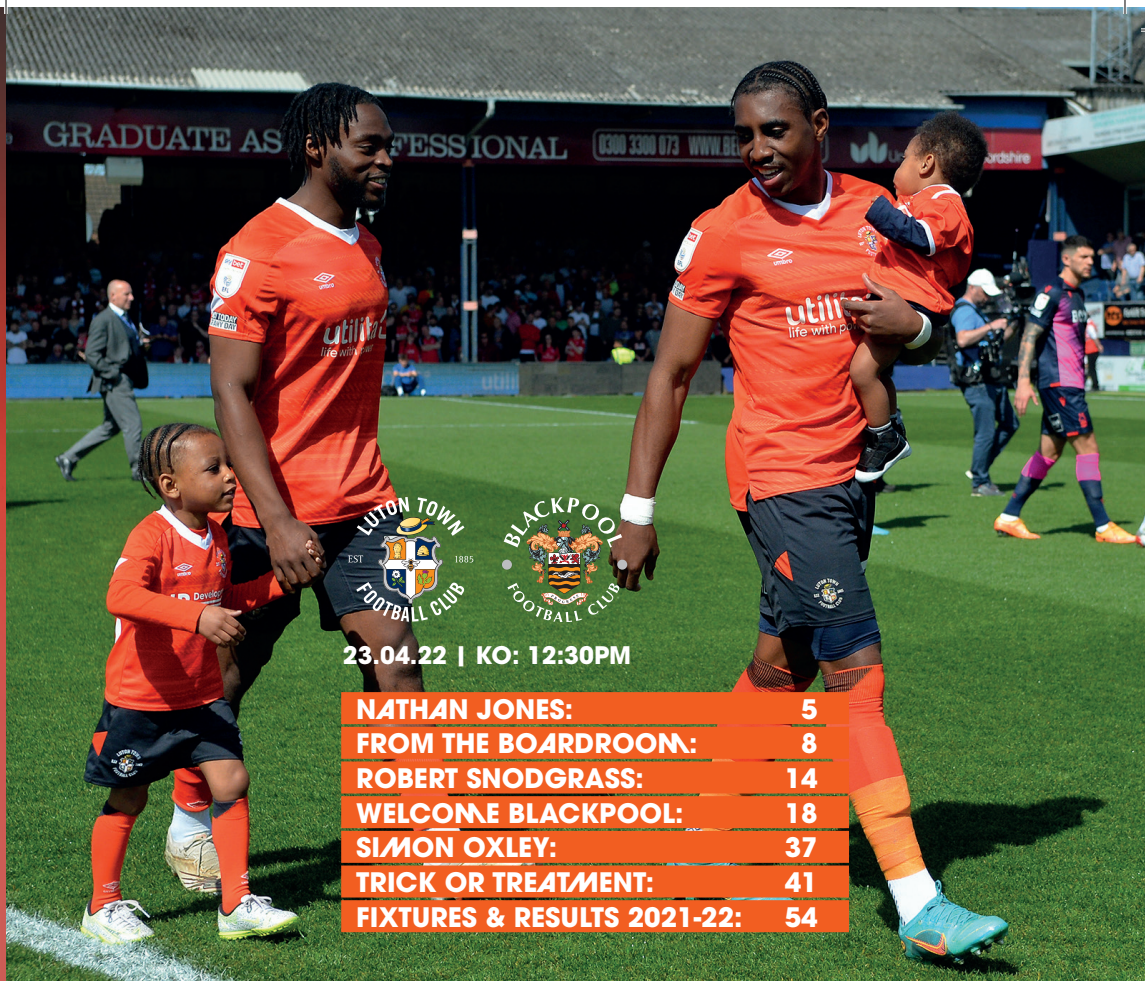

Good afternoon and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the second of three successive lunchtime kick-offs to finish the league campaign here.

If this one can go as well as the last one against Nottingham Forest, when I thought we were magnificent, then we will have taken another giant step towards where we want to be.

We welcome Neil Critchley, his staff, their players and everyone who has travelled with Blackpool today. I watched them a lot when they were in League One and I was living further north, keeping an eye on a certain midfielder who was enjoying his first loan before coming to us, and I haven't been surprised that they have had an excellent first season back in the Championship.

We know that they will be offering a really tough test for us again today, just as Cardiff did on Monday. That is the Championship. There is never an easy game despite how the league table might look. It is relentless and unforgiving from start to finish.

Just over a week ago we beat the team that has been the best in the division since Steve Cooper took over. We changed things tactically and went after Forest, while dealing with two of the biggest threats in the Championship down their right.

We dug in when we needed to in the second half, especially after we had lost Sonny to a second yellow card that shouldn't have stood, and together with our wonderful support inside the ground, we pulled off arguably our best win of the season.

We are going to need that backing again this afternoon because we are right down to the bare bones in terms of numbers, with the injury list extended further on Monday down at Cardiff. To lose both Breezy and Sheasy before half-time was tough to take, and then to lose Fred and have had to make all of our substitutions with half-an-hour still to play seriously limited our ability to change the game.

I joked afterwards that we call our subs plasters, rather than game changers these days, but we were glad that one of them managed to stick his head on a perfect Robert Snodgrass cross to earn us a second successive 1-0 win.

It proved that our squad depth this season is paying off for us, because everyone is always ready to play and come in to do their job for the team.

That will continue again today, and again they need your help from the stands. Give it everything you've got, put on another public show of what Luton Town is all about for the Sky cameras, because we are on the verge of achieving something truly special and it is going to need everyone to play their part.

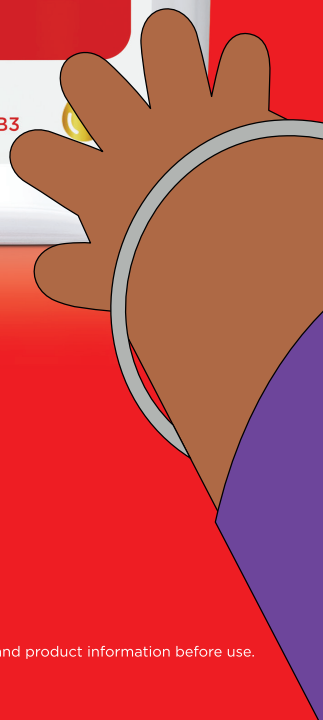
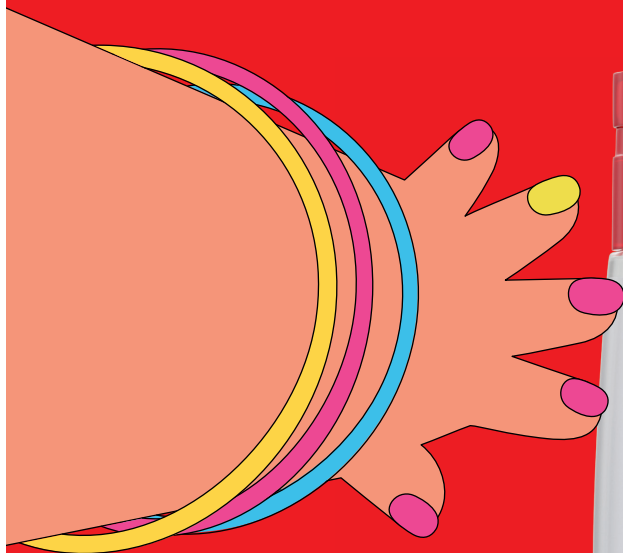

ROBERT SNODGRASS

OUR SCOTTISH INTERNATIONAL MIDFIELDER WAS THE SUBJECT OF THIS WEEK'S 10 TO TACKLE ON SKY SPORTS' EFL PODCAST, WHICH YOU CAN LISTEN TO BY SUBSCRIBING ON YOUR USUAL PROVIDER. HERE IS WHAT THE 34-YEAR-OLD HAD TO SAY...

What do your team-mates call you?

Snods, Snoddy, call me anything on the pitch really, you Scottish... you know the rest!

Who is the biggest character in the dressing room?

I've had a lot of big characters, but I've just added one since I've come here – Kal Naismith. He's one of the right good characters. He's a brilliant character to have in the dressing room, he's a top player and a funny guy.

Highlight of your career so far?

I think the highlight is coming back from a near career-ending knee injury and getting promoted with Hull at Wembley, and having all my family there. They supported me through 18 months really, so I would say that moment.

A moment in your career you would like to change?

I would have loved to have qualified for a major tournament for Scotland. That was a hard one but everything happens for a reason. Watching them from a fan's point of view has been great.

Best player you have played with?

Jack Grealish. In terms of entertainment, someone who can excite a crowd, I think he's right up there. I always knew he was going to kick on. Sometimes you can't give the genius any instructions, you just let a genius be free and when I was playing with him, that's the type of player he was. He added goals and assists to his game and got better and better.

Earliest football memory?

My earliest one – we went as a school to watch the 1998 World Cup when John Collins scored a penalty against Brazil. We actually watched that match in the cinema! That was my youngest football memory and just being hooked after that. It was such a great feeling, everyone was supporting Scotland, it was a terrific day.

Do you have a pre-match routine?

Just the usual, try and get a nice pre-match meal before the game, chicken and pasta, sometimes beans on toast, plenty of fluids in and as you get

a bit older, it's about 'Can you keep hitting those numbers, can you keep trying to compete with the younger generation?'

What's your squad number and what is the significance?

12 was the first number I wore, 23 was the last, which was going back to what I wore at Leeds. 12 is what I'm wearing now and it was the first number I wore when I came through at Livingston.

Favourite item of football memorabilia?

I'm not a big one on collecting, but I have my Wembley jersey, some Scotland stuff, I've got framed the things that I have done. Just memories for myself and achievements.

Which Championship player has been toughest this season?

I haven't really played much this season, but team wise I'd probably say Fulham are right up there.

What are you best at other than football?

Being a good team-mate, communication, trying to help others, realising the team's potential and you get that with more experience.

What do you plan to do after football?

I don't know, I'll cross that bridge when it comes to it. My family have supported me all the way through, so when that time comes, I'm sure I will try and be a full-time dad first and foremost because I have been supported and have been able to be me, and free to enter this football world to be part of a team. I can't think that far ahead.

What makes Luton special?

It is the togetherness. There is something special about this club, it's like they are a throwback where the fans are right on the edge, the players try and give them everything and as a team, we're creating something special here. I don't think you can put a price on togetherness and hard work, all the things you would say are the basics in the game, but they do it very well here. I've loved every single second since I've come in the door. Great people, great lads, lads that want to listen, they want to learn and they push me as well, which is most important. I've loved it here, it's a special club.

THE GOALKEEPER: CHRIS MAXWELL

Maxwell began his career at Wrexham and made 76 league appearances for the north Wales side, before a four-year spell at Fleetwood.

He featured over 100 times in the league for the Cod Army, and later joined Preston. The goalkeeper made over 70 league appearances for Preston, and had loan spells at Charlton and Hibernian.

The 31-year-old stopper joined Blackpool in January 2020.



THE DEFENDER: MARVIN EKPITETA

After a spell with Oxford's academy, Ekpiteta made his name in the National League South with Chelmsford City.

After impressing with the Clarets, he had later spells at both Concord Rangers and East Thurrock. In January 2018, he got his chance in the Football League with Leyton Orient and went onto feature 74 times in the league.

In July 2020, the 26-year-old joined the Seaside and has since made 73 appearances, scoring seven times.



THE MANAGER: NEIL CRITCHLEY

After a short playing career, Critchley's coaching career started with Crewe Alexandra, before he joined Liverpool as Under-18s coach.

The 43-year-old went onto manage Liverpool's Under-23s side, as well as the first-team on two occasions, standing in for Jürgen Klopp.

In March 2020, he took over at Bloomfield Road and won promotion to the Championship in his first season by winning the League One play-offs.

THE MIDFIELDER: KENNY DOUGALL

Born in Brisbane, Dougall progressed through the academy at Brisbane City in NPL Queensland, before moving to Telstar in the Eerste Divisie.

He spent a year with Telstar before he signed for Sparta Rotterdam in the summer of 2015, playing over 80 times before the call came for the Australian international to come to England to join Barnsley in 2018.

After two seasons at Oakwell, Dougall signed for Blackpool in October 2020.



THE ATTACKER: GARY MADINE

Vastly experienced striker Madine made his senior debut with Carlisle in , and went on to make 66 league appearances for the side before a move to Sheffield Wednesday.

The 31-year-old featured over 100 times in the league for the Owls, before making the move to Bolton. Madine later had a spell at Cardiff.

In January 2020, he signed for Blackpool, five years on from a prior loan spell, and he has since taken his career goals tally past 100 with a strike against QPR last November.

WATCH OUT FOR... JOSH BOWLER

After spending time at Fulham and Aldershot in his youth, Bowler progressed through the QPR academy and one senior appearance, coming against Norwich in May 2017.

In July 2017, he signed for Premier League club Everton. He later joined Hull on loan for the 2019/20 season, featuring 28 times in the Championship.

In June 2021, he left Goodison Park permanently to sign for Blackpool.

A HAT IN BOTH CAMPS

After bursting onto the scene at Blackpool, Kiernan Dewsbury-Hall made a huge impression with the Hatters and is now playing his trade in the Premier League.

Nathan Jones was an avid watcher of the midfielder during his time at Bloomfield Road, where he enjoyed a brief but successful loan in League One, contributing four goals and an assist in 10 matches.

And following his return to the club, Jones made it one of his top priorities to secure the services of the young midfielder during the summer transfer window, whom he had scouted during his time without a job.

Rarely a match went past where Dewsbury-Hall wasn't the Man of the Match recipient and his work-rate, on-the-ball quality and goals impressed the Town faithful massively, even though they were forced to watch him through their TV screens rather than in the flesh. That disappointment was mutual after Kiernan admitted: "I have said before that the only downside of this loan is that I have not been able to experience a full Kenilworth Road and the fans in full voice."

Such were the level of his performances, Kiernan swooped four awards at the end of the season, including the Players' Player of the Year trophy voted for by his team-mates.

After building his senior experience during his respective loan spells, the 23-year-old is now a mainstay in the Leicester starting line-up and a regular in European fixtures, Dewsbury-Hall is making the impression both Blackpool and Luton fans knew he would make.

He was introduced into the team over the Christmas period and has remained ever-present, scoring his first Premier League goal in a 2-1 win over Crystal Palace earlier this month.

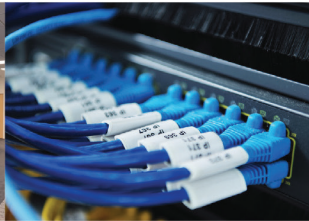

Since losing at Barnsley in mid-October the Town had embarked on a magnificent run of 27 League games without defeat, and with the finishing line in sight the table toppers were naturally hoping to extend their record against a strong Blackpool side at Kenilworth Road.

A capacity crowd saw the Hatters go straight out of the blocks and take the lead after six minutes, when a cross from Kazenga LuaLua was swept home by James Collins.

In truth the Town should have taken more advantage of their dominance in the first 25 minutes but on the half hour Blackpool levelled when Crystal Palace loanee Nya Kirby volleyed home from 20 yards.

The game was then more evenly balanced with chances at both ends but moved more in Blackpool's favour when Collins was dismissed on the hour mark after picking up two yellow cards in two minutes.

Blackpool took immediate advantage with Matty Virtue hammering the ball home from a corner but the Town rolled their sleeves up and left it late to level when substitute Jason Cummings scuffed home a shot with four minutes left.

Town boss Mick Harford was annoyed that the Hatters did not capitalise on their superiority in the opening period but gave Blackpool credit for their performance. "It was frustrating and I'm sure that if we had got the second goal, it would have been more and we would have carved them open, but fair play to them."

Blackpool manager Terry McPhillips said: "We've come here and given the best team in the league a scare. In the end it's a little scabby one that's gone through the legs of someone, and it's a real disappointed dressing room."

Division Two (now the Championship).
20th November 1971.

After four seasons of non-stop excitement, the Town's hopes of a third promotion over the same period ended with three poor displays over Easter 1971, but it had been good while it lasted. The collapse of club financial sponsor Vehicle and General did not help though!

The 1971/72 campaign was always going to be an anti-climax and so it proved. With ace marksman Malcolm Macdonald now banging in the goals for Newcastle following his record £180,000 move, the striker's role had been taken over by Don Givens and new signing Vic Halom, but although both were

good players in their own right, neither had the explosive power of Supremac.

With goals hard to come by, extra pressure was placed on the defence with the result that too many games were ending 0-0 or in a narrow defeat. After a win over Fulham in late September the Town went on a run of eight games without a further victory, leading up to the first visit to Blackpool since 1959/60.

Considering that the Hatters had lost at eventual bottom club Watford in a dismal game the previous week and had slumped to just above the drop zone, a full trainload of supporters, taking advantage of the special £1.25 fare, set out from Luton along with the players and directors.

With snow starting to fall, the train ground to a halt at Warrington due to a derailment and there we sat. The Town officials had been told of the potential problem when stopping briefly at Crewe, and coach Jimmy Andrews telephoned through the team to centre-half Chris Nicholl, who was already at the ground having stayed with relatives in the north-west. No mobile phones in those days!

With a potential fine now avoided the team still had to get to Bloomfield Road in time and the train finally arrived with barely twenty minutes to go before kick-off. The players were already changed and a coach with a police escort whisked them off to the ground scattering a carnival procession along the way.

We supporters had to walk and I got in just as the game kicked off in a blizzard.

Blackpool had not set the division on fire since relegation from the top flight the previous summer but had lost only once at home that season, to eventual champions Norwich, and still had some household names in their side with Tommy Hutchinson and Micky Burns both going close in the opening minutes.

It was the Hatters, though, who opened the scoring after 35 minutes when Givens hit a shot from the edge of the area following a goalmouth scramble. The ball eluded everyone before ending up in the back of the net.

It was now backs to the wall as the Town defence battled against the elements and the Blackpool forward line but, although substitute Fred Kemp hit a post towards the end, we managed to hold out and even had the luxury of seeing our own Viv Busby fire against the bar in the closing stages.

A relieved and pleased Luton manager said afterwards, "I thought we settled down into a much better combination (Stock had gambled by leaving striker Halom out of the side) and there was no doubt about the fighting spirit and combination."

Blackpool manager Bob Stokoe was not so happy: "We have not been playing as a team for some time," he said.

The victory rejuvenated the Town to some extent as the team went on a run of seven games without defeat following the Blackpool victory and although the season was nothing much to shout about, an eventual position of 13th could be regarded as satisfactory. Blackpool finished in sixth spot in the days before play-offs.

As a postscript, to cap the 'Trainride from Hell', the heating system broke down on the way home and I can assure you it was very cold!

Anyone missing their weekly fix of medical drama following the decision to axe the BBC's *Holby City* could certainly find a more than adequate replacement in the treatment room at LTFC.

I feel the need to take at least a basic course in physiotherapy to enable an informed commentary to continue. At Cardiff on Monday it was a procession as messrs Bree, Shea and Onyedimma limped off in quick succession, and yet they still won, which shows so much about this group of players.

After changing his definition of substitutes from "gamechangers" to "plasters", NJ again restated the case for five replacements. It would seem to make sense with many clubs being penalised for good cup runs and/or covid postponements with league matches then shoe-horned in to the remaining weeks. My only reservation would be managers using the extra substitutions to waste even more time in the closing minutes.

On the subject of fixtures, the TV schedule also needs some attention. The 12.30 kick-offs are OK-ish, and seem to suit us for the most part, but the switch to a Monday night in Huddersfield, and the now Bank Holiday Monday trip to Fulham seem to disregard those who watch in person rather than on a screen.

Today we find ourselves on the brink of securing a play-off place. A Championship play-off place. There are plenty of ways to

quantify the likely achievement. My favourite is to look at the clubs who haven't made it such as Cardiff, Swansea and Stoke, and then there are those who will still be playing League One football next year, like Ipswich, Portsmouth and at least one of Sheffield Wednesday and Sunderland.

It would also mean Premier League football would be three games away. I make no apologies for describing that possibility as "life-changing". Not necessarily for players and managers, although there will clearly be financial reward, but for the club and the town.

As Gary Sweet pointed out in these pages recently, promotion would solve the current "challenges" with the stadium "in one fell swoop". That would mean a new home to secure the club's future for the next 100 years, plus jobs, homes and redevelopment for the town in increasingly difficult times. As I said, "life-changing".

I was chatting to a Hatter who attends games with his two sons. The boys started coming during the Conference-winning season, have now seen three promotions, and are certainly enjoying the current campaign. Coupled with that, they have seen England reach a World Cup semi and a European Championship final. He's pointed out to them that it's not always like this!

This really could happen, couldn't it? Two games in four days off the back of three games without a win.

A catalogue of key players already in the treatment room with three more disappearing into Luton's very own "Bermuda Triangle" during the latter of the two games. The first against a team who were unbeaten in nine and had won five games on the spin. Six huge points, done so in a manner that epitomised what this Luton Town team is all about.

After a disappointing defeat on the road to Huddersfield, the form team in the Championship came to Kenilworth Road in the shape of Nottingham Forest, with Luton producing an outstanding 90 minutes of football to claim a crucial three points with Kal Naismith's penalty.

Much of the response to that game on social media and in the press centred around Luton's gritty, aggressive approach and how their success is rooted in hard work and desire. This is of course true, but Luton's tactical intelligence and understanding is just as important. Individuals running a lot is pointless without it being done whilst working within a wider framework and collective understanding. It's about effective running, which is what the Hatters are so good at.

The Town deployed Amari'i Bell on the left of the back three to match-up with the dangerous Brennan Johnson, whilst Fred Onyedinma was critical in foiling the threat of wing-back Djed Spence from left wing-back. Singling out the latter of those two, Onyedinma's understanding of when to step high onto Spence's first touch to deny him space was critical in the Hatters keeping a clean

sheet against a team that had scored 15 goals in their previous five games.

The same applies to the almost completely new midfield trio of Rob Snodgrass, Allan Campbell and Kal Naismith, going man-to-man and denying space to Forest's technically gifted central midfielders when Luton's front men forced the ball centrally.

When you mix the psychological and physical characteristics that are so often affiliated with this team with the tactical understanding and cohesion that it embodies, what you get is a team that is as hard to beat as anyone in the league.

After a game that would've both physically and psychologically stretched the players, recovering and climbing the second mountain just three days later is arguably an even bigger challenge than conquering the first, especially with the number of injuries to key players. But once again, this squad found a way to win and put the Hatters within touching distance of the Championship play-offs.

With three games of the season remaining, three points should be enough to seal the chance to compete for a place in football's promised land. Whilst this group's psychological resilience, drive and work ethic has been central to what they've achieved this season, their talent and tactical understanding has been just as important in pushing this club to where it is – and that should not be overlooked.

Kal Naismith praised a monumental team effort to condemn Nottingham Forest to a first league defeat since January.

The ten-man Hatters produced a strong performance to get the better of their play-off rivals thanks to the Scotsman's first-half penalty after he took responsibility from 12 yards and finished calmly.

"It is unbelievable humility from Elijah to be honest," Naismith commented after the match. "We had a chat before in the warm up and I said 'look big man, I'll get the ball, we know the tactics, they'll try and get in your head because you've missed one, wait until it all settles down and when it settles down, you can come to me if you want it and I'll back you to score."

"You're our talisman, you're brilliant at penalties, everybody misses them, but you assess the situation and if you don't want it, I'll step up and hit it. To be fair to him, there's not many strikers that would have that humility in the situation and say, 'right Kal, you have a go', if he wants the next one, he can take it. We would never be where we are without him, he's been tremendous this season."

On a personal note, it was the 30-year-old's second goal of the season, both of which have come in front of the Sky Sports cameras, but for him it was all about the bigger picture at the end of the 90 minutes.

"It was a brilliant game. I don't know how it looked from the side but playing in it was enjoyable, it was feisty, good play at times, rough and tough, it was a proper Championship game. It was really tough, playing in midfield is a lot tougher and more combative in there. It's easy for me to say that now we've got three points!

"To a man, every single player was outstanding, even the ones coming off the bench. Robert Snodgrass came into the centre-midfield role, and he's not started a game for us. He was outstanding, but I could name everyone.

"I'm proud of everyone that we bounced back, you don't know how hard that is to do in the Championship. When you go and get beat it's easy to feel down especially the way we lost (at Huddersfield). We felt if we scored the penalty, we would go on with momentum we would have gone on and won that game."

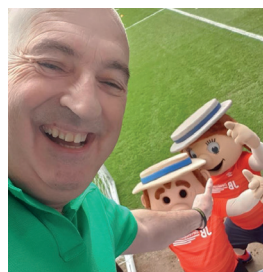

WHO?

The Cottagers have already claimed promotion back to the Premier League after a dominant season which has seen them score almost 100 goals. This season's promotion was their third promotion from England's second tier in five years, winning the play-offs in both 2018 and 2020 with the Whites unable to maintain their top flight status with 19th and 18th placed finishes in 2019 and 2021.

GROUND?

Fulham have played their home fixtures at Craven Cottage since 1896 and hosts a capacity of 19,359. It's record attendance stands at 49,335 in 1938 when the Cottagers faced fellow London rivals Millwall and has posted an average attendance of 16,707 so far this season.

HAVEN'T WE MET BEFORE?

The two sides last met at Kenilworth Road in December, playing out a 1-1 draw after Elijah Adebayo's second half equaliser cancelled out Championship top scorer Aleksander Mitrovic's opener. In 2019, the two sides played out an entertaining 3-3 draw, with the visitors equalising deep into stoppage whilst the reverse fixture at Craven Cottage ended in a 3-2 victory for the hosts.

KNOWING ME, KNOWING YOU

Former Hatters midfielder Mark Pembridge finished his career at Craven Cottage and is currently the club's joint U23s manager, whilst Hatters Conference promotion winner Alex Lawless spent two years at Fulham as a youngster but didn't make a senior appearance, joining the Hatters five years after departing.
