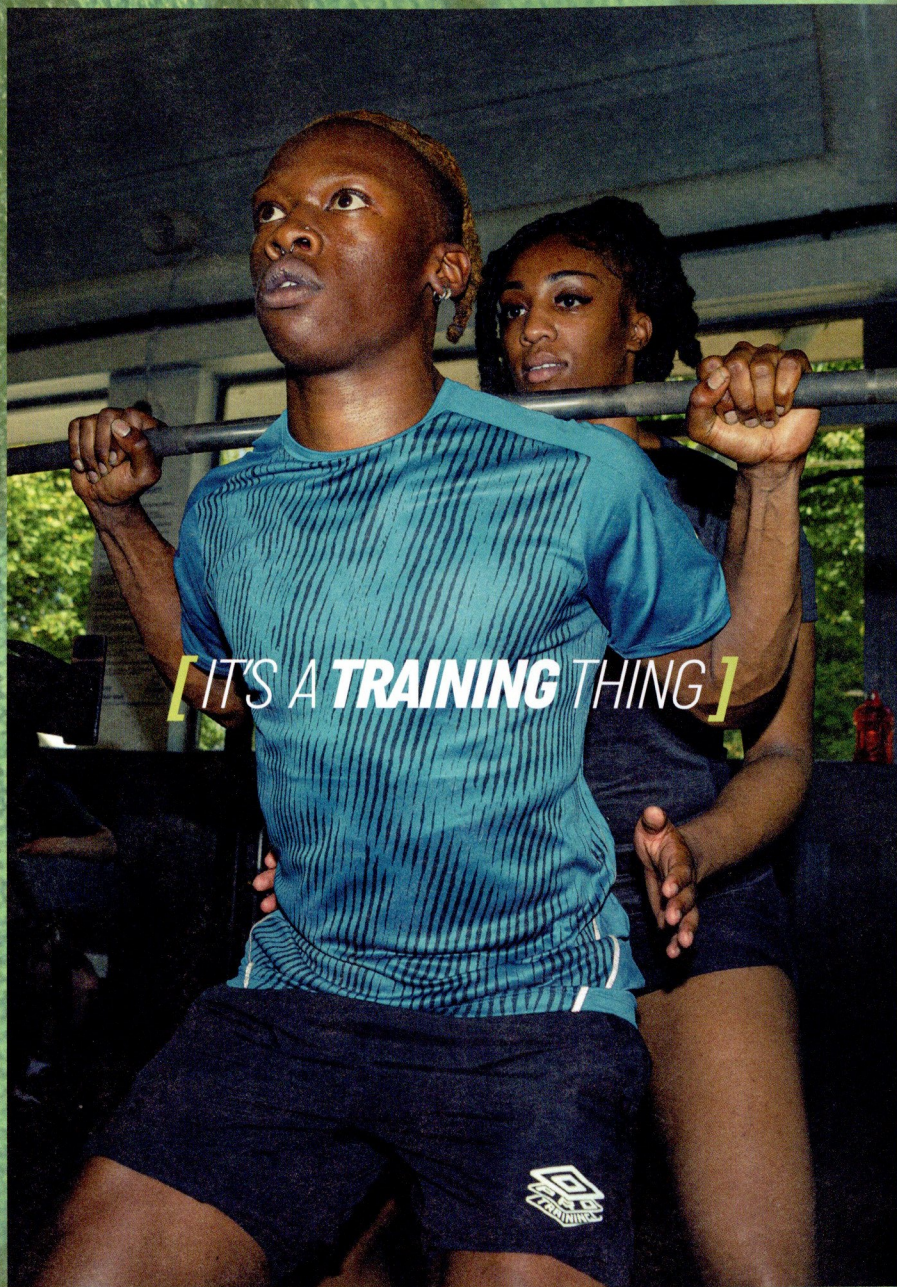

Good evening and welcome to Kenilworth Road for this Sky Bet Championship fixture with Norwich City.

I'd like to wish everyone a happy Christmas and hope that you had a great day yesterday. We were all disappointed not to be able to play Millwall, but we appreciate the efforts you have made to get here tonight for another unusual Boxing Day kick-off time, as I know you would have done last Sunday morning, along with all of the positive responses we had to the request to help clear the snow off the pitch.

I'll kick-off by saying a huge thank you to everyone for the welcome that Richie, Paul and I have received since our appointment last month.

From Gary, David and the board, through to Mick, every single member of staff, the fantastic squad of players we've inherited and, of course, the supporters we've been lucky enough to meet so far, the warmth has hit all three of us through the freezing temperatures outside.

It is an honour to be asked to manage this brilliant club at such an exciting time for Luton, not just for the club but the town as a whole, with the new stadium at Power Court shining like a beacon in the plans we've been so impressed by.

Today is going to be a special occasion for us, just as it was up at Middlesbrough a fortnight ago. The 'Welcome Rob' banner meant so much. Allied with the fact that so many fans

The talent is there, everyone can see that. But there is an honesty, an endeavour, a work-rate and a togetherness that I've quickly got to recognise in the period since we came in.

The World Cup break has definitely helped in that process. It's been a unique time, and one that I doubt we'll

ever experience again, having the chance to come into a club midway through a season and having this spell to not only work with the players, but to get to know them and the club as well. That's really going to benefit us going forward and the big thing now is to start getting results, to get that buy in and belief. They achieved brilliant things last season, and they already have so far this, so we don't need to change too much.

We want to try and build, evolve and grow as we go on, and of course we are going to make some tweaks, because in the end it is going to be a reflection of us. But we do so many things well at this club, we've got to keep continuing to do that and because of the lads' attitude, work ethic and talent, I know we will get better at them. That showed on Wednesday in an excellent performance against a near full-strength Arsenal first team, in what was a really worthwhile friendly. After the youth team's cracking win at Birmingham on Monday, it added to a great atmosphere around the club heading into Christmas.

If I can give one message to you, the supporters, it is to get behind the lads, as I know you always do, starting today against a very good Norwich City side who will make life difficult for us under Dean Smith.

I've been here as an opposition player and experienced what it is like trying to compete against the atmosphere you create. It's hard, I can assure you, and in the best way possible, I want it to be that way for us to use in our favour now. We need our fans to be at their brilliant best, get behind the lads and make it a really difficult place for everyone who comes to Kenilworth Road, because getting our home form going is really important for us to be successful.

Please enjoy the game and we look forward to seeing as many of you as possible at QPR and Huddersfield during what I know is a busy and expensive time for everyone. Please travel safely and have a great New Year.

## FROM THE BOARDROOM

Good evening everyone and a very warm welcome to Kenilworth Road for today's game against our Norwich.

Our postponed game against Millwall was due to kick off at the unprecedented time of 11.30am and today, Boxing Day, it's 7.45pm. So many of these inconsiderate timings seem to be giving little thought to the social and travel arrangements of supporters. For me it's a worrying trend to be seemingly discouraging live attendances along with saturation TV coverage of all levels of football.

Football without fans is a hollow game as we saw through the Covid lockdown and we should be careful to avoid it being redirected from the stadium to the living room. There is always a tingle of excitement and anticipation when you walk up to a stadium and first get a glimpse of the pitch. I always tell people that if you haven't felt the electricity generated among the crowd at a live game you have missed out on one of life's exhilarating experiences. That's what hooks you in and brings you back time and again.

What disruption this World Cup has caused. It all seems so surreal. It's six weeks since we last played a game here. They say that football is a game of two halves, this year it's a season of two halves.

Games against Norwich have provided many memorable moments over the years. One of my first ever games in 1959 was to see us beat them 1-0 at St Andrews, Birmingham in a replay to reach the FA Cup Final. More recently was the historic 1-0 win at Carrow Road in 2013, which was the first time a non-league club had beaten a team in the Premier League. We beat them at their place earlier in the season, and with Delia saying they would get their own back here it'll be interesting to see how it goes.

A lot has transpired since we were last here. We said goodbye to Nathan, Chris and Alan just before the last home game, and while the players, in most cases, were enjoying a well-earned break, we were so fortunate to be able to identify and recruit an impressive new manager, and the same can certainly



be said of his two assistants. We are delighted and privileged to welcome Rob Edwards, Richie Kyle and Paul Trollope to our club and hope they enjoy their time with us.

Because of the World Cup break we have had the unusual opportunity to have some time to get to know the new boys, and they have been able to spend some quality time with the players. Changes are never easy, but it seems from both sides that it has gone smoothly so far.

Gary and I were fortunate to be able to join the squad on part of their trip to Dubai and were able to witness the bonding in progress.

Rob and his team have considerable coaching experience, including being part of the FA's England coaching set up, and we have all been fascinated by

some of their thoughts and ideas.

It will be different, but we are excited about the change and looking forward seeing their plans in action. We have spent time talking with them about the club, its history and philosophy, and they have already seen for themselves the attitude, camaraderie and work ethic in the squad.

Their first game in charge was away at Middlesbrough and most people on both sides agreed that a draw would have been a fairer reflection of a decent performance, particularly in the first half. However, that wasn't to be and some dubious refereeing decisions and a red card meant we couldn't withstand the late pressure.

This game marks the halfway point in a disrupted season and we should be pretty happy with where we are. Let's hope that we have a bit of luck on the injury front in the second half of the season, as in several cases it will be like having new players as they return to fitness. We are all very confident with our choices and hope that you will enjoy the way they play and get behind them.

Last Wednesday saw us in a behind closed doors friendly against a very strong Arsenal first team. I was tucked

up in bed with a bug so particularly unhappy to have missed it, but I'm told it was an excellent performance with a final scoreline of 0-0.

Last Monday saw the U18s at Birmingham in the FA Youth Cup and what a performance it was. A 6-0 win against a Category 2 academy away from home. Apart from the score, it was just a brilliant performance and bodes well for the future. We have been drawn at home against QPR in the next round in January and highly recommend coming along if you can.

As we approach the end of 2022 it is worth noting that despite adversity Gary, Mike and their teams are continuing to move ahead with plans for Power Court and improve our other facilities. A new gym is being completed at the Brache and we are only too aware that we need to upgrade our Academy to EPPP2 at the earliest opportunity.

We were all very sad to hear that lifelong fan Fred Young passed away recently. Fred had supported the club for 88 years, after his family's milkman suggested he take up a hobby. That meant cycling from his home in Welwyn to Luton for every home game! A season ticket holder up until the 2019-20 season, when Andrew Shinnie presented Fred with his own shirt at West Brom to mark his 100th birthday, he unfortunately hadn't been able to return since Covid. He did have a club calendar next to his bed in the home where he spent his final days, however, and still had daily chats with his son Steve about the football.

Fans are proposing a minute's applause at the 17th minute of today's game because that is the date he died. As he was 102 the only chance of doing it at that point of the game would be if we were playing Wycombe. Please join in the tribute to a great fellow supporter. RIP Fred.

## RICHIE KYLE & PAUL TROLLOPE

**LUTON TOWN v NORWICH CITY**

**As well as welcoming Rob Edwards to Kenilworth Road last month, the Hatters had two more new faces joining with Richie Kyle and Paul Trollope as assistant managers.**

Kyle, 38, was Edwards' number two at both Forest Green Rovers and Watford, with the pair having worked together for the Football Association as in-possession and out-of-possession specialist coaches with England U16s and U20s.

They had first met through Edwards' links to former playing club Blackpool, where Kyle was Under-18s coach and head of coaching before progressing to first team level, helping the Seaside to promotion from League Two at the Hatters' expense in 2016-17.

Kyle, who had started coaching part-time in Everton and Blackburn's academies, had a brief spell as Canadian women's national team assistant manager in 2021, before returning to this country to help Edwards lead Forest Green to the League Two title.

With a second opportunity at Championship football, Kyle admitted: "When you get a little bit of a knock in life, you always have to come back a bit stronger. Personally, I have a fire in my belly, a hunger to try and prove people wrong."

"You have another opportunity at a good level to try and achieve success. I'm as passionate as anyone, I know we have a great opportunity here to really build on what has gone on and take it up to the next level."

Trollope, 50, made almost 500 appearances during a playing career that took in spells at Torquay, Derby, Coventry and Northampton. The midfielder also won nine Welsh caps between 1997 and 2003, when Edwards featured in some of the same international squads.

A five-year stint as manager at Bristol Rovers, where he finished his playing days, saw Trollope win promotion from League Two and reach Wembley in the Johnstone's Paint Trophy. He was the seventh longest-serving manager in the EFL at the time of his departure from the Memorial Stadium in 2010.

Later Trollope was part of Chris Coleman's Wales' staff in the build-up to, and during their run to the semi-finals of the European Championships.

"When you're between jobs, whether you're a manager or whether you're a coach, you look at opportunities as they come along," said Trollope. "I reconnected with Rob again recently and as soon as he said there was a possibility of working together, it was something I was very excited about."

## THEIR TOWN

Today's opposition are Norwich City, who arrive at Kenilworth Road in fifth place in the Sky Bet Championship table having won three of their last six matches, but on the back of home defeats to Middlesbrough and Blackburn Rovers in their last three outings.

The Canaries were founded in 1902 and play their home games at Carrow Road. They have won the League Cup twice in their history, in 1962 and '85, and have spent a fair amount of time in the Premier League in recent years. Their best season saw the Canaries finish in third place in the inaugural campaign of 1992-93 and qualify for European football, when they were knocked out of the UEFA Cup last 16 by Inter Milan having beaten Bayern Munich in the previous round.

Over the past dozen years Norwich have become a 'yo-yo' club, bouncing around the top-flight and Championship, spending six seasons in each since 2011-12. The Canaries were relegated in bottom place last term, recording only five league wins all campaign under Daniel Farke, who had led the Norfolk side to promotion twice, and the current manager, Dean Smith.

This season has been better, with strikers Teemu Pukki and Josh Sargent scoring nine and seven goals respectively, but still not up to the expectations of the Canaries supporters as inconsistency has blighted their form leading into, and since the World Cup break. Town were one of four teams to beat Norwich during their six-match winless run in October, with a classy goal from Carlton Morris securing a 1-0 success at Carrow Road, with City midfielder Kenny McLean sent off.

The Hatters also came out on top in the last meeting here at the Kenny, when George Moncur, Matty Pearson and James Collins scored in a 3-1 win in front of 1,000 fans who were invited to a test event during the behind-closed-doors season of 2020-21.





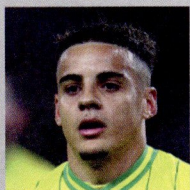
## DEAN SMITH

**MANAGER** | After retiring from playing in 2005, Smith was assistant manager at Leyton Orient before taking over at Walsall in 2011. He stayed with the Saddlers until 2015, getting them to the final of the Football League Trophy before moving up to the Championship with Brentford. In October 2018, he joined boyhood club Aston Villa and led them back to the Premier League via the play-offs. He took over at Norwich in November 2021, but couldn't prevent relegation last term.



## TIM KRUL

**GK** | The Dutchman has vast English football experience, making 222 appearances in the top flight as well as 98 in the Championship. Krul began his career playing in ADO Den Haag's youth system, before completing a move in 2005 to Newcastle. He had loans with the likes of Falkirk and Carlisle before venturing back to the Netherlands with both Ajax and AZ Alkmaar prior to signing for Brighton in 2017. Now 34, Krul joined the Canaries a year later.

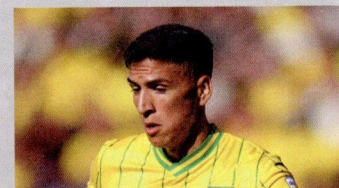
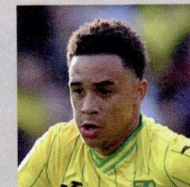


## MAX AARONS

**DEF** | Started out in the Hatters' youth system before moving to Norwich's academy in 2016. In June 2018, he signed a three-year professional contract, and quickly established himself as a key member of City's Championship title-winning side. The 22-year-old has played 24 times in all competitions this season, and is approaching the 200 club appearance landmark. He also has 20 caps for England U21s.

## AARON RAMSEY

**ONE TO WATCH** | Aston Villa loanee Ramsey has found form at Norwich this season after consistently impressing in Villa's U23s. The 19 year-old joined the Premier League club's youth system at Under-9 level, and he has played for England at every age from U16 to U20. Ramsey had a loan spell at Cheltenham last season, making 15 appearances in League 1. This year, in 18 Championship appearances, the Birmingham-born midfielder has scored three and assisted three.



## MARCELINO NÚÑEZ

**MID** | The Chilean international started his career with the Católica U19s squad. He worked his way through the ranks, putting in impressive performances and eventually found himself in Católica's first team. He had two consistent seasons as a box to box midfielder. The Canaries put a bid in for Núñez last summer, and since then the 22-year-old has been one of their most influential players, making 20 appearances so far and scoring once.



## JOSH SARGENT

**ATT** | The USA international made his Norwich debut in August 2021, coming on as a substitute in a 3-0 defeat against Liverpool. Prior to his Norwich days, Sargent played for Sporting Kansas City in America before being scouted by Werder Bremen. After a successful few seasons in Germany, Norwich signed him on a fee in the region of £10m. This season, he has scored 9 goals in 21 games in the Championship.

Under the spotlight is a player with a connection to both the Hatters and today's visitors, with club historian *ROGER WASH* looking back at their first and last appearances for the Town.

After failing to make the grade at both Arsenal and Fulham, John probably thought it was the end of the line when he joined Division Three (now League One) side Luton on a free transfer in 1969.

Full-back John soon became a crowd favourite at Kenilworth Road though, with his swashbuckling runs down the wing and fierce shooting, and it was a sad day when he left for Norwich in 1977 for £60,000 after 264 League starts for the club.

At Carrow Road he was moved to midfield and became a consistent goalscorer before spells with Seattle Sounders, Sheffield United and Manchester City. Player/coach roles at Stockport and Chester then followed before John was appointed player/manager of a very poor Cambridge United side in 1984. John showed his frustrations by being sent off three times in his five League outings at the Abbey!

After managing several non-League sides, John worked for the PFA before becoming Director of Youth Development for the Thailand Football Association in Bangkok.

## FIRST GAME. LUTON TOWN 3 BARROW 0. (9/8/69).

Making his League debut for the Town alongside fellow newcomers John Collins and a little-known defender, also from Fulham, Malcolm Macdonald, it was an easy start for John as a comfortable 3-0 win was recorded.

Goals from Keith Allen, Collins and Mike Keen set the Hatters up for what would be a promotion winning campaign.

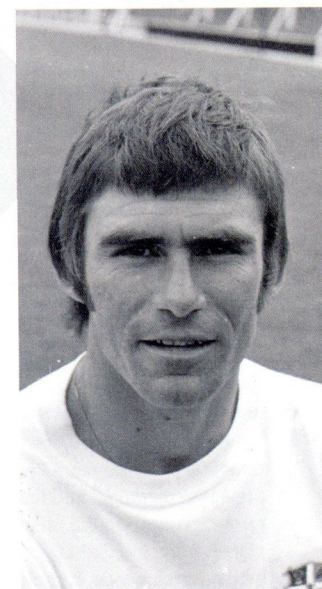
## LAST GAME. LUTON TOWN 3 BRISTOL ROVERS 1. (19/4/76).

## LARS ELSTRUP: WHAT COULD HAVE BEEN

The summer of 1989 was always going to signal a period of change for the Hatters. Losing in the Littlewoods Cup final to Nottingham Forest the previous campaign, and finishing rather too close to the relegation places in the top flight for comfort with an ageing side, it could be seen that a refresh was needed.

Out went Ricky Hill to Le Havre after 15 years with the club, followed by skipper Steve Foster who joined up with his old team-mate Brian Horton at Oxford. With Brian Stein and Mal Donaghy having

already left, the Littlewoods Cup winning squad of 1988 was slowly being broken up.

Off the field, controversial Chairman David Evans stood down to be followed by long standing Chief Executive John Smith. Brian Cole took over as Chairman with Henry Richardson and Ray Pinney joining the Board. Club Secretary Bill Tomlins moved internally to become Chief Executive.

When news that talismanic striker Mick Harford was to undergo an ankle operation just as the season was due to begin, alarm bells were beginning to ring amongst the Luton faithful who sensed a struggle emerging.

Out of the blue the Town entered the transfer market. Tough

tackling Mick Kennedy came in from Leicester in a part exchange deal involving another member of the Littlewoods Cup winning side, Rob Johnson, but more was to follow.

The club's transfer fee record was smashed when Denmark international forward Lars Elstrup came in from Danish champions OB Odense. At this stage, Elstrup had netted eight goals from 12 appearances for his country including two on his debut against Sweden and one against England.

With many clubs in Europe, notably Cologne, after the services of the former Brondby and Feyenoord striker, it seemed a great coup when he decided to sign for Luton. The fee, although undoubtedly a club record, was shrouded in mystery. A letter from the UK based agents employed by Odense confirmed that £730000 would be paid by Luton and in addition Raphael Meade (signed by the Town earlier in the year from Dundee United for £250000 and still valued at the same figure) would go to Denmark.

Elstrup, apart from rent-free accommodation, removal expenses from Denmark, eight return tickets a year, a car and an annual salary of £50,000, would also receive a signing-on fee. How much is open to debate. On the agents letter it was stated as £20,000, yet in an expose by Mihir Bose of the Daily Telegraph, Elstrup's two year contract stated £170000.

The Inland Revenue took great interest in this apparent anomaly for a while, especially as Odense only received £400000, but even accountants called in by the Hatters could not provide a solid answer.

Elstrup appeared to have it all. Six feet tall, tremendously fast and with a rocket left foot shot, he immediately drew comparison with Malcolm Macdonald, but his first season at Kenilworth Road never really got going.

In and out of the side at the start, he took until the end of October before he netted a first League goal, in a 1-1 draw at Millwall, although before this he had scored five times in an 11-5 aggregate win over Mansfield in the Littlewoods Cup.

His first season came to an abrupt halt after Christmas when he needed a cartilage operation and only returned at the back end of the campaign when he came off the bench in the last four games, including the never to be forgotten final day 3-2 win at Derby to avoid relegation.

Luton supporters were probably thinking that we had bought a dud but, fully fit and re-energised, Elstrup showed his full potential in 1990-91.

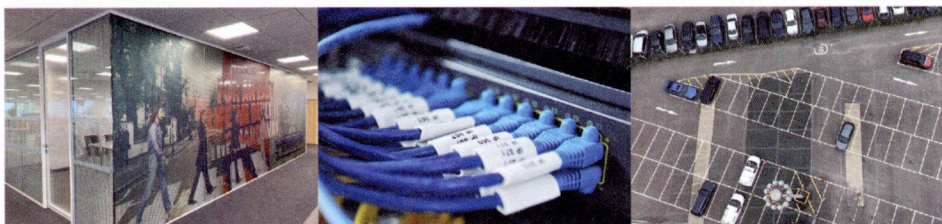
Leading the line, Elstrup bagged both goals in an early season 2-1 win at Southampton, went one better in a 3-1 victory at Norwich and netted twice at Nottingham Forest. In this latter game he was up against super-quick England international defender Des Walker. The song was regularly warbled from the Trent End at Forest 'You'll never beat Des Walker', but Elstrup did, holding the defender off in a long chase before slotting the ball in the net!

By the end of the campaign, Elstrup had missed only one game and finished streets ahead as top scorer in a struggling Luton side. His last goal came in the final day 2-0 win over relegated Derby, where his header to add to an own goal from Rams' Mick Harford, confirmed top flight status for another year.

Elstrup put his improvement and adaptation to the English game down to manager Jim Ryan, who had taken over the hot-seat in January 1990. When Ryan was unceremoniously sacked after the Derby win in May 1991, Elstrup took the decision to return to Odense.

The problem was that Odense had no money and under an agreed European formula, the Town were due around £650,000 which would have provided new manager David Pleat with a war chest.

Elstrup was adamant that he wanted to go and turned down fresh terms at Kenilworth Road. He said that he would retire for six months and go back to banking before signing on for Odense

as an amateur. UEFA stated that they would take a dim view of this and scrutinise any paperwork relating to Odense in the transfer market.

As it turned out the Town 'reluctantly and unhappily' accepted a cut-price £250,000 from Odense, taking the view that anything is better than nothing.

Elstrup enjoyed two further seasons at Odense including scoring in the Danish FA Cup final and also turning out for his country in the 1992 Euros. Denmark were given a last minute reprieve after Yugoslavia were thrown out due to United Nations sanctions against the war torn country, and then went and won the competition. Elstrup scored the winner against France and netted a penalty against Holland in the semi-final shoot-out.

Elstrup then dropped out of the game completely, changed his name to Darando (which means the river that streams into the sea) and joined the anarcho-Buddhist Wild Goose sect.

He then set up his own new-age community called 'Heart of the Sun' and tales of his brushes with the law filtered back to Kenilworth Road to much amusement, tinged with regret at losing a superb striker who was at the top of his game when he departed.

After offering seminars on new age topics Elstrup, now approaching 60, still lives in Denmark where he keeps out of the public eye.

It's Rob Edwards' first home match in charge at the Keny and he'll obviously get a terrific reception from you lot. You'll start to get to know Rob better over the coming weeks. I have known him for six months having dealt with him when he was manager of the other Championship team in the BBC Three Counties patch! He's a good guy and you're going to like him as a person.

We will now get another chance to see what he's like as a manager at Championship level after being given such a short amount of time in Hertfordshire. When Rob arrived there he spoke about how he needed time to change the culture, to rebuild and to create a togetherness within the squad.

His chief executive infamously said that the club would stick with him "come hell or high water". Ten league games in and he was gone. It was no surprise to us journalists who know how the owner operates at Vicarage Road, but was really harsh on Rob.

Like I'm sure he will do here, the emphasis was on passion and commitment from his players. He created a happier training ground and dressing room.

The players he deals with here at Kenilworth Road will be slightly different to what he had there. Rob was having to manage really big-name players. Individuals who are huge assets of the club worth tens of millions of pounds.

That comes with challenges. Players are treated differently by the club and egos are high. I would imagine it must be a difficult group to manage.

Here at Luton there seems much more of a squad togetherness and the training ground/dressing room culture is

particularly strong. This is a tight group which the previous manager made sure didn't get above its station. No passengers, no idiots; that was Nathan's mantra. This is an honest bunch of guys willing to fight for each other and the club. Rob will love that.

I watched nearly every Watford game Rob was in charge of. He started five unbeaten and had one defeat in eight. The new Hatters boss likes to try to keep possession perhaps a bit more than his predecessor, and is maybe a bit less direct.

He's quite an attacking coach and often criticised Watford for not taking enough risks and being braver on the ball. He likes to press high and he also likes a 3-4-3 formation, which isn't dissimilar to how the Hatters normally play.

He will place quite a big emphasis on his wing backs and he won't be scared to play out from the back a bit more.

I'm looking forward to seeing how he does here at Luton and wish him all the best. He has some very big shoes to fill and I really hope Nathan succeeds at Southampton.
