Good afternoon and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the latest in this sequence of big matches in the Sky Bet Championship.

I want to start by dealing with last Sunday. I know the result will have hurt you all, as it did myself, the staff, players and everyone at the club this week. They still have to come here later in the season, of course, and we will put it right.

We do have to put it into context with what we had to deal with on the day, with the bug that took two starting players out of our line-up at the last minute, and also consider that it came at the end of what had been a wonderful week.

We would have taken six points from nine at the start of that three-game week. No question. I know that most people would have taken the six – or even fewer – in a different order, but the two magnificent wins we recorded will help take us to where we want to be.

Our performance against Queens Park Rangers was top drawer, convincingly beating a side who were joint top of the table at the time, and who then went clear last weekend until Burnley won in midweek.

The atmosphere here at Kenilworth Road was right up there with the best we've experienced in recent times, and then what followed on the Tuesday night at Norwich was outstanding.

To have almost 1,200 make the journey for a midweek game was amazing. We limited a very good team who are highly-fancied for an immediate return to the Premier League to a couple of chances, and scored a wonderful goal ourselves through Carlton Morris.

The spirit and relationship we have between the group and supporters was never more evident than that night, and again at Watford last Sunday when the singing before and during the game, and the ovation we received afterwards, was humbling.

As those who came to the open training session at Kenilworth Road on Tuesday saw first hand, the players have been working hard this week and are determined to get back to winning ways today.

Remember, we have collected more points (70 from 40 matches) than any other Championship club in the calendar year so far. We have lost just two of our last 12 matches and could go back up to fourth with a win.

We know how tough a task that will be, because Sunderland are a huge club with an excellent young team who have the momentum from winning promotion via the play-offs last season. I welcome Tony Mowbray, his staff, their players and everyone who has made the long journey south, and wish them a safe trip home afterwards.

I know this is my 300th game in charge of Luton Town and you won't find a manager more proud of their Club. I wish it was so many more. The backing myself and the team have received over that time has been incredible, so let's have some more this afternoon.

I have received many apologies from those involved in the game since Sunday, from Nathan down, and I – as the ultimate responsible officer – would like to apologise to you all for such an inept display.

Of course, we never want to make excuses after it was clear that we were the poorer team. But it's important, as we have done, we analyse the reasons, so we learn from mistakes or avoid the traps next time, wherever possible. Yes, it was that third game in a week scenario; yes, we had injuries, late illnesses and player even playing through sickness; yes, we could argue that the key events of the game didn't favour us. All factors that we need to consider, but the main factor was that we didn't perform on the day, for which there is no excuse.

I would also like to thank everyone who attended the game on Sunday who, by and large, represented the Club positively, in spite of the result. Putting aside a couple of minor incidents, the day went by relatively smoothly with your contribution and not necessarily due to the rather enthusiastic policing of the event.

What is important now, is that we bank the frustration and pain to act as a reminder at a later date. It is equally important that we returned to such a positive mindset ahead of today's tough encounter, which we can do by putting one disappointment into perspective.

Given the schedule we had in front of us a fortnight ago, we actually had an excellent week returning 6 points from three tough games. As Eric would probably have put it, we're getting all the right points, just not necessarily in the right order!

Tuesday's open training day, I believe, came at a very opportune time as around 500 supporters witnessed a lively session at Kenilworth Road in a surprisingly positive



Lastly, as usual, I'd like to reassure everyone that despite the economic and political chaos that ensues, we continue to crack on with Power Court. The lengthiest process of all is the preparation and UKPN will soon be on site to start their major works which will take over two years to complete (without necessarily completely constraining our progress on the stadium, I should add).

Alongside this we have groundworks and civils contractors on site now continuing with our final investigations and putting together the final plans for opening up the River Lea culvert.

Back to today, this is the first of five matches before we take a brief pause for the World Cup. So it goes without saying, and of course we know, that you will keep playing your part.

It's Nathan's 300th match in charge so, congratulations Gaffer – you've made us proud and long may it continue! Please give Nathan and the lads everything as you always do to make it a day to remember.

Good afternoon and welcome to everyone here today, including those who have travelled down from my hometown in support of Sunderland.

You'll understand that in this meeting of the two football loves of my life, my priority has to be three points for Luton Town, a football club that has given me so much since I first signed here as a player and whose supporters have made me one of their own.

In another life I'd have been sat, or stood more likely, in the Oak Road End this afternoon wearing red and white. In fact, in my mid-teens I stopped playing for a couple of years to follow the Lads all over the country, often hitch-hiking to matches.

I came to Kenilworth Road in 1984 and the four-decade rollercoaster ride began with the best set of supporters around. My son William was born in Luton so this town means so much to me, even though I do go home to Sunderland as often as I can to see my family, and I always try to tie it in with a visit to the Stadium of Light.

It was a dream to be able to play for Sunderland, which I did for a brief spell in 1993, but I had to return south. I was so grateful to the board at the time, and Terry Butcher, for allowing me to move to Coventry to be as close as I could be to William, who was only a toddler and had been injured in an accident.

I've watched Sunderland three times already this season and I always get a great reception whenever I'm there, as I did on the day I was privileged to be able to lead the Hatters there in 2019 when we last met.

That was in League One and a lot has happened since to both clubs, but Sunderland are in good hands with Tony Mowbray in charge. Tony is a very experienced manager

who will do well with the young squad he has there, as he did at Blackburn.

Here, I can only say that I was gutted when Nathan left in the build-up to that last Sunderland match, although I was honoured that Gary, David and the board entrusted me to take charge for what ultimately proved to be a successful campaign.

Equally, I was so glad to have played a part in helping to bring the Gaffer back during the Lockdown of 2020 – and I am thrilled for him to be celebrating 300 matches in charge of Luton Town today.

His record shows that he was the best man to keep us up in that restart, and from then he has led the team from strength to strength with the support of some brilliant staff here.

We know that last Sunday was disappointing and it hurt everyone, but the spirit, togetherness and camaraderie of the group will make sure we bounce back.

I was involved in the team meeting before the open training session at Kenilworth Road on Tuesday and it was very positive, so we are looking forward to put that one to bed, but never forget that we need to improve on the performance from that game. I'm certain that they will.

Thank you again to both clubs and both sets of fans. It's always a special atmosphere here at the Kenny, but today for me will be a little bit more so. Enjoy the game and Come On You Hatters!

Today it is good to see that our Club is again supporting the Stonewall Rainbow Laces Campaign to promote LGBTQ+ within the football community. Not only are supporting this campaign but we are also officially launching our very own LGBTQ+ Supporters Group - The Rainbow Hatters.

Being a Hatters Fan for my whole life, visiting from a young age with my dad and Grandad and a current Diamond Season Ticket Holder, who just happens to be Gay, it's a pleasure to be involved with the start up of the Rainbow Hatters, to increase the diversity and inclusion amongst all of us at Luton Town.

The purpose of launching the Rainbow Hatters is to provide a supporters' club for anyone within the LGBTQ+ community, their allies or anyone who is wishing to support the further development of diversity and inclusion within the football pyramid. All of these could be blockers, but we can all work together to try to eradicate the harassment and intimidation some have experienced.

It is worth noting that in a couple of weeks' time, we take our

break for the World Cup, held in Qatar, in which being a member of the LGBTQ+ community is illegal, and punishments are severe. This is something we all need to work with the EFL, FA and governments around the world to challenge and create equality for all without persecution.

I am proud that Luton Town are taking this to the next step and over the coming months we will look at what we can do within the club and group to help encourage more of the LGBTQ+ community to become mighty Hatters Fans!







THEIR TOWN

The visitors for today's game are Sunderland AFC, who currently sit 14th in the Sky Bet Championship table. Now managed by Tony Mowbray, who replaced the Stoke-bound Alex Neil in September, the Wearside club arrive off the back of a 4-2 defeat at the Stadium of Light against a strong Burnley side.

Founded in 1879, the Black Cats have had some major honours in their history. They have won the FA Cup twice, once in 1937 and again in 1973. They have also been champions of England six times, although the most recent of those successes in the old First Division was way back in 1936.

The Black Cats played at Roker Park for 101 years before moving to the 49,000-seater Stadium of Light in 1997. Sunderland have spent 16 years in the Premier League, dropping in and out of the top-flight regularly apart from one 10-year spell up to 2017, when were relegated to the Championship. This was a difficult time for their loyal fans, much of which was documented in the Netflix series, Sunderland 'Til I Die.

They dropped straight through the second tier in 2018, suffering back-to-back relegations. They then spent four gloomy seasons in the League One trap before getting promoted back to the Championship last term, which they achieved by winning the League One Play-Off final 2-0 at Wembley against Wycombe.

Sunderland are currently on a run of only one win in their last seven matches. Their top scorer is Ross Stewart, who had netted five goals in seven appearances but has not played since August due to injury. A former striker the clubs share is Mick Harford. The Sunderland supporter is a well-known figure at his hometown club, having played for them briefly in 1993, while his work here at Luton is the stuff of legend.



TONY MOWBRAY

MANAGER | Experienced manager Mowbray took over at the Stadium of Light in August this year following the departure of Alex Neil. After a playing career spanning over 500 matches with Middlesbrough, Celtic and Ipswich, he moved into management in 2004 with Hibernian. Mowbray returned to Scotland with Celtic in 2009 but has since remained in England, most recently a five-year stint with Blackburn Rovers prior to his move to Sunderland.



ANTHONY PATTERSON

GK | Young goalkeeper Patterson came through the ranks with Sunderland and made his competitive debut in 2020. After a brief loan spell with Notts County in September 2021, he was recalled in January due to an injury to number two Lee Burge. He would go on to establish himself as Sunderland's first-choice keeper, featuring in the successful play-off campaign as they defeated Wycombe Wanderers 2-0 at Wembley.

DANNY BATTH

DEF | Former Wolverhampton Wanderers defender Batth has played all-bar four minutes in the Championship so far this season. Batth, 32, started his football career at Wolves and, from first joining the academy at 10, he was at Molineux for almost 20 years prior to his move to Stoke in 2019. 107 appearances later, the English centre-back switched to Sunderland this summer and has played his part in five league clean-sheets so far this term.

AMAD DIALLO

ONE TO WATCH | Ivory Coast international Diallo arrived on loan from Manchester United this summer. The 20-year-old joined the Atalanta youth system in Italy and scored on his Serie A debut, the first player born in 2002 to do so. The Red Devils acted and snapped up the impressive youngster in 2021. He has since had loan spells at Rangers and now Sunderland, where he scored his first goal in English football last weekend.



SUNDERLAND FOCUS



PATRICK ROBERTS

MID | Tricky winger Roberts started his career at Fulham and was highly regarded upon his move to Manchester City in July 2015. He would make just a single appearance for the Citizens however, spending his time away from the Etihad with six successive loan spells, starting with Celtic and most recently with French club Troyes. The now 25-year-old agreed a permanent move to Sunderland this summer and has scored twice so far.



JACK CLARKE

ATT | Former England U20 international Clarke broke through the ranks with Leeds United and following his first professional season, joined Tottenham Hotspur on a permanent basis. Similar to Roberts, however, his time would be spent away from the first-team and out on respective loans, first straight back to Leeds, followed by QPR, Stoke and Sunderland last season, which then turned into a four-year-deal this summer.

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, as club historian ROGER WASH looks back at Billy Bingham's first and last appearances for the Town.

Born in Belfast, Billy started his football career with Glentoran where he began to attract scouts, including those of the Town, due to his skills as a right winger of pace and bravery, with the added ability of being more than an occasional goalscorer.

Billy decided to opt for top-flight Sunderland in October 1950 rather than Second Division Luton, but the Town eventually got their man in the summer of 1958 following the Weariders' relegation.

Top scoring in 1959-60 in an ageing side, Billy's goals were not enough to save the Town from relegation and although prepared to stay he was soon on his way to Everton in a cash and exchange deal which saw John Bramwell and Alec Ashworth coming the other way.

FIRST GAME. LUTON TOWN 1 WEST BROMWICH ALBION 1 (23/8/58)

The season opened with a home clash with West Brom at Kenilworth Road with the majority of the 24425 crowd wanting to see the new 'marquee' signing Billy Bingham.

He did not disappoint as he was everywhere trying to get his fellow forwards to think on the same wavelength. The Town took an early lead after Baggies defender Maurice Setters needlessly handled the ball with the ever-reliable Gordon Turner shooting home from the spot.

West Brom defended resolutely after that but the Town could not force the second goal. Instead it was future Hatter Derek Kevan who levelled 16 minutes from time to give the away side an undeserved point.

LAST GAME. STOKE CITY 3 LUTON TOWN 0 (1/10/60)

With four absences and eight changes to the side it was perhaps understandable that the Town would go down rather tamely to an efficient Stoke side who did not need to be at their best.

Debutant 16-year-old goalkeeper Mike O'Hara gifted Stoke the first and third goals, and while Billy Bingham forced some last ditch tackles and saves, it was a game to forget in his last outing.

HATTERS THE TOAST OF FLEET STREET

1955 was a good time to be a Luton Town supporter with the Hatters the talk of every pub and club in the land, and even keeping Manchester United and Wolves off the back pages.

After the Town won promotion to Division One (now the Premier League) for the first time at the end of the 1954-55 season, manager Dally Duncan proclaimed that he would not be making any summer signings and would instead rely on the players who had earned the prize. Luton supporters were not so sure!

They need not have worried, however, as the team made a steady start to the season, losing only one of its first five games and beating highly fancied Preston and Tottenham at Kenilworth Road along the way, as well as winning 1-0 at Everton.

The national press really began to sit up and take notice of this small club from Bedfordshire when FA Cup holders Newcastle were seen off at Kenilworth Road, closely followed by Stanley Matthews' Blackpool.


When Wolves were hammered 5-1 before a record Luton league crowd of 27,911, with England centre-half Billy Wright

given the runaround, the Town pushed up to ninth position in the table and the players were beginning to believe that a realistic tilt at the title was a distinct possibility.

The biggest test of these 'upstarts' was surely to come when the Division One leaders, Sunderland, came to Kenilworth Road on November 19th 1955 and another large crowd of 25,802, which included most of Fleet Street, gathered to see if the bubble would burst.

Sunderland, at that stage, had never been out of the top flight and boasted an expensive side which included Wales captain Ray Daniel, England's Len Shackleton and mercurial winger Billy Bingham, who was later to play for the Hatters. They had also achieved a run of six games without defeat.

Considering what was about to happen, the first half hour passed fairly gently

without a goal being scored, although it took a brilliant save from Town goalkeeper Ron Baynham to keep out a wicked shot from Shackleton.

The breakthrough came in the 31st minute when Sunderland 'keeper Willie Fraser pulled down Luton winger Mike Cullen from behind, and the ever reliable Gordon Turner scored from the spot.

This was to prove the turning point as, by the time the half-time whistle sounded, the Town were 4-0 up. Firstly Cullen, normally a goal provider rather than a scorer, hit home a 25-yard shot followed by close range efforts from Jim Adam and Bob Morton.

The Wearsiders had no answer to the rampant Luton forward line and their square defence was cut to ribbons as short through passes on the ground more often than not found their man and created danger.

The second period opened quietly before Daniel had a mad spell during which he failed to find his goalkeeper with a back pass, leaving Morton to nip in and then handled a corner giving Turner the chance to increase the lead even more from the spot.

Sunderland hit back with a goal from Ted Purdon, before Cullen netted from an acute angle, with Morton completing the Luton goal tally ten minutes from the end, running 40 yards before beating Fraser to complete his first hat-trick.

Purdon hit home a consolation in the final minute, following a rare lapse of concentration in the Luton defence, but that was soon forgotten as the players left the field to a standing ovation, 8-2 winners.

For a short time afterwards the Town were the most talked about team in the country, and the newspaper reports spoke about 'the most attractive team in the land' and 'the slaughter of Sunderland had to be seen to be believed', as well as 'never was there a humiliation like this.'

The opening day of the following campaign saw Sunderland the visitors to Kenilworth Road once more. Mindful of their thrashing the previous season, the so-called 'Bank of England'

side packed their defence and with the Town a little out of sorts, the first half was fairly even.

After taking the lead on 17 minutes when Cullen shot home a clever back-heel flick from Morton the Town were under some pressure and on another day three presentable opportunities for Shackleton would have been put away.

John Groves, deputising for the injured George Cummins, could not put a foot right in the first period but in the second half he stepped up several gears and controlled the game. Early in the second half Groves set off on a long run which ended with him setting up Turner. On the hour mark Turner was upended in the box and, deadly from the spot, put the Hatters three up.

Bingham pulled a goal back for the visitors shortly afterwards before Groves and Turner, the latter with a rocket shot

from the edge of the area, saw the Town move further in front. Despite a consolation from Purdon, the icing on the cake came with six minutes to go when Turner banged in his fourth goal of the game to set up a brilliant start to the season.

The story does not finish there, though. In the following season the two teams met at Kenilworth Road in February 1958. After a two minutes silence for those who perished in the Munich air disaster, the Town took an early lead when Groves headed home a George McLeod free-kick.

Allan Brown increased the scoreline on

28 minutes after accepting a chance from Turner. Not to be outdone, the Hatters' all-time record goalscorer put the Town 3-0 ahead shortly after the interval via a cross from Jimmy Adam.

Sunderland then enjoyed a brief bright spell when they pulled a goal back from Ambrose Fogarty, but normal service was soon resumed when Turner banged in two quick fire goals, both set up by Brown. Turner then boosted his tally to four for the second season running when netting in the 86th minute before Brown scored the Town's seventh with seconds to go.

Spare a thought for poor goalkeeper Willie Fraser who, apart from letting in eight in 1955/56, had conceded six the following season and seven in 1957/58. He did make one more appearance at Kenilworth Road, in the colours of Nottingham Forest shortly before the 1959 FA Cup final, and picked the ball out of the net five times! One for the record books?





PLAYER CARE OFFICER

I am the new Player Care Officer and have been in the role since September 2022. In this short but busy period of transition from my previous role as Premier League Kicks delivery lead at the Luton Town Community Trust, I have been made to feel at home and part of an already established but still growing team at the Academy.

The Player Care Officer is responsible for enhancing a player's journey through the Academy and for providing a programme that supports holistic development. My role is to always be on hand to support those experiences and ensure that players make the most of their time here. These age-appropriate experiences range from activities such as staying safe online, mental health and taking part in community projects.

The main roles and responsibilities are to develop and implement a Player Care programme for all players across the three phases of the Academy to provide the best possible care, support and development so they can maximise their potential both on and off the pitch. Player care has evolved over the recent years with more clubs investing in full-time positions, with the aim of supporting the duty of care to ensure the players' wellbeing is looked after.

Player Care involves the Player and Parent education and welfare support, through delivery of workshops and a life skills program - developing relationships with staff, players and parents helping to strengthen the bond between the club and the local community.

I never assume what's best in terms of player care or support for the player and their family. This is developed to the individual's needs and requirements through 1-2-1 mentoring sessions player and parent surveys and group workshops, while generating feedback to create the best possible program.

Ultimately it takes time to build up relationships and



familiarity with that individual to acknowledge what they may or may not need. Once you formalise that relationship, you're able to provide them with a level of support and care that they're more open to receiving. It's always tailored to the individual – it's nice to acknowledge each personal situation to work out how best to develop and support them.

A significant proportion of young people who enter Academy football will not have a professional football career and there is a need to help manage their expectations, support their holistic development and prepare them for potential release or indeed for the next part of their journey. Recognising the important role we play in a young person's development alongside the impact that Academy football and being released can have on their emotional health and wellbeing.

That is just a snap shot of my role and how we support the boys and families within our Academy here at Luton Town, and I will provide further updates on projects that we are involved in in the coming weeks.

ADULT HEALTH SESSIONS

One of the growing areas at Luton Town FC Community Trust, and something we're very proud of, is our work in the health sector. We have had enormous success with Fit Hatters; an EFL Trust funded 12 week programme that focuses on classroom based sessions educating participants around making healthy lifestyle choices, alongside a varied fitness regime taking place within the stadium at Kenilworth Road.

We have run multiple cohorts of Fit Hatters within the last couple of years and will soon be opening up our next male and female groups. Alongside Fit Hatters, we have a number of other health based sessions that are open to adults that we'd love you to attend. On Wednesday evenings between 6pm and 7pm we run a circuits session at Beech Hill School.

This is a mixed session allowing participants to build up their stamina and fitness through a number of stations focussing on endurance training, resistance training and high intensity aerobics. On Thursday evenings we run football sessions at Beech Hill School, offering participants the opportunity to improve their skills, boost their mental and physical health, whilst also taking part in small sided games.

These sessions are open to over 35s of all abilities, with a male session at 6pm and female session at 7pm. We also run a very popular session on Saturday mornings, Away Day

Hatters. Taking place at our Ely Way base in Leagrave, these sessions run on Saturday's where The Hatters are either playing away from home, or if there is no game at all. Away Day Hatters focuses on fitness, strength and conditioning and are open to all, regardless ability or fitness aims.

Health Lead for Luton Town FC Community Trust, Beth Drake, said: "We're very proud of our varied health programme. We ensure our programmes are accessible and open to as many people as possible. 

Today's encounter with Sunderland brings up the landmark 300th match for Nathan Jones as manager of Luton Town Football Club.

It all started with the 0-0 draw against Cambridge United on 16th January 2016 (the first of just 23 fixtures ending goalless!) and the record is now won 140, drawn 81 and lost 78, with 456 goals scored and 327 conceded.

Only David Pleat, 609 matches (over two spells) and Dally Duncan 514 matches have managed the Hatters for more competitive matches than Nathan.

His first spell in charge saw Nathan take charge of 139 League matches, with a win percentage of 51.1%, the highest of any permanent Luton manager and an average of 1.82 points per game, again the highest.

These League fixtures included promotion from League Two in 2017/18, and the start of ultimately back-to-back promotions in 2018/19 by winning League One, as well as the 3-1 League Cup win against Championship Aston Villa at Kenilworth Road, when Luton were in League Two.

The start of the 2017/18 campaign saw a record opening day victory when new signing James Collins scored a hat-trick on his debut as Yeovil Town were beaten 8-2, with 7-1 and 7-0 victories to follow against Stevenage and Cambridge United before December!

Following his return for the last nine matches of the 2019/20 season, Nathan oversaw four wins, four draws and just one defeat to complete the "Great escape" as the Hatters survived in the Championship with the final day win over Blackburn Rovers, who coincidentally haven't won in 22 League matches at Kenilworth Road, a run that was extended with a 2-0 victory for Luton last month.

The current second spell includes 117 League matches, of which the win ratio is 41% and 1.51 points per game, which is 6th overall for a permanent Luton manager's spell in charge.

Combining the two spells and you get a 46.5% win percentage and 1.68 points per game which would result in 77 points in a League season.

From these 256 League matches the most common scoreline is 1-1, occurring 39 times, with 32 occasions when the Hatters have won 1-0.

There have been 88 different opponents for the gaffer across the previous 299 matches, with Wycombe the most frequent opposition as the Hatters have played them 9 times, with six victories, two draws and just one defeat.

Of these opponents the best record is against Hull City, four matches and four victories, whilst Nathan is unbeaten against a total of 40 opponents, with six matches against Cambridge, Exeter and Yeovil the longest unbeaten run.

A total of 69 different players have been announced as signings, either on-loan or as a permanent signing, whilst Nathan Jones has been manager, starting with current first team coach Alan Sheehan, back in January 2016.

The last time Sunderland were here at Kenilworth Road was back in August 2018, when the sides drew 1-1 courtesy of a Matty Pearson equaliser, and there are still eight players at the Club who were in that matchday squad four years ago.
