

We apologise to any supporters inconvenienced by this fixture amendment.


## IFOLLOW BECOMES HATTERS PLAYER

**We can confirm to supporters that following our promotion, live video streaming of Premier League matches is not permitted for clubs, so there will not be an alternative to iFollow Hatters for watching matches live on the club website or app for next season.**

Audio commentary of matches will continue to be available however via EFL Digital, along with behind-the-scenes video content and match highlights, but this service will now be named Hatters Player.

The cost of an overseas Season or Monthly Pass subscription to Hatters Player has been reduced to be the same as a domestic subscription, costing £45 annually or £4.49 per month, to reflect the absence of live match video streams.

Single match passes for Hatters Player audio commentary will be available for £2.50.

# WELCOME GILLINGHAM

**Tonight, we welcome Gillingham to Kenilworth Road as our first visitors of our new-look home for this Carabao Cup second round tie.**

Neil Harris' side have so far had an excellent start to the season in League Two and, as we went to press, were top of the fourth tier.

In the previous round of Carabao Cup, the Kent club beat Russell Martin's Southampton side 3-1 on an amazing night at the Priestfield Stadium. A double from Robbie McKenzie as well as a goal from Ashley Nadesan provided a shock win for the Gills to set-up tonight's tie.

Last season, Gillingham had an underwhelming season in League Two, rallying in the end to overcome a poor start to finish in 17th place on 55 points. Walsall and Doncaster Rovers also finished on the same amount of points – and all three were opponents for the Hatters during the League One campaign in 2018/19.

It's been since then that the two sides have faced each other. The last time each club met one other was in March 2019 which resulted in a 2-2 draw at Kenilworth Road. Danny Hylton and Jack Stacey were on the scoresheet that day for the Town, helping them on their way to the League One title.

The Gills won their opening four games of the League Two season all by a 1-0 scoreline. Their season opener saw them defeat Stockport but wins over Accrington, Sutton and Crawley have meant Harris' side went into last Saturday's game with Colchester with a 100 per cent record – without conceding a goal.

Last season in the Carabao Cup, Gillingham made it to the fourth round of the competition. It was in the fourth round where they were knocked out by Premier League side Wolves.

**Dom Jefferies.** Young Welshman who signed from Brentford B in 2022. Came through the ranks at Newport and was named the Gills' young player of the year last term.



**Jonny Williams.** Experienced Welsh international who was named in the squad for the 2022 World Cup. Joined the Gills this summer after leaving Swindon where he scored 10 goals last term.



**Shaun Williams.** Gills captain and Irish international with over 600 career appearances, the majority at Championship level with Millwall.

## NEW BOYS TAME THE GILLS

After the euphoria of the Fourth Division title win of 1967/68, followed by the near miss in gaining further promotion the following season, it was felt by a lot of Hatters supporters that we had shot our bolt and that the glory days were going to be just a distant memory.

Those feelings were reinforced when 'golden boy' Bruce Rioch was sold to Aston Villa for £100,000 which was then a record fee for a player leaving Division Three (now League One).

In Rioch's place the Town welcomed Peter Phillips from Bishop's Stortford, Alan Guild from East Fife and John Ryan from Fulham – all on free transfers. Also from Fulham, for the princely sum

of £17,500, came defender Malcolm Macdonald, a player of whom manager Alec Stock said: "He's the right age for us at 19. We wanted younger players and we wanted a left-back."

The pre-season friendlies did not bode well though, and a 5-2 defeat at Aldershot was followed by a narrow win over the Italian Under-21 side and then a dull 1-1 home draw with Clyde. ▶

## CLASSIC MATCH

During the second half of the match against Clyde, Macdonald was moved to the left-wing in place of the injured Mike Harrison and retained this position in a 10-0 joke game against a Gibraltar side who had never played on grass before.

An extremely subdued crowd of 'only' 12,080 turned up at Kenilworth Road for the opening game of the season to see new boys Ryan, Macdonald and previous day signing from Reading, John Collins, take on Barrow.

In a fairly comfortable victory, goals from Keith Allen, skipper Mike Keen and Collins saw off an average Barrow side, but the supporters were not satisfied. Barrow had conceded five goals at Kenilworth Road five months previously and they were still wondering when the Rioch windfall would be spent.

Despite all this, a large crowd of Luton supporters went to Bournemouth the following week and swelled the attendance at Dean Court to 9,735. They were not disappointed as Macdonald scored his first senior goal for the club, when he sped onto a defence splitting pass from Keen before rounding the goalkeeper and side-footing the ball home. Little did supporters know that this was to be the first of many – not bad for a full-back!

Fans were beginning to allow themselves to slip out of the doldrums after a home victory over Orient the following week, especially as the Town had fought back from 2-0 down to win 3-2, with the deciding goal coming from Macdonald in the 86th minute.



The Town were now on a roll but, as is often the case, we were brought back to earth when Halifax came to a wet and windy Kenilworth Road for a mid-week game and went home with a point following a deserved 1-1 draw.

Although Macdonald netted the Luton goal, the tall Halifax centre-half Chris Nicholl kept him under fairly close control all evening and we were pleased to hear afterwards that Stock had agreed to buy him for a huge (by Luton standards) fee of £34,000.

Nicholl had been tailed by Stock for several weeks but to the supporters it felt that he had signed him simply because he had kept Macdonald quiet. "He will play for England one day," said his old manager Alan Ball senior. ▶

# CLASSIC MATCH

All those fans who had doubted Alec Stock and his apparent failure to spend money were well and truly silenced the following day when another £25,000 was found for Matt Tees, a proven goalscorer, who was dropping down a division to join Luton from Charlton.

"Both players will appear on Saturday at Gillingham," said Stock, which guaranteed there would be a large influx of Town supporters in the Medway Towns for the game.

The Gills were pointless at the bottom of the table and were desperate for a result to kick-start their season. They set their stall out early by clattering both Macdonald and Tees, who they obviously regarded as the danger men, but it was the Town that drew first blood when Gillingham's Andy Smillie needlessly handled the ball in the area after 13 minutes, with Macdonald lashing home the resultant penalty.

The Town had the better of the first half without being able to make their superiority tell but, aided by some ruthless defending, Gillingham managed to claw themselves back into the reckoning early in the second period.

It was now the turn of the Luton defenders to show their worth with Nicholl having an outstanding game and gradually things turned the Town's way again with the midfield of Keen, Collins and Keith Allen providing ammunition for the forwards and winger Graham French in particular.

The points were secured after 76 minutes when a cross from French was turned into his own net by Gillingham full-back Mike Green, and although it was a scrappy win it proved the Town could fight as well as play pretty football.

Gillingham finished the season one place off the relegation positions due, in the main, to away wins over the three top sides, Orient, Luton and Bristol Rovers. It was their win over Rovers at the end of the season that virtually guaranteed the Town promotion!

### MEMORABLE WIN!

LUTON 3-0 CHARLTON.

29th AUGUST 1981



Brian Horton marks his first Luton appearance with an impressive display against a newly promoted Charlton side who had six players making their debuts. The Valiants are swamped after Donaghy dives to head the first goal from a Horton corner. Paul Walsh hits a post for the visitors. The Town would go on to enjoy their season, winning the Division Two title come the end of the campaign.

### TOP-FLIGHT TO NON-LEAGUE IN 19 YEARS

The Town last played in the top tier of English football on this date at Highbury against Arsenal in 1990. Despite a goal from Danish international Lars Elstrup giving the Hatters the lead, the Gunners hit back and a goal from Michael Thomas gave the hosts all three points.

If you had told any Luton fans inside the famous old ground that night that they would be watching the Town in the Conference 19 years later then you would no doubt receive some interesting looks. However, that's exactly what happened in 2009 when Mick Harford's side drew 0-0 at Kettering in front of 3,266 at Rockingham Road.



### ‘THE BEST GAME EVER’

The words of legendary British journalist Dennis Hackett describing the Hatters' 5-4 defeat to Wolves in the top-flight back on this day in 1956, there. Molineux was packed to the rafters with 46,781 treated to a nine-goal thriller that the Town were on the wrong end of despite the best efforts of all-time leading goalscorer Gordon Turner, whose hat-trick was all in vain.

## WHO'S IN TOWN?

West Ham United, aka the Hammers, aka the Irons, make the short trip up from East London to become the first club in the top-flight to visit Kenilworth Road since Aston Villa on 25th April 1992. Founded as Thames Ironworks in 1895 they became West Ham United in 1900. David Moyes is the man in charge and the club now call the London Stadium (formerly Olympic Stadium) home after moving from Upton Park in 2016. The Hammers finished 14th in the Premier League last season but Moyes' side will be best remembered for their UEFA Conference League success following their win over Fiorentina in the final.

## SO FAR SO GOOD

Due to bank holiday printing deadlines we sit here typing this without knowing how the Hammers fared in their Saturday evening fixture at Brighton in the Premier League – but West Ham fans were jumping for joy following their first home match of the season at London Stadium. Moyes' side saw off London rivals Chelsea 3-1 thanks to goals from Nayef Aguerd, Michail Antonio and Lucas Paquetá. That brought their points tally to four following their opening-day-of-the-season draw at Bournemouth.

## LONG-TIME NO SEE

Taking out friendlies and a Checkatrade Trophy match against the Hammers Under-21s, the last time the two sides met in true competitive sense was a belter under the lights at the Kenny: March 1994, FA Cup quarter-final replay. Luton 3-2 West Ham. Scott Oakes' (pictured) hat-trick sent the Town to a semi-final at Wembley against Chelsea. The Hatters also tasted victory in the last league match against the Irons at Kenilworth Road. A 2-0 win in the new Division One (now Championship) was achieved thanks to goals from Phil Gray and Martin Williams. In the last 12 matches between the two clubs at Kenilworth Road, the Town have lost just once.

## A HATTER AND A HAMMER

Plenty of Town players in the squad have links with Friday's visitors. The most obvious starting place is our longest-serving player, Pelly Ruddock Mpanzu, who originally joined the Hatters on-loan from West Ham in December 2013.

Defenders Dan Potts – the son of Hammers legend Steve Potts, who played in that game in 1994 – and Reece Burke also came through the ranks in East London – as did midfielder Louie Watson prior to his move to Derby.
