covers all aspects of the sports industry, providing a really good grounding to enable boys to decide if

they want to specialise in, for example, coaching or sports science at degree level. From a football perspective, the boys train three days a week and play in the EFL Youth Education league against other professional clubs in a national league arranged in eight regional leagues against neighbours and rivals from Stevenage, Wycombe and MK Dons.

While all eight of the leagues are organised on a regional basis, the Cups are national and the squad is pictured following a successful trip to Bristol Rovers in the EFL Youth Cup.

### WHO?

Promoted to the Championship in 2015, Brentford have been in the division ever since. Previously they have been Fourth Division winners three times, Third Division winners two times and Second Division winners as well, back in 1935.

### STADIUM - GRIFFIN PARK

Griffin Park has been home for Brentford ever since 1904 but won't be from next season. This campaign is their farewell to Griffin Park, a ground which once held 38,000 fans in 1949 – hosting Brentford's FA Cup sixth round tie against Leicester City. The current capacity crowd of 12,000 will hope it can be a memorable season in which they wave goodbye in style.

### HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

The last meeting between the two sides dates back over ten years ago and was then a League Two fixture. Brentford won the

game 2-0 but the Hatters have the all-time superior record over their counterparts, winning 35 games compared to Brentford's 25, sharing 15 draws as well.

### KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU

Former Hatters youth academy graduate Arthur Read is currently part of Brentford B, having departed Kenilworth Road in the summer. Alan McCormack signed for the Town from the Bees in the summer of 2017. Whilst he didn't rack up a huge amount of games in a Luton Town shirt, he certainly played his part in our back-to-back promotions – he signed for Northampton Town at the end of last season. Andre Gray and Alfie Mawson have also pulled on a shirt for both clubs. Gray left the Hatters in 2014 after making over 80 appearances, joining Brentford in a spell that lasted one season before he gained promotion to the Premier League with Burnley. Mawson spent part of his youth career developing with the Bees and did play once in a loan spell at Kenilworth Road.

# THE LAST WORD

**It's stating the obvious, but it gets pretty chilly around this time of year. Despite that, there's something poetic about coming to the football in the winter months – getting wrapped up in warm clothes, digging out that old scarf you've had since '88, the smell of onions cooking lingering in the air, a cup of hot beef extract, the smell of the mud on the pitch. It's part of the experience.**

Unfortunately, for people living homeless on the streets of Luton – the experience is no fun at all.

Last Friday evening, I was part of a group of colleagues made up of office-based staff here at Kenilworth Road, who took part in the 'Sleepover for Signposts'. The idea was a simple one – to spend a night sleeping over at the Stadium, and to raise some money along the way.

At this point it's only fair to point out that it was a 'sleep-over' rather than a 'sleep-out', and although we did spend some time in the stands, we didn't spend the whole night in the cold and rain. It was a particularly wet winter night last Friday after all.

Personally, I felt a bit guilty about this, but Phyl from Signposts, who originally suggested the idea, explained that although homeless people are dealing with exactly those conditions, the people that she had met through her work wouldn't wish their situation on anybody. She explained that they try and bring an element of fun into everything they do, so actually the sleepover was right 'on-brand'.

Signposts help to house people in need of emergency accommodation, often taking them directly off the streets and into one of their housing blocks. They provide help and support, and an address, which gets them back into the system.

Then, over time they support them towards being able to live self-sufficiently. They give their clients volunteering opportunities, which in-turn provides thousands of man-hours to the community, picking litter, marshalling events and so on.

We might not have slept out in the cold, but it was an uncomfortable night with precious little sleep in unfamiliar surroundings away from our loved ones. I spent a lot of the night thinking about how it might feel to live out on the streets of Luton, especially at this time of year and how scary, and sad it must be for people in that position.

On the night we raised £1,100, which will go towards our target of raising £20,000 for Signposts this season.


