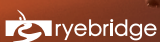

## THE MANAGER

**Good afternoon and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for our Sky Bet Championship match with Huddersfield Town.**

It's a little over two and a half days since we were last here for the Coventry game, but I'm sure every Luton Town supporter who was here on Wednesday has had a spring in their step the past couple of days.

We knew a result like that had been coming. Our performances in recent weeks had been good, but we couldn't quite get over the line with the points they merited.

We should have had the same outcome against Swansea in the previous home match, when we had chances to make the game safe at four and five-nil either side of half-time, but didn't.

On Wednesday we showed that lessons are being learnt, and that with players coming back to fitness, we are an excellent, aggressive, front-footed Championship side.

Coventry could have gone joint-top with a win, so they are a good side who had been in excellent form since the start of the season. They weren't an out of sorts outfit coming here down on their luck.

So to set about them as we did from the first whistle made me a very proud manager, and considering the level we are now at, it was the best

performance I've seen from one of my teams.

We recorded eight and seven-goal wins in the League Two promotion winning season, but relative to where we are, that was as good as it has ever been.

However, that performance in midweek will mean nothing if we don't build on it this afternoon against a Huddersfield side who have started the season well, but sit just two places and three points above us.

I welcome Carlos Corberan, his staff and their squad - especially Matty Pearson, who was excellent for us in his three years here. We have a good recent record against Huddersfield and hope that continues this afternoon to send us unto the international break with momentum.

I have to congratulate Glen Rea on making his 200th appearance for the club. It's taken him a little longer than he'd have hoped, due to the injury he suffered a couple of years ago and the fact he's been out of the team recently. But when I need a clean sheet, I turn to Glen and he showed exactly what he's about against Coventry.

Finally, thanks as always for such brilliant support. We'd waited a long time for a midweek night under the lights with 9,000 Luton Town fans inside Kenilworth Road, and on Wednesday she rocked like always.

More of the same again this afternoon please. Raise the roof and enjoy the game.

# NOTES FROM THE BOARDROOM

DIRECTOR

**Welcome to Hatters across the world and those present at the Kenny today as we extend a warm welcome to Huddersfield Town and Carlos Corbern and his team. Of course, a very special welcome goes to Matty Pearson who will always remain a favourite at Kenilworth Road and is always a very welcome visitor.**

After over 120 games for the Hatters, there is no doubt the huge role Matty played for us during his three years at our Club and we all know how professional and committed he is, which makes him a wonderful professional. It's good to see him back – thank you to a true Hatter.

After a fantastic evening on Wednesday we now want to push on and show this division just how well we can compete.

Elsewhere, we have seen the launch of the 'Fair Game Manifesto', and I found it positive that Luton Town are proudly supporters of these objectives, and that Luton Town Supporters Trust is involved in the construction of this manifesto.

What I found very disheartening though is that Luton Town is the ONLY supporting club in the whole of the Premier League and the Championship. Yes, really – we are the only supportive Club from England's top two leagues. Unbelievable, and every opposing fan you meet on your travels must be so disappointed.

This is an initiative by fans and Supporters' Trusts, Government, the Mayor of Manchester, the Sports Minister, and a myriad of professionals, professors, and specialists including nine universities, Supporters Direct, Human Rights Watch, Women in Sport, and the Bank of England to name a few.

And yet Luton Town is the ONLY club to be supportive in the top two leagues of English football?

So, why did the Fair Game Manifesto rattle some cages? Regular readers of my notes will know my feelings towards those that govern and control our national game – anonymous in any crisis, unable to change or grow or improve, incompetent, disconnected from supporters, not fit for purpose, blatant conflicts of interest, no understanding of gender or cultural equality, jobs for their own network...I could go on, but Stu will not give me enough space.

Additionally, it took outrage and Parliamentary threat for our leaders to include women, young representatives, and other cultures and viewpoints previously restricted to a bunch of grey-haired white men within a secretive FA Board. That reluctance for inclusion and growth by all the game's bodies is simply insulting to so many.

And these are not just my words. You can imagine how delighted I was to read the following extracts from a letter sent by Tracey Crouch MP, our Sports Minister, to Oliver Dowden, the Cabinet Minister:

"At the moment the FA is far from fit for purpose.... and needs considerable reform"

and

"I and my predecessors as Sports Minister often stood at the Dispatch Box and claimed that it was 'Last Chance Saloon' for football to reform itself. It is with some sadness that I note they didn't heed those warnings..."

The letter goes on to reiterate the concerns raised in Parliament around the FA and its ability to govern, and that change has been dreadfully slow. Indeed, in recent years there have been some huge errors by the FA showing their disconnection from the real world with both sexist and racist behaviour from the very top.

The Fair Game Manifesto not only expands on these shortcomings but is asking for change. Some of the things they call for Luton Town have been leaders in – rejection of betting sponsorships; the Supporters Trust having control over colours, designs, badges, and history; fair treatment for all; criticism and the calling out of those that are unfit to manage the game; prudent financial management; competent

management of, and investment in, prized local assets; supporter engagement and openness of information.

For us, none of this is new, just expected. Just fair. Imagine being a supporter of every other Championship and Premier League Club who do not support this well thought through manifesto. How should they feel now – their owners have slapped them in the face and completely ignored what fans up and down the country want and deserve.

Of course, this is the first manifesto and as with any first work, not everything will be achieved or agreed to, some things could be too easy to abuse or circumvent, and some things might not even be practical. Whilst I have read the full manifesto, it contains a lot to consider so it's early days, but nevertheless the umbrella themes and aims are spot on and have been given a lot of thought. After all, I don't think Einstein's first attempts were accurate and a great strength of leaders is to be able to adapt and modify in order to effect the change that is needed.

Fans that support this manifesto are not being unreasonable. They are not trying to wrest power or money from others; they are not acting with self-interest; they are not trying to gain undue advantage from others. They are not acting naively because they often know their Clubs better than the 'owners'.

Fans are protecting our game for the future. As a Board, we

are fans, but are also willing to share and we also know the Club is not – and never has been – ours. Our Club belongs to ALL of us so in the same way LTST and you support this manifesto, so do we. Even if that means some of the Board's 'power' is reduced or obligations increased, we have no doubt the governance and fairness of the game can be greatly improved.

It is an honour to sit at the table where decisions about our Club are made. It is not a right. I am one of those lucky people today, but tomorrow it will be someone else just as orange. 2020 is not a small group of people: it's a dynasty, a philosophy. People will come in, people will move on, but the same principles, the same objectives, the same core values, the same love, will remain.

I am staggered at the lack of support from top Clubs, and moreover absolutely gutted that the supporters of those big clubs are falling into the same old trap – as long as they are raking in the money, spending on huge wages, accepting immoral monies, and, importantly, climbing league places, then supporters are all too easily blinded to the moral duties we all have to our communities and our history. They need the courage to act for the bigger picture, and unselfishly.

Whilst I can berate the FA or the EFL, or criticise the Government for 'people pleasing', or even call out owners and directors at other clubs for continuing this abominable behaviour and destruction of so many historic Clubs, I also have to turn to fans and call them out. At Luton Town we have been humbled in the past and we have learnt to recognise firstly who we are, secondly how lucky we actually are, and thirdly that success comes because we are a team and working for the good of the game rather than in our own interests. We know our friends at clubs like AFC Wimbledon and Bury AFC think like us, but it is so worrying that so many fans in the top two leagues are happy to remain ill-informed and inward looking.

Sing loud and proud – in my book, you have more right than most.

# TOM LOCKYER

**After a stop-start beginning to his life as a Luton Town player, a year after joining from Charlton Athletic, Tom Lockyer is fully settled and raring to go for the rest of the campaign.**

Watching predominantly on iFollow, fans were able to see the best of the Welsh international when he played 15 successive matches last term before an ankle injury against boyhood club Cardiff City in February sidelined him for the rest of the season, and curtailed his progress in a Town shirt.

"It has not gone quite how I imagined it to go, but it has been really fun along the way," says the 26-year-old, who fought his way back to fitness to be included in his country's Euro 2020 squad.

"I can't really grumble too much, these things happen in football, injuries are a part of the game and I've had a few setbacks along the way. I haven't had too many in my career before so it has been quite difficult, but I'm loving my time here."

And whilst he has started to settle into a regular in defence, his fellow defenders haven't been quite so fortunate with injuries and battles with Covid contributing to a number of defensive changes so far this season.

"It is one of those things that you're going to have injuries throughout the season, that is why you have a big squad to deal with it," said Lockyer. "The injury situation at the minute is quite bad and it's not where we want to be, but when they come back into the mix it will only benefit the team."

One major difference to Lockyer's game has been the impact of fans returning to the stadium after 18 months without them. Demonstrated best by his exchanges with the Bristol City fans after a late Danny Hylton equaliser, the former Bristol Rovers captain certainly relishes the opportunity to give something back to the opposing fans!

"I love Bristol as a city, it is fantastic and with the rivalry, when I went there with Charlton the year before last, I had another interesting reception and they scored a last minute winner and I didn't hear the end of it."

"I was getting stick this time and they thought they won the game at 1-0 in the 90th minute, but obviously super Danny Hylton does what he has made a career doing, and it was fantastic because they were on me all game and it was nice to give a little bit back!"

From the perspective of having Luton fans back, he continued: "Last year I had a teaser with 3,000 supporters over the two games here against Norwich and Preston, and I thought that was cool. But seeing the Kenny rocking is fantastic."

"I'm quite lucky I've been at three clubs in my career that have all had fantastic fan bases and get right behind the team, and Luton is no different which is fantastic."

"I've said it before, the fans are massive and they might not think they play such a crucial part, but they literally are the 12th man when we need



them. Especially when it is backs against the wall, which it will be at times this season, and they can drag us through."

After finishing in a strong mid-table position last term, the 26-year-old is hoping he and his team-mates can improve on that feat this time around, saying: "We want to build on last year. It is not that easy to keep on improving year after year, especially with the turnover of players we have had, so another mid-table finish – if we can finish above what we did last year – then you would say it is progress."

"Although the club has almost established itself as a solid Championship team, you can never be too careful in this league because you always see big teams in and around it at the bottom. You can't get complacent in this league, and I don't think we will do that."

Away from life as a Hatter, Locks has earned another call-up to the Wales squad for their two upcoming World Cup qualifiers against Czech Republic and Estonia.

Following the disappointment of not featuring in the Euro 2020 matches, mainly due to his lack of game time in the build-up to the tournament, the defender hopes to contribute to helping his country reach the finals next year.

"There is a good core there that have been together for a long time now and everyone gets on really well, which you wouldn't say it too dissimilar to here," he says.

"When you're living out of each other's pockets two weeks at a time, it would be a long two weeks if you weren't getting on with everyone. It is always a good environment there and I love going away."

# THE OPPOSITION

**Finishing six points away from the drop zone in 20th position in the Sky Bet Championship table, Carlos Corberan's Terriers managed to pull themselves away from relegation to remain in the second tier last season. This season, however, they will hope to see a considerable improvement at a club who were in the Premier League not too long ago.**

A number of new players were brought into the John Smith's Stadium squad during the summer, with Huddersfield aiming for a better campaign this time out.

Goalkeeper Lee Nicholls made the switch from Milton Keynes, while Matty Pearson makes his return to the Kenny today after leaving the Hatters for the Terriers in the summer. Jordan Rhodes returned to the club, nine years on after leaving, while Josh Ruffels from Oxford, Blackpool's Ollie Turton, Tom Lees from Sheffield Wednesday and Bradford's Connor Shanks all joined. The Terriers also made loan signings, with Levi Colwill joining from Chelsea, as well as Daniel Sinani and Mipo Odubeko joining from Norwich and West Ham respectively.

In the 2020/21 season, both games between the two sides ended in 1-1 draws. The fixture at the John Smith's in November saw George Moncur put Luton ahead, before Carel Eiting levelled for Huddersfield. In the reverse fixture at Kenilworth Road, James Collins edged Nathan Jones' men in

front, with Naby Sarr netting the equaliser.

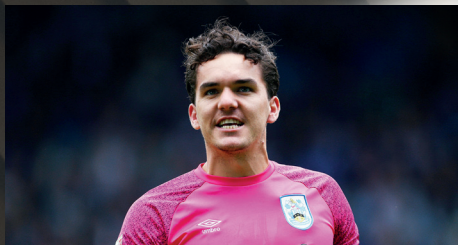
So far this season, it's been a promising start for the Yorkshire side. Sitting just outside the play-off places, the Terriers began their campaign with a 1-1 draw away at Derby. A 5-1 defeat to Fulham followed, before Huddersfield won three on the bounce. They were 1-0 winners over Preston, 2-1 over Sheffield United and 4-0 victors over Reading.

A 2-0 defeat to Nottingham Forest was followed up with a 1-0 loss away at Swansea, before they were 3-2 winners against Blackburn in midweek.

Sitting two places above the Hatters in seventh, it has been a much improved start for Corberan's side, and they will hope to continue in that vein. We welcome the supporters who have made the trip south from West Yorkshire to be in the Oak Road end today, and wish them a safe trip home.







## THE GOALKEEPER: LEE NICHOLLS

Goalkeeper Lee Nicholls began his career at Wigan, and had a number of loan spells away from the club. Loan spells at Hartlepool, Shrewsbury, Sheffield Wednesday, Accrington, Northampton and Bristol Rovers followed. Nicholls left Wigan in 2016, making 12 appearances for the club in all competitions. That summer, he joined Milton Keynes. He made over 150 appearances in five years there. The 2020/21 season saw him lose his place to Andy Fisher, before leaving this summer to join Huddersfield, where he has been battling Ryan Schofield for the number one spot.



## THE DEFENDER: MATTY PEARSON

A name familiar to all Hatters supporters, Matty Pearson swapped Luton for Huddersfield earlier this summer. He began his career at Blackburn and without making an appearance, Pearson joined Rochdale. He was sent on loan to Halifax, and would later sign for the Shay club permanently. His performances for Halifax earned him a move to Accrington, where he spent the next two seasons. After a season at Barnsley, the 28-year-old joined the Hatters in the summer of 2018 and was part of the side that won promotion to the Championship. After three years at Kenilworth Road, Pearson left for Huddersfield this summer.



## THE MANAGER: CARLOS CORBERAN

After a short career as a player, Carlos Corberan went into coaching. His first roles were at Villarreal's C and B Teams, working as a fitness coach, later moving into the first-team coaching team. He coached at three Saudi Arabian clubs before going into management himself. Corberan's first roles were with Doxa Katokopias and Ermis Aradippou in Cyprus. In 2017, he joined Leeds as the Under-23s manager. After the appointment of Marcelo Bielsa at Elland Road, Corberan combined his Under-23s duties with being a first-team coach. In July 2020, Corberan joined Huddersfield.

## THE MIDFIELDER: JONATHAN HOGG

In his youth, Jonathan Hogg played for Middlesbrough before moving onto Aston Villa. He made seven first-team appearances for the club in all competitions, as well as loan spells at Darlington and Portsmouth. Hogg left Villa in 2011, joining Watford. He spent two seasons at Vicarage Road and made 78 league appearances. In 2013, Hogg made his move to The John Smith's Stadium and has been a regular in the side's midfield. The 2016/17 season saw the Terriers win promotion into the Premier League, and Hogg was the Players' Player of the Year. Hogg has made almost 300 Terriers appearances in all competitions.



## THE STRIKER: DANNY WARD

Playing for Leeds in his youth, Danny Ward progressed through Bolton's academy and went onto feature twice in the Premier League for the club. After loan spells at Swindon, Coventry and Huddersfield, he joined the latter permanently in 2011. His first spell as a Huddersfield player lasted four years, making over 100 league appearances for the club. Ward spent the 2014/15 season on loan at Rotherham, and joined the Millers permanently. Ward signed for Cardiff two years later, featuring in the Championship and the Premier League before making his return to Huddersfield in August 2020.

## WATCH OUT FOR... JOSH KOROMA

Born in Southwark, Josh Koroma came through at Leyton Orient. He made his debut for the O's in April 2016 before scoring his first goals for the club with a hat-trick against Newport in March 2017. After relegation from League Two, Koroma spent two seasons in the National League with Orient. In 2018/19, the 22-year-old scored 11 league goals as Orient were crowned National League winners. In July 2019, Koroma joined Huddersfield and made seven league appearances before a loan at Rotherham. After returning to the club, the winger has been a key man under Corberan.

**Following a fine 1-0 win at Bournemouth in mid-January, the Town had lost three straight games and were desperately looking to get back to winning ways.**

A 1-0 defeat at eventual promotion winners Brentford was hard to take considering how well the team played, a 3-1 reversal in the FA Cup at Chelsea saw the Town give as good as they got for large parts of the contest but a 1-0 scoreline at Blackburn was totally unjust with the Rovers winner coming in such controversial circumstances.

A chance to put things right came with the visit of Huddersfield to Kenilworth Road, with the Terriers hoping to end an eight match winless run away from home and the Town hoping to get back to winning ways. One change was made to the side,

with Luke Berry replacing Glen Rea, and it was the Town who were on the front foot from the start with James Collins tapping home a Harry Cornick cross after 11 minutes.

The Hatters should have doubled their lead shortly before the interval when Dan Potts headed a Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu cross against a post from point blank range.

In the second period, Huddersfield enjoyed more of the possession without really hurting the Luton defence until, having thought they had weathered the pressure, a goal was conceded on 74 minutes when Naby Sarr nudged the ball in after the unsighted Simon Sluga in the Luton goal parried a free-kick into his path.

The last meaningful action came when Harry Toffolo was dismissed for a lunge on substitute Rea in stoppage time, and from the subsequent free-kick Rea's header hit the outside of a post.

Both managers afterwards reluctantly agreed that a draw was a fair result.

# MEMORY MATCH

**NETHERLANDS FA XI 1 LUTON TOWN 3  
FRIENDLY. 6TH FEBRUARY 1935.**

**For the first time in their almost 50 year history the Town were about to venture from these shores to play on the 'Continent'.**

Accepting an invitation by the Netherlands Football Association they were due to travel to Holland to play a selected Dutch team in Amsterdam at the three month old Ajaxstadion, by now given a shortened name of De Meer due to it being located in the Watergraafs Meer district. The invitation was no doubt brought about by the Town's exploits in the FA Cup during this period – reaching the quarter-finals in 1933, narrowly losing to Arsenal in 1934 and beating Chelsea a couple of weeks before. All this as a Division Three (South) club which is now equivalent to League One.

Following a 3-0 defeat at QPR on the previous Saturday, the Town party of 13 players and 13 officials met at Luton station at 6.30pm on the Monday evening before eventually joining the S.S.Vienna at Parkeston Quay for the 10pm crossing to the Hook of Holland.

The Hook was reached at 5.30am the following morning where the party took a train to Amsterdam, arriving at the Carlton Hotel at 8am where breakfast was served.

The majority of the party then 'retired to their rooms' to catch up on sleep before being taken on an afternoon 'motor-coach' trip in and around the environs of Amsterdam. A visit to a cheese factory was arranged, as well as the trip being extended to the 'picturesque and medieval fishing village of Valendam where inhabitants were seen in the traditional native costume.'

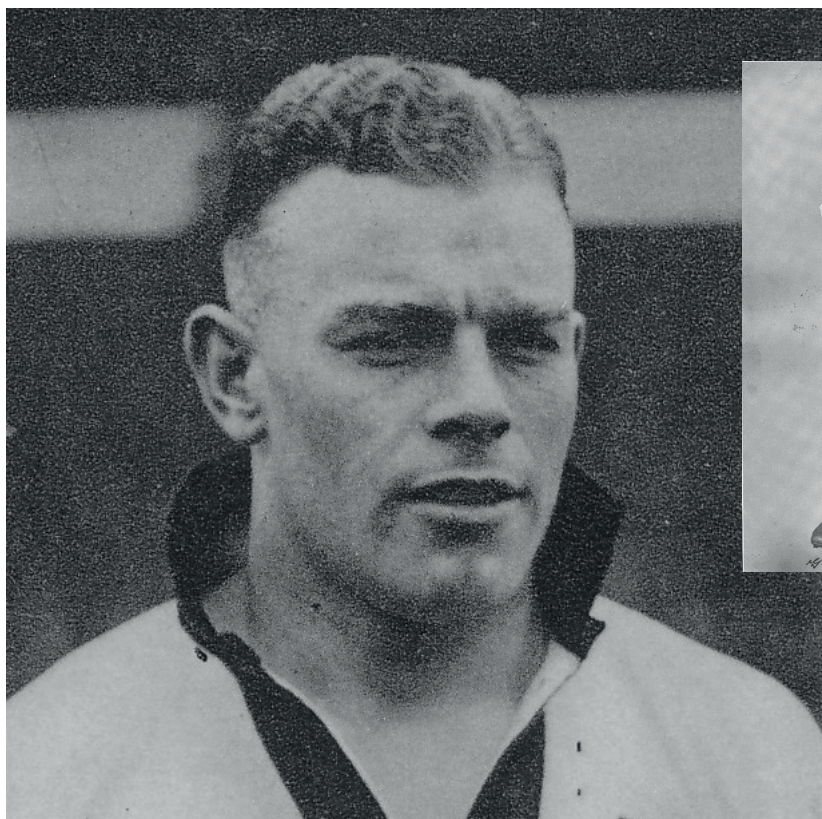
After dinner, the party listened to the hotel orchestra before bed, and after breakfast the following day, were taken to the stadium for a guided tour of the new Ajax facilities where they were 'amazed at the magnificent structure, beautifully planned in a spacious area.'

The early afternoon kick-off was witnessed by a crowd of around 7,000 who braved the cold and blustery conditions. The Netherlands FA XI was full of Dutch internationals and it looked like it was going to be a long afternoon when they took the lead after only two minutes.

A quickly taken free-kick was eventually worked through to Boerhout, who fired in a shot that Joe Coen in the Luton goal had no chance of saving.

It was then seen that Luton defender Harry Reece was limping badly but with substitutes being allowed in Holland, Hugh McGinnigle took his place.

Undismayed by these early set-backs the Town went on the attack and for the remainder of the half little was seen of the Dutch forwards. Jack Ball hit the bar with a fierce shot before the inevitable equaliser on 20 minutes when winger George Stephenson

cut inside at full speed before sending a shot into the top corner of the net. The Town were now in full flow with Ball rattling the crossbar again and Stephenson hitting an upright.

In the second period, with the wind at their backs, the Town put the game to bed netting two goals within five minutes of the re-start. Firstly, Sam Bell took advantage of a Stephenson shot that had been fisted away by the Dutch goalkeeper to fire home, before half-back Joe Payne sent a through pass to Ball whose shot could not be held by the goalkeeper leaving a simple tap-in for Stephenson.

The Dutch upped their game after these early reverses, but the Luton defence held firm with Coen only once being called into serious action while at the other end the Town forwards tended to overplay on the, by now, cut up surface.

After the game, Luton Chairman Charles Jeyes presented a straw hat covered in silk to the

Netherlands FA, and miniature straw hats in porcelain to the Dutch players and officials.

The travelling reporter rather patronisingly stated, 'The Dutch team struck one as knowing the rudiments of the game very well, but in the finer points were sadly lacking'.

Bob Glendenning, the English coach of the Netherlands FA was rather more gracious when he said, 'You are the finest English team that has ever visited Holland, the players gave a marvellous exhibition, and truly upheld the traditions of English football. I can easily understand now how you beat Chelsea, if this is the football you play.'

The homeward journey was made the following morning via Flushing, with Luton being reached at 11 pm on the Thursday. Unaffected by all this travel, the Town beat Torquay 3-1 at Kenilworth Road the following Saturday.

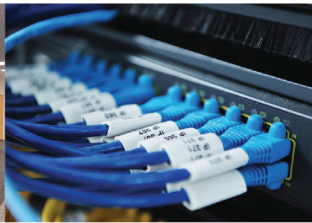

Pearcey always enjoyed his chats with Joe Kinnear, and I was sorry to hear the news of Joe's illness. His time here was certainly never dull. We had to wait 90 minutes for his first press conference but it was, like all those that followed, well worth the wait.

**There are a lot of good things happening on the pitch for Luton Town. Even though the results might not have been there to show for it before Wednesday night, the Hatters are without a doubt showing performance levels that stand them in good stead to win games over the course of the season.**

After last Saturday's 2-1 defeat at Bournemouth, manager Nathan Jones made a comment that reflected the magnitude of what Luton were trying to achieve this term:

*"Do we come right off, be really negative and shut up shop, or do we want to turn into the side that's front footed, that's bold?"*

In the early stages of last season, the Hatters wouldn't have gone about competing with their ex-Premier League opponents in the same way. There would've been more players behind the ball in much deeper starting positions as the Town attempted to nullify their opponents and steal three points.

Jones has answered the very question that he posed after the Bournemouth defeat in the way he's consistently set Luton up to play this season – man-to-man everywhere, trying to win the ball back high and impose themselves on their opponents at every opportunity.

It's no surprise what Luton did to Coventry on Wednesday night – it was a performance typical of what Luton have done this season, but this time they had the goals to show for it.

All of this has been done amidst the backdrop of a mounting injury list the likes of which Hatters fans have never seen under the leadership of Nathan Jones. For all the talk of adding athleticism to the squad over the summer, Luton have lost arguably their four most athletic players who provide a dangerous blend of running power, skill and intelligence in Allan Campbell, Admiral Muskwe, Fred Onyedinma and Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu.

That's Luton's entire engine room on the treatment table, players who fit the style like a glove in their ability to get the ball forwards at speed, win duels and attack second balls.

Luton are becoming the front footed, aggressive, and "bold" side that they set out to be at the start of the season. The foundations are very much there – as I spoke about in my last column, the Hatters are one of the best teams in the league in their ability to create high quality scoring chances – but where Luton must do battle next is in the murky fine margins of the Championship.

They showed that that's what they could do on Wednesday night, showing a cutting edge that at times has evaded them this season. That final touch, that last block, that small movement that takes an opposition forward away from them – consistently overcoming those margins is the next step in this squad's development, and an empty treatment room will help that process.

Time and patience is something that's required after a summer of squad churn and rebuilding, particularly with the recruitment of a berth of relatively inexperienced players at Championship level. As Wednesday's dominant victory over Coventry City showed, this group is taking steps in the right direction.

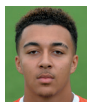

### Biggest fear?

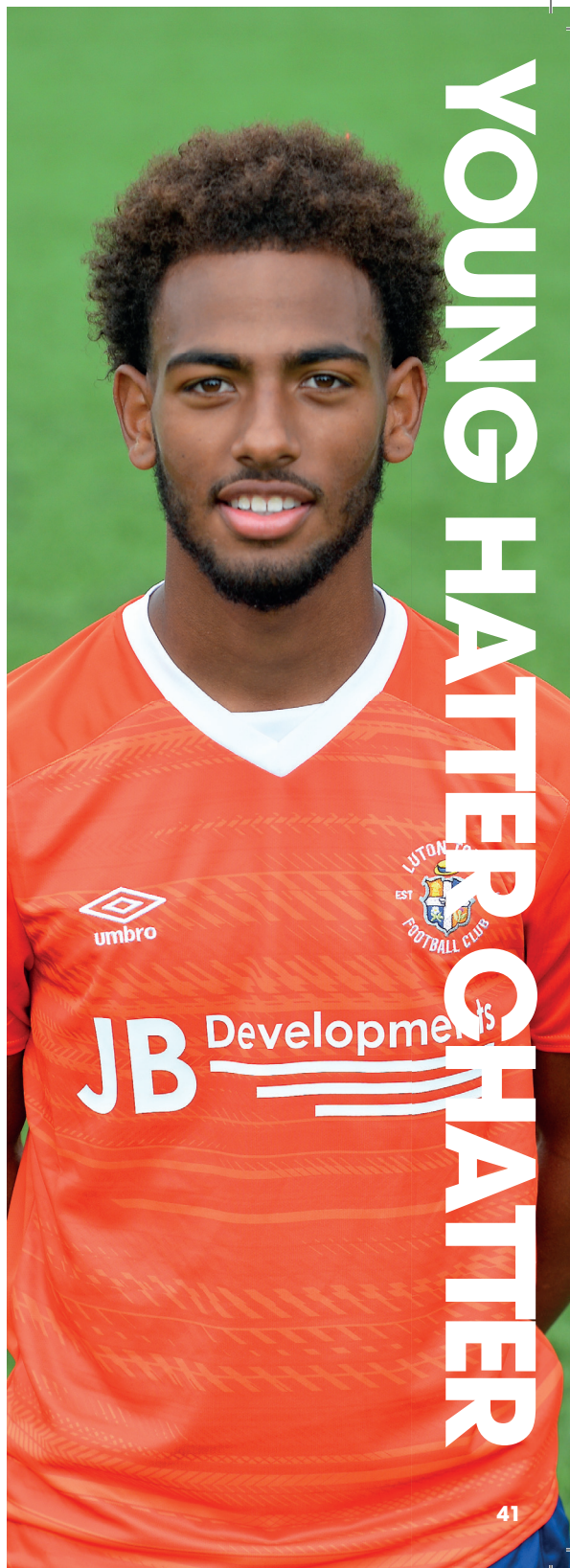
Snakes, it has to be! Other than that, I wouldn't say I have a fear.

## TRUST'S COHESION TEAM ATTEND EMERGENCY FIRST RESPONSE TRAINING



**Our cohesion team attended Dunstable Police Station last week as part of a day long event which consisted of basic emergency first response training including how to administer CPR and how to set and treat stab wounds.**

The event was organised by Police Now, a non-profit organisation with a mission to transform communities and reduce crime by recruiting, developing and inspiring diverse leaders in policing.

PC Beer of Beds Police came up with the idea and organised the event after realising that many of the individuals getting injured in knife crime and gang violence would seek help from our cohesion staff and community sports leaders in the first instance, rather than the police or ambulance service. This was delaying the amount of time it took for emergency services to be alerted and provide necessary life-saving care.

Through providing first aid training to well-trusted community leaders in the area and building strong relationships with Luton Town's Community Trust outreach work we can provide an extra layer of care to young people injured in gang violence and open further opportunities to engage with those affected by knife crime.

PC Steven Beer said: "It has been a very rewarding experience creating this project, from its initial idea phase to seeing it through to completion. I am very grateful for the Trust's staff for their participation and for TrainEEAST for completing the training for us. I look forward to working together with everyone again in the future, so we can continue our work to help those affected by gang violence and reduce knife crime in the community."

Sergeant Karanjit Sanghera, who works alongside PC Beer in the Community Cohesion team at Bedfordshire Police, said: "Events like this that Steven has organised are very important in the role of Community Cohesion. It shows how we can work well with our partner organisations, and also helps to build trust in our communities that have been impacted by violent crime."

Daniel Douglas, Community Operations Manager at Luton Town FC Community Trust, said: "It's a great initiative and the training means we will have trained staff at all of our events that seek to improve community cohesion amongst the Town's young people. A lot of our work is focussed on reducing knife crime, but it is unfortunately a fact of life and this training means our staff are equipped to deal with it should it happen."



## TRUST EDUCATION FOOTBALLERS LINK UP WITH AMPHILL TOWN FC

**This season both our pre-academy U16s and U17/18 college students will have the opportunity to play additional games in the Southern Counties Floodlit Youth League (SCFYL) through a partnership with local Spartan South Midlands club Amphill Town FC.**

The SCFYL is the top level available to boys up to U18 age group outside of academy football, and features most of the top non-league clubs in the North Home Counties region.

While our U16 pre academy boys are still focussed on gaining a professional scholarship with a professional club, for all our U16 to U18 boys it provides an extremely competitive level of football and a good stepping-stone and learning pathway into the senior game locally.

Alex Wallace, Football Development Officer, at the Trust, said: "Amphill Town currently sit in Division

One of the Spartan South Midlands League and while not many teenagers play at this level, the opportunity of a taste of first team football is there, and more importantly the opportunity of a good pathway into senior football exists for all of our older boys.

"It's the most difficult step U18s take and so many are lost to the game, and while lower down the age ranges we are looking to produce elite academy players through our youth development programme, we equally as a Trust want to ensure boys stay in the game.

"Results are not important for us in the first part of the season as boys adjust to the pace and physicality of U18 football – but performance is and evidence of progression – so our younger boys need to learn fast, take lessons on the chin and step up a level.

"The same goes for our girls section to a certain extent, and while this season is the first for female educational scholars in the EFL Community and Education Alliance, the ultimate aim is to provide pathways into the senior womens game."

"We were again hit by injuries to key players but we saw it through and got the job done. Two wins puts us straight back in the mix, and we will hopefully be able to put a run of form together now."



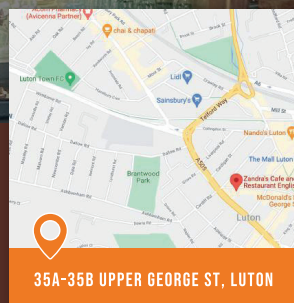

# COVENTRY REACTION

## CORN ON THE COV!

**Harry Cornick played a starring role in Wednesday's thrashing of Coventry City, a result he knew full well was coming after a number of impressive team performances in recent matches.**

The number seven produced arguably one of his best showings in a Luton shirt, contributing two goals and two assists on an evening where the Hatters were simply too hot to handle.

"It has been coming," Cornick admitted post-match. "We have put in some really good performances recently and it is nice to see it all come together and get a result I think we deserved today.

"Off the back of a tough game against Bournemouth where we thought we deserved a point at least, and then obviously the result against Swansea which was really deflating to be honest because we were in the same position today, three-nil, four-nil at half-time. Going into half-time we thought 'not again' so we made sure we got it right today and finished the job well."

After scoring his third and fourth goal of the season, the forward was disappointed to be subbed off before getting the opportunity to secure his hat-trick, but was more relieved when the same happened with Elijah Adebayo!

"I was gutted when my number came up, I wanted to go and get my hat-trick and then I'll come off," he smiled. "I was looking thinking if he [Adebayo] doesn't come off as well then I will be raging! If he has left him on for the hat-trick and not me I would have been...but we both got taken off and now we rest up for Saturday."

Town's top scorer Adebayo also scored twice on the night, and Cornick was full of praise for the striker who bounced back after missing a big

chance against Bournemouth last Saturday.

"He is a top, top player I have no doubt about that. I said to him after Bournemouth you are going to get thousands of chances in your career, one chance is not going to define you. He has come straight back, scored two tonight and that is what he does.

"He will score you so many goals. He's a threat and even if he doesn't score, he wins every header, he gets us up the pitch and if we keep him for a long time, we're a lucky club. There will be a lot of people after him because I think he will go right to the very top."


Keen to bring his strike partner back down a few pegs, Cornick did say that if the ex-Walsall man had played his cards right, he could have easily had a third goal on the night!

"To be fair to Eli, he should have got a hat-trick because I said he should go and press the left-hand side, but he was too tired to move. I said I'll go for you, I'll press, then Bezza wins the ball, and I had my chance on goal. If Eli wasn't so lazy, he would have had a hat-trick tonight - that's his own fault!"

All joking aside, the forward's attention immediately turned to this afternoon's match where the Hatters will look to make it two wins from two at home against a Huddersfield side who have made a good start to the season.

After turning performance into result, Cornick is well aware that the players will need to be at their best to do just that once again.

"We play well every week, it is not like we have put in a bad performance recently, it is just we haven't been getting the points," said Cornick. "We have been going in a bit deflated and then we go back

to the training pitch and work hard. We had two days to prepare for this one, so not a lot of time but we knew what we were doing, we knew the game plan, and we executed it perfectly.

"It is a crazy league. We think we should be higher than we are. I think we are a top six side. The gaffer thinks we are a top six side. I think most of the boys at the club do and it is about putting in the performances and getting the results we deserve.

"I don't think we've had the results we've deserved recently so today it is nice to see the performance and the result come together.

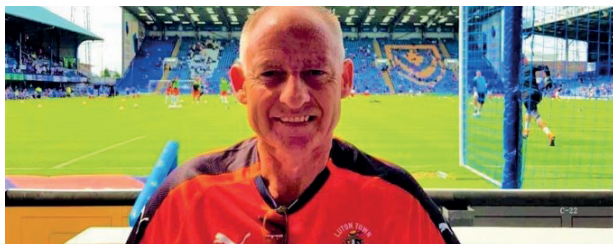

## WHO?

Formed in the same year as the Hatters, Millwall narrowly missed out on a spot in the Championship play-offs two seasons ago before securing a top half finish last year. The Lion's last piece of silverware came in 2001 as they were crowned League One champions with a club record points haul of 91. More recently, the Lions reached the quarterfinals of the FA Cup in 2017 and 2019, losing both ties to Premier League opposition.

## GROUND?

Millwall have played their home fixtures at the Den since 1993 and was originally called 'the New Den' to distinguish it from its predecessor, which was the Lions' home for 83 years. It boasts a capacity of 20,146, with an average attendance of 13,734 in the 2019/20 season.

## HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?


The two sides last met in February 2021 at Kenilworth Road, with George Evan's stoppage time equaliser cancelling out Elijah Adebayo's second half strike. The Lions triumphed in the game at The Den earlier in the season, winning 2-0, and they have a superior head to head record against the Hatters since the two sides first met in 1903, winning 35 and losing 22, with 27 draws.

## KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU

In the current Town squad, winger Fred Onyedima started his career at Millwall, playing 151 times for the Lions and scoring 12 goals. Our former midfielder Ryan Tunnicliffe signed in the summer of 2019 after his release from The Den, having made 51 appearances in south London. Going back further, ex-Hatters midfielder Ahmet Brkovic joined Millwall on loan and then permanently in 2008 from Luton, having made almost 200 appearances for the Town in a seven-year spell at the club.
