

Good evening and welcome back to Kenilworth Road for the second time in four days for tonight's visit of Reading.

Reading made a very good start to the Championship season and although their results have been mixed of late, we have seen enough of them to know they are as tough an opponent as any in this league.

I know Paul Ince well having done our coaching qualifications together and, of course, through Tom, who I managed at both Stoke and here during his loan spell. There are few managers around with the playing pedigree that Paul has, and he's done an excellent job in difficult circumstances to initially keep Reading up, and really kick on this year.

I welcome Paul, his staff, Tom and his team-mates, and everyone who has made the relatively short journey from Berkshire tonight, and wish them a safe trip home after the game.

On Saturday we kicked off the sequence of five matches inside a fortnight leading into the World Cup break, and although we were obviously disappointed not to take all three points having been in front, I was delighted with the response to the previous weekend.

A point was a fair result in the end. In the first half I felt we were the better side and deservedly got the lead on the stroke of half-time through Carlton Morris, but in the second half Sunderland grew into it and got their goal, and we had to defend our box really well.

I felt we maybe lost a bit of control in the game when Henri Lansbury went off, because that natural defensive midfield player gives us that. We could have been a bit more clinical in that initial period when we were on top, but it was important that we showed we had bounced back because last week was hard to take.

It was my 300th game in charge on Saturday and when I think back over the course of that time, we've had so much to celebrate together, so many achievements and milestones reached, with players like Pelly, Potts, Glen and a few others here throughout.

Other clubs look on enviously at our numbers, loyalty and progress, so be proud, be loud and let's have another memorable night under the lights. Enjoy the game and COYH!





## PELLY-RUDDOCK MPANZU

**Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu reiterated his desire to put injury disappointment behind him in a bid to help the team as much as possible for the remainder of the campaign.**

The bubbly, confident midfielder faced another injury setback after his return from knee surgery was cut short, which meant Mpanzu was unavailable for the three previous league matches.

But in typical Pelly style, he was quickly back involved in the heart of the midfield battle against Sunderland, looking his energetic self - and he vows that he's ready whenever gaffer Nathan Jones needs him.

"If the manager needs me to start, I will be in a good frame of mind to say yes," said Pelly. "Whether it's 45 minutes, 60, 80 minutes, I'm sure my body is ready enough to handle that. It is the manager's choice to decide how many minutes you play."

"He has been great. He has put me in a position where I can play a lot of games. Unfortunately I got injured against Huddersfield, so that put me out, but I've been here throughout his whole time at the club."

"He has been a great manager, and he is one of the best managers in the league which is why he got the Manager of the Year award last season. He's putting in the work and he's put the club in a great position."

## SUNDERLAND REACTION

It has been a long road to recovery for the 28-year-old, made worse by the recent set-back, but he thanked the club staff for their support during his operation and rehabilitation process.

"Injuries are part and parcel of the game so hopefully I'm doing everything right. It was a muscle injury, but hopefully I'm back fully fit and I can push on and contribute towards the season."

"It was my first operation so I wanted to take it slow, wanted to make sure all the muscles around my knee are all okay and that I'm fighting fit, so I've taken a bit longer than usual but hopefully now I can have a run of games."

"The support from the staff throughout my rehab has been great to be honest. Si (Simon Parsell), Chris (Phillips), Daz (Darren Cook) and the S&C boys have been working very hard with me, so hats off to them for putting me back in a position where I can play week-in, week-out in the Championship. Hopefully I can push the team on."

Continuing, Mpanzu added: "The more games you play, the more comfortable you feel. The more games I can play, the more I can get into the rhythm of the game and hopefully put in performances that will justify me starting, not coming off the bench."

"The league is so tight, one win can push you up four or five places, so we have to keep our heads down, our heads strong and keep trying to put in performances and get points on the board."

After feeling as if the Hatters dropped two points at home to Sunderland, the former West Ham man is looking to help put Town's home record back on the track for tonight's visit of Paul Ince's Reading.

"We felt like we dropped two points but you never know, that point may prove very, very strong at the end of the season. As long as we're not losing games, a point is a point, but today we felt like we dropped two considering how well we defended up until the goal and we had a lot more chances to put the game to bed."


"We have to try and put this game (Sunderland) behind us. Hopefully we can pick up another three points, and then go away to Blackpool which is a tough game, so hopefully we will have a good week."

"We know at home we're a really good side, so us not winning at home is frustrating, but we have to dust ourselves down."

"The games are coming thick and fast before the World Cup. We've got four more games – Saturday, Tuesday, Saturday, Tuesday – so we're going to have to use the squad. I know we have a good squad here so hopefully everyone gets used and we get as many points as we can before the break."

With Carlton Morris now the joint-second highest goalscorer in the division, Pelly is counting on him and the other attackers to ensure the team go into the World Cup break with as many points as possible.

"We have three, four, five fantastic strikers all chipping in. Whoever scores, whether it's Carlton, Eli, Cornick, Cameron Jerome, Cauley Woodrow is unfortunately injured right now, but we have top strikers in this club and in the league. Whoever scores, we have to get round them and hopefully they are going to fire us towards the play-offs, and at the end of the season we will see where we finish."



## INTERVIEW: ALFIE DOUGHTY

**Alfie Doughty is looking to put injury woes behind him and show the Luton Town faithful what he is capable of.**

After getting a glimpse of the 22-year-old in pre-season and following two three starts in a Luton shirt in the Sky Bet Championship, Doughty wants to make a real impact on the team going forward.

## THE GROUP IS QUALITY. THERE IS A REAL TOGETHERNESS

"It has been a bit of a frustrating start," the former Stoke City admitted during his interview with the local press before Saturday's game against Sunderland. "Pre-season was going so well and then two days before the start of the season, I pull up with a hamstring injury. You can't help it but I'm back now and I'm very happy.

"I did have six weeks of pre-season with the boys and it did help. It's probably more to do with the fans, they watched a bit of me, but it wasn't anywhere near what I can actually produce."

Suffering a recurring hamstring injury was far from ideal for the pacey winger, who had impressed in his early matches upon joining the club this summer. But with the full support of the physio staff at Luton Town, Doughty has since played a part in three Championship matches, providing the assist for Carlton Morris to open the scoring against Sunderland.

"Luckily the physio team just helped me out with it and now it feels back to normality. That is why we took a bit more time than it would have just to make sure it was ready, because of how quick I am, sometimes I'm more prone to getting injuries than any other.

"I have just played 70 minutes against Norwich and then 90 against Watford, so it seems to be okay."

Support from manager Nathan Jones and his team-mates has also provided the number 45 with a big boost, and now he intends to repay the faith shown in him.

"If a manager wants to sign you it is always a positive. They see something in you and I appreciate it. He has proved everything he said to me really, he believes in me so I just have to give that trust back now."

"The group is quality. There is a real togetherness in this group and I think you can tell by the performances and the games we have played, how well we perform as a team. There are no individuals, it's team collectiveness."





## THEIR TOWN

Today's visitors are Berkshire-based side Reading. Founded in 1871, the Royals play at the Select Car Leasing Stadium and sit 11th in the Championship table, two places below the Hatters but only on goal difference, with both on 25 points.

Managed by Paul Ince, the Royals had a decent start to the season, although they do lack consistency with eight wins, one draw and eight defeats from their 17 games. They are currently on a run of just one win in six matches, losing four. Most recently they lost 2-1 at Vincent Kompany's Burnley after conceding a last-minute goal, despite going 1-0 up thanks to former Town loanee Tom Ince, their top scorer with four.

Reading fans have some great memories in the Championship, in particular the 2005/06 season when the Royals won the league with a record-breaking 106 points under another ex-Manchester United player, Steve Coppell. This success saw Reading play in the Premier League for the first time. They were last there in the 2012/13 campaign after once again winning the second tier title under Brian McDermott.


They were relegated back to the Championship at the end of that season, and their best finish since the drop was in 2016/17 when they came third under yet another former Old Trafford favourite in Dutchman Jaap Stam. They lost the play-off final on penalties at Wembley against Huddersfield Town.

Last May, Reading travelled to Kenilworth Road for the final match of the regular Championship season. The Hatters won the game 1-0 to seal a place in the play-offs after Reading goalkeeper Orjan Nyland lay the ball down to kick up field, before Harry Cornick came from behind him to steal the ball and placed it into the net with one of the cheekiest goals seen at the Kenny for many a year.



## PAUL INCE

MANAGER | After a glittering playing career that took in Manchester United, Inter Milan and Liverpool as well as 53 caps for England, Ince retired from playing at 39 years of age, becoming the manager of Macclesfield Town. After saving the Silkmen from relegation, the 55-year-old became manager of Milton Keynes, where he won League Two. He then managed Blackburn, Notts County and Blackpool before taking charge of Reading in February after eight years out of the game.



## JOE LUMLEY

GK | The Englishman is currently on a season-long loan at Reading from Middlesbrough. Last term, Lumley made 34 appearances in the Championship, and five appearances in other cup fixtures. In the FA Cup, he started in wins against both Manchester United and Tottenham Hotspur. The 27-year-old has made 15 appearances so far in the current campaign, managing to collect four clean sheets along the way.



# READING IN FOCUS

## ANDY YIADOM

DEF | Before joining the Royals four years ago, London-born Yiadom had experience in the EFL, playing for Barnsley in League One and Barnet in League Two. The right-back started in Watford's youth system, before gradually making his way to the Championship, initially via spells in Non-League with Hayes & Yeading and Braintree Town. The 30-year-old has made 15 appearances so far this season and has 26 caps for Ghana.

## TOM INCE

ONE TO WATCH | Ex-Town loanee Tom Ince was part of Liverpool's reserves before signing a contract with Notts County, and eventually landing a transfer to Blackpool in July 2011. The 30 year-old seems to have landed his feet with the Royals this season, picking up four goals and three assists in his opening 17 games. His best performing years so far were 2015/16 and 16/17, where he scored 26 goals for Derby, as well as picking up 14 assists over the two seasons.



## JEFF HENDRICK

MID | The 30 year-old was a summer signing for Reading, on a season-long loan from Newcastle. He had made 16 appearances and scored once for the Royals before the weekend. Internationally, the Dublin-born midfielder has played 75 times for the Republic of Ireland, contributing two goals. Hendrick began his playing career at Derby before moving to Burnley £10.5m, and then Newcastle, from where he also had a loan spell with QPR last season.



## LUCAS JOAO

ATT | The Angolan international began his playing career for CD Nacional, in Portugal's First Division, picking up a tally of seven goals and nine assists as a 21-year-old. The following season João made a move to Sheffield Wednesday, and has stayed in the Championship ever since. The 29-year-old had netted three times for the Royals in 13 appearances this season prior to the weekend. In total, he has scored 38 and assisted 13 since joining in 2019, and has one cap for Angola.

## FIRST AND LAST JOHN COLLINS

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, with club historian ROGER WASH looking back at their first and last appearances for the Town.

Born in Chiswick in 1942, John started at QPR on leaving school and signed professional forms for the West London club in August 1959. A clever forward who made a name for himself as a scorer of important goals, John played 172 League games and netted 46 goals before having a brief stint at Oldham in 1966.

He did not stay long in the north and signed on for Reading in August 1967, where he was virtually ever present over the next two seasons. A change of manager at Elm Park and the lure of ex-QPR boss Alec Stock, now at Luton, saw John move to Kenilworth Road for £11,000 in August 1969.

Stock knew what he was getting and the fee proved a bargain as John netted ten goals, mainly from the right wing, as the Town won promotion to Division Two (now the Championship) in 1970. John left Luton for Cambridge United in February 1971 where he enjoyed two seasons before hanging up his boots.

After finishing playing, John was assistant to old colleague Mike Keen at Watford and coach at Fulham with Alec Stock, before running a building firm in West London.

### FIRST GAME: LUTON TOWN 3 BARROW 0. (9/8/69)

John Collins, making his Luton debut on the opening day of the season alongside other new boys John Ryan and Malcolm Macdonald, saw the Town ease past Barrow on a humid afternoon.

John reacted first to a saved Brian Lewis penalty to open his Luton account, adding to goals from Keith Allen and Mike Keen and send the crowd of 12,080 home happy.

### LAST GAME: NORWICH 1 LUTON TOWN 1. (19/12/70)

After being virtually ever present during the promotion campaign of 1969-70, John found it difficult to stake a claim in the Division Two (now Championship) side in the following season.

His only start turned out to be his last game for the club. Replacing the injured Roger Hoy, John was part of a team that lay in second spot in the division and an early goal from Malcolm Macdonald instilled confidence. Sadly, a last minute penalty, converted by Ken Foggo after Jack Bannister punched away a goalbound header, saw the Town fail to rise to top spot.



## TONY READ... THE ULTIMATE SHOWMAN



Followers of Luton Town of more than fifty years standing will go all misty eyed when recalling Tony Read, a showman goalkeeper who saw off many pretenders to his throne, as well as displaying a more than adequate ability at centre-forward as proved when he once scored a hat-trick in a league game.

Now 80, Tony lives in north Norfolk and still looks back with affection to his days at Kenilworth Road where he was a crowd favourite for seven years.

Born in Haydock in 1942, Tony had early trials with both Wolves and Liverpool, but after rejection returned to an apprenticeship in engineering before being snapped up in 1960 by Sheffield Wednesday, then one of the powers in the land.

Unfortunately, the Owls boasted England international Ron Springett between the sticks and as well as being remarkably consistent, he was also virtually injury free, leaving little chance of a first team place for a third or fourth choice keeper.

Although admitting to learning a lot while at Hillsborough, Tony needed to move on if he wished to gain first team experience. His eventual move to Peterborough in 1964 turned out to be a case of 'out of the frying pan' as Posh ended up with five goalkeepers on their books, and the only way Tony could get a game was to display his hidden talents as a striker.

Although the Hatters signed Tony as a goalkeeper, he is convinced that it was because of a goal he scored against Pat Jennings at White Hart Lane during a Tottenham versus Peterborough reserve game!


Coming to Luton in March 1965, just as the team was about to sink to the old Division Four (now League Two), it was soon discovered that the new signing was suffering from a broken bone in his foot which was typical of the luck, or more likely malaise, creeping through Kenilworth Road at the time.

As the Town started the 1965/66 campaign in the football basement for the first time in their history, manager George Martin had managed to bring together a team blending youth and experience centred around tough ex-Blackburn centre-half, Matt Woods, and prolific goalscorer John O'Rourke.

With Colin Tinsley claiming the goal-keeping slot, Tony was left kicking his heels until the manager, feeling that O'Rourke needed someone to take the weight off his shoulders, decided to play him up front.

With this move a legend was born! Tony went goal mad and netted twelve in only 20 starts, including a hat-trick against Notts County at Kenilworth Road in a 5-1 win.

"I remember mis-hitting a free-kick and seeing the ball somehow trickling over the line for my hat-trick goal, with Matt Woods' groans turning to congratulations in an instant. Towards the end of the season the goal supply had dried up, but I was now looking on myself as the complete centre-forward. After a game at Notts County where, looking

back, I missed several sitters, George Martin announced in the changing room that I would never make a striker (or words to that effect!) and I moved back into goal, where I stayed for the next six years apart from an emergency spell in the forward line over Easter 1967."

The Town should have won promotion in 1966, but a row over bonuses as the season drew to a close meant several senior players only went through the motions in a vital game at Newport, which was lost, and with it the chances of a quick return to Division Three.


With the Hatters offloading the dissenting players that summer, the following season was always going to be a struggle with no experience in the side, but new manager Allan Brown, appointed in November 1966, was determined to take the club back to its former glories. This included seeking out a better goalkeeper.

"Allan had a thing about Scottish goalkeepers, even though they were looked on as a joke at the time. Many a recruit came down for trial games and to a man they were all super fit athletes, but could not come out for, or catch, crosses."

During his time between the posts at Kenilworth Road, Tony saw off goalkeepers Colin Tinsley, George Ramage, Ron Swan, Bob Taylor, Sandy Davie and Alan Starling, who were all seen as his replacement.

It was, of course, a golden age for the Hatters with the championship of Division Four won in 1968, a near miss at further promotion in the following season, runners-up in Division Three in 1970, followed up by the narrow failure in a bid to return to the top flight 12 months later.

Tony was the regular goalkeeper throughout this time, hence the affection held by all Luton supporters of that era. Extremely athletic and a spectacular shot stopper, he also showed the ability to claim crosses and would be regarded as priceless today because he also possessed the additional talent of being very comfortable with the ball at his feet.

During his 229 first team appearances for the Town he witnessed the skills of Graham French (who was sent to live

next door to Tony in a hopeless bid to curtail the errant winger's partying habits), Bruce Rioch, Chris Nicholl and Malcolm Macdonald, and became a bit of a legend himself with his ability to save penalties.

It was one such penalty save, against Geoff Hurst of West Ham in a cup tie at Upton Park, that bought belated national recognition for Tony with the flying dive being shown for weeks on television afterwards. It was soon after that Tony lost his place to Keith Barber, and this time it was for good.

Although there was the chance to move to Millwall, Tony decided to concentrate on his many business interests and retire from the game completely.

Tony's last Kenilworth Road appearance took place during the club's centenary celebrations in 1985 when he turned out for an 'old' Luton XI against Watford. The lasting memory is of Tony, ever the showman, leaning against a goalpost being interviewed by a television reporter while the game was in full flow!

Hatters' Heritage trustee Andy King and myself visited Tony last month to record an interview with the great man. The video is now on the Hatters' Heritage website - [hattersheritage.co.uk](http://hattersheritage.co.uk) - and does not disappoint as he talks about his toughest opponents, memorable games, his penalty saving technique and Graham French!


Throughout my career, I have always wanted to win. It was a significant driver in my mentality, and I want to install this in any team I am lucky enough to coach.



## ADULT HEALTH SESSIONS

One of the growing areas at Luton Town FC Community Trust, and something we're very proud of, is our work in the health sector. We have had enormous success with Fit Hatters; an EFL Trust funded 12-week programme that focuses on classroom based sessions educating participants around making healthy lifestyle choices, alongside a varied fitness regime taking place within the stadium at Kenilworth Road.

We have run multiple cohorts of Fit Hatters within the last couple of years and will soon be opening up our next male and female groups. Alongside Fit Hatters, we have a number of other health based sessions that are open to adults that we'd love you to attend. On Wednesday evenings between 6pm and 7pm we run a circuits session at Beech Hill School. This is a mixed session allowing participants to build up their stamina and fitness through a number of stations focussing on endurance training, resistance training and high intensity aerobics.

On Thursday evenings we run football sessions at Beech Hill School, offering participants the opportunity to improve their skills, boost their mental and physical health, whilst also taking part in small sided games. These sessions are open to over 35s of all abilities, with a male session at 6pm and female session at 7pm. We also run a very popular session on Saturday mornings, Away Day Hatters. Taking place at our Ely

Way base in Leagrave, these sessions run on Saturday's where The Hatters are either playing away from home, or if there is no game at all. Away Day Hatters focuses on fitness, strength and conditioning and are open to all, regardless ability or fitness aims.





## THE LAST WORD

**Town boss Nathan Jones achieved something that only two others have done in the rich and lengthy history of Luton Town Football Club at the weekend, and that was to make it to 300 games as manager of the Hatters.**

To say he is closing in on the two above him in the leaderboard is a bit far fetched for the time being, Daily Duncan sitting second on 514 matches and David Pleat way out in front on 609.

Catching Pleat would mean that Jones would have to stay at the helm for at least another six seasons, taking him almost into 2030, and while not impossible, is a fair way off.

If he continues the level of improvement that he has overseen since first taking over back in January 2016, then Luton would probably be looking to retain their Premier League title and push for Champions League glory by then, as Town's upward trend since he was appointed has been nothing short of remarkable.

There have been the odd down days during his tenure, none more so than the recent defeat at Watford, although that has been covered more than enough now. But the good times, of which there have been 140, far outweigh them.

The League Two promotion at Carlisle won't be forgotten, plus the following celebrations at Notts County, while his achievement in keeping Luton in the Championship when they were odds-on to go down, something no other manager could have done, should never be underestimated.

Since then it's been a gradual progression, finishing 12th and then a fine sixth last term, where had Town not suffered so badly with injuries, they could have been sitting back at the top table of English football once more this season.

It didn't happen though and the Hatters found themselves in the second tier yet again, which if you cast your minds back to when Jones strode down the tunnel for that first 0-0 draw with Cambridge, would have been perfectly acceptable to the 9,227 supporters in attendance that day.

Players have come and gone since then, naturally, although two remain, Dan Potts and Pelly-Ruddock Mpanzu, the latter now determined to get back to his best following a long spell out of the side with injury.

Another fine achievement for Jones is that he has now managed 118 matches at Championship level for Luton, which as mentioned recently, is a startling effort considering the number of comings and goings in the division this term.

Town's home form has been the only sticking point between the Hatters' going into tonight's contest with Reading higher than the ninth place they occupy, giving up the lead in five of their nine home matches this term, something they did once more against Sunderland on Saturday.

The Royals are yet to draw on the road this term though, suffering six defeats from their eight matches, so fingers crossed, here's to victory number 141 at 9.30pm!


