## **Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for another huge Championship match under the lights against Huddersfield Town.**

There is a sense of anticipation for this one since we were edged out in the play-offs by them just a few months ago, although we and anyone who watched both legs of that semi-final know that there was absolutely nothing between the sides.

Huddersfield have had a difficult start to the season but we know they will provide as stern a test as ever, especially following the appointment of their new manager Mark Fotheringham, who I welcome to Bedfordshire along with his staff, their players and everyone who has travelled.

It goes without saying that we are in a real good place having put back-to-back wins together for the first time this season, recording a third successive away success at Hull on Friday night.

I was so pleased with the way we played here against Blackburn in our last home game, when I thought we were excellent, especially in the second half.

We carried that on with a terrific, front-footed aggressive first half display up at Hull, which is never an easy place to go, especially coming off the back of the international break when players being away and a couple of late injuries meant we couldn't prepare as fully as we'd have liked.

To give you an indication, Amari'i Bell played against Argentina in New Jersey in the early hours of Wednesday morning, touched down at Heathrow early on Thursday morning and was in at The Brache to jump on the coach by lunchtime for the journey north before playing the full 90 minutes!

Hull parting company with their manager on the morning of the game could have worked against us as well, but the players and staff were meticulous in the way we went about simply being Luton Town and looking after ourselves.

Of course, Henri Lansbury's goal and celebration takes the headlines, but I was equally delighted for Elijah because although that first goal went down as an own goal, make no mistake, it was one honed on the training ground with Alan Sheehan working tirelessly with Eli to get into that position.

Finally, I'd like to congratulate Dan Potts on what will be his 200th appearance for the club if he plays tonight. There are two players remaining who were here when I arrived at the club. It was great to see the longest servant, Pelly, make his return from injury on Friday night, as we've missed him.

The other, Pottsy was halfway through his first season as a League Two left-back, but sidelined by injury in January 2016. He has worked hard on his game, his fitness and physicality to develop into a fine left-sided centre-half in the Championship, and a real leader too.

That is what we do here. We have an environment in which players are encouraged to learn and grow, and they will have tough nights. But with ours and your support, they come through to keep helping this club progress, and I'm proud of players like Pottsy and Pelly.

Give them your full backing again tonight, as you did so passionately on a wet, wonderful Friday night in Hull, and let's make it three in a row.

## FROM THE BOARDROOM

### DAVID WILKINSON

Chairman



**Good evening everyone and welcome back to Kenilworth Road after another break. In my view these continual breaks are a major irritation and must affect results for no other reason than they interrupt momentum, and we all know how important that is.**

On the other hand, it did give a couple of our players the experience of international football, albeit some had to go halfway around the world to get it. It was good to see Amari'i up against Lionel Messi and some of the best players in the world in the Argentina team and play so well.

Our opponents today are Huddersfield Town, with whom we are quite familiar after some interesting meetings over the last few seasons. We particularly remember the play-off semi-final at their place last season and the unpleasant ending, which as I've commented before, meant we were unable to get closure for what was a wonderful season. Our players, management and fans were left in limbo, being unable to celebrate an incredible year.

Pitch invasions were a worrying trend at the end of last season and apart from the one at Huddersfield, we had to tolerate equally annoying trouble at Fulham and saw shocking events unfold at Forest in the other play-off semi. I note that some punishments have been handed out, but I'll make no comment about whether they are likely to prevent further trouble. From my perspective there was a lack of effective stewarding in all those cases, and maybe proper training would be more effective than relatively modest fines.

It is encouraging that after a slow start we have picked up ten points from the last five games, and our first home win. We were nervous at the prospect of three games in the west over a two-week period, but picked up two great results in Wales.

Gary, Stephen, Paul Watson and I travelled together to Hull

on Tuesday and saw a very professional performance and an amazing goal against a recently managerless team. It was the sort of game that is often a banana skin; no manager, playing for futures and all that.

Something you never heard when I was young: "You've got to be able to play well without the ball". We seem to be good at it, which shows how meaningless possession stats can be. Little possession but high XG – fascinating. The game is so much more tactical these days, which gives an opportunity for lesser mortals with that nous to compete against bigger budgets.

Having been forced onto Teams and Zoom due to Covid, the EFL are back to meeting face to face – the first being at Walsall on Thursday last. Online meetings are great for presentations, but leave a lot to be desired when it comes to networking and getting a feel of opinion, so it's good that physical connection is back.

One of the most important topics at present is the promised White Paper based on Tracey Crouch's Fan-Led review. Most people in football agree that the current state of affairs is not sustainable and that below the Premier League, finances are a mess. Of course, Covid made it worse, but it was bad before that. It is vital for the industry that changes are made.





There seems to be acceptance from both sides of the political spectrum that there needs to be some independent governance to protect clubs for the benefit of the communities they support.

Fans are so often the last consideration of new and particularly foreign owners and they, who are the lifeblood of the game, must be given greater consideration. However, having said this, in the current political climate there must be a risk that it slips through the cracks and down the agenda. We all need to do all we can to make sure this doesn't happen.

There is a lot more confidence in the senior management at the EFL and we are fortunate to have Rick Parry and Trevor Birch pushing this agenda, particularly with their knowledge and experience of the Premier League.

Not everyone agrees that change is needed, and I note Karen Brady's comments reported at the weekend. All that I would say is that we are where we are with the current structure, so it needs to be better or different.

The inequalities in the Championship caused by parachute payments are a fact and are a major proportion of funds provided to that division. This is why relegated clubs are nearly always favourites to be re-promoted.

The encouraging thing is that there seems to be a consensus within the lower echelons of football at the moment and people prepared to use their influence to make things better.

## HENRI LANSBURY

**“Normally they end up in row Z, but I caught that one sweet and it ended up in the bottom corner.”**

An ever-modest assessment from midfielder Henri Lansbury who ended his four-year streak without a goal with a sensational strike in the 2-0 win against Hull City!

After finding the bottom corner from 30 yards out, Lansbury retrieved the ball and set about pretending to mow the grass at the MKM Stadium, which by now supporters are well aware is his favourite hobby away from football.

“I have been working on it for a while (the celebration), just haven’t had the chance to score,” said the 31-year-old. “I thought I better do it because it could not happen again!”

“It was just one of those things, it falls nice and you have to hit it, luckily I caught it sweet and it went in.

Best goal of his career? The midfielder responded: “No, no, no, I’ve scored better than that! It’s up there, it was a nice strike and hopefully there is more to come this season.

“I have been scoring a few in training but I don’t normally get that far forward in games, I usually pride myself on clean sheets these days, so it was nice to get on the scoresheet.”

As well as seeing his name on the scoresheet, Lansbury had a big hand in the opener but he passed the credit to first team coach Alan Sheehan, who has been working relentlessly with the players on set-pieces.

“He has been unbelievable with us. He’s taken so much time out and he’s got us going and tonight it has paid off.”


It was yet another tenacious display from the midfielder who has now featured in back-to-back wins and clean sheets, but the former Arsenal man revealed just how challenging his role in the team can be at times.



“It is tough because I hear from the lads behind ‘left, right, left, right’, then Clicker runs off so I have to go and track his man. I said to him I’m going to stand with the referee in the centre circle next week! The boys did good, we’re looking well so we have to keep pushing in the right direction.

“Pelly is back now, and I like to see him doing well, I like to see the team doing well. If I’m in the team or out the team, as long as the team is doing well, that is all that matters.”

ELEANOR HAIGH. 1995-2022



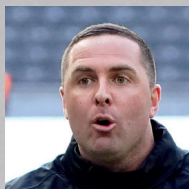
We would like to dedicate our coverage of tonight's visitors to Eleanor Haigh, a hugely talented member of the Huddersfield Town media team who sadly passed away last month at the age of 26. Eleanor was so helpful and friendly on our trips to the John Smith's Stadium, as well as when visiting here, and our thoughts are with her family, friends and colleagues at what has been such a sad time for all.

Last season Eleanor was a highly valued and much-loved part of a club that reached a Wembley play-off final after defying the odds throughout the campaign, not to mention a Hatters onslaught in the two-legged semi-final, before eventually falling to Nottingham Forest at the final hurdle.

A Premier League club as recently as 2018-19, the Terriers came as close as possible to a return to the top-flight but were hit by the departure of head coach Carlos Corberan in the summer. Electing to promote from within, the West Yorkshire side installed former player and academy coach Danny Schofield, but his reign lasted just 69 days with Town winning just one of their opening eight league games.

Coaches Narcis Pelach and Paul Harsley oversaw victory against Cardiff to give Huddersfield seven points from nine, with new boss Mark Fotheringham appointed ahead of the weekend's game at Reading, where a 3-1 defeat left the Terriers 23rd in the Championship ahead of tonight's game, three points off safety.





## MARK FOTHERINGHAM

**MANAGER** | Scottish head coach Fotheringham was appointed by the Terriers last week, replacing Danny Schofield. The 38-year-old made over 200 appearances in a playing career that lasted more than 15 years, which include stints at Norwich City and at clubs in Scotland and mainland Europe. Fotheringham began his coaching career at Cowdenbeath before working in Germany, where he is highly regarded after notable spells at Hertha Berlin and FC Ingolstadt 04.

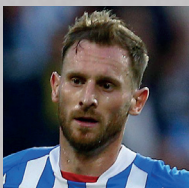


## LEE NICHOLLS

**GK** | Last season's Championship Goalkeeper of the Year Nicholls graduated from Wigan Athletic's academy and had multiple loan spells in the Football League before signing for Milton Keynes in 2016. After a quiet first season, he began to start regularly and heavily contributed to their League Two promotion. The 29-year-old joined the Terriers in May 2021 and made 19 clean sheets as Huddersfield reached the play-off final.

## TOM LEES

**DEF** | Experienced centre-half Lees has made over 400 Championship appearances since he graduated from the Leeds United academy in January 2009. The 31-year-old had loan spells at Accrington Stanley and Bury before appearing 135 times for Leeds. Lees then moved across Yorkshire to Sheffield Wednesday in 2014, where he played 274 times across seven seasons. Huddersfield Town signed Lees last summer and he made 38 appearances in the 2021-22 season.

## SORBA THOMAS

ONE TO WATCH | Winger Thomas began his academy career at West Ham United before dropping down to Non-League side Boreham Wood at 16. The Welsh international made his National League debut in September 2017 and reached the National League play-offs twice across three years. Thomas signed for the Terriers in January 2021 and made 51 appearances last season, which earned the 23-year-old his first call-up to the Wales squad in October 2021.



# FIELD TOWN OCUS



## JACK RUDONI

MID | The 21-year-old midfielder joined Huddersfield from AFC Wimbledon earlier this summer after standing out for the Dons in League One. Rudoni has been deployed anywhere across the midfield throughout his career, and has played in the middle and on the left since his arrival at the John Smith's Stadium. The youngster graduated from Wimbledon's academy in March 2019 and made over 100 appearances for the Dons.

## JORDAN RHODES

ATT | Vastly experienced striker Rhodes began his professional career at Ipswich Town before going on to score over 220 goals and earn 14 caps for Scotland. The 32-year-old has been promoted four times, including top two Championship finishes with Middlesbrough and Norwich City. Rhodes scored 36 League One goals in Huddersfield's promotion campaign in 2011-12 and returned to the John Smith's Stadium after suffering relegation with Sheffield Wednesday in 2021.

**Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, as club historian ROGER WASH looks back at Willie Davie's first and last appearances for the Town.**

Born in Paisley in 1925, Willie first came to prominence with St Mirren where he attracted scouts from many big clubs, but Luton manager Dally Duncan won the day. A cheque for £7,500, plus Tom Kiernan, brought the clever inside-forward to Kenilworth Road in December 1950, where his goals and 'assists' kept the club in Division Two in the miserable 1950/51 season.

When panicking Huddersfield put in a £23,000 bid for the player in December 1951, a record for both clubs, it was too good to turn down and although Willie could not prevent the Terriers from suffering relegation from the top flight, they bounced back at the first attempt.

After five years at Huddersfield, Willie played for Walsall and Bath City before returning to Yorkshire, where he worked in local hospitals before his death in 1996.

### **FIRST GAME: BRENTFORD 1 LUTON TOWN 0 (16/12/50)**

With only three wins from 20 games, the Town were struggling at the wrong end of the Division Two (now Championship) table.

At a muddy Griffin Park the Hatters enjoyed the majority of the play but could not turn their superiority into goals despite the promptings of new signing Willie Davie. Instead a goal from Bees' Ken Coote 16 minutes from time, against the run of play, settled the contest and summed up the Town's season so far.

### **LAST GAME: LUTON TOWN 2 BIRMINGHAM 4 (08/12/51)**

The ship had been steadied and the Town were in an altogether better position mid-way through the 1951-52 campaign.

The Hatters had yet to beat Birmingham in a League game, with the Blues fast becoming a bogey side. The Town had equalised Birmingham's opener through George Stobbart when skipper and centre-half Syd Owen came out worst in a clash of heads with Blues forward Tommy Briggs.

Suffering from concussion, Owen could do nothing to prevent Birmingham's second goal just before the interval, and missed the whole of the second period in the days before substitutes. Ten-man Town performed heroically and often looked likely to pull the game back, but it wasn't to be.

# GRAHAM FRENCH

**Luton legend John Moore has been heard to say that if you were to combine his endeavour with the genius of Graham French, then a perfect footballer would have been produced to compare to the best in the world.**

That the tale of French is one of a wasted talent is undeniable, but on his day he was unstoppable and truly got the 'bums off seats' of those who were privileged to see him play.

Born in Wolverhampton in April 1945, French starred as a schoolboy footballer and, on leaving school, had the choice of all the Midlands clubs but perversely chose Huddersfield where he stayed eight months, turning out for their youth team, before leaving with a 'bad back'.

French next turned up at Shrewsbury where he demanded a trial, which was granted and led to him making 25 appearances for the Shrews as a 16 year old, playing mainly on the left wing. Such were his talents that he was picked for the England Youth team in the 'Little World Cup', which was won and where he was the stand-out performer playing alongside future Hatters Ray Whittaker and David Pleat.

A £12,000 move to Swindon of Division Two (now the Championship) followed in August 1963, but not before Graham turned down Chelsea! Returning from the Canary Islands after a holiday paid for by the FA as a reward for winning the World Youth Cup, he was approached at Heathrow by Chelsea manager Tommy Docherty, who wanted to sign him.

French said that he needed time to think about it with Docherty taken aback at this stance, thinking that you should immediately want to sign for a big club like Chelsea. Docherty walked away never to be seen again and the big chance was gone, although stories have circulated that

French was rude to the Doc at their brief meeting!

After a year at Swindon, French was 'fed up' and even though his weight had ballooned to 14 stone 7lb, he was taken on by Bill McGarry at Watford for £1,250. Training hard and winning a place in the Watford first team he seemed settled, but when McGarry left the club so did French, who had his contract cancelled and went on to sign for Wellington in the Southern League.

At the Bucks Head, French became a crowd favourite who was indulged by the management when turning up late for training or for matches, as they knew he could win games on his own. Scouts began to take notice again, but it was the Town who won the day when their £5,000 offer was accepted in November 1965.

Supporters knew little about him but they were soon to herald a new hero. A big man with deceptive pace and the ability to play on either wing, he could beat full-backs at will and put in telling crosses as well as score his share of goals.

Anyone lucky enough to be present at Kenilworth Road on 18th September 1968 will have witnessed his 'Goal of the Century'. Picking up the ball at the edge



of his own penalty area, French loped down the middle beating several players in a mazy run before slipping the ball under Dave Hollins in the Mansfield goal. No footage exists but if it did, the goal would still be shown today.

French always had a problem with his weight and regularly returned from the close season needing to lose many pounds. Tales about his punctuality, keeping his greyhounds in the gym whilst training and a general love of the 'party life' swirled around the town, but so long as he was performing on the pitch indiscretions were overlooked. It is a good job that social media was not around then!

There is no doubt that French got in with the wrong crowd, which would eventually lead to his downfall. With the Town winning promotion to Division Two (now the Championship) in 1970, all seemed set fair for Graham to parade his undoubted

skills at a higher level, but a bombshell was dropped in early August 1970 when he was arrested following a shooting incident at a local pub.

He was immediately suspended by the club to throw manager Alec Stock's plans into disarray, and life had to go on without him until after the trial which was held over five days at Nottingham Assizes at the end of November.

Fortunately, the local Evening Post had a reporter attending the trial who gave a blow by blow account of the proceedings and the sheer stupidity of a footballer who was at the prime of his career.

French was badly beaten up in the car park of Cesars Palace in the early hours of Sunday 26th July, and afterwards set out to get his revenge. Five days later, with two others, he hijacked the car of one of the assailants in Skimpot Lane and put him in hospital – the use of a knuckleduster was mentioned and French had a revolver with him 'for insurance'.

Not content with this, French recruited three others and the six of them set off in two cars to the Unicorn pub to exact more revenge. The people they were looking for were not there, but they got involved in an altercation with a person of 'not the highest reputation' who ended up being shot in the shoulder by French at close range with another revolver supplied by one of his 'friends'.

All six, which included two part-time bouncers, bundled into one of the cars and drove away (slowly I would guess) with French waving the gun out of the window. All six were arrested the following day.

French maintained he had been robbed at Cesars Palace during the original altercation and was not seeking revenge, but merely to get his property back. The gun was 'for show' and went off accidentally.

The prosecution proved, via a ballistics expert, that the gun could not have gone off accidentally and that everything French did was pre-meditated. French was sentenced to three years in Stafford prison with the club immediately sacking him.

French served 20 months of his sentence and was released on parole in September 1972. He was immediately welcomed back to Kenilworth Road, where he needed to prove himself once more.

Prison deprivations meant that it was some time before he was ready for first team football, which eventually came in December 1972 in a home game against Millwall – and what a second debut!

Latching on to a long clearance from goalkeeper Keith Barber he raced

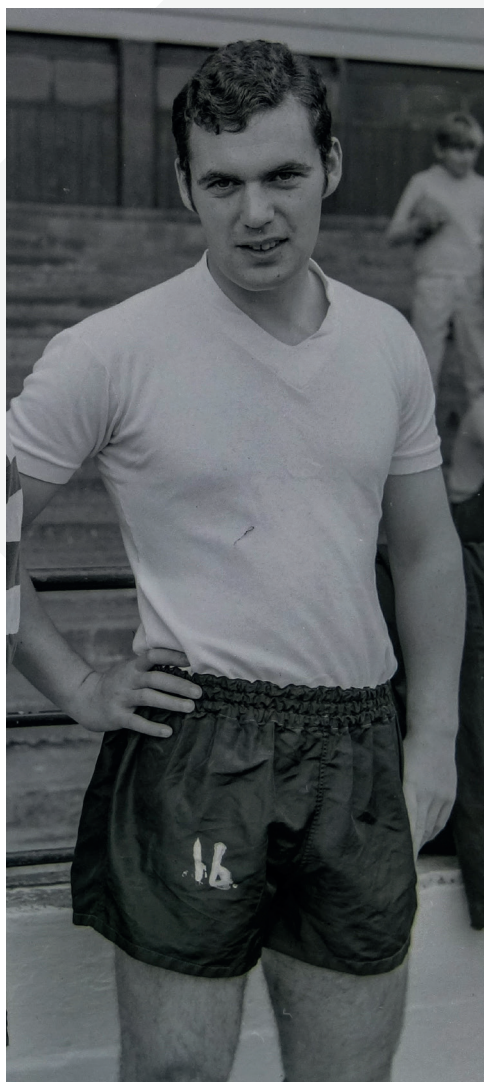
through the Lions defence before sending a fierce shot past Bryan King and lifted the roof off. This goal was the Town's second in an eventual 2-2 draw.

Sadly he was not the same player and after a further seven appearances and a short loan spell at Reading, he was released before suddenly turning up at Southport in April 1976 and playing two games for his old manager Allan Brown under the assumed name of Lafite (a play on words).

After that there were rumours of him heading for South Africa and the USA but the 'Poor man's George Best', as he is regularly dubbed, is now known to be back in the Midlands where, despite several attempts to make contact, he does not want to know. Partially understandable but he would certainly sell-out a Hatters' Heritage 'Meet the Player' evening.

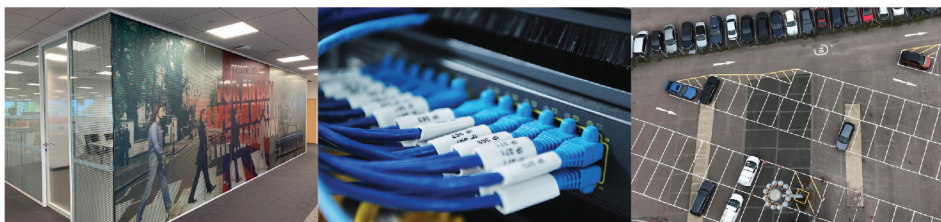

Best memory during his 50 Luton matches? The 24-year-old has one in particular.

"The moment we got into the play-offs. You work hard all season with ups and downs, the chances you get, we could have clinched it before that but then that last game, the emotion, how hard you work, the staff and the fans. The whole build-up to that game was brilliant, that was probably one of the games I will always remember."

Fully established as a fans' favourite, Campbell has a song to go with his rising popularity to the tune of Whigfield's Saturday night, which the midfielder enjoys hearing whilst on the pitch.

It wasn't until the 81st minute that the deadlock was broken. Maddix collected the ball in the opposition's half and charged down the pitch. Holding off the defenders, she held the ball up in the box, cut right and sold the keeper, blasting her shot in to the net.

The ladies almost doubled their lead at the death when McKay shot just over the crossbar, but Maddix's goal was enough to leave the Hatters five points clear of second-placed Haringey Borough going into their trip to Wodson in the FA Cup on Sunday, which the Hatters won 7-0 with McKay netting a hat-trick, Sanders getting two, Lauren Low one and an OG to progress into round two.

## BLACK HISTORY MONTH

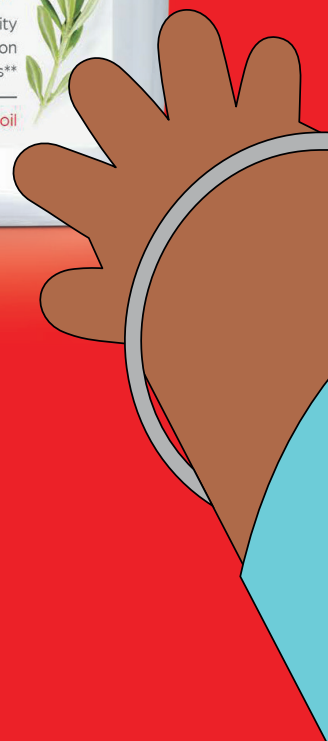
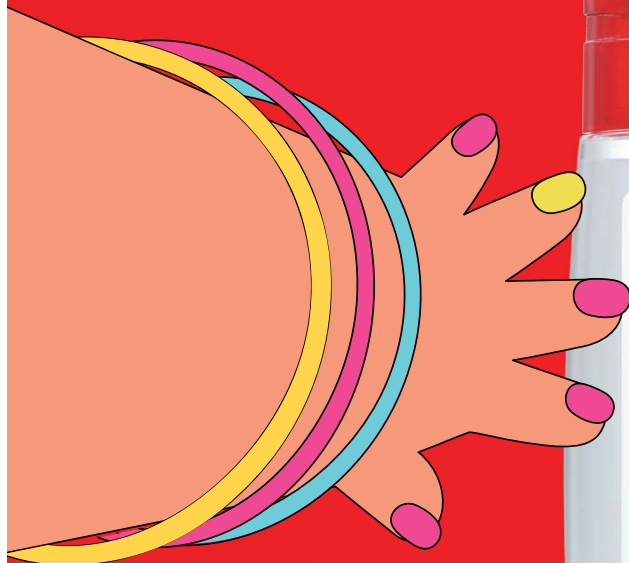

**Longevity is often a dirty word in football, particularly for managers, and it has proved so yet again this week.**

Having brought in Forest Green boss Rob Edwards during the summer and promised to 'support him come hell or high water', that lot up the road then pulled the trigger after just 10 games of the season on Monday afternoon, swiftly replacing him with former West Ham and Croatia manager Slaven Bilic.

With Luton heading to Vicarage Road next month, don't bet on the new man still being there, that game some 20 days away.

It wasn't just the Hornets who were clearing out the manager's office either, Hull City doing the same with their former Georgian international Shota Arveladze.

They went one further than those at Vicarage Road though, announcing his exit just hours before their 2-0 defeat against the Hatters on Friday night.

The merry-go-round at Watford in particular becomes even more laughable when you consider that since Nathan Jones returned to Kenilworth Road in May 2020, the Hornets have now tried their hand with eight managers, including former England boss Roy Hodgson.

The board's reasoning was that Edwards had enough time to show the identity of his team, but performances hadn't reflected their hopes and ambitions. However, was 10 games enough of the campaign to really judge him?

Some had been disappointed by Luton's start to the campaign, which started without a win in four games, but with 11 games having now been played, then, following that success on Friday night, they have won four out of seven, only losing once.

Prior to the City trip, Nathan Jones' side had exactly the same amount of points as they did last season too, and we all know how that went.

Signs are starting to look good as well, Carlton Morris in supreme form with six goals in seven games and showing exactly why Luton paid out a club record fee for him in the summer.

As for that longevity word, with Paul Warne enticed away from his role at Rotherham to head to Derby County, it means Jones is now the third longest serving manager in the second tier behind Mark Robins and Gary Rowett.

Looking at those currently employed by Championship teams shows just what a short shelf-life the job is, with only the three managers mentioned earlier having passed their two year anniversary.

A further three have done over a year, with six managers in the six to 12 months category, meaning unsurprisingly, the top mark of nine have done just under six months, that soon to become a dozen once new faces are in place at Cardiff, Rotherham and Hull.

Up against another newbie in Mark Fotheringham this evening, Jones has already spoken of his desire to become the longest serving manager in the league, and the way things are going, few would bet against it!
