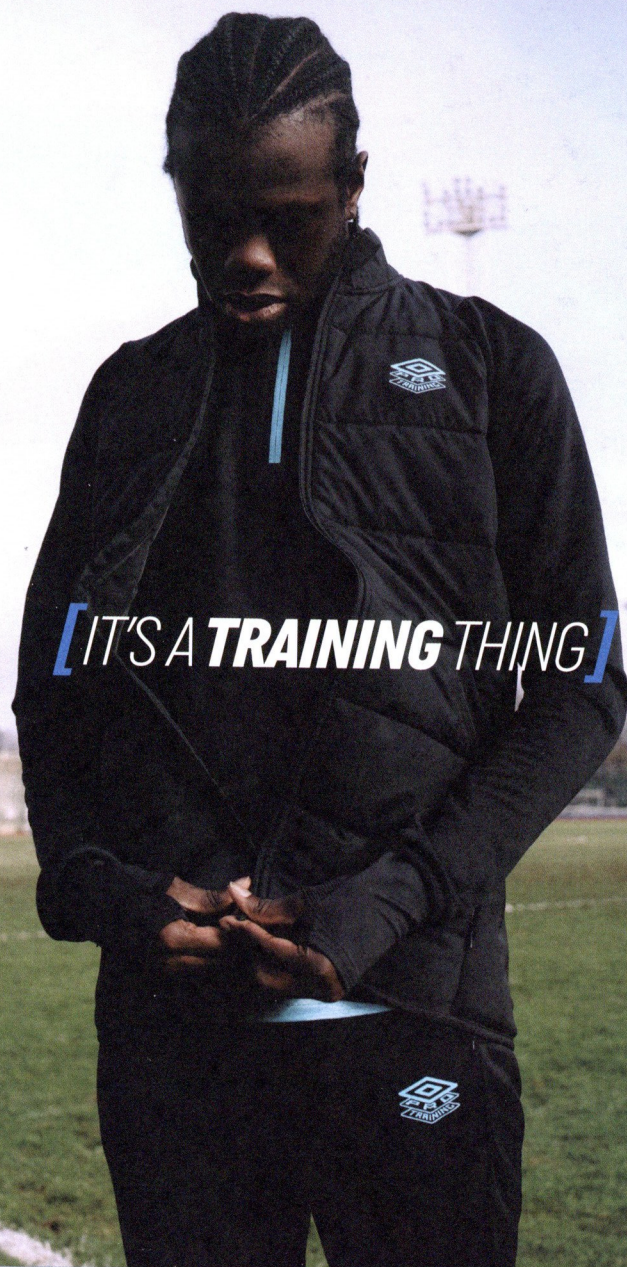

GOOD AFTERNOON AND WELCOME BACK TO KENILWORTH ROAD FOR THE SECOND TIME IN FOUR DAYS FOR THIS SKY BET CHAMPIONSHIP FIXTURE AGAINST BLACKBURN ROVERS.

The welcome is extended to everyone who has travelled south from Blackburn, especially their manager, Jon Dahl Tomasson, his staff, their players, officials and supporters.

Blackburn arrive here in Bedfordshire third in the table, despite having suffered more defeats than ourselves from the opening nine games. We know that we will be in for a tough afternoon as we always are when we face them, because they are always a potent Championship side with a real attacking threat.

We tend to do better against the top sides here, and we can also take heart from knowing that if we can turn some of our decent performances into wins, we can shoot right up the table to the kind of position they find themselves in.

We know we aren't far away, but we have to be better defensively than we were on Wednesday night against Coventry. I keep repeating myself, but we have played well in games here and not had our rewards as a combination of poor decisions by the officials and ourselves have cost us. On Wednesday night we saw both.

We can't keep conceding two goals at home and expect to win matches, because that is not the type of team we are. Although we love to score goals, we have built our reputation in this division on keeping clean sheets and pride ourselves on being aggressive, fit and strong. We kept 19 clean sheets last season but only two in nine matches so far this year, which is isn't good enough at this level.

That said, we had the lead against Coventry – as we did in the draw with Sheffield United and defeat to Wigan – and looked a real threat every time we went forward. We had no

control in the game though and in the end, either side could have won it.

We also have to acknowledge the fact that just as in the Sheffield United match, another huge call by a ref or assistant has denied us the opportunity to win the match. The handball on Wednesday was a great save if you are a goalkeeper, and these decisions that aren't being made in our favour are hard to take. We could be sitting on four more points if those two were called right. They are game changing moments, but we are determined to put right the parts that we can – we know we have to be better in all areas – and get that first home win on the board as we head into the international break.

You did the club proud with the tribute to the Queen before the match on Wednesday. The silence was impeccably observed and hearing the national anthem sung around our home ground was something none of us have ever experienced before. It was a special, emotional moment, so please play your part again today.

Be loud, be proud and enjoy the game. COYH!

Enjoy the game today and fingers crossed we are celebrating that elusive home win come 5pm!

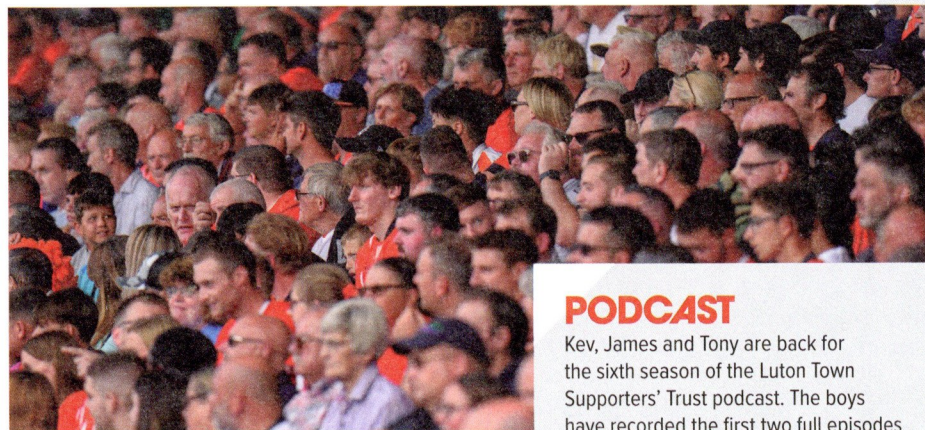

MATCH REACTION

FRED ONYEDINMA

A mental battle. That is what Fred Onyedima had faced during the off-season after he was dealt a blow with a recurring hamstring injury.

But after making his first start of the season in midweek against Coventry City, the pacey wideman is hoping to put those woes behind him to focus on helping the team as much as possible this term.

Following an effective appearance against Cardiff City and a brief cameo versus Wigan, Onyedima was utilised as a wing-back from the start against the Sky Blues and once again, it didn't take long for the 25-year-old to make an impact.

Picking out Carlton Morris with a knockdown from Harry Cornick's cross, the former powered an effort past Ben Wilson to put the Hatters in front, during what proved to be a frantic start to the

"We started off well and we thought we were going to go on and push," said Onyedima. "The first half for me personally was good but it was disappointing we didn't capitalise on our chances and win, so we just have to go again on Saturday."

"We have to keep building. I feel like the most important thing is that we didn't lose, we have to still look forward for that first win at home and hopefully we can do that on Saturday."

With summer signing Carlton Morris up and running with five goals, Onyedima is relishing the opportunity to continue supplying chances to Morris and the other forwards in future matches.

"The strength that he has, he causes problems for every defender," the wing-back said. "He can score goals with his head, left foot or right foot so he has to keep building on that."

"With Eli (Elijah Adebayo) and Carlton, you know you can put it in an area, you don't even have to think too much you know they are going to be there to score. Hopefully we can use that more because I feel like we haven't used it to the best of our ability but hopefully we can in the games to come."

Onyedima was on the pitch for 72 minutes before being substituted, but it was an opportunity to show yet again what he can do in front of the Luton Town faithful. After a tough time on the sidelines, that was all he wanted.

"It was unfortunate because I did so much work trying to get back fit in the off-season, and it was one of those ones where you do it again and mentally it



challenges you because you're thinking 'Is it going to happen again?' The staff helped me, took their time with me just to build me up again and I'm grateful for them as well. I'm happy to be back, hopefully I can keep fit and stay in the team."

"With football that is what happens. I just have to keep my head down, stick to it and do the work again and then come back stronger."

"I've come here and unfortunately, I've had a few niggles and I don't want that to stick. I want to put that behind me and be injury-free, I just want to play and show the best of my ability."

"Hopefully I can keep doing that and add some end product with assists and goals, and then we can push on as a team."

Ahead of today's match against high-flying Blackburn Rovers, it presents another opportunity to earn what is proving to be a somewhat elusive home win of the season.

"As a team we know what we're capable of, we know how good we are, especially at home, especially last season. We can't focus on that too much but we know that win is going to come and hopefully when it does we can push on."

"Blackburn are a good team but if you look at our squad, we have depth as well so that will be an interesting game."

Onyedima added: "We've got a good team. Even if some players are injured we have a good squad. That is football. We can't just feel sorry for ourselves, we have to do the best we can and I feel like we have the squad. Unfortunately we haven't had the best of results but I know when it clicks, we can push on."

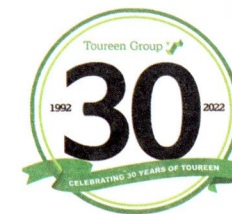

IT'S BEEN A WHILE SINCE I WROTE ONE OF THESE COLUMNS, SO IT'S A PLEASURE TO FEATURE BACK IN THE MATCH DAY PROGRAMME.

It's been busy a start as ever to the championship season with nine games played in just over five weeks. This has included four tough away games with over 36 hours spent on the team bus and over 1,420 miles travelled. This takes a real toll on the team when they are leaving it all out on the pitch, like we aim to do every game.

Those of you who spent as much time on the motorway as we have, full credit to you guys. Your unwavering support is never underappreciated and is a massive boost for the players and the staff. Mind you, if you are going to spend that much time away from Luton, Wales has proved not to be a bad place to do so.

With this many games in such a short space of time (a regular theme this season with a game every 3.6 days due to the World Cup), there has been a big focus on recovery around the training ground.

This has carried on from last season where our fixture schedule after the Christmas Covid break was relentless with over 10 three-game weeks, out of a possible 15 game weeks. With these circumstances imposed on us, the nature of our successful results and extension of the season due to the play-offs, this pushed a lot of the squad to the brink and we unfortunately incurred a few injury issues due to the lads' efforts and outputs across these physically demanding game weeks.

As a performance department, overall staff and club, we have learnt a number of lessons and worked hard over the off season to further develop all injury prevention and recovery strategies.

Within these plans we are in the process of developing a new recovery area at the training ground with contrast

hot and cold hydrotherapy baths and compression pump areas. We also have great support from Lucy Motto and the team at David Lloyd Luton, where we make use of the aqua facilities to aid recovery and readiness to play.

In addition to these optimal recovery strategies it's important that when we do have the chance to complete fitness and strength work, we have the right facilities to do so. This is why the club is currently investing in a new state of the art gym facility.

With the help and support from Chris Bell and Paul Watson at the club, as well as Chris Billingham and the team at Muscle squad, plans are in place to develop a top end strength and conditioning centre to further benefit the players' strength and power competencies.

The lads are currently in a good place physically which will continually be challenged throughout another arduous Championship season, but everyone is confident we can be as competitive as last season, especially with your support – so make some noise today like you always do.

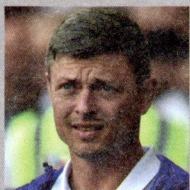

Today's opposition are Blackburn Rovers, a club founded in 1875 and who play at Ewood Park. They currently sit in third place in the Championship table.

Blackburn Rovers are a club with great history in the English Football League. They won the Premier League in 1996 under Kenny Dalglish, with former Town boss Ray Harford as his No.2, and have spent all but one of the last 11 seasons in the Championship since being relegated from the top flight in 2011-12.

Rovers have started the season well under new boss Jon Dahl Tomasson, who replaced Tony Mowbray following their 8th-place finish last season, and have picked up 15 points from a possible 27. They have recorded wins against QPR, Swansea, West Brom, Blackpool and Watford in the league so far, but have lost their other four matches, including three on the bounce against Reading, Sheffield United and Stoke.

Blackburn have also reached the third round of the Carabao Cup, where they will visit Premier League side West Ham in November after earning wins over League Two clubs Hartlepool United and Bradford City.



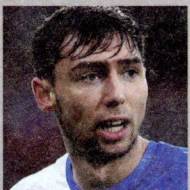
JON DAHL TOMASSON

MANAGER | Tomasson had an illustrious playing career, representing clubs in Denmark, the Netherlands, Italy, Germany, Spain and England. His most notable spells are at AC Milan, where he won a Champions League medal, and a season at Newcastle United. The 46-year-old earned over 100 international caps for Denmark and became assistant manager after retirement. Tomasson won back-to-back league titles with Swedish club Malmö FF before joining Rovers this summer.



TOMAS KAMINSKI

GK | Belgium-born Kaminski had numerous stints with clubs in his home country, including Gent and Anderlecht, before his move to Rovers in August 2020. The 29-year-old has made almost 100 appearances for the club and signed a contract extension earlier this year. Kaminski was named Rovers' Player of the Season in the 2020-21 season and has earned 33 caps across all youth ages for the Belgium national team.



HARRY PICKERING

DEF | Young left-back Pickering began his career at Crewe Alexandra, where he graduated from their academy. The 23-year-old was instrumental in the Alex's promotion from League Two in the 2019-20 season and earned a move to Rovers in January 2021. Pickering finished the 2020-21 season back on loan at Crewe before he broke into the Rovers team last season. So far, Pickering has played every minute in the Championship this season.



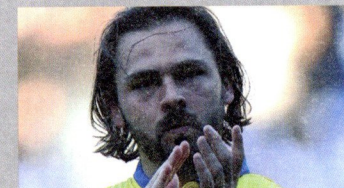
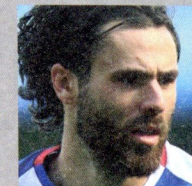
BLACKBURN ROVERS IN FOCUS

BEN BRERETON DIAZ

ONE TO WATCH | Chilean international Brereton Díaz began his academy career at Manchester United before graduating at Nottingham Forest. The 23-year-old made 57 appearances for Forest before permanently joining Rovers in January 2019 after a loan spell. Brereton Díaz made his Chile national team debut in June 2021 and has four goals in his 15 appearances. So far this season, Brereton Díaz has netted four times after finishing top scorer last term with 22.



BRADLEY DACK

MID | 28-year-old Dack began his professional career at Gillingham and contributed to their promotion to League One in the 2012-13 season before winning their Player of the Season award in the 2015-16 season. The midfielder signed for Rovers in June 2017 and scored 18 goals in his first season as Blackburn were promoted back to the Championship. Dack netted 18 times again the season after, before three seasons of injury frustrations.

GEORGE HIRST

ATT | Leicester City loanee Hirst joined at the end of this summer's transfer window to boost Rovers' attacking options. The centre forward is a graduate of Sheffield Wednesday's academy, the club which his father David made over 300 appearances for, and joined Leicester after a season in Belgium at OH Leuven. The 23-year-old made two Premier League appearances before loan spells at Championship side Rotherham United and League One Portsmouth.

LUTON TOWN v BLACKBURN ROVERS
SATURDAY SEPTEMBER 17TH 2022 | KENILWORTH ROAD

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, as club historian ROGER WASH looks back at John Aston's first and last appearances for the Town.

It was a major coup by Luton manager Harry Haslam when he managed to entice the holder of both a League champion's and European Cup winner's medal to Kenilworth Road. Still only 25 when he came to Luton from Manchester United in 1972, John soon became a crowd favourite with his clever wing play encompassing a deceptive turn of pace, a tremendous left foot and an ice-cool temperament.

After helping the Hatters to the top flight in 1974, his knack of scoring vital goals almost saved the Town from their ultimately unsuccessful bid to avoid immediate relegation. After leaving Luton in 1977, John had a season at Mansfield before finishing his career at Blackburn in advance of concentrating on his Stalybridge business, 'Pet World'.

FIRST GAME: CARDIFF CITY 2 LUTON TOWN 1 (12/8/72)

With four players making their debuts, including John, the Town get off to a great start when from a shot hitting the Luton crossbar at one end, a counter attack led to Jim Ryan being fouled in the box in the other. Aston then opened his Hatters account from the spot.

Sadly, it was not to be an opening day win for either Aston or new manager Harry Haslam as Cardiff fought back to take a tight game as the Town tired.

LAST GAME: OLDHAM ATH 1 LUTON TOWN 0 (27/8/77)

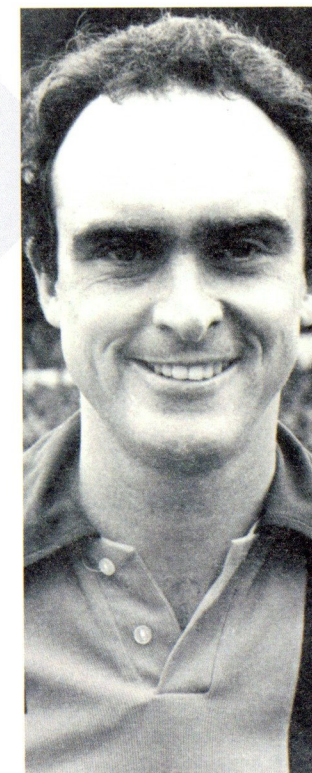
A disappointing end to John Aston's Town career with a narrow defeat at Boundary Park. The Town had most of the play but could not find an opening with the Latics goal coming from a long cross from Les Chapman which caught in the wind and swirled over the head of Luton goalkeeper Milija Aleksic into the corner of the net.

The Town's dismal day was completed by the dismissal of Paul Futchter for two bookable offences.

At least John did not have far to go home afterwards!

After a couple of seasons in the doldrums, when the Town narrowly escaped relegation from the old Division Two, the youth policy encouraged by manager Dally Duncan finally came to fruition leading to a top ten finish in 1951/52 and a run through to the quarter-finals of the FA Cup.

To harness the youth and vigour in the side, the signing of Jesse Pye from Wolves in the summer of 1952 was a masterstroke. Pye, still only 32, was far from over the hill and proved a revelation with his silky skills for such a big man as well as his experience and goalscoring abilities.

An England international and the scorer of a goal every other game at Molineux, Pye also had the ability to teach. He took young Gordon Turner, who was to eventually end up as the

Town's record goalscorer, under his wing and taught him the tricks of the trade, much as Bob Hatton would do with Brian Stein a quarter of a century later.

Goals flowed during the 1952/53 campaign, particularly at Kenilworth Road, and in one five-game spell in autumn 1952, the Hatters racked up 23 goals including a 6-0 mauling of Blackburn with Pye netting a hat trick.

For the visit of Rovers, a crowd of 16,276 gathered on a gloomy November afternoon to see a hard-fought first half

with nothing much between the teams as the Town failed to click into gear.

A goal ahead at the break, courtesy of a 40th minute effort from Roy Davies, supporters were perhaps thinking that the recent goal-fests were behind them, and when George McLuckie hit the angle of post and crossbar early in the second half for the visitors, a narrow win would have been grasped with both hands.

Suddenly, the Hatters shook themselves out of their torpor and went goal crazy, again orchestrated by Pye. It took 11 minutes into the second half before the big striker smacked the ball into the net from a Charlie Watkins pass, and from then on he was unstoppable.

Shortly after scoring, Pye was brought down by Rovers defender John Campbell in the area leaving the deadly Bert Mitchell to score from the spot and make the game safe.

The Town had now built up a head of steam and went looking for more goals. Sympathy must be given to 17-year-old Blackburn defender Alan Bean, making his debut, as he was given the complete runaround by the experienced Pye who completely controlled the game.

Five minutes after the penalty, Bernard Moore added a fourth before Pye cut

through the now demoralised Blackburn defence with two brilliant individual runs to net goals five and six, and with it his first hat-trick for the Town.

A shiver probably went through the whole town of Blackburn when the draw was made for the Third Round of the FA Cup that season with a trip back to Kenilworth Road about the last place they would wish to visit.

Snow in Luton in the week prior to the cup-tie had melted, leaving the Kenilworth Road pitch a muddy morass. But that did not bother the crowd of 21,034, which included a fair number from Lancashire who had travelled through the night to be there, who looked forward to a typical 'blood and thunder' clash.

With Bert Mitchell suffering from an ankle injury, young Irishman Arthur Taylor was drafted into the forward line for his debut, but even he could not have dreamed of the incredible start to his Luton career.

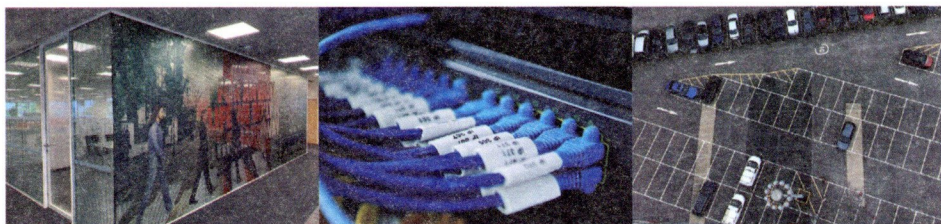
In the first minute Pye went on a run into the heart of the Blackburn defence. The ball ran loose to Bernard Moore who crossed to the unmarked Taylor to slam the ball high into the net past Blackburn goalkeeper Reg Elvey. After waiting 18 months for his chance since signing from Glentoran, Taylor had scored with his first touch of the ball!

Before Rovers had recovered from this shock, Elvey was picking the ball out of the net again when Pye cleverly steered it into the far corner with his left foot after five minutes.

The Town were three up after 17 minutes when Pye set up Taylor, who rammed the ball home from an acute angle and it seemed as if a cricket score was on the cards.

Credit to Blackburn though, as they refused to buckle and

pulled a goal back through McLuckie on 23 minutes after Luton goalkeeper Ron Baynham had failed to cut out a cross from the right.

Sensing that the game was not yet over, Blackburn threw everything at the Town's defence and only a goal-line clearance from Les Jones prevented the match from being turned on its head.

Blackburn continued to turn on the pressure in the second half but the Luton defence, with skipper Syd Owen outstanding, held firm. Gradually

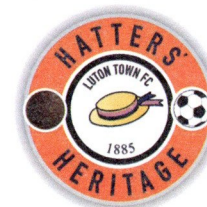
Blackburn hopes began to fade and, with 15 minutes to go, another clever through pass from Pye was snapped up by Moore, who made the score 4-1.

Two minutes later Pye scored the goal of the game when he picked up the ball just inside the Blackburn half and ploughed through the mud, leaving everyone in his wake before slamming it past the helpless Elvey.

With six minutes to go Pye completed his second hat-trick against Rovers that season with another solo effort. Although the final scoreline of 6-1 was a little flattering, the Luton supporters certainly did not care!

The Hatters finally bowed out of the competition to eventual finalists Bolton in the 5th Round.

Claire is a 42-year-old mother of three who was born and grew up in Luton. Her family are avid Luton Town Supporters and her dad, Nigel Young, was a season ticket holder for 22 years. Sadly, Nigel passed away in 2008 from cancer.

In December 2021 Claire received the devastating news that she had breast cancer. In February 2022 she had a double mastectomy and then started a six-month course of Chemotherapy in March 2022.

Her next step for treatment would usually be radiotherapy, but unfortunately due to a rare gene mutation and a chest condition called Pectus Excavatum, this is not possible and could cause further complications.

Instead, Claire needs a treatment called Proton Beam Therapy, which is not available in the UK for Breast Cancer. Claire is currently in India receiving this treatment and her friends and family continue their fundraising efforts to help pay for this.

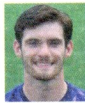

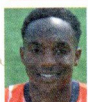

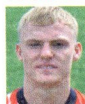

ACADEMY UPDATE

Good afternoon all and welcome to Kenilworth Road for this Championship fixture against Blackburn Rovers.

With the sad passing of Queen Elizabeth II last week, all Academy fixtures were cancelled and therefore there is no update with regards to games. I thought I would instead talk about the Academy system and how it works, as there are many people who don't fully understand the pathway players follow to get from the Academy through to the first team.

The youngest age boys can sign for the Academy is during their Under-9s season, when the selected boys leave their grass-roots clubs and join the Academy programme. These selected boys then train with our staff at The Brache for three nights per week and then compete in fixtures either on Saturdays or Sundays.

As a Category 3 Academy, our games programme pits us against other Category 3 Clubs such as Southend, Bournemouth, Northampton and Portsmouth. As well as these inter category fixtures, we also arrange friendly fixtures against Clubs with Category 1 and 2 Academies such as Tottenham, Chelsea, Arsenal and West Ham, where our boys are given the opportunity to test themselves against some of the top Academies in the country. Our boys always hold their own in these fixtures which shows what a strong group of players we have.

As per the rules of the Elite Player Performance Plan (EPPP), the boys in the younger age groups all sign one-year contracts with the Academy, and at the end of the season,

a decision is made whether to retain or release them. This changes when the boys get older as the 13-14 and 15-16 age groups come with a two-year contract, which is in place to support the boys during periods of change away from football i.e. moving into secondary school and during GCSE years.

Halfway through the boys' Under-16 year, a decision is made to offer them an apprenticeship with the Club or not. Those boys who are successful in gaining a scholarship then join us for two further years on a full-time basis at the end of their GCSEs, where their ultimate goal is to gain a professional contract.

Those boys who are not successful are supported by the Academy staff to try and find a new Club, or to move into whichever academic pathway they choose.

Hopefully that has given you a brief insight into how the Academy is set up and how we are trying to support those boys who have the dream of becoming the next James Justin.

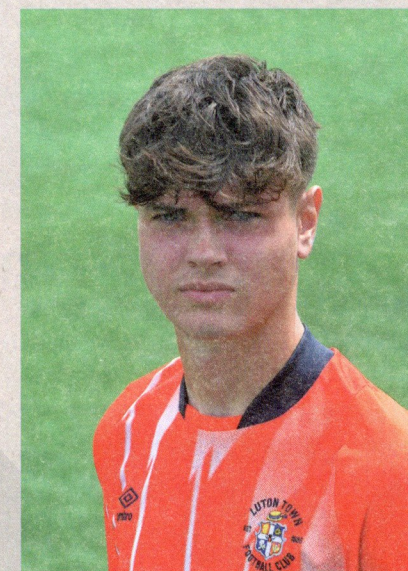

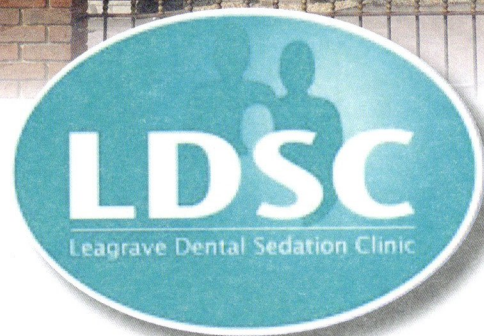

Fit Hatters is a FREE health programme supported by the EFL Trust and Sport England for men and women aged 35-65 who are looking to lose weight, get fitter and lead a more active life. The 12 week programme is delivered by coaching staff from the Community Trust and is based at the stadium. It brings together Hatters fans just like you, who want to lose weight, learn about healthy eating and who are beginning to think about taking part in an exercise programme to get fit. Each week the programme comprises 45 minutes in the Eric Morecambe 'classroom' and 45 minutes of activity sessions pitch side under the famous Kenny lights. In August we completed another successful cohort of the programme, with some staggering results across the board. Many of our participants commented on how they got just as much out of the social side of the programme, as well as picking up some great ways of making lifestyle changes that will make a real difference in the long term.

I learned ways to make small changes to my diet and exercise through the Fit Hatters programme. I would encourage anyone to sign up for what has been a life saver for me. I was not in a good place but now am now fitter, healthier and happier than I have been for a long time."
