I always say that we like to experience something different when we have a cup draw, rather than play a side that we are already going to come up against in our own division.

Newport is a cracking draw because it gives us chance to renew acquaintance with a club that we have shared a big part of the journey we have both been on in returning to, and re-establishing ourselves in the Football League.

Those Welshmen among us look at it with a bit of extra romance too, although I am pleased it's a home tie when you consider the crazy travelling we're scheduled to do in the opening month of the season with two opportunities to visit our families back home in God's country already!

I welcome James Rowberry, who has made an impressive start to life in management since replacing Mike Flynn mid-way through last season, along with his staff, their players and every official and supporter who has made the journey up from South Wales tonight.

Newport had built a reputation for enjoying good cup runs under Mike, and in the last couple of seasons we've enjoyed plenty ourselves; one in this competition when we played Manchester United without fans, and then earlier this year when we drew Chelsea in the FA Cup for the second season in a row, thankfully on that occasion with a full house here to watch it.

Winning becomes a great habit, and although we've played well and gained two excellent results in the Championship so far, we are eager to get that first one in the bag tonight.

With the volume of matches we have to play in August – a minimum eight and nine if we progress here – we have to



take the opportunity to give minutes to players who haven't featured much yet. We left some at home over the weekend, rather than make the trek to the north-west, so they could prepare properly and be ready for this one.

We are going to have to use the group, and we've been able to build a wonderful squad with the additions we've made this summer. It's their opportunity to come in and stake a claim for a shirt against Preston, but first and foremost they know they need to get the job done tonight.

It won't be easy, and we'll need your help as always. Your support was absolutely outstanding on Saturday, out-singing the Burnley supporters for long periods when they'd come for what they thought would be a party.

You did us proud, and although we actually felt a tinge of disappointment in the dressing room not to come away with all three points, I know from the ovation at the end that the lads did the travelling 1,026 proud too.

Get behind them again tonight and enjoy the game.

JOHN McATEE

We were pleased to announce the signing of Grimsby Town forward John McAtee for an undisclosed fee last week.

As part of the transfer the 23-year-old, whose goals helped fire the Mariners to promotion from the National League last season, will return to Blundell Park on a season-long loan to continue his development in Sky Bet League Two.

McAtee started his youth career with Shrewsbury Town in 2015 and was handed his Football League debut on the final day of the 2016/17 season by then Shrews' manager Paul Hurst.

The forward joined up with Hurst again at League Two side Scunthorpe United, before reuniting with him for a third time at Grimsby. He found the net 16 times in all competitions last term, including the opener in the National League play-off final against Solihull Moors to help send Grimsby back to the Football League.

After completing his paperwork at Kenilworth Road, McAtee said: "I see this as a big opportunity for myself coming to the Championship and I'm delighted to get it done."

On returning to Grimsby for the season to continue his progression, he added: "That's the aim, definitely. I want to get more game time under my belt so when I'm back here next year, I'm ready to go.

"The manager explained to me the values of the club, and it's clear to see anyway that the club is going in the right direction. We spoke about a plan for me, which sounded good."

What can supporters expect to see from McAtee upon his return next season? "Bottom line is I work hard," he said. "I try my best to get goals, I'm positive, I run forward, I'll tackle, I will do the ugly side as well as on the ball so that's what you can expect."

ARIBIM PEPPE

Aribim Pepple became Nathan Jones' ninth summer signing last week, after agreeing a move from Canadian Premier League side Cavalry FC – subject to international clearance.

The Kettering-born striker, 19, lived in Leicestershire before moving to Canada with his family at the age of five. It was there that he joined his local club, Calgary Foothills, at Under-10 level and signed for the first team after impressing in the Canadian Premier League open trials aged just 15.

He signed his first professional contract in August 2019 and played 13 times that season before he announced his departure from Cavalry to move to Spain to join the Getafe youth team.

Pepple, known as Bim, scored on his debut for Getafe's U19s and later made his international debut for Canada U17s, before returning to Cavalry in April this year.

He made an immediate impression upon his return and was named the CPL's Player of the Month for June after becoming the first-ever player to score in five consecutive matches. The 6ft forward scored six goals in seven outings this term, averaging a goal every 70 minutes for the league leaders.

Pepple, who spent time on trial with both Sheffield United and Leicester City in 2021, said: "It feels really good to finally get this done and be here. I'm so excited to finally come over and join Luton.

"Just in the short time I have been around the club, it is clear the goal of the team this year is to get promoted to the Premier League. If I can help in any way possible, that is my goal. I met Jay (Socik) and the analyst crew, I told my agent right away that the information they have about me, they know more about me than I know about myself! Instantly I was hooked and then talking to the gaffer, seeing what the long-term plan is, it seems like the perfect spot for me."


Newport County AFC are one of three teams from Wales in the Football League, the other two being our Championship opponents Cardiff City and Swansea City.

Founded in 1912, Newport County faced bankruptcy in 1989 and eventually folded in the early months of 1989, reforming under the ownership of the fans, but with David Hando as chairman. Nicknamed the Exiles, as they restarted playing again over the border in Gloucestershire, the club rose from the Hellenic League and finally returned to the EFL in 2013 under the late Justin Edinburgh.

Michael Flynn took over in 2017 and steered the club away from relegation danger in his first season, and almost led them to promotion two years later, making it to Wembley for a play-off final, but it was agony for the County fans as Tranmere Rovers netted a 119th-minute winner.


They made it to Wembley again in the 2020/21 season but lost in extra-time once more, this time to Morecambe with future Hatter Carlos Mendes Gomes bagging the winner from the penalty spot.

Last term saw Newport finish 11th after Flynn was replaced by ex-Cardiff academy coach James Rowberry, and this will be the first meeting between the sides since the Hatters' League Two promotion-winning campaign in 2017/18.



JAMES ROWBERRY

MANAGER | Retiring from playing aged 21, Rowberry pursued a career in coaching and achieved his UEFA Pro Licence aged only 29. He had coaching roles at both Newport and Cardiff, working under a number of different managers during his time with the Bluebirds. In October 2021, he took over as manager of Newport County and guided the side to an 11th place finish in Sky Bet League Two.




NICK TOWNSEND

GK | Townsend began his career at Birmingham and had loans at Oxford City and Lincoln, as well as a short stint at Barnsley. His time at Oakwell was made permanent, and he featured in 16 league games for the Tykes. The 27-year-old also had a loan spell at Solihull Moors. In 2018, he made the move to South Wales to sign for the Exiles.

MICKY DEMETRIOU

DEF | Since making the move to the Exiles in January 2017, Demetriou has featured in over 200 league games for the Wales-based side. He began his career at Worthing, before spells at Bognor Regis, Eastbourne and Kidderminster. The 32-year-old was given a chance in the Football League with Shrewsbury, and had a loan spell at Cambridge. The defender has been an ever-present for Newport since his move.

OMAR BOGLE

ONE TO WATCH | After spells at West Brom, Birmingham and Celtic in his youth, Bogle's first-team career started in non-league with Hinckley. He'd go onto have impressive spells at Solihull and Grimsby, before spells further up leagues with Wigan and Cardiff. The 29-year-old went onto sign for Charlton, Doncaster, and Hartlepool, and signed for the Exiles earlier this summer.

AARON WILDIG

MID | A product of the Cardiff City academy, Wildig went onto feature for the Bluebirds first-team in 16 league games. Permanent spells at both Shrewsbury and Morecambe followed, with the later lasting seven years. After his lengthy spell with the Shrimps, Wildig left for Newport County in July 2022.

OFFRANDE ZANZALA

ATT | A summer signing, Zanzala started his career at Derby County, before a spell at Accrington Stanley after an initial loan spell. After leaving Stanley, the Congo-born striker had a short stint at Crewe Alexandra, and later joined Barrow. The 24-year-old had a loan spell at Exeter City last season, before linking up with Newport in the summer.

Newport County were last visitors at Kenilworth Road in September 2017 and the Hatters put their opponents to the sword on that afternoon, early on in the League Two promotion winning season.

Nathan Jones' side extended their unbeaten record to five matches with an impressive display against the Exiles, also making it five wins from the first six home matches that term.

Alan Sheehan opened the scoring in the 12th minute when his free-kick evaded everyone in the box and found the back of the net.

Danny Hylton netted a brace before half-time with a back heel from close range and what later became a trademark Panenka chip from the penalty spot!

The visitors scored a consolation goal shortly after the restart through captain Joss Labadie, but were unable to drag themselves back into the contest with the Hatters remaining fifth in the table on 21 points.

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, looking back at GERRY KING's first and last appearances for the Town.

Born in Radnor in April 1947, Welsh schoolboy international Gerry started out with Cardiff, making his debut as a 17 year old, but found it hard to maintain a regular place in the side at Ninian Park and so reluctantly accepted a move to Torquay in 1965.

At Plainmoor, Gerry helped the Gulls to promotion and played a blinder against Luton along the way, something that was remembered by Hatters manager George Martin who was pleased to pick up the left winger on a free transfer over the summer of 1966.

After scoring on his debut against Halifax at Kenilworth Road, Gerry struggled in a poor Luton side and netted only three more League goals from 22 games over that season. He was therefore probably glad to escape and move back to Wales with Newport where he was altogether rather more successful over the next two seasons.

After turning out for Ton Pentre, Barry and Bridgend, Gerry retired for the game to concentrate on his coal business before becoming a drayman with Ansell's Brewery for many years. His son Jamie later turned out for Newport.

FIRST GAME: LUTON TOWN 2 HALIFAX TOWN 0 (20/8/66)


The Town had very narrowly failed to win promotion from Division Four (now League Two) at the first attempt in 1965-66 and missing top scorer John O'Rourke, sold to Middlesbrough in the close season, they were looking on new signing Gerry King to fill the gap. Halifax, missing five players through injury and suspension, comfortably held the Town in the first period, but after a half-time rocket from manager George Martin, the Hatters came out after the interval with all guns blazing. King netted on 49 minutes after being set up by Ray Whittaker, and then three minutes later nodded down a David Pleat cross for Bruce Rioch to double the lead.

LAST GAME: CHESTERFIELD 0 LUTON TOWN 0 (6/5/67)


The Town were about to end their worst ever season in the Football League, eventually finishing eighth bottom but thankfully avoiding the re-election places. The game at Saltergate had nothing riding on it and after Spireites goalkeeper Malcolm Brunt had to leave the field with a cut head on 20 minutes the Town pounded away against a resolute Chesterfield rearguard who gave sound protection to outfield player Gerry Clarke who was forced to deputise between the sticks.


Hugh Billington nets the only goal of the game in a Football League (South) clash with Newport at Kenilworth Road in May 1946.



LUTON UNITED

Luton United is an early intervention project our inclusion team have successfully launched in primary schools across the North of Luton, working in partnership with Luton Youth Offending Service and Bedfordshire Police.

We have been awarded funding from our Bedfordshire Police & Crime Commissioner through the Community Safety Fund. Our aim is to engage with all Year 6 students within the targeted areas before they begin their transition into high school to improve community cohesion and prevent vulnerable young people entering the criminal justice system. The areas our project focuses on are Lewsey Farm, Marsh Farm and Hockwell Ring, are currently experiencing increasing serious youth violence and anti-social behaviour.

So far, we have engaged with over 300 young people across each of the estates through collapsed curriculum sports days, which have combined both fun and competitive competitions along with interactive workshops focused on community issues. In addition to this we have an eager cohort from each of the estates enrolled onto our integration holiday camp hosted out of our Ely Way community hub, which will give them that opportunity to cross over communities and interact with young people who they wouldn't usually get the chance to normally before transitioning into high school.

We have teamed up with trusted partners to ensure we get the best out of our delivery. Samantha McKay, Deputy Head of Luton Youth Offending Service, has led workshops focused on Law and Healthy Relationships and Police Constable, Ommer Khan, has worked with his team to develop lessons on community cohesion and educate the young people about the roles and responsibilities the force has in our local community. Our community trust inclusion team have been focusing on aspirations along with the organisation of sports days, cross estate integration events and a mini school football league.

Community Operations Manager, Daniel Douglas, explained:

"Through the ongoing support of our Crime Commissioner, we can deliver targeted projects such as this. Anti-social behaviour and serious youth violence are sadly increasing around the town and it is important that we are engaging with young people at a key age to educate them about these specific topics before their transition into high school. Along with professionals we can engage, target and empower young people to reach their full potential in a safe environment. The youth are the future of the town and we will ensure to provide them with positive role models to give them the best chance of achieving."

Since beginning the project in April, we have managed to successfully complete our pilot programme with the existing Year 6 students. We look forward to welcoming many of these to our integration camps throughout the summer holidays, and will be working with the new Year 6 pupils throughout the new school year.
